Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 70 km/h, and central pressure of 1000 hPa

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

"GARDO" is unlikely to directly affect the weather condition in the country within the forecast period.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

The tropical depression is unlikely to directly affect the sea conditions over the coastal waters of the country.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

Tropical Depression "GARDO" is forecast to track northwestward to westward over the Philippine Sea east northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon as it merges itself with the larger circulation of Super Typhoon "HENRY". Thereupon, "GARDO" will weaken into a Low-Pressure area within 12 hours or sooner.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
