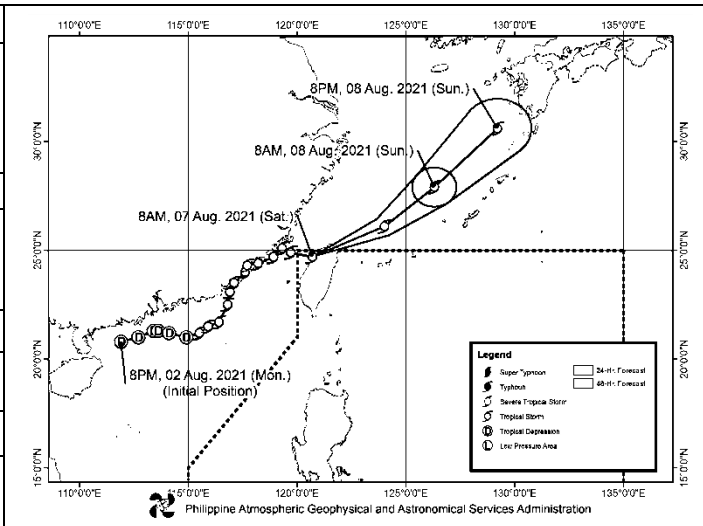
Tropical Storm "HUANING" (LUPIT)

Issued at 11:00 AM, 07 August 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 PM today.

TROPICAL STORM "HUANING" ENTERS THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY AND MAKES LANDFALL IN THE VICINITY OF HSINCHU CITY IN TAIWAN

Location of Center (10:00 AM)
The center of Tropical Storm "HUANING" was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Hsinchu County, Taiwan or 465 km North of Itbayat, Batanes (24.9°N, 121.0°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 110 km/h , and central pressure of 992 hPa
Present Movement
East Southeastward at 15 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds extend outwards up to 280 km from the center

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TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS IN EFFECT

No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

"HUANING" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition and bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period.

Severe Winds

The latest forecast scenario for "HUANING" shows that the hoisting of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals over any land area in the country is unlikely. However, the Southwest Monsoon that it enhances will bring gusty conditions over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Apayao, and Abra.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by "HUANING" will bring rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m) over the northern and western seaboard of Luzon. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #37 issued at 5:00 AM today.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, "HUANING" is forecast to move generally east northeastward until tonight. The storm is expected to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility and emerge off the north or northeastern coast of Taiwan over the East China Sea this afternoon or evening. Afterwards, "HUANING" will turn northeastward and head towards the direction of Kyushu in southern Japan.
- "HUANING" is forecast to remain a tropical storm throughout the forecast period. However, the possibility that the storm will weaken into a tropical depression while traversing Taiwan is not ruled out at this time.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 PM today.
