TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 5 Tropical Depression NENENG

"NENENG" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES AS IT DECELERATES WEST SOUTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA

Location of Center (4:00 PM)

The center of Tropical Depression "NENENG" was estimated based on all available data at 795 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (18.7°N, 129.0°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **70 km/h**, and central pressure of **998 hPa**

Present Movement

West southwestward at 10 km/h

Strong winds extend outwards up to 280 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- Tomorrow early morning through afternoon, light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Apayao, Kalinga, and Ilocos Norte.
- Tomorrow afternoon through Sunday afternoon, moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, Ilocos Norte, and Ilocos Sur. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains over Isabela and the rest of Ilocos Region and Cordillera Administrative Region.
- Under these conditions, **scattered flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible**, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall.

Severe Winds

- Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale strength) will be experienced within any of the areas where Wind Signal No.1 is currently in effect
- Per latest track and intensity forecast, the most likely highest wind signal that will be hoisted is Wind Signal No.2.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- Due to the surge of northeasterly surface windflow, a **marine gale warning** remains in effect over the seaboards of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #11 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- In the next 24 hours, the surge of the northeasterly surface windflow and the approaching tropical cyclone may also bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 3.5 m) over the eastern seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon. These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Depression NENENG is forecast to move westward before turning west northwestward on Sunday. On the
 forecast track, the tropical cyclone is forecast to maintain this heading until it makes landfall or may pass very close
 in Babuyan Islands or Batanes on Sunday morning or afternoon. Afterwards, NENENG will move generally west
 northwestward and may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Monday.
- NENENG is forecast to further intensify while moving over the Philippine Sea and may reach tropical storm category by Saturday evening or Sunday early morning.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
