

Location of Center (10:00 PM)

The center of Tropical Storm "DOMENG" was estimated based on all available data at 995 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (22.2°N, 131.4°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 75 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 90 km/h, and central pressure of 996 hPa

Present Movement

Northward at 20 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to 400 km from the center

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rains

Tropical Storm "DOMENG" is not directly affecting the archipelago at this time. However, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by this weather system and Severe Tropical Storm "CHABA" outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) will continue affecting the western sections of Central and Southern Luzon. For more information, refer to the **24-Hour Public Weather Forecast** issued at 4:00 PM today.

Severe Winds

No tropical cyclone wind signal is currently hoisted for this tropical cyclone. However, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Tropical Storm "DOMENG" and Severe Tropical Storm "CHABA" will bring **occasionally gusty conditions** reaching strong breeze to gale-force in strength over Extreme Northern Luzon, the northern and western portions of Luzon, and the western portion of Visayas. These conditions are more likely in coastal and mountainous/upland localities of these areas.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- Under the influence of Tropical Storm "DOMENG", Severe Tropical Storm "CHABA", and the prevailing Southwest Monsoon, a **Gale Warning remains in effect** over the western seaboards of Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #3 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- Moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 4.0 m) will also prevail over the remaining seaboards of Northern Luzon. These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Storm "DOMENG" is forecast to gradually accelerate northward or north northwestward until tomorrow morning, then northwestward for the remainder of tomorrow. On the forecast track, this tropical storm will exit the PAR tomorrow morning or afternoon. Outside the PAR region, "DOMENG" is forecast to pass very close or over the Ryukyu Islands tomorrow evening before turning north northwestward on Sunday as it moves over the East China Sea.
- "DOMENG" is forecast to gradually intensify and may reach severe tropical storm category in the next 36 hours.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 AM tomorrow.
