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TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS IN EFFECT

No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

“HUANING” is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition and bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period.

Severe Winds

The latest forecast scenario for “HUANING” shows that the hoisting of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals over any land area in the country is unlikely. However, the Southwest Monsoon that it enhances will continue to bring strong winds (strong breeze to near gale) with higher gusts over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Apayao, and Abra.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by “HUANING” will bring rough to very rough seas (2.5 to 4.5 m) over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Northern and Central Luzon. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor. For more information, see the Gale Warning #38 issued at 5:00 PM today.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “HUANING” left the Philippine Area of Responsibility at 11:00 AM today.
- On the forecast track, “HUANING” is forecast to move generally northeastward over the East China Sea towards the direction of Kyushu in southern Japan.
- “HUANING” is forecast to remain a tropical storm throughout the forecast period.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final bulletin for this tropical cyclone.
