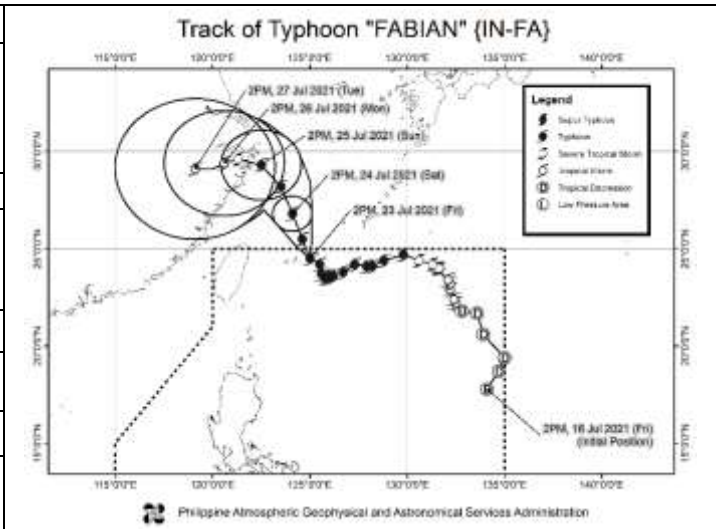
Typhoon "FABIAN" (IN-FA)

Issued at 5:00 PM, 23 July 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 11:00 PM today

TYPHOON "FABIAN" IS NOW MOVING OVER MIYAKO ISLANDS WHILE MAINTAINING ITS STRENGTH.

Location of Center (4:00 PM)
The center of the eye of Typhoon "FABIAN" was estimated based on all available data at 540 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (24.7°N, 125.0°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 185 km/h , and central pressure of 955 hPa
Present Movement
West Northwestward at 10 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 590 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p>Heavy Rainfall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> "FABIAN" is unlikely to directly bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period. Under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon being enhanced by "FABIAN", scattered to widespread monsoon rains will be experienced in the next 24 hours over Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, Occidental Mindoro, and northern portion of Palawan (including Calamian Islands). More information is provided in the Weather Advisory #14 for Southwest Monsoon and the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued at 11:00 AM and 4:00 PM today, respectively. <p>Severe Winds</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale conditions) will be experienced over Batanes throughout the passage the typhoon. Occasionally gusty conditions associated with the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Visayas and the rest of Luzon, especially in the coastal and upland localities of these areas.
HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
<p>In the next 24 hours, under the influence of the enhanced Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "FABIAN":</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rough to very rough seas will be experienced over the seaboard of Luzon (including the areas under TCWS #1), and Central and Western Visayas. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #8 issued at 5:00 PM today. Moderate to rough seas will prevail over the remaining seaboard of the country. Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating in these conditions.
TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> "FABIAN" is now crossing over Miyako Islands. This tropical cyclone will move generally north northwestward in the next 36 hours and northwestward by Sunday (25 July) afternoon before making landfall over the eastern portion of mainland China on Sunday evening or Monday (26 July) early morning. "FABIAN" is forecast to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tonight. "FABIAN" is forecast to gradually intensify in the near term and reach its peak intensity (155 km/h) tomorrow afternoon. A weakening trend in its intensity may begin by Sunday morning.
