



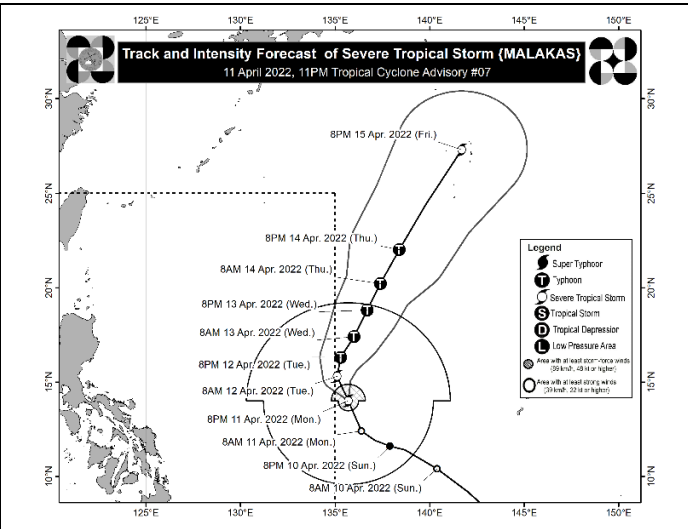
TROPICAL CYCLONE ADVISORY NO. 7
Severe Tropical Storm "MALAKAS"

Issued at 11:00 PM, 11 April 2022

Valid for broadcast until the next advisory at 11:00 AM tomorrow

"MALAKAS" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING NORTH NORTHWESTWARD

Location of Center (10:00 PM)
The center of Severe Tropical Storm "MALAKAS" was estimated based on all available data at 1,255 km East of Southern Luzon (14.6°N, 135.8°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 125 km/h , and central pressure of 985 hPa
Present Movement
North northwestward at 15 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds or higher extend outwards up to 600 km from the center

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GENERAL OUTLOOK FOR THE FORECAST PERIOD

- "MALAKAS" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country. However, swells resulting from this tropical cyclone is forecast to generate moderate to rough seas over the northern and eastern seaboard of Luzon and the eastern seaboard of Visayas and Mindanao. **These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts.** Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.
- "MALAKAS" is forecast to continue tracking generally north northwestward in the next 12 hours. A slight eastward shift in the present track forecast compared to the previous bulletins due to the recent north northwestward movement of the severe tropical storm decreased the likelihood of "MALAKAS" entering the Philippine Area of Responsibility. In the event that the severe tropical storm enters the PAR, its duration within the region will be brief. A turn to the northeast is expected by tomorrow evening or Wednesday morning as "MALAKAS" gradually accelerates.
- This tropical cyclone is forecast to intensify throughout the forecast period, reaching typhoon category by tomorrow evening. A peak intensity of 150 km/h may be reached by Wednesday evening.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to continue monitoring for updates related to this tropical cyclone.

Unless an intermediate advisory or initial tropical cyclone bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.
