Typhoon EGAY (DOKSURI)

Issued at 11:00 PM, 27 July 2023

TYPHOON EGAY IS NOW ENTERING THE TAIWAN STRAIT.

Location of Center (10:00 PM)

The center of the eye of Typhoon EGAY was estimated based on all available data at **315 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (22.0°N, 119.1°E) (OUTSIDE PAR)**

Intensity

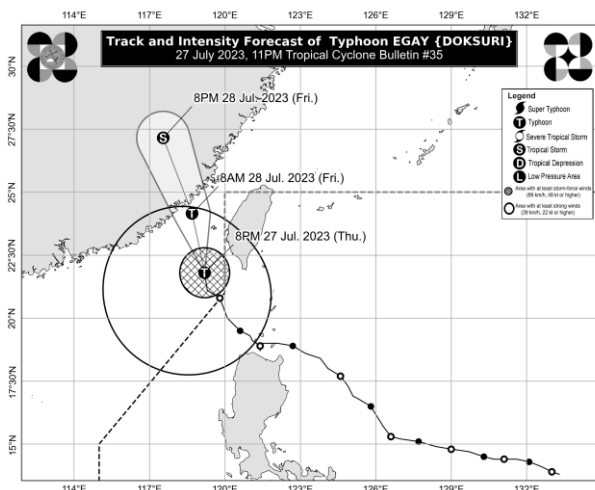
Maximum sustained winds of **150 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **185 km/h**, and central pressure of **955 hPa**

Present Movement

Northward at 15 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to typhoon-force winds extend outwards up to **480 km** from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by EGAY will continue to bring occasional to monsoon rains over the western portion of Luzon in the next three days. For more information, refer to **Weather Advisory #11 for Southwest Monsoon** issued at 11:00 PM today.

Forecast rainfall are generally higher in elevated or mountainous areas. Under these conditions, **flooding and rain-induced landslides are expected** especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days.

Severe Winds

EGAY is no longer bringing severe winds over the country. However, **the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by EGAY** will continue to bring **gusty conditions** over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

- **Tonight and tomorrow:** Luzon and Western Visayas
- **Saturday:** Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Romblon, Antique, and Kalayaan Islands.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Under the influence of EGAY and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon, a **Gale Warning is in effect** over several coastal waters along the seaboard of Luzon and the eastern and western seaboard of Visayas. For more information, refer to **Gale Warning #10** issued at 5:00 PM today.

Rough to very rough seas: Sea travel is risky for small seacrafts. For larger vessels, operating in gale conditions requires experience and properly equipped vessels. Mariners without proper experience or operating ill-equipped vessels are advised to remain in port or seek safe harbor.


TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

EGAY is forecast to track northward or north northwestward over the Taiwan Strait and make landfall over Fujian, China tomorrow morning. Rapid weakening of EGAY will ensue as the typhoon moves inland over China.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

With this development, this is the final bulletin for this tropical cyclone.
