

# TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 31F Typhoon "FABIAN" (IN-FA)

Issued at 5:00 AM, 24 July 2021

## TYPHOON "FABIAN" ACCELERATES NORTHWARD AND IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF **RESPONSIBILITY (PAR)**

### Location of Center (4:00 AM)

The center of the eye of Typhoon "FABIAN" was estimated based on all available data at 640 km North Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (outside the PAR) (25.9°N, 124.7°E)

### Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 170 km/h, and central pressure of 960 hPa

### **Present Movement**

Northward at 15 km/h

## **Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds**

Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 620 km from the center

### HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

### **Heavy Rainfall**

Under the influence of the Southwest Monsoon being enhanced by "FABIAN", scattered to widespread monsoon rains will be experienced in the next 24 hours over Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Metro Manila, most of Central Luzon, CALABARZON, and MIMAROPA, and portions of Western Visayas. More information is provided in the Weather Advisory #15 for Southwest Monsoon and the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued at 11:00 PM yesterday and 4:00 AM today, respectively.

### **Severe Winds**

Occasionally gusty conditions associated with the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over Luzon and Visayas, especially in the coastal and upland localities of these areas.

### **HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

In the next 24 hours, under the influence of the enhanced Southwest Monsoon and Typhoon "FABIAN":

- Rough to very rough seas will be experienced over the seaboards of Luzon and the western and central seaboards
  of Visayas. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should
  immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #9 issued at 5:00 AM today.
- Moderate to rough seas will prevail over the remaining seaboards of the country. Mariners of small seacrafts are
  advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. Inexperienced mariners should avoid navigating
  in these conditions.

## TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- "FABIAN" exited the PAR at 11:00 PM yesterday.
- The typhoon is forecast to gradually accelerate while moving generally northwestward over the East China Sea. On the forecast track, "FABIAN" may make landfall in the vicinity of eastern mainland China on Sunday afternoon or evening
- Gradual weakening is expected beginning tomorrow as "FABIAN" moves closer to the China coast. However, there
  is an increasing possibility that this typhoon will further weaken as early as today. Nevertheless, "FABIAN" is
  forecast to rapidly weakening as it moves inland after making landfall over eastern China, eventually leading to its
  degeneration into a remnant low by Tuesday evening.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

Unless re-entry occurs, this is the final bulletin for this tropical cyclone. Succeeding updates will be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast at 5:00 PM today.
