TROPICAL DEPRESSION "ISANG" CONTINUES TO TRACK NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

Location of Center (10:00 PM)


The center of Tropical Depression "ISANG" was estimated based on all available data at 1,160 km East of Northern Luzon (18.5°N, 132.6°E)

Intensity

Maximum sustained winds of **45 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **55 km/h**, and central pressure of **1006 hPa**

Present Movement

Northwestward at 25 km/h

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TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS IN EFFECT

No Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal is currently in effect.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

"ISANG" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition and bring heavy rainfall in the country throughout the forecast period.

Severe Winds

The latest forecast scenario for "ISANG" shows that the hoisting of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals over any land area in the country remains unlikely. Moreover, its passage is unlikely to enhance the Southwest Monsoon and bring gusty conditions to the country.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, Tropical Depression "ISANG" remains less likely to cause sea conditions within the coastal waters of the country which may be risky to any type of sea vessel.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, "ISANG" will remain far from the Philippine landmass throughout the forecast period. The tropical depression is forecast to move northwestward until tomorrow, then turn north northwestward on Saturday. "ISANG" is likely to exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Saturday evening or Sunday morning.
- "ISANG" is forecast to remain a tropical depression and may weaken into a low pressure area by Sunday evening, possibly earlier.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

Unless an intermediate bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
