



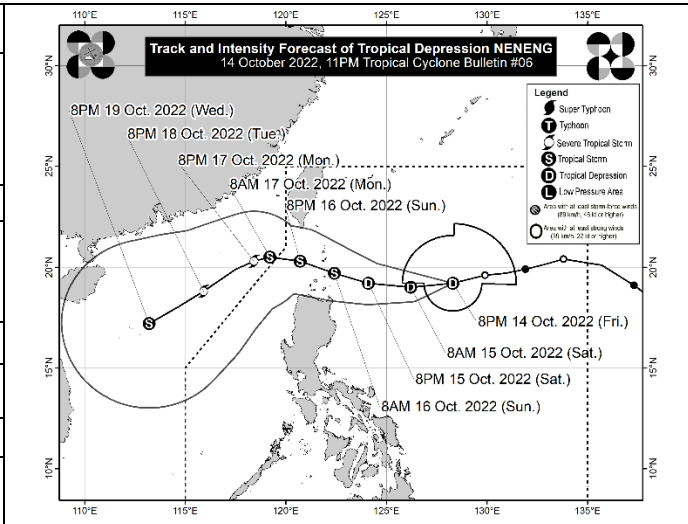
TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NO. 6
Tropical Storm NENENG

Issued at 11:00 PM, 14 October 2022

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 AM tomorrow

TROPICAL DEPRESSION “NENENG” MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH WHILE MOVING WEST SOUTHWESTWARD

Location of Center (10:00 PM)
The center of Tropical Depression “NENENG” was estimated based on all available data at 685 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (19.2°N, 128.0°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 70 km/h , and central pressure of 998 hPa
Present Movement
West southwestward at 15 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds extend outwards up to 360 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall

- *Tomorrow early morning through afternoon:* Light to moderate with at times heavy rains are possible over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Apayao, Kalinga, Ilocos Norte, and Abra.
- *Rest of tomorrow through Sunday evening:* Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains are likely over Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Apayao, Kalinga, Abra, and Ilocos Norte. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains are possible over the northern portion of Isabela and the rest of Ilocos Region and Cordillera Administrative Region.
- Under these conditions, **scattered flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible**, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall.

Severe Winds

- **Strong winds (strong breeze to near gale strength)** will be experienced within any of the areas where Wind Signal No.1 is currently in effect. Per latest track and intensity forecast, the most likely highest wind signal that will be hoisted is Wind Signal No.2.
- The convergence between the circulation of NENENG and southwesterly winds may bring occasional gusts reaching strong breeze to near gale strength over Southern Luzon and Visayas.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

- Due to the surge of northeasterly surface wind flow, a **marine gale warning** remains in effect over the seaboard of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #11 issued at 5:00 PM today.
- In the next 24 hours, the surge of the northeasterly surface wind flow and the approaching tropical cyclone may also bring **moderate to rough seas** (1.5 to 3.5 m) over the eastern seaboard of Central and Southern Luzon. These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

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TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Depression NENENG is forecast to turn more westward through tomorrow morning or noon before turning more west northwestward for the rest of tomorrow through Sunday while moving towards Luzon Strait. On the forecast track, NENENG may pass very close or make landfall in the vicinity of Babuyan Islands or Batanes on Sunday morning or afternoon, then exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Monday as it begins turning westward or west southwestward.
- NENENG is forecast to further intensify while moving over the Philippine Sea and may reach tropical storm category within 24 hours.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
