Tropical Storm "FLORITA" (MA-ON) Issued at 2:00 AM, 23 August 2022

Location of Center (1:00 AM)

The center of Tropical Storm "FLORITA" was estimated based on all available data including those from Daet Doppler Weather Radar at **140 km East Southeast of Casiguran, Aurora (16.0°N, 123.4°E)**

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **85 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **105 km/h**, and central pressure of **994 hPa**

Present Movement

Almost stationary

Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to 280 km from the center

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- **Today:** Heavy to intense with at times torrential rains over Cagayan, Isabela, Cordillera Administrative Region, Ilocos Region, and Zambales. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over the northern and central portions of Aurora, Bataan, and the rest of Cagayan Valley. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Camarines Provinces, and the rest of Central Luzon.
- **Tomorrow early morning through afternoon:** Heavy to intense with at times torrential rains over Ilocos Region, Benguet, and Abra. Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over the rest of Cordillera Administrative Region. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Cagayan Valley.
- In the next 24 hours, the Southwest Monsoon will also bring monsoon rains over Western Visayas, MIMAROPA and the rest of Bicol Region. For more information, refer to the **Weather Advisory #3 issued at 11:00 PM today.**
- Under these conditions, scattered to widespread flooding (including flash floods) and rain-induced landslides are expected especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps, and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall.

Severe Winds

- Winds may reach gale-force in strength in any of the areas where Wind Signal no. 2 is hoisted throughout the
 passage of Tropical Storm "FLORITA". Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale strength) will be experienced
 within any of the areas where Wind Signal no. 1 is currently in effect.
- In the next 24 hours, **gusts reaching strong breeze to near gale strength** may also be experienced (especially in the coastal and mountainous areas) over Metro Manila, Zambales, Bataan, Mindoro Provinces, Marinduque, Romblon, Northern Samar, Antique, Aklan, and the remaining areas of CALABARZON and Bicol Region.
- Based on the track and intensity forecast, the highest possible wind signal that may be hoisted throughout the passage is TCWS #3.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- Under the influence of Tropical Storm "FLORITA" and the prevailing Southwest Monsoon, a Gale Warning remains in effect over the northern, eastern, and southern seaboards of Luzon and western seaboard of Visayas. For more information, refer to **Gale Warning #2** issued at 5:00 PM yesterday.
- In the next 24 hours, the Tropical Storm and the Southwest Monsoon will also bring **moderate to rough seas** over the western seaboards of Northern and Central Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the eastern seaboards of Visayas (1.2 to 2.8 m). These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Storm FLORITA will continue to gradually accelerate northwestward and is forecast to make landfall in the vicinity of the east coast of either Cagayan or northern Isabela this morning. Afterwards, the storm will traverse the rugged terrain of Northern Luzon and emerge over the West Philippine Sea tonight. On the forecast track, FLORITA may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Wednesday morning.
- FLORITA may further intensify into a severe tropical storm prior to its landfall. After landfall, this tropical cyclone
 may slightly weaken due to frictional effects of the rugged terrain of Northern Luzon. Once over the West Philippine
 Sea, FLORITA is forecast to re-intensify and may return to severe tropical storm category by Wednesday afternoon
 or evening.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
