Typhoon CHEDENG (GUCHOL)

Issued at 11:00 PM, 10 June 2023

TYPHOON "CHEDENG" BEGINS TO WEAKEN AS IT MOVES NORTH NORTHEASTWARD.

Location of Center (10:00 PM)	
<p>The center of the eye of Typhoon CHEDENG was estimated based on all available data at 910 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (20.9°N, 130.7°E)</p>

<p>Maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 170 km/h, and central pressure of 965 hPa</p>

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HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

CHEDENG is unlikely to directly bring heavy rainfall over the country in the next 3 days. However, the **Southwest Monsoon enhanced by CHEDENG** will bring **occasional to monsoon rains over the western portions of Luzon and Visayas in the next 3 days**. For more information, refer to **Weather Advisory No. 5 for Southwest Monsoon issued at 11:00 PM today**.

Severe Winds

The hoisting of Wind Signals in anticipation of tropical cyclone severe winds is unlikely at this time. However, the enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon over the next 3 days may bring gusty conditions over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland/mountainous localities exposed to winds):

- **Tonight and tomorrow:** Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, and Northern Samar.
- **Monday:** Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Romblon, Marinduque, northern mainland Palawan, Calamian Islands, Cuyo Islands, Kalayaan Islands, Bicol Region, and Western Visayas.
- **Tuesday:** Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Occidental Mindoro, Romblon, Kalayaan Islands, and Semirara Islands.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

In the next 24 hours, CHEDENG may bring moderate to rough seas (2.0 to 3.0 m) over the seaboard of Extreme Northern Luzon. **Mariners of small seacrafts are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea. If inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels, avoid navigating in these conditions.**

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, **CHEDENG will remain far from the Philippine landmass**. It is forecast to accelerate north north northeastward or northeastward and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility tomorrow evening or on Monday early morning.
- CHEDENG is forecast to weaken due to increasingly unfavorable environment. It is likely to be downgraded into a severe tropical storm within the next 36 hours.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
