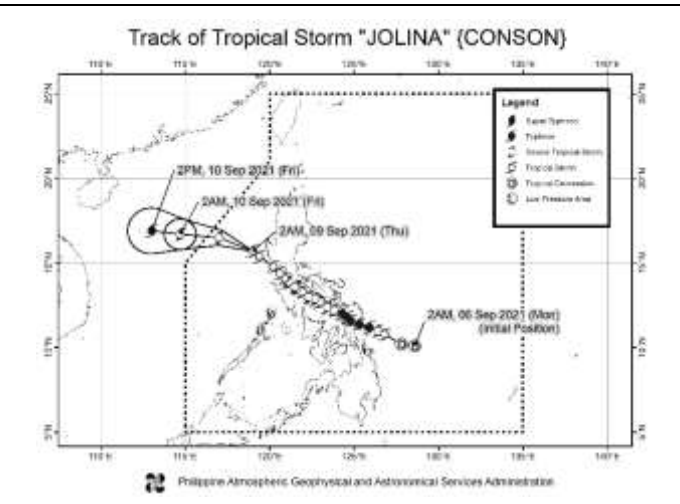
**Tropical Storm "JOLINA" (CONSON)**

Issued at 5:00 AM, 09 September 2021

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 11:00 AM today

**TROPICAL STORM "JOLINA" MAINTAINS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING NORTHWESTWARD AWAY FROM THE LANDMASS OF LUZON.**

<b>Location of Center (4:00 AM)</b>
The center of Tropical Storm "JOLINA" was estimated based on all available data at <b>145 km West Northwest of Iba, Zambales</b> or <b>175 km West of Dagupan City, Pangasinan (15.8°N, 118.7°E)</b>
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>85 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness of up to <b>115 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>998 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
<b>Northwestward 25 km/h</b>
<b>Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds</b>
<b>Strong winds or higher</b> extend outwards up to <b>160 km</b> from the center

<b>1</b> (Strong winds prevailing)	<b>The western portion of Pangasinan</b> (Anda, Bolinao, Infanta, Aguilar, Sual, Labrador, Dasol, Bugallon, Burgos, Mabini, Agno, City of Alaminos, Bani, Lingayen, Mangatarem) <b>and the northern portion of Zambales</b> (San Antonio, Botolan, San Narciso, San Felipe, Cabangon, Palauig, Iba, Masinloc, Candelaria, Santa Cruz)	-	-

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p><b>Heavy Rainfall</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the next 24 hours, light to moderate with at times heavy rains may be experienced over Zambales, Bataan, and Pangasinan.</li> <li>Under these conditions, isolated to widely scattered flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are still possible especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps.</li> </ul> <p><b>Severe Winds</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale conditions) with occasional gusts will continue within any of the areas where Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal (TCWS) #1 is in effect. This may result to up to very light damage to structures and vegetation.</li> <li>All wind signals presently hoisted will likely be lifted within the day.</li> </ul>
HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the next 24 hours, Tropical Storm “JOLINA” will bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 4.0 m) over the western seaboard of Luzon. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor.</li> </ul>
TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>On the forecast track, “JOLINA” will move generally northwestward today over the West Philippine Sea and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) this afternoon or tonight. Outside the PAR, the storm is forecast to move generally westward towards the vicinity of Vietnam or southern China.</li> <li>“JOLINA” is forecast to re-intensify and reach severe tropical storm category today. Furthermore, the storm may reach typhoon category tomorrow.</li> </ul>

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
