The center of Tropical Depression INENG was estimated based on all available data at 1,240 km East Northeast of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (25.1°N, 133.0°E)

Maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 70 km/h , and central pressure of 1000 hPa

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT

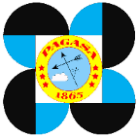

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Tropical Depression INENG is not directly affecting the country, although it and the remnants of HAIKUI are still slightly enhancing the Southwest Monsoon, which will bring occasional rains over the western portions of Northern and Central Luzon in the next three days. For more information, refer to **Weather Advisory #25 for Southwest Monsoon** issued at 11:00 PM yesterday and **24-Hour Public Weather Forecast and Outlook** at 4:00 AM today.

With the remnants of HAIKUI continuously weakening over mainland China and INENG rapidly moving north northeastward away from the country, the Southwest Monsoon is forecast to continue weakening within the week.



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Severe Winds

The **Southwest Monsoon** will continue to bring **gusty conditions** over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

- **Today:** Batanes and Ilocos Provinces

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

INENG is less likely to bring rough sea conditions over any seaboard of the country through the forecast period. However, due to the Southwest Monsoon that it is slightly enhancing, a **Gale Warning is in effect** for the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon. Some disruption in civilian maritime activities is expected over these areas (e.g., suspension of sea travel) due to hazardous sea condition. For more information, refer to **Gale Warning #30** issued at 5:00 AM today.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

INENG is forecast to continue accelerating north northeastward or northeastward towards the sea south of mainland Japan will gradually intensifying.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless re-entry occurs, **this is the final bulletin for this tropical cyclone.** Succeeding updates will be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued twice daily at 4:00 AM and 4:00 PM.
