TROPICAL DEPRESSION "NANDO" DECELERATES AS IT INTERACTS WITH THE CIRCULATION OF "MARING".

Location of Center (4:00 PM)	
The center of Tropical Depression "NANDO" was estimated based on all available data at 895 km East of Central Luzon (15.6°N, 129.9°E)	
Intensity	
Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h , and central pressure of 1002 hPa	
Present Movement	
West southwestward at 20 km/h	
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds	
Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 350 km from the center

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
The tropical depression is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country within the forecast period.
HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
The tropical depression is unlikely to directly affect the sea conditions over the coastal waters of the country within the forecast period.
TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Both "MARING" and Tropical Depression "NANDO" are presently embedded within the larger circulation of a monsoon depression. "NANDO" is forecast to move generally southward as it interacts with the circulation of "MARING". During this period, "NANDO" may likely be assimilated and merged into the circulation of "MARING".Considering the trend of changes in the forecast scenario in previous bulletins and the uncertainty surrounding the interaction and merger event between "MARING" and "NANDO", there is a moderate to high likelihood that changes may still occur in the track and intensity outlook for this tropical depression in the next bulletin.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
