The center of Tropical Depression "GARDO" was estimated based on all available data at 1,040 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (22.6°N, 131.7°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **70 km/h**, and central pressure of **1000 hPa**

North Northwestward at 20 km/h

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

"GARDO" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country within the forecast period.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

The tropical depression is unlikely to directly affect the sea conditions over the coastal waters of the country.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Depression "GARDO" is forecast to move generally north northwestward throughout the forecast period as it interacts with Super Typhoon "HENRY".
- "GARDO" will degenerate into a remnant low within 12 hours as "HENRY" begins to assimilate its circulation.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
