"JENNY" MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AS IT ACCELERATES WEST SOUTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of Tropical Storm JENNY was estimated based on all available data at 1,025 km East of Central Luzon (15.3°N, 131.2°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 65 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 80 km/h, and central pressure of 1000 hPa

Present Movement

West Southwestward at 35 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to $330\ km$ from the center

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TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT

No Wind Signal hoisted at this time.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Tropical Storm JENNY is not directly affecting the country at this time. However, due to the proximity of the track forecast to Extreme Northern Luzon, **heavy rainfall over Batanes and Babuyan Islands** may be experienced on Tuesday or Wednesday.

The Southwest Monsoon may be enhanced by this tropical cyclone, resulting in possible **occasional rains** over the western portions of Southern Luzon and Visayas tomorrow. As such, the possibility of issuing a Weather Advisory for Southwest Monsoon is not ruled out.

Severe Winds

The current forecast scenario shows that **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals may be hoisted** over Extreme Northern Luzon tomorrow or on Monday in anticipation of the onset of tropical cyclone severe winds. However, the hoisting may happen earlier should there be changes in the forecast scenario.

The potential enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon by JENNY will bring gusty conditions over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

- Tomorrow: Palawan, Romblon, most of Visayas, and Dinagat Islands
- Monday: Most of MIMAROPA and Visayas, and Dinagat Islands

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

On Monday, JENNY may bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 3.5 m) over the coastal waters of Extreme Northern Luzon and northern mainland Cagayan. Mariners of motor bancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- JENNY is forecast to move generally northwestward until Monday. A west northwestward turn towards Luzon Strait-Southern Taiwan area may take place on Tuesday. A landfall or close approach scenario over Extreme Northern Luzon or northeastern mainland Cagayan is not ruled out since these scenarios are within the forecast confidence cone.
- JENNY is forecast to steadily intensify throughout the forecast period and may become a severe tropical storm tomorrow. Furthermore, this tropical cyclone may reach typhoon category on late Monday or on Tuesday.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
