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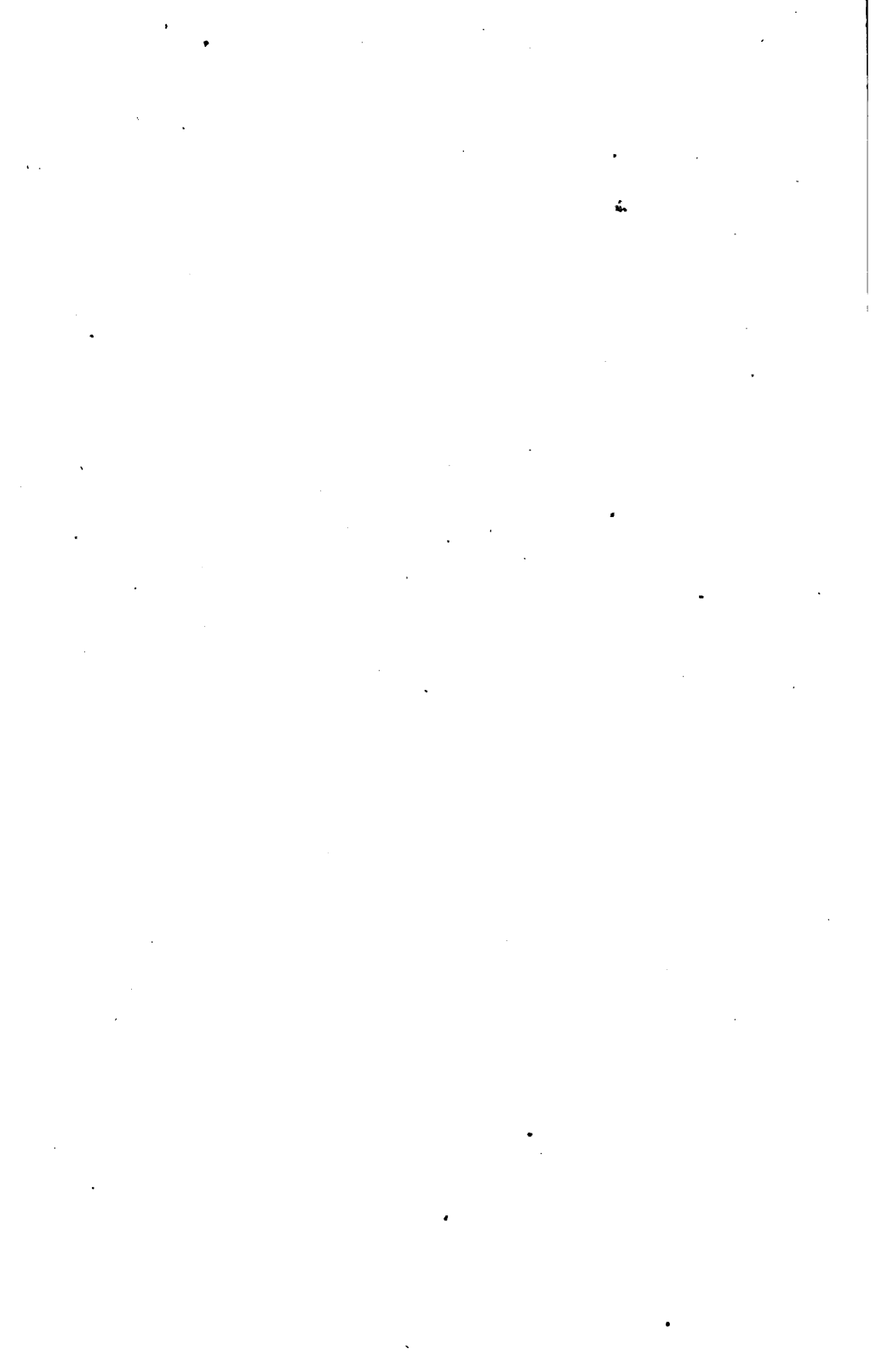


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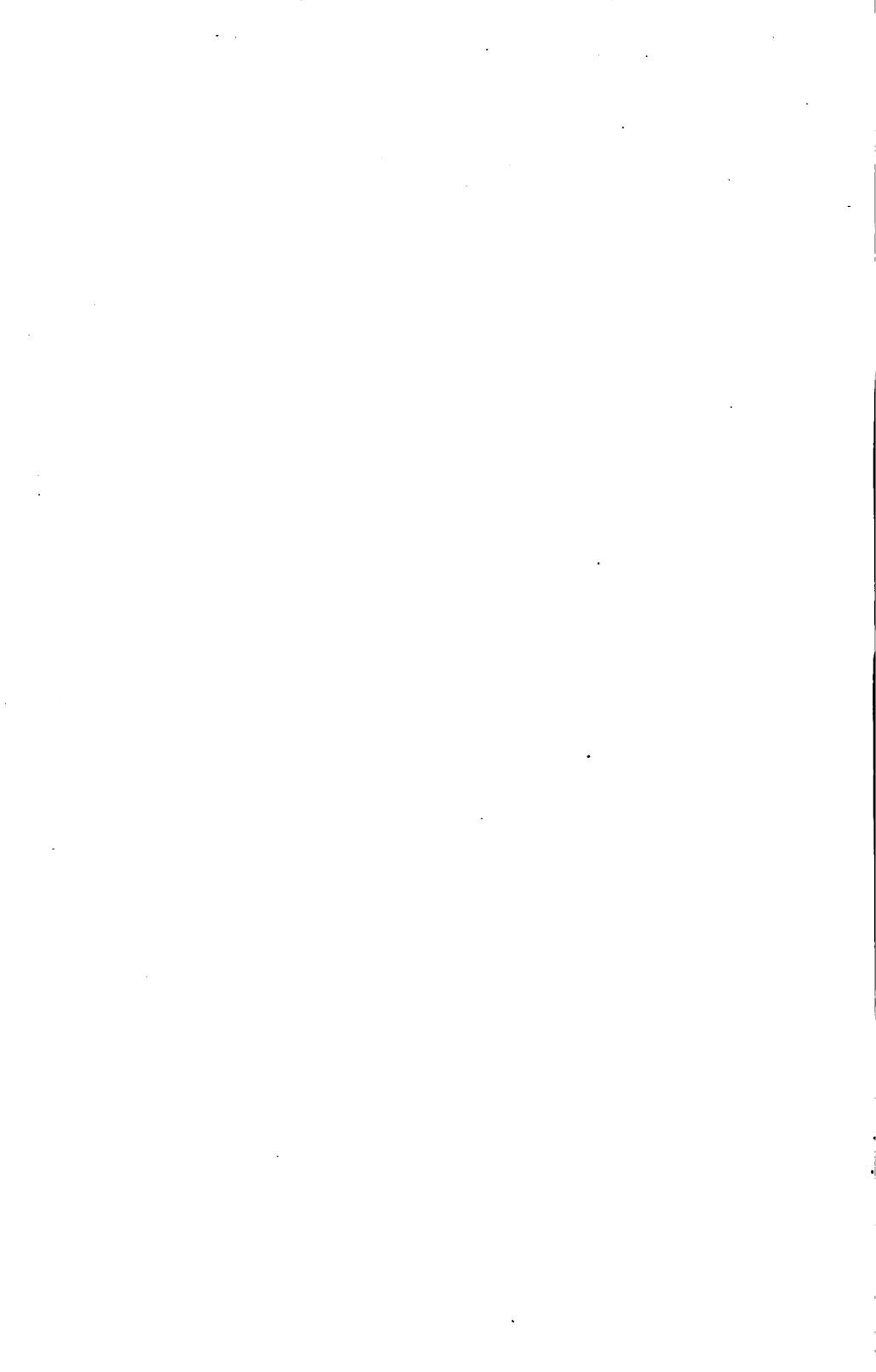

P R E F A C E .

THIS register is a small octavo volume, measuring seven inches and a half by four inches and three-quarters. It consists of three gatherings of parchment, roughly fastened by ties of the same material into a parchment cover, and this now very ragged envelope bears traces of the words "Byrcham New . . . regester book."

The first page has suffered from rubbing, from damp, and from pitiless scribbling; and thus the entries on it, between 1569 and 1579, have become almost obliterated. These, however, have been first deciphered independently, and then compared with the names of the same persons appearing elsewhere as the parents of children baptised or buried. As the readings in every case obtained confirmation from the comparison, they may perhaps be taken as free from doubt.

Notes are appended, showing where four or five of the oldest hands quit the record. No names are affixed in these notes; but it is admissible to go further in the preface, and to say that the first, which writes all from 1562 to 1599 inclusive, with exquisite neatness and in yellow-brown ink, cannot be that of John Balkey, who became Rector in 1561, on the gift of Robert, Lord Dudley, for he was buried in August, 1573. The brief tenure of the living in 1573, by Christopher Watson, not being evidenced on this record, the second writer is the Rev. Adam Rowstone, or Rawstone, who signs the register in 1603, but ceases to record in 1609, though his death, as the book itself shows, did not take place till 1621. His writing is bold and diffuse.

The third hand, presumably that of some *locum tenens*, enters four baptisms in 1609.

A fourth writer, who signs himself Adam Rawstone (see p. 27), probably the son of the first rector of that name, appears in 1610 and finishes in 1619. There is a slight change in his hand after 1616; but it is everywhere neat, compact, and upright, differing very widely from the hand of the previous Adam Rowstone.

Then, either among the baptisms or the burials, the fifth (1621 and 1622), sixth (1623 and 1624), seventh, and eighth hands are seen. Three of these must be traces of Giles King, John Stuer, and perhaps John Steares. No. 7 records two burials in 1625 and 1626,—carelessly enough on p. 27 among the baptisms,—while No. 8 copies them into their proper places on p. 41.¹

Next, beginning with marriages in 1620, and baptisms and burials in 1627,—and thus making entries which perhaps 5 and 6 ought to have made,—we have the small, neat hand of “Tho: Carter, Rector *ibidem*.” This faithful gentleman evidently found our register disused when he took over the parish in 1679: mayhap because it had been mislaid, and a second register had been started in lieu of it. He decided, however, to continue the old record, and transcribed, as we may think, from the later volume all the marriage, baptismal, and burial entries from 1620 down to his own time. His source of information can only be conjectured as above; but that he was copying is obvious, not only from dates, but from the transition which occurs, about 1679, from the neat hand of one who

transcribes at one sitting, to the less regular writing of one who enters on separate occasions, and is subject to the changes and chances of pen and ink.

Mr. Carter's hand ages with his record, and ceases in 1717. Two marriages in 1718 are no doubt entered by the old rector's curate; but with 1719 the rule of Samuel Bagge supervened. The poor man, however, seems to have lost his reason, and such trifles as the life records of his parishioners, involving, perchance, nothing more important than their property and reputations, were left by his substitutes to a parish clerk.

We learn, thus, that "Sarey the dater of Robt and Franes Crow" was "babtis" in "Fabery 1723." Thus, also, it is that three sadly blundered entries of christenings in 1722, 1723, and 1724, respectively, have been blotted out after being viciously re-copied. They now appear as having all taken place in 1722—a pleasant record, possibly, in future years for the child of a then newly married couple.

Page 46, as far as 1732, and the whole of p. 47, are written carefully, but cruel slovening elsewhere prevails; and p. 45, which, with pp. 6, 7, and 8,

contains the latest entries (of baptisms and burials mixed) is a disgrace to the Church of England of the eighteenth century.

The *obiter dicta* of scrawlers are, of course, plentiful; and on p. 48 of the Register, which is otherwise blank, is a seventeenth-century poem signed by a parishioner :—

Thou that through fortune art extold so hie,
 And thou which eatest the fat of the greate mother,
 Death with his dart subduse the[e] at y^e last
 And takes the[e] cleane from all terrestriall pleasur.

The[e] thinkest riches heaven for to obtaine

Now in this world you all ways to remaine.

This literary genius flourished *circa* 1652. He has had so long to wait for public recognition that he ought to be spared all criticism.

Those who search this register should bear in mind the careless mixing of entries of different classes which disgraces the later portion. They had better either read the index or search the record page by page, and then check results by the index. Care has been taken to make the latter complete; but variations of spelling render it unsafe to trust to mere alphabetical order. Real workers learn late

in life that indexes should always be *read through*. The body of a book may often be skimmed with safety if the index be really perused.

The truth must be stated that Bircham Newton is not a famous or historical place. Indeed, it is said that in 1511 it had only *one* inhabitant. Careful search has elicited very little more about it than Blomefield has already given; but we can give a few additional references to early records, and we can certainly annex a better list of rectors.

Newton appears in Domesday Book as Niwetuna, which Blomefield ventures to say means a town near to some river or water, and Bircham was added to distinguish the place from Newton Flotman and others of the name.

Tove, a freeman, was lord of it before the Conquest, and was forced, ultimately, to give place to Ralph de Bellofago; but, at a time before the latter had it, the eleven freemen on the land held under Eudo [de Rie]. Stigand had the soc, which, before the Conquest, was valued at 60s. per annum, but at 100s. at the Domesday survey. The parish, Blomefield adds, was half a leuca in length and breadth, and paid 20*l.* to a 20s. gelt. In Tove's

time there were four villeins, three bordarii, and three servi, as well as the eleven freemen.

There was a church endowed with twenty acres of land, which were valued at 16*d.* per annum.

Ralph de Bellofago's heiress, Agnes, married Hubert de Rie, Castellan of Norwich Castle; but his descendant—grandson, Blomefield thinks—Hubert de Rie, Baron of Rie, dying without male issue in the 8th year of Henry II., left two daughters as co-heiresses. He had previously given the town to William de Kerdeston, to be held of his barony of Rie; and from the *Feet of Fines, Norfolk*, John, No. 38, and from the *Charter Roll*, 1st John, 2nd part, m. 28, it appears that in the year 1200, Alina [de Rye], wife of John le Mareshall, and Isabel [de Rye], wife of Geoffrey de Chester, levied a fine of land in Newton. It was thus confirmed to Roger de Kerdeston, to be held by half a knight's fee, and Fulk de Kerdeston appears, on the occasion of the aid for the marriage of Henry III.'s sister to the Emperor, as holding the fourth part of a knight's fee.

It remained in the De Kerdeston family until in the 24th Henry VI. it was settled by Sir Thomas Kerdeston and Philippa his wife on themselves in

tail, with remainder to William de la Pole, Earl of Suffolk.

This, Blomefield no doubt learned from the Feet of Fines, 24th Henry VI., No. 210 :—

William, Earl of Suffolk and Alicia his wife *v.* Thomas Kerdeston, Knt., and Philippa his wife: of manors of Sydesterne and Newton-juxta-Bircham.

In 12 Henry VII. the Earl of Suffolk granted Newton to the Robsart family, and the place becomes in a way linked with the Cumnor tragedy.

On the death of Robert, Earl of Leicester, it descended to the Walpole family, by the marriage of Edward Walpole of Houghton with Lucy, daughter of Sir Terry Robsart, and in Blomefield's time it was still held by the Earl of Orford.

In Edward I.'s reign, the rector had 50 acres of land with a house, and the early eighteenth century Terrier subjoined (see p. 33) shows practically the same glebe lands.

From Bishop Tanner's notes preserved at Norwich, we learn the following :—

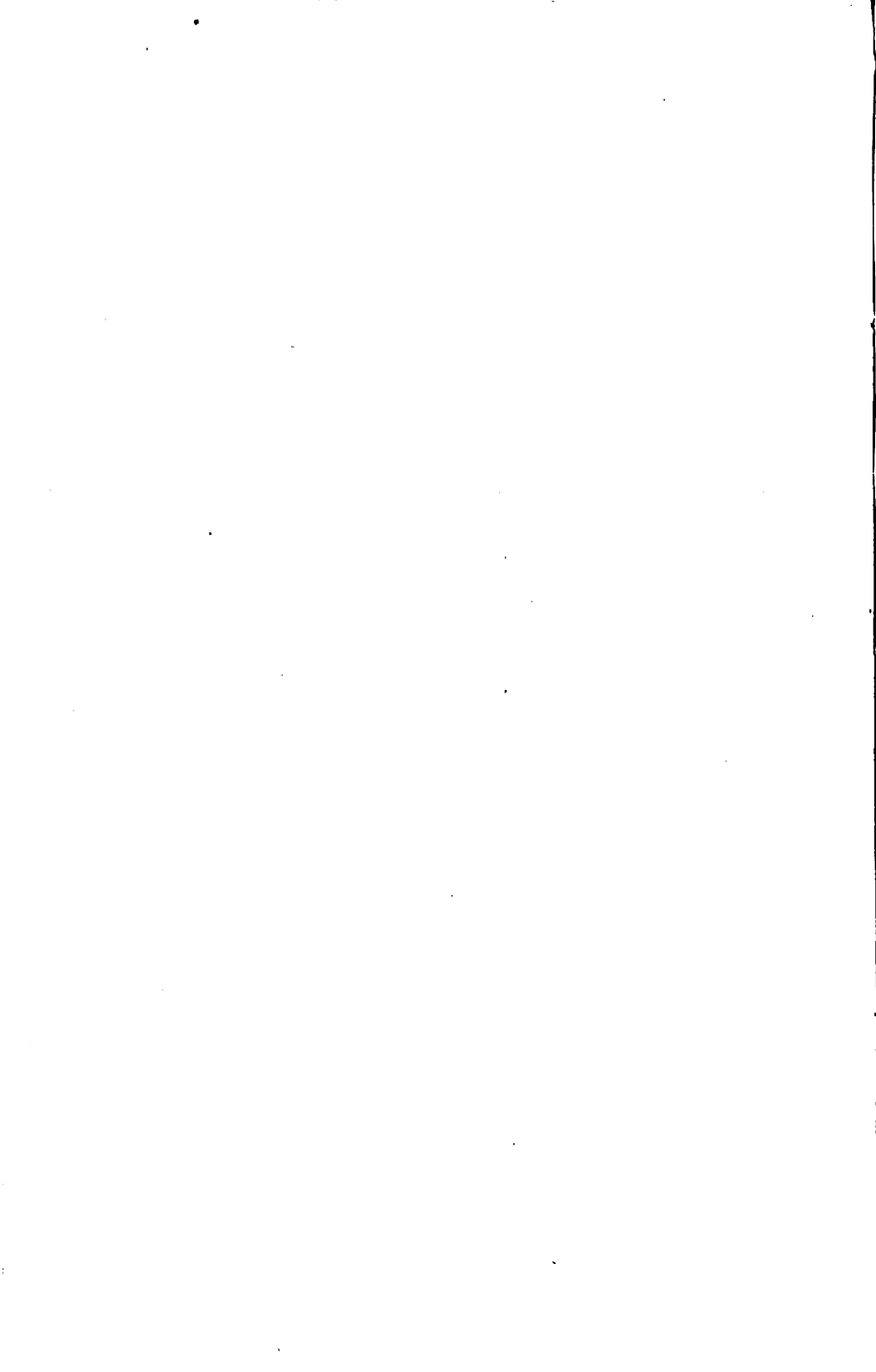
The register now printed came into the hands of the late Sir Thomas Beevor, Bart., as executor of
