Location of Center (4:00 PM)

The center of the eye of Typhoon JENNY was estimated based on all available data at 275 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (22.1°N, 119.6°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 170 km/h, and central pressure of 955 hPa

Present Movement

Westward at 15 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to typhoon-force winds extend outwards up to 450 km from the center

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Forecast accumulated rainfall from today to tomorrow afternoon:

• 100-200 mm: Batanes

Forecast rainfall are generally higher in elevated or mountainous areas. Under these conditions, flooding and raininduced landslides are possible especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days.

In addition, JENNY will continue to enhance the Southwest Monsoon and bring light to moderate rains over the western portions of Luzon. For more information, refer to **24-Hour Public Weather Forecast and Outlook** at 4:00 PM today.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 2.
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

The enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon by JENNY will bring **gusty conditions** for the next 3 days over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

Today: The southern portion of Aurora, Romblon, and portions of CALABARZON, Metro Manila, Bataan, and Bicol Region.

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HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

Under the influence of JENNY, a **Gale Warning is in effect** for the coastal waters along the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to **Gale Warning No. 9** issued at 5:00 PM today.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Outside the PAR region, JENNY will continue to move westward (becoming west southwestward to southwestward by Sunday) slowly over the Taiwan Strait and the coastal waters of southeastern China.
- Once over the Taiwan Strait, additional cool dry air from the north will entrain into JENNY, resulting in continued weakening. JENNY may become a tropical depression by late Sunday.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
