THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION CONTINUES TO MOVE NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA WEST OF NORTHERN MARIANAS

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GENERAL OUTLOOK FOR THE FORECAST PERIOD

- The tropical depression is forecast to move northwestward until tomorrow before turning west northwestward. It will likely enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Wednesday (08 September) morning. On the forecast track, the tropical cyclone will move west northwestward on Wednesday and Thursday, and northwestward on Friday until the end of the forecast period. It is expected to remain far from the Philippine landmass throughout the forecast period.
- The tropical depression is expected to reach tropical storm category within 12 to 24 hours. Due to favorable environmental conditions, the tropical cyclone will like continue to intensify throughout the forecast period and may reach typhoon category by Thursday.
- The tropical cyclone is unlikely to bring significant amounts of rainfall over the country throughout the forecast period. However, the possibility of hoisting Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal #1 over Extreme Northern Luzon is not ruled out at this time based on the recent trend in the track forecasts from the past advisories.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to continue monitoring for updates related to this tropical cyclone.

Unless an intermediate advisory or initial tropical cyclone bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.
