**FIRST WARD.**—All within a line drawn as follows, viz. :—From the Moss toll on the Greenock road along the centre of the Greenock road, southward to a point opposite to the centre of the north road of the Race Course leading westwards from the Greenock road, thence along the centre of that road to the centre of the road that intersects the Race Course road, thence southward along the centre of that intersecting road and the road in a line therewith, passing West March to the centre of the Greenhill road, thence westward along that road to a point opposite to the centre of the north end of Well street, thence southward along the centre of that street to a point in the centre of Wellmeadow street, thence westward along the centre of that street to a point opposite the centre of the north end of Castle street, thence southward along the centre of that to the south end thereof, thence southwards along the centre of Ralston square to the north end of the street or avenue leading to Castlehead, thence southward along the centre of that avenue to a point opposite to the north-east corner of the mansion-house of Castlehead, thence to the north-east corner of the said mansion-house, thence in a direct line southward to the point where the Parliamentary line intersects the Espedair Burn near Haircraigs, thence along the Parliamentary boundary westward, northward, and eastward to the point first described.

— **SECOND WARD.**—All within a line drawn from a point in Greenhill road opposite to the centre of the north end of Well street, along the middle of the Greenhill road, Underwood road, and St. James street, to a point opposite the centre of the street called Stoney brae, thence by the centre of Stoney brae till it joins Oakshaw street, thence along the centre of the road leading round the High Church wall to the Churchhill, thence along the centre of Churchhill to New street, thence along the centre of New street to a point opposite the centre of Shuttle street, thence along the centre of that street to George's place, by the west and south of George's Church to a point in George street opposite the north end of Wardrop street, thence along the centre of that street to Canal street, thence along the centre of that street to a point opposite to the centre of the road leading to Canal basin, thence along the centre of that road to the Canal, thence along the centre of the Canal westward to the east boundary of the First Ward, then northward along the said boundary to the point first described.

**THIRD WARD**—All within a line drawn from the point where the Burn called St. Mirren's Burn enters the River Cart, up the centre of the River Cart until it reaches the extremity of the Parliamentary boundary of the Burgh at or near the junction of the Hawkhead Lade with the River Cart, thence along the Parliamentary line until it reaches the intersection of Espedair Burn at or near Haircraigs, thence along the east Boundary of First Ward till it reaches the Canal, thence along the centre of the Canal till it reaches the street leading from Canal street to the Canal basin, thence along that street till it reaches Canal street, thence eastward along Canal street to the bottom of Wardrop street, thence along Wardrop street to a point in George street at the north end of Wardrop street, thence by the south and west sides of George's Church to a point at the north end of the church opposite the south end of Shuttle street, thence along Shuttle street to the centre of New street, thence by the centre of New street till it reaches the centre of Causeyside, and from thence down Causeyside until it reaches the said burn called St. Mirren's Burn, and thence along the burn to the point first described.

**FOURTH WARD**—All within the Parliamentary boundary to the west of the centre of the River Cart, which is not included in any of the preceding Wards.

**FIFTH WARD.**—All within the Parliamentary boundary of the Burgh situated on the east of the centre of the River Cart.

No Inland Letter must exceed 18 inches in length, 9 inches in breadth, and 6 inches in depth. Re-directed letters are liable to new rates of postage, but though the new postage should not be paid on the reposting the letter, it will, on delivery, be charged only the prepaid rate.

Newspapers for Foreign parts and Colonies, if posted later than 8 days after publication, are charged *book postage*.

## PARCELS POST

1. A Parcel, within the prescribed limits of weight and size, can now be sent from any one part of the United Kingdom to any other part of it, whatever be the distance, for a moderate and uniform rate of charge.

2. There are upwards of 15,000 Post Offices at which such Parcels can be posted, so that convenient means of sending are within the reach of all,

3. Parcels will be delivered regularly at every place where there is a delivery of letters, and may therefore now be sent to many places where previously they could only be sent, if at all, irregularly and by uncertain methods.

4. All postage being paid in advance, the sender knows exactly what the service will cost, and also that the receiver of the Parcel will be put to no expense.

*The following are the chief Regulations of the Parcels Post :—*

1. The Rates of Postage are, for a Parcel :—

Not exceeding 1 lb. in weight, . . . . .	3d.	Exceeding 3 lbs. and not exceeding 5 lbs., . . .	9d.
Exceeding 1 lb. and not exceeding 3 lbs., . . .	6d.	— " 5 " " " " " " " " " " " "	7 " ..1s.

*No Parcel can be sent exceeding 7 lbs. in weight.*

2. The dimensions allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel are—Greatest length, 3 ft. 6 in.; greatest length and girth combined, 6 ft. For example—A Parcel measuring 3 ft. 6 in. in length may measure as much as 2 ft. 6 in. in girth. A shorter Parcel may be thicker; thus, if it measure no more than 3 ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3 ft. in girth—*i.e.*, round its thickest part.

3. The most convenient mode of measuring will be by means of a tape 6 feet long, having the length of 3 ft. 6 in. marked thereon. Such a tape might conveniently be marked in one colour up to 3 ft. 6 in., and the remaining part in another colour.

3. The full postage must be *paid in advance*, by means of ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender.

4. Parcels must not be posted in a letter-box, but must be handed over the counter of a Post Office. If a Parcel be posted in a letter-box, it will be treated and charged as a letter (or as a book-packet if entitled to pass at the book-rate of postage).

5. The Postmaster-General is not liable for any loss arising from Parcels being lost or damaged in transmission through the post; but every precaution is taken to prevent loss or damage.

*Prohibited Parcels.*

6. Parcels bearing or containing writing or marks of an offensive or indecent character; or containing gunpowder, cartridges, lucifer matches, or other combustible material, live animals, offensive or filthy matter, or any substance likely to cause injury to other Parcels, or to the Officers of the Post Office, may not be sent through the post.

*Parcels requiring Special Precautions.*

7. Parcels containing ripe fruit or eggs, fish, meat, or other animal matter; or knives and other sharp instruments; can only be sent if so packed as to prevent all risk of injury to other Parcels. Liquids must be sent in bottles, cases, or cans securely stoppered, and so packed as to be secure from breakage.

*N.B.*—The public will greatly assist the work of the Post Office, and help towards the safe delivery of Parcels, by taking care that they are in all cases strongly and securely packed, especially those with fragile or perishable contents.

*Collection of Parcels in Rural Districts.*

Rural Postmen, whether on foot or mounted, are required to accept Parcels from the public for despatch wherever they now collect letters. The Postman on foot must not accept from any one person a greater weight of Parcels than 7 lbs. in the aggregate, unless he shall have received notice, on the previous day, from such person of his intention to send a greater weight. A mounted Rural Postman is not required to accept a greater weight in the aggregate than 21 lbs. from any one person, unless similar notice shall have been given to him.

## BOOK POSTAGE.

Printed Books, Pamphlets, Magazines, Reviews, &c., whether British, Foreign, or Colonial, may be forwarded by post between places in the United Kingdom (made up in the same manner as newspapers), if prepaid in stamps, at the following rates:—

Under 2 oz.,  $\frac{3}{4}$ d.; under 4 oz., 1d.; under 8 oz., 2d.; and  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. for every additional 2 oz. No parcel to exceed 18 inches any way, but may contain any number of separate Books, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment, and may be either printed, written, or plain.

Books, if prepaid in stamps, are also forwarded by packet, if unwritten on inside or in the cover, at the rate of  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. for every 2 oz., to Canada, United States of America, and the Continent.

## REGISTRATION.

The British Registration Fee on every letter posted for delivery in the United Kingdom, or addressed to any British Colony or Foreign Country, is now 2d.

The same reduction has taken place in the fee chargeable on any newspaper or book packet, addressed to a British Colony or to the Kingdom of Italy, which the sender may desire to register.
