<b>THE THREAT OF HEAVY RAINFALL CONTINUES AS “AGATON” WEAKENS INTO A LOW PRESSURE AREA.</b>

<b>TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT</b>

<b>HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS</b>
<p><b>Heavy Rainfall</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Tonight through tomorrow evening:</b> Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains are still possible over Eastern Visayas, Sorsogon, Masbate, the northern and central portions of Cebu including Bantayan and Camotes Islands, Aklan, Capiz, Antique, Iloilo, Guimaras, and the northern and central portions of Negros Provinces. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over MIMAROPA, Dinagat Islands, Zamboanga del Norte, Quezon, and the rest of Bicol Region and Visayas.</li> <li>Under these conditions and considering significant antecedent rainfall, <b>scattered to widespread flooding (including flooding) and rain-induced landslides are still expected</b> especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps.</li> </ul> <p><b>Severe Winds</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Despite the lifting of wind signals, occasionally gusts reaching strong breeze to near gale in strength may still be experienced over Eastern Visayas, Central Visayas, Caraga, Misamis Oriental, and Camiguin.</li> </ul>

<b>HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In the next 24 hours, rough seas (2.8 to 3.7 m) will prevail over the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Visayas and Mindanao. <b>These conditions may be risky for most seacrafts.</b> Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to remain in port or take shelter, while those operating larger vessels are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.</li> <li>Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.1 m) will prevail over the southern seaboard of Southern Luzon, the remaining seaboard of Visayas, and the northern and western seaboard of Mindanao. <b>These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts.</b> Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.</li> </ul>

<b>TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The remnant circulation of “AGATON” is forecast to track eastward towards the Philippine Sea away from the Samar-Leyte landmass as it merges itself with the larger circulation of Typhoon “BASYANG” outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).</li> </ul>
