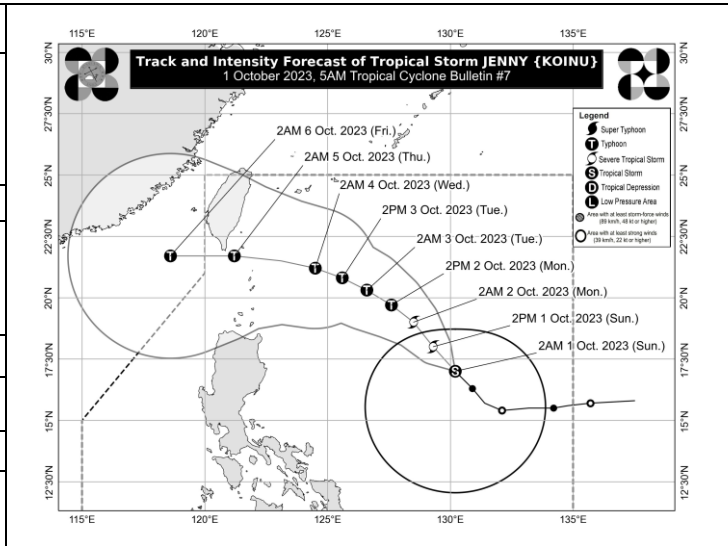
Tropical Storm JENNY (KOINU)

Issued at 5:00 AM, 01 October 2023

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 11:00 AM today.

“JENNY” FURTHER INTENSIFIES OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

Location of Center (4:00 AM)
The center of Tropical Storm JENNY was estimated based on all available data at 835 km East of Central Luzon (17.3°N, 129.9°E)
Intensity
Maximum sustained winds of 85 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 105 km/h , and central pressure of 992 hPa
Present Movement
Northwestward at 20 km/h
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds
Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to 500 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Tropical Storm JENNY is not directly affecting the country at this time. However, due to the proximity of the track forecast to Extreme Northern Luzon, **heavy rainfall may be experienced** over Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and the northern portions of mainland Cagayan, Apayao, and Ilocos Norte on Wednesday or Thursday.

The Southwest Monsoon may be enhanced by this tropical cyclone, resulting in possible **occasional rains** over Palawan and Occidental Mindoro in the next 3 days. For more information, refer to **Weather Advisory No. 1 for Southwest Monsoon** issued at 11:00 PM yesterday and **24-Hour Public Weather Forecast and Outlook** at 4:00 AM today.

Severe Winds

The current forecast scenario shows that **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals may be hoisted** over Extreme Northern Luzon tonight or tomorrow in anticipation of the onset of tropical cyclone severe winds. However, the hoisting may happen earlier should there be changes in the forecast scenario.

The enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon by JENNY will bring **gusty conditions** for the next 3 days over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

- **Today through tomorrow:** Palawan, Romblon, and Western Visayas
- **Tuesday:** Western Visayas, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and most of CALABARZON.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Tomorrow, JENNY will bring moderate to rough seas (2.0 to 4.0 m) over the coastal waters of Extreme Northern Luzon and the northern portion of mainland Cagayan. **Mariners of motor bancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.** Furthermore, there is a high possibility of hoisting a Gale Warning for these coastal waters in the coming days.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- JENNY is forecast to move generally northwestward until tomorrow before turning west northwestward on Tuesday towards the Luzon Strait and generally westward on Wednesday. On the track forecast, JENNY will pass over the Bashi Channel between Batanes and the southern portion of Taiwan between Wednesday evening and Thursday morning. However, a landfall or close approach scenario over Extreme Northern Luzon is still not ruled out since these scenarios are within the forecast confidence cone.
- JENNY is forecast to steadily intensify throughout the forecast period and may become a severe tropical storm today. Furthermore, this tropical cyclone may reach typhoon category tomorrow evening or on Tuesday.


