

TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 24 Tropical Storm "JOLINA" (CONSON)

Issued at 11:00 AM, 09 September 2021 Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 PM today

TROPICAL STORM "JOLINA" CONTINUES TO MOVE WESTWARD OVER THE WEST PHILIPPINE SEA.

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of Tropical Storm "JOLINA" was estimated based on all available data at 240 km West of Dagupan City, Pangasinan (16.0°N, 118.1°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **85 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **115 km/h**, and central pressure of **998 hPa**

Present Movement

Westward 10 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 160 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- In the next 24 hours, light to moderate with at times heavy rains may be experienced over Palawan, Western Visayas, and Zamboanga Peninsula. For more information, see the Weather Advisory #2 for Southwest Monsoon and the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued at 11:00 AM and 4:00 AM today, respectively
- Under these conditions, isolated to widely scattered flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are still possible especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps.

Severe Winds

Moderate to strong winds associated with the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will be experienced over the western section of Luzon.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, Tropical Storm "JOLINA" and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.1 m) over the western seaboard of Luzon. Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts over these waters. Mariners without the proper experience should immediately seek safe harbor.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, "JOLINA" will move generally west northwestward today over the West Philippine Sea and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tonight. Outside the PAR, the storm is forecast to move generally westward towards the vicinity of Vietnam or southern China.
- "JOLINA" is forecast to re-intensify and may reach severe tropical storm category today. Furthermore, the storm may reach typhoon category tomorrow (10 September).

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 PM today.

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
