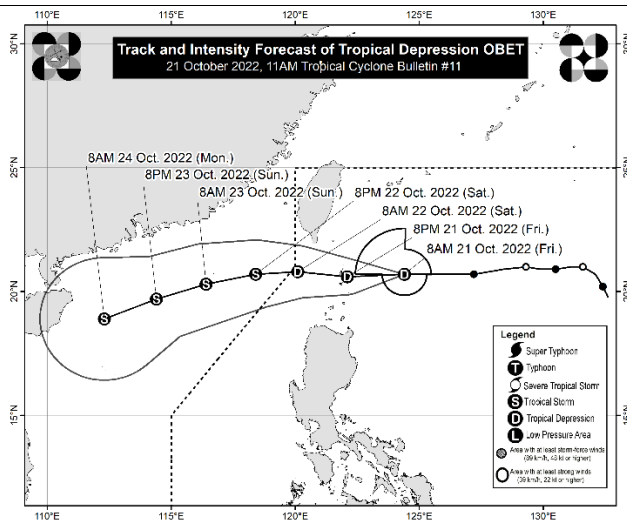

TROPICAL DEPRESSION "OBET" CONTINUES TO MOVE WESTWARD TOWARDS THE LUZON STRAIT

Location of Center (10:00 AM)
The center of Tropical Depression OBET was estimated based on all available data at 205 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.7°N, 123.9°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h , and central pressure of 1004 hPa
Present Movement
Westward at 20 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong winds extend outwards up to 220 km from the center

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p>Heavy Rainfall</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Today through tomorrow early morning:</i> Moderate to heavy with at times intense rains likely over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern portions of Ilocos Norte, Apayao, and mainland Cagayan. Light to moderate with at times heavy rains possible over the rest of Cagayan, Apayao, and Ilocos Norte. • Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazard as identified in hazard maps and in localities with significant antecedent rainfall. <p>Severe Winds</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Throughout the passage of OBET, strong winds (strong breeze to near gale strength) may be experienced within any of the areas where Wind Signal No. 1 is hoisted. However, the hoisting of Wind Signal No. 2 (for gale-force winds) remains possible should OBET reach tropical storm category prior or during its traverse of the Luzon Strait – a scenario that is not ruled out at this time. • Prevailing strong to gale-force winds from the Northeast Monsoon will continue over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern portions of mainland Cagayan, Apayao, and Ilocos Norte prior to the arrival of tropical cyclone winds this noon.
HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Under the influence of the surge of the Northeast Monsoon, a marine gale warning remains in effect over the seaboard of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning #24 issued at 5:00 AM today. • In the next 24 hours, the combined effects of the surge of the Northeast Monsoon and the approaching tropical cyclone may also bring moderate to rough seas over the seaboard of Central Luzon (1.5 to 3.5 m) and the western and eastern seaboard of Southern Luzon (1.2 to 3.0 m). These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.
TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tropical Depression OBET is forecast to track generally westward until tomorrow and its center is likely to pass over or very close to Batanes between this afternoon and evening. On the track forecast, OBET will exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow morning or afternoon. • OBET is forecast to gradually intensify and may reach tropical storm category between tomorrow early morning and afternoon, although the possibility of a slightly earlier intensification to tropical storm category is not ruled out.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
