INTRODUCTION

It was not the original intention to compile this genealogy, but so much of the early history was obtained for the inscription on the Tifft monument erected in May, 1895, in Nassau, N. Y., that it was determined to arrange in as compact a form as possible, all the facts learned about the various descendants, in order to preserve the same for future reference.

The record, though incomplete, represents a great deal of labor and study, and is the result of extended examinations of town histories, various family records and genealogies, and also extensive correspondence with the numerous descendants of John Tifft.

An effort has been made to ascertain when the Tiffts came from England and from what part, but so far without success. Two brothers are found in this country; William, in Boston, in 1638, who died leaving only one daughter, and John, of Portsmouth, R. I., in 1655, who is the ancestor of the Rhode Island Tiffts.

The name "Tefft" or "Teft" is Saxon, and means "a piece of ground where there has been a house." (Etymological Dictionary of family and Christian names by William Arthur, A. M.)

The name at different times in Colonial Records is variously spelled,— Teffe, Teft, Tefft, Tift, Tift and Tifft, all pertaining to the same general family.

The following is an abstract from a letter written by Rev. Benjamin F. Tefft, D. D., LL. D., to Parker W. Tefft of Chicago.

"While in London on a mission for the United States Government, I employed some one to hunt up the family name in England. The result was the following: The family originally belonged to the French Huguenots, when the spelling of the name was "Thevet," and pronounced as if spelled "Tevay." The family with many others were driven out of France



by the St. Bartholomew massacre, and came to England. The Teffts of this country undoubtedly came from England. Now, when you take the name Thevet with its French pronunciation, and put it beside the name of William Teffe, how natural the transition and then how easy to change the final e to t, and produce a name of one syllable and easily pronounced Tifft."

The above mentioned Benjamin F. Tefft was born in Floyd, N. Y., August 20, 1813, and died a few years ago in Bangor, Maine. He was a prominent Methodist Episcopal clergyman, author and teacher. In 1843 he was Professor of Greek and Hebrew Languages in the Indiana Asbury University; in 1846, he was editor of the *Ladies' Repository*, and of the publications of the Western Book Concern. In 1859 he re-entered the itinerant work of the church, and received appointments in Maine. In 1861 he was appointed Chaplain to the First Regiment of Maine Cavalry, Army of the Potomac. In 1862, Consul of the United States to Stockholm, and acting Minister to Sweden. In 1864, Commissioner of Immigration from the north of Europe to the State of Maine. In 1874, representative from Penobscot County to the State Legislature. Dr. Tefft was a member of the Geographical and Statistical Society of New York, and of the Society of Arts of England.

The system of numbering is as follows:

Beginning with John, the names are all numbered consecutively; his oldest child being number 2, and so on. This consecutive numbering precedes the name, and the Roman characters denote the order of births in each family. The small figure following the name denotes the generation.

For example—taking 186 (II) John⁶ (who is the descendant that came to Nassau, N. Y., in 1793); going back until we come to this number 186 (II)⁶ in the consecutive numbering, we find him to be the second child of 105 (V)⁵, Robert; following backward still further, we find 105 (V)⁵ to be the fifth child of 60 (I) John Jr.⁴; who is found to be the first child of 32 (I) John³, and he in turn is found to be the first child of 2 (II)² Samuel; who is the second child of John¹, the original settler in Rhode Island.

• RECORD OF THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN TEFFT, of Portsmouth, R. I.

William Teffe, Boston.

It appears by the Town Records, that William Teffe, tailor, "was admitted to inhabit 24, December, 1638," and to buy the house of Jacob Wilson Sawyer, which was sold him the same day.

William Teffe and wife joined the church August 2, 1640.

Perhaps William Teffe's daughter, Lydia, married John Dibble or Deeble of Boston, and had a son Abraham.

Will of William Teffe, of Boston, 1646.

"The first day of the third Month, one thousand six hundred and forty-six, I William Teffe of Boston, in the Massachusetts Bay, doe make this my last Will and Testament. First, I give vnto my daughter Lydia, the summe of twenty pounds, partly, for the discharge of seaven pounds which I received for her in England being a Lagacie given unto her by one Robert Elvinge, deceased, and partly as a Legacie from (myselfe,) so as shee never make other demands of the said Legacie given by said Robert Elvinge, and so she doe not marry without her motherin-lawe's Consent, or the consent of such friends as her said Mother shall leave her vnto. To be payed in fours of the youngest Cattle, at due prices except the least of all, and in such of the household goods and mon(ies) as indifferently shall reach to the making up thereof according to the proportion of it, (excepting the feather-bed whereon I now lye and vppon the praisement of the goods within two months after my decease, her said portion to be putt forth for her best advantage vntil her age of twenty years or day of marryage with consent as aforesaid, (if shee shall live therevnto, even either of them.)

Itm. I give my least Steere Calfe vnto the Eldest child of my brother John Teffe, to be delivered vppon demand, after my decease, if it be then living, paying for the charge of the keeping of it after my decease vntil it be demanded. All the rest of my goods and chattells, whatvoever, together with my dwelling house and garden and grounds vnder and about it, and all the buildings therevppon, and fences about them, and also together with my land at Long Island, and the barne and fruites growing vppon the said ground both vnder my house and at Long Island, I give and bequeath vnto my beloved wife Anne Teffe, whom I make sole Executrix of this my last will, to her and to her heires and Assignes, forever, and in testimonial thereof I have herevnto sett and putt my hand." WILLIAM TEFFE.

In presence of Tho. Leverett, John Harrison, John Ingolsby. Testified before the Governour (Mr. No)well, and Mr. Hibbins, by Mr. Tho. Leverett and John Harrison. 2 (9) 1648. Copiavera.

Mass. Archives. Vol. 15 B. p. 69. (This will is recorded at Suffolk Probate office, Lib.VII, fol. 266.) That record contains also the deposition of John Harrison on June 19, 1661, and of John Ingolsby, November 23, 1672, each in regard to an interlineation made in the latter part of the above will.

The said will was Entered and Recorded November 23,1672. twenty-four years after the instrument was proved.

Record of descendants of John Tefft, of Portsmouth, R. I.

John Tofft,¹ brother of William Tefft of Boston, Mass., married Mary —, and lived in Portsmouth, Kingstown, R. I. John Tefft died in 1676. Mary Tefft died in 1679.

Facts concerning (I) John¹ Tefft.

The first account of him is a freeman in 1655. The freeman (in Anglo-Saxon times) was strictly the freeholder and as a free member of the community to which he belonged, became inseparable from the possession of his "holding" in it. It was this sharing in common land which marked off the freeman from the unfree man, the tiller of land which another owned.

Rhode Island required a freehold estate of \$134, for suffrage, and permitted the eldest son of said estate to vote.

1662, Nov. 22. He and wife Mary sold seven acres to Robert Shink of Newport.

1671, May. Kingstown. His name was recorded as an inhabitant of Pettaquamscott.

1674, Nov. 30. Will—Ex. son-in-law Samuel Wilson. To Samuel Wilson, my now dwelling house and 20 acres in Pettaquamscott. To wife Mary, all cattle, viz: two oxen, two cows, two yearling steers, eight swine kind, a ewe and a lamb, and all other movables. To son Samuel Tifft, 28. To son Joshua, 18, To daughter Tabitha Tefft, 18. and an iron pot after wife's decease. Debts to the sum of \mathcal{L} 1, 38. to be paid equally by son-in-law Samuel Wilson and son Joshua Tift.

1676, Jan. 26. The death of John¹ is alluded to in a letter from Captain James Oliver, (written at the house of Richard Smith in Narragansett). He first mentions that Joshua Tefft son of John¹ had married a Wampanoag. That he shot twenty times at the English in the Narragansett fight; was captured and executed at Providence, and then declared that he was a "sad wretch, who had never heard a sermon but once these fourteen years," and that "his father going to recall him, lost his head and lies unburied. (See 4 (III) Joshua,² son of John.¹

1679, Nov. 19. His widow signed in satisfaction of her thirds, her signature being witnessed by Tabitha Gardner.

Facts concerning Samuel Wilson.

June 21, 1670. Samuel Wilson had a letter sent him by the Commissioners of Connecticut, sitting at Wickfield, requesting the delivery of two of their men, detained of Thomas Mumford, they being messengers of Connecticut inoffensively riding on the King's highway. He complied and released the men.

June 30, 1684. An agreement was made by the orphans of Samuel Wilson with consent of Jireh Bull, executor. The eldest brother, Samuel Wilson, was to have three lots adjoining the housing, with said housing, &c., part had of his father-in-law Tefft. The rest of the land was to go equally to the children including Samuel, and so all of them a share. The agreement was signed by Samuel Wilson, Robert Robert and Mary Hannah.

Facts concerning Samuel Tefft.

1677. Freeman.

1679, May 12. He was fined 20s. for not attending jury. 1679, July 1. Taxes, 35., 1½d.

1680, March 12. His fine of 20s. for not attending jury of General Court of Trials was remitted by the Assembly, he having had no warning by the General Sergeant.

1687, September 6. Kings Town. Taxed 9s., 4¹/₂d.

1709, June 28. He and twenty-six others bought the tract called Swamptown, being part of the vacant lands in Narragansett, ordered sold by the Assembly.

1721, October 29. His wife Elizabeth, in testifying as to what age James Wilson would have been had he lived, calls her own age seventy years, but other evidence makes her not quite so old.

1725, March 16. Will-proved, 1725, December 20. Ex. wife Elizabeth. To son John, 100 acres in South Kingstown. To son Samuel, south half of homestead. To sons John and Samuel, 135 acres in Westerly. To son Joseph, land in Shannock Purchase, Westerly. To wife Elizabeth, dwelling house, barn, orchards, etc., and north half of homestead for life, and then to sons John and Samuel equally, and these two sons, to be at equal charge in maintaining daughter Tabitha Tift, supporting her for life. To daughters Elizabeth Carpenter, Esther Mumford and Mary Newton, each £,20, paid by son John. To daughters Mercy Tift and Susanna Crandall, £20 each. To children of Sarah Witter, deceased, f_{20} . To daughter Mercy Teft a further sum of \pounds_{30} . To granddaughter Sarah Witter, f.10 at eighteen. To grandson Daniel Tift, son of Peter,



deceased, \pounds_{20} if he lives in my family till age. To wife Elizabeth, all movables not given away, at her disposal to children.

Facts concerning Joshua Tefft.

1676, January 14. He was brought in captive to Providence as related in a letter of same date written by Roger Williams to Governor Leveret of Massachusetts: "This night I was requested by Captain Fenner and other officers of our town, to take the examination and confession of an Englishman who hath been with the Indians before and since the fight. His name is Joshua Tift, and he was taken by Captain Fenner this day at an Indian house, half a mile from where Captain Fenner's house (now burned) did stand." He was asked how long he had been with the Narragansetts, and answered twenty-seven days, more or less. In answer to the question how he came amongst them, he said he was at his farm a mile and a half from Puttuck-



quamscot where he hired an Indian to keep his cattle, himself proposing to go to Rhode Island, but the day he prepared to go a party of Indians came and told him he must die. He begged for his life and promised he would be servant to the Sachem for life, and his life was given him as such slave. He was carried to the fort where were eight hundred fighting men. His eight cattle were killed. He said he was in the fort and waited on his master, the Sachem, till he was wounded, of which wound the Sachem died nine days afterward.

1676, January 18. He was executed, his answers obviously, not being satisfactory to the examiners, but it may still be doubted whether much that is related of him by the old chroniclers is more than fable. It was asserted by these that he was of Providence, which was not the fact, though he was captured there, and that he turned Indian and married a squaw, renounced his religion and nation, and fought against the whites. Probably the closing sentence of one of those narrators was considered excellent religion by some of the readers. "As to his religion, he was found as ignorant as a heathen, which no doubt caused the fewer tears to be shed at his funeral."

To son John, 120 acres "near about north from place where the old house stood and did belong to my honored father, Samuel Teft, deceased," having already given to John a tract in Richmond and house on said land. 

Facts concerning Thomas Mumford.

Thomas Mumford's first wife, Abigail, was murdered about two weeks previous to May 28, 1707, by a negro slave belonging to him, and the body of the negro having since been found upon the shore of Little Compton, (he having drowned himself as was believed to prevent being taken alive) it was ordered by the Assembly that his head, legs and arms be cut from the body and hung up in some public place near Newport, R. I., and his body to be burned to ashes, that it may be "something of a terror to others from perpetrating of the like barbarity for the future."





Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved Son Robert Tefft to him his heirs and afsigns forever a certain tract of Land that he Now lives on. Lying and being in the Town of Exeter in ye County and Colony aforefaid all the Lands belonging to me on the South Side of ye dividing line that now is between him and my aforefaid Son Jonathan Tefft.

And alfo my Will is that all my Lands Lying in South Kingftown which was given to me by my Honored Father John Tefft in his Laft Will and Teftament to be fold by my Executors and the one half of the money that the faid Lands is Sold for to be Equally divided between my Three Sons, vz. 

In August, 1882, and July, 1891, W. S. Tifft of Buffalo, N.Y., visited the old Tifft homestead in Exeter, R. I. He went by way of Wickford, which used to be called Updike New Town, and passed the ten-rod road his father used to talk so much about. It is mostly walled on either side. The country is rough and grown up to second and third growth timber. The farm is stony and unproductive, and is occupied by a Baptist minister 75 years old, who rides four miles on horseback each Sunday, and preaches at two appointments; receiving \$2 for his day's services. He had a housekeeper by the name of Tifft. The farm has never been sold for more than John Tifft received for it in 1793.


The family cemetery was found on the farm, but most of the names were defaced by time, there being only a few marble stones. But the names of Jonathan and Sprague Tefft could be read.

The Removal of 186 (II) John Tifft[®] from Exeter, R. I., to Rensselaer Co., N. Y.

Note:--This branch of the family always spelled their name Tifft, after their removal from Rhode Island.

John Tifft, visited Rensselaer County, N.Y., in 1792, purchased a farm, in the town of Nassau, and contracted for the building of a barn thereon. In February, 1793, the family, consisting of John, his wife Anna, and eight children—the oldest fifteen years of age, and the youngest a babe—started for their new home, a distance of 150 miles. The father drove a team of horses, conveying in a large canvas covered sled, his wife and the five youngest children; the household goods were packed in a sled and drawn by two yoke of oxen, and driven by the eldest son, a lad of fifteen : the stock of cows, sheep and swine were driven by the second and third son.

Their route lay through woods much of the way; at one time they were guided by marked trees in a piece of timber called



Beckett's woods. The journey was made in twenty-two days and was accompanied by many inconveniences and discomforts; for, storms overtook them-in one instance a fall of rain and snow, freezing, obliged them to get the oxen and cows shod before they could proceed on their way. If Anna Vallett Tifft, the wife and mother, shrank from these hardships, John, her husband, came to the rescue and inspired her with a portion of his resolute determination: and she, in turn, as the days came and went, reassured her children that they should reach their destination, and there possess-in time-a home with pleasanter surroundings than the old one. We are sure that, in all ways, during that trying time, she strove to exercise that fortitude which became the wife of a pioneer. The older boys, while driving the cows, young cattle and sheep, made the march more a pastime than a hardship. They crossed the Connecticut River, moving northwest, till they reached Pittsfield, near the line between Massachusetts and New York. While crossing the bank of the Connecticut, one of the sleds tipped over. The older boys, Robert, Jeremiah and Simon, had been intrusted with the secret of the place where the money (silver) was stored in a basket and packed in a certain barrel. Anxious for their treasure, they soon assured themselves of its safety, and carefully returned it to its former place. We can imagine the momentary annovance caused by this mishap; and also the hearty good will exercised in restoring all to rights; and how they again journeyed onward with renewed good cheer and courage. When finally settled in their new home, that eventful journey doubtless furnished the subject of many interesting talks with their neighbors. Even the grandchildren remember the story, heard from their parents, also enjoying its rehearsal.

Upon his return he engaged in business with the Tildens of New Lebanon, N.Y., and soon after settled on a farm near Genoa, Cayuga Co., N. Y., where he lived until his death. As a result of strict attention to farming, united with skillful management, he was abundantly prospered. A few years before his death he built large barns and other outbuildings, with a modern house, furnished with all the improvements found in the dwellings of those living in large towns and cities. The buildings as a whole, are said to be the finest and most convenient in Cayuga County. He was generously helpful in church enterprises, and ready to assist the unfortunate at all

times. He possessed a large share of that indomitable will, so characteristic of the Tiffts, bringing it to bear in all his undertakings. It was said—" In his demise the town loses a good citizen, an accommodating neighbor and friend, and the family a devoted husband and father." He died Nov. 24, 1894, in Genoa, N. Y.

Joseph N. Tifft, in his early manhood, exhibited a taste for the legal profession, and read law for a brief period. Abandoning the idea, however, he taught school for a time, and finally went to Buffalo, where he engaged in the iron foundry with the firm of George W. Tifft, Sons & Company, of which he was an active member at the time of his death. He was a man of unusual business capacity, and was universally esteemed for his integrity of character. Possessing a large and liberal nature, he was frank and generous in his dealings. He read much and thoughtfully, few men being better informed on the leading topics of science, literature, invention and art. He was a



Trustee in the Central Presbyterian Church, and a liberal contributor to every Christian and philanthropic enterprise.

He died April 22, 1873, in Buffalo, N. Y., and was buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery in that city.

Mrs. Lily Lord Tifft is the daughter of Harriet Mills and the Rev. Claudius Buchanan Lord, of Marysville, Tennessee. She comes of a long line of clergymen on both sides; and in giving her life to philanthropy and the higher education of women, she maintains the traditions of her family. She is a member of the Board of Directors, and has been since 1881 Secretary of the Buffalo Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals; besides being, for many years, one of the Executive Committee of the American Humane Association, in which capacity she has rendered efficient aid. Mrs. Tifft has also served as a member of the Board of Managers of the Buffalo Orphan Asylum, and acted as Secretary, holding the office for some years. She responded to the call for the organization of the Women's Educational and Industrial Union, becoming a charter member. and is still serving on the Board of Directors, as well as working on the Committee for Protective work. She is also a charter member of the Board of Managers of the Newsboy's and Bootblack's Home, and is interested in the Children's Aid Society. In 1892 Mrs. Tifft was appointed by the Mayor of Buffalo, N.Y. (the first woman to hold the place) on the Board of School Examiners, and was re-appointed for five years, in February, She was also appointed by Governor Flower in 1894, 1805. the only woman on the Board of Managers of the Thomas Indian Orphan Asylum, situated on the Cattaraugus Reservation, N. Y., the only Red Indian Orphan Asylum in the world, and re-appointed for five years in 1895, by Governor Morton. She is Secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Women, and a vice-President of the Educational Congress held in Chicago in 1893. In November, 1895, Mrs. Tifft was elected Secretary of the N. Y. State Federation of Women's Clubs and Societies. She is also President of the Civic Club of Buffalo,



N. Y., organized in February, 1895, and is a woman of rare culture, ripe experience and good executive ability. Residence, Buffalo, N. Y.

Emily S. Waterbury died July 16, 1888, in Petersburg, N. Y.

Rev. Adoniram Waterbury was converted, and became a member of the East Nassau Baptist Church in 1849. He was licensed to preach by the Second Baptist Church of North Nassau, in 1853. A part of 1854-55 was spent in Michigan doing pioneer work. Returning to his native state, he was ordained by the Petersburg, N. Y. Church in October, 1859, in the service of which church he labored thirteen years and six He was then called to the pastorate of the Baptist months. Church in Lebanon Springs, N.Y., where he labored four years. He afterward served the Greenbush, N. Y. church nearly six years and six months, the Rensselaerville, N. Y. church seven and one-half years, and the Franklin, N. Y. church two years. The next two years was spent in Colorado, where he assisted pastors in extra service, and is now (August, 1895) serving his third year with the church in Tawas City, Mich. He has endeared himself to many who were his co-workers in the churches, and the memory of that work is still cherished;



their hearts growing tender as they recall his faithful, forcible manner of presenting the Word of Life to his listeners.

Simon Tifft and Ann Webster (who was born June 3,1788),were married at the Webster Homestead in Stephentown, N. Y., Esq. Thomas of Stephentown, performing the ceremony. It is remembered that he said: "They are the handsomest couple I ever married." Diligent search has been made to find the record of the marriage, but without success.

Simon Tifft was Captain of a Company in Lieut.-Col. C. Carr's Regiment, N.Y. Militia, War of 1812, from Sept. 8 to 20, 1814. The regiment started for Sackett's Harbor, N.Y.; reached Whitehall when peace was declared, and they returned home. He was also Captain of the Militia of Stephentown and Nassau, N. Y. for a number of years.

Ann Webster Tifft died Sept. 14, 1859. Simon Tifft died March 3, 1873.

Outline of Ann Webster's descent.

Ann Webster was a lineal descendant of Governor John Webster, ¹ who came from Warwickshire, Eng., about 1630-33, and settled at Newton, (now Cambridge) Mass. He removed with Rev. Thomas Hooker's party or soon after, across country to Hartford, Conn., and became one of the original settlers of that city, and one of the founders of the Republic of Connecticut. He was Magistrate (or Judge) from 1639 to 1655, when he became Deputy Governor, and in 1656 Governor of the State (or Colony) of Connecticut. He removed from Hartford, Conn., to Hadley, Mass., in 1659; bought a large tract of land on the Connecticut River, and was again made Magistrate (or Judge) in 1660. Gov. John Webster died April 5, 1661, at Hadley, Mass., where he was buried. His grave was not marked until his descendant, Noah Webster, of Dictionary fame, had a tombstone erected over it. His wife's first name was Agnes.



Nothing more is known of her, and it is not known whether he married her in England or in this country. Agnes died in 1667.

One of his four sons was Thomas.² It is not known when he was born, or whether he was born in this country. He married at Northampton, Mass., June 16, 1663, Abigail Alexander of Northampton. Thomas and one other son went to Hadley with Governor John, the other son remained in Connecticut.

Thomas Webster died at Northfield, Mass., in 1686, and his wife died there before 1690.

One of the two sons of Thomas Webster² was George,³ who was born at Northampton, Nov. 7, 1670, and was married there in 1696 to Sarah Bliss of Springfield, Mass. He was one of the original settlers and founders of the town of Lebanon, Conn. Land was "set off" to him in that town in 1699. He died there April 12, 1721, and his wife died in 1759 or 1760.

One of the sons of George Webster³ was Pelatiah,⁴ who was born at Lebanon, Nov. 17, 1702, and who married at Lebanon, Dec. 14, 1725, Joanna Smith.

Pelatiah Webster died at Lebanon, Feb. 15, 1756, and his widow died there prior to 1771.

One of Pelatiah's⁴ sons was Constant,⁵ who was born at Lebanon, Dec. 7, 1741, and married between 1755 and 1760 Miss Kinnie (or Miss Wordsworth,—his descendants do not agree on the name, and no record can be found), for his first wife. He was bound out at the age of about fourteen years, to a neighbor, to learn the blacksmith trade, but ran away soon and enlisted in the French and Indian Wars of 1755-63. There is record of service rendered by him in Capt. A. Fitch's Co., 2nd Conn. Regiment, from April 13 to Dec. 4, 1761, 33 weeks and 5 days, for which he was paid \pounds 16, 178., 1d. His company was mustered out in June, 1761, at Albany, N. Y.

Constant Webster⁵ settled at Worthington, Mass., where he owned a farm and carried on his trade as a blacksmith. He was captain of a militia Company there and a member of the Congregational church. He died in Worthington, Mass., about 1826. The date of death of his first wife is not known.

Constant⁵ had a brother, Pelatiah Webster, who was a noted political writer at the time of the Revolutionary War. A brief account of him will be found in "Drake's Dictionary of American Biography," also in "Hinman's Connecticut in the Revolution."

One of Constant's⁵ children by his first wife was Constant, Jr.,⁶ who was born about 1760, and who married at Worthington, Mass., about 1787, Chloe Daniel (born Jan. 19, 1766, daughter of Walter Daniel). He was a blacksmith and farmer. He died at Stephentown, Rensselaer Co., N.Y., Feb. 1830. It is not known when his wife died. He was the father of Mrs. Ann (Webster) Tifft.⁷

Reuben S. Tifft with four others moved from Rensselaer County to Chemung County in Feb., 1829, with wagons drawn by oxen, being on the way thirteen days. They encountered snow drifts, rain, hailstorms and mud. Their last stopping place was Newtown (Elmira), where the mud so encased the wheels of their wagons that on the following morning there were no spaces between the spokes—it had frozen solid during the night. When they reached their new home they found but one framed house in the vicinity. The schoolhouse, as well as dwelling houses, were made of logs. They attended worship on Sunday in a barn, and experienced such other privations as pioneers usually meet. Reuben S. Tifft served as Supervisor of the town of Veteran, was Highway Commissioner, and a member of the Board of Judges at the Chemung County Agricultural Fair for live stock, for a number of years.

He died in Veteran, N. Y., Nov. 13, 1888.



Rev. Isaiah Bangs Coleman was the fifth child of Calvin Coleman and the grandson of John Coleman, one of the pioneers of Stephentown. Such advantages as the common schools gave seem to have been the limit of his early education; adding to that, habits of industry and application, he soon qualified himself for teaching, following it for ten years. He experienced religion when eighteen years old. Seven years later he was licensed to preach, and in little less than a year was ordained to the ministry as Free Will Baptist. For nine years he had no settled pastorate. In 1844 he accepted a call to the West Stephentown church, dispensing the Word of Life for forty years among the people there. Not one among those who officiated as clergyman at the marriages of the Rensselaer County Tiffts was so beloved as he.

Not only did he rejoice with them at their wedding feasts, but in times of sorrow and affliction, he mingled his tears with theirs, and gave freely of his loving sympathy. He performed during his pastorate there, three hundred and fifty-three marriage ceremonies, preached four hundred funeral sermons, and in addition, probably preached about five thousand sermons. His tender sympathy was intensified as the years passed, for he went often to the homes in the valleys and on the hillsides to speak words of hope and consolation. He was abundantly blessed with means to further his benevolent intentions (though it is said that he never accepted a stated salary for his services). Nor did he forget the work of Missions, leaving in his will **a** large sum for its use. He said: "This will help preach the gospel when I am dead."

He entered into rest March 14, 1883.





George Washington Tifft's first business enterprise was the clearing of timber land in the vicinity of his early home. This. with other similar ventures, combined with his natural business sagacity, resulted in his having, when 21 years of age, quite a sum of money for that locality. He remained in Nassau, N. Y., after his marriage until he was 25 years of age, at which time he removed to his farm, previously purchased, in Orleans County. In 1841 he went to Michigan City, Ind., and engaged in buying and shipping grain. In 1842 he came to Buffalo and formed a co-partnership with the late Dean Richmond in the milling business, and in 1843 he opened a branch of the transportation line, known as the Troy and Michigan Six-day Line,-(did not run on Sundays), under the name of George W. Tifft & Co. Selling his interest in the boats the next year, he formed a partnership with Henry H. Sizer in the produce and commission busi-For the nine years following this he gave his attention to ness. the milling business. He was prominent among the founders of the International Bank of Buffalo, of which he was the first president, occupying the position until 1857, the year of the great financial crash, which carried down so many banks and business He among others was compelled to suspend. houses.

In 1857 he took hold of the steam engine company, built blast furnaces and conceived the idea of smelting Lake Superior ore with mineral coal. In 1858 Mr. Tifft became the president of the New York & Lake Erie Railroad. About this time he turned his attention to the improvement of real estate and became an extensive builder, putting up the Tifft House, Buffalo, then the principal hotel of the city; also the Tifft elevator, besides about 74 dwelling houses. Soon after he came to Buffalo he purchased about 600 acres of land in the southern portion of the city, known as the Tifft Farm. This tract he sold, with the



exception of a few parcels which he disposed of to his children. He also owned an extensive tract of land in Shelby County, Iowa.

The last twenty years of his life was given chiefly to the management of the Buffalo Engine Works, which was owned by the firm of George W. Tifft, Sons & Co.

Amid all the changes of his eventful life Mr. Tifft always maintained an unimpaired credit; always holding his obligations sacred. He took a deep interest in public affairs, although never accepting office. He was a great admirer of Lincoln and gave largely toward the support of the war.

During the whole of his residence in Buffalo, a period of 40 years, he was identified with the Central Presbyterian Church. George W. Tifft died June 24, 1882, in Buffalo, N. Y.

APPENDIX D.

Outline of the ancestors of Marion S. Lamb, wife of Edwin Vallett Tifft, as given by herself.

First Generation.

Isaac Lamb and his father settled first, after coming from England to America, on a large tract of land in Haverhill, New Hampshire, from which they were driven by the Indians, and for safety, they went to Connecticut. In 1696 Isaac Lamb became a freeman and purchased land, in Groton, Conn., 50 acres, of Peter Crary. He lived on this farm 18 years. In 1714 he bought 200 acres in Mystic, Conn. This purchase became the homestead, and has been occupied by his descendants for over 180 years. Isaac Lamb is said to have been a soldier in Cromwell's army. He was one of the founders of the first Baptist Church in Connecticut, and he died in 1723.

Isaac Lamb and Lydia had nine children.

Second Generation.

Isaac Lamb, born in 1705 in Mystic, Conn. It is recorded that his brother Daniel was a teacher. The baptism of two of his sisters is recorded as occurring in 1695 and 1698 in Stonington, Conn. His brother Ezekial had a son who was a Baptist deacon in Holyoke, Mass., and his brother Daniel a son who was a deacon in a Baptist Church. He married Tabitha Wightman, who was the daughter of the Rev. Timothy Wightman. Two of his sons were Baptist clergymen.



Isaac Lamb married Lydia Richards of Preston, Conn., in June, 1733. They had six children. Daniel, their third son, moved to Camillus, N. Y., from Eastern, N. Y.

Third Generation.

Daniel Lamb was a deacon in the Baptist Church of Camillus, N. Y. He had seven children and lived to be 80 years of age—a long life "full of good works."

Fourth Generation.

Isaac Lamb, born in 1778, died in 1843. He married Serena Moore in Stillwater, N. Y. They had two children, Daniel and Henry, their mother dying soon after the birth of Henry.

Fifth Generation.

Daniel Lamb, born June 28, 1809. He married July 7, 1833, in Lebanon, N. Y., to Lydia Groves, who was born Feb. 3, 1814, and who was the daughter of John and Percy Lily Groves, of Lebanon, N. Y.





APPENDIX E.

Outline of the Paternal Ancestors of Maria E. (Maxon) Tifft.

First Generation.

Richard Maxson of Boston, Mass., and Portsmouth, R. I., married Goodwife ——. He was a blacksmith. Oct. 1634, he was admitted to the church, being at this time in the employ of James Everill. 1638, Portsmouth. He and others were admitted as inhabitants of the Island of Aquidneck, having submitted themselves to the government that is or shall be established. 1639, Feb. 7. "Richard Maxson, blacksmith, upon complaints made against him, was accordingly detected for his oppression in the way of his trade, who being convinced thereof, promised amendment and satisfaction."

1639, April 30. He and 28 others signed the following compact: "We whose names are underwritten, do acknowledge ourselves the legal subjects of his majesty King Charles, and in his name do hereby bind ourselves into a civil body politicke, unto his laws according to matters of justice."

1640, March 6. He had 36 acres recorded.

Second Generation.

John Maxson of Newport and Westerly, the first white child born in Rhode Island, near the present site of the city of Newport, in 1639. Died in 1720, Dec. 17. Married Mary Mosher, who was born in 1640, and died Feb. 2, 1718, and the daughter of Hugh Mosher.



On March 22, 1661, he signed certain articles in regard to Misquamicut (Westerly) lands. He became a freeman in 1668, and in 1670-86-90-1705, served as Deputy. October 24, 1677, he was excused from serving on jury because his mother-in-law and wife were both sick. In 1687 he was Overseer of the Poor, and was chosen in this year, with another, to present a petition to Sir Edmund Andros for a town charter. In 1687 and 1688 he served on the Grand Jury. On Sept. 16, 1690, he and two others were appointed by the Assembly to proportion a rate for Westerly. On March 28, 1692, he had a grant of 50 acres near Captain Joseph Davol's, which he sold the next year to Edward Larkin. In March, 1702, he was one of the proprietors in common lands at Newport.

In 1707, June 25, he deeded son Jonathan, for love, etc., 22 acres of land. Sept. 20, 1708 Elder of the Seventh Day Baptist Church.

"Our beloved brother John Maxson, Sr., was ordained to the office of an elder to the congregation in and about Westerly."

Will—proved 1721, Feb. 16. Executors, three sons, John, Joseph and Jonathan. To wife $\pounds 40$, two cows, with keep of same, and the house we now live in to be her abode for life. To son John $\pounds 5$, an iron kettle, and great bible which was my father's. To son Joseph, husbandry tools, riding mare and $\pounds 5$. To son Jonathan, 203. To daughter Hannah Maxson, a feather bed. To grandsons John, son of John, John, son of Joseph, and John, son of Johnathan, 203 each. To son Joseph's five daughters, viz.: Tacy, Judith, Mary, Ruth and Elizabeth Maxson, each 103. To daughter Mary Lewis, $\pounds 12$. Asa Maxson, born 1750, March 6, died 1842, Nov. 18. Married Lois Stillman, daughter of Joseph Stillman, born 1756 and died 1820. Buried at Adams Centre, N. Y.

Asa Maxson was Ensign of the 3rd Company of Militia from Westerly, R. I., 1776, 1779, 1780 and 1781. Lieutenant of 3rd Company Militia, Westerly, 1783.



Asa and David Maxson (probably brothers) settled in Petersburg, N. Y., buying 150 acres of land at 5 shillings an acre.

Seventh Generation.

Joseph Stillman Maxon, born Aug. 3, 1797, deacon Seventh Day Baptist Church. He married, Feb. 21, 1822, Elizabeth Vars, who was born Feb. 22, 1802, in Berlin, N. Y. She died in Grand Rapids, Mich., Jan. 31, 1884, and was buried at Adams Centre, N. Y. Joseph Stillman Maxson died Jan. 23, 1836; buried at Adams Centre, N. Y.

Elizabeth Vars descends from John De Vars, whose ancestors can be traced 700 years, back to the nobility of France. John De Vars was born in France about 1650-55; came to America about 1680, and settled at Newport, Rhode Island. He had one child, Isaac De Vars. Isaac had a son, Theodaty. Theodaty had a son, Isaac. Outline of the Maternal Ancestors of Maria E. (Maxon) Tifft.

First Generation.

George Hull came from Derbyshire, England, in 1633. Was a freeman of Dorchester, Mass., and a representative to the General Assembly. He moved to Windom, Conn., and afterwards to Fairfield. Was Assistant Governor of that state in 1637. George Hull was on committee at the general court, Hartford, Ct., in 1639, when the first constitution in this country was formed.

Second Generation.

Cornelius Hull married Rebecca, daughter of Rev. John Joanes, the first minister of Fairfield, who was of Welch origin.

Third Generation.

Cornelius Hull.

Fourth Generation.

Ebenezer Hull. He must have come to Redding, Conn., prior to 1733, for his name appears in a petition to fix a site for a meeting house in 1725. Ebenezer Hull and wife were among the original church members in 1733.



Fifth Generation.

Daniel Hull, born in Redding, Conn., in the year 1722; died in Berlin, N. Y., Aug. 26, 1811. Mary Betts, his wife, was born in 1728. They removed to Berlin, N. Y., in 1770, and were the first Yankee settlers of that town. They had ten children. Daniel Hull served in the Revolutionary War. The first assembly for religious worship in the town of Berlin was held at Daniel Hull's. In the early history of the town, before it had a code of laws, and being remote from Fort Orange (Albany) the inhabitants chose Daniel Hull and James Denison as a Vigilance Committee, with about the same rights and duties that magistrates now possess. Later, as communication with the outer world was established, he was appointed magistrate with two others, for the entire County of Rensselaer.

When the Declaration of Independence was received the inhabitants through this country assembled at the house of Daniel Hull to hear it read and take counsel for future action. The militia formed in line on the grounds. Here Daniel Hull read that Declaration for the first time, publicly, in the valley of the Hoosick. After the reading he said: "I am one to sustain this Declaration."

Requesting the commanding officer to open ranks he, Daniel Hull, stepping forth between the two lines, requested all who would sustain the Declaration to follow him. Seeing an exciting stir and smile from the soldiers, and looking back he saw his wife, who had joined in the line of march, acknowledging that her services should not be withheld in sustaining that Declaration of Independence.

Sixth Generation.

Daniel Hull, Jr., born in Redding, Conn.; moved with his father to Berlin, N. Y., in 1770; died April 2, 1842. Married Phebe Greene. Held various military offices, to a major's commission, by which title he was generally knowh at the time of



his death. He was a political man of the old school; a Federalist, a frequent member in conventions, representing his people in State and County, and a member of the Legislature. He was a strong advocate of the Freemen's Rights, a promoter of the Arts and Sciences, and a friend of the oppressed.

Seventh Generation.

Benjamin L. Hull, born in Berlin, N. Y., 1796; died in Berlin, Jan. 12, 1869. He married Maria Jones, who was born in 1803. Maria (Jones) Hull was the daughter of James Jones and Waty Jerome. James Jones was the son of James Jones and Catherine Denison. James Jones enlisted from Stephentown, N. Y., in the Revolutionary War. He was on duty a greater portion of the time from the commencement to the close of the war. He was at St. Johns, Ticonderoga, Crown Point, Fort Edward, and other places on Lake George and Lake Champlain as an Orderly Sergeant and also as an Ensign and Lieutenant in Col. Killian Van Rensselaer's regiment of the militia at Albany, Schenectady, Schoharie and other places on the Mohawk River.

Maria Jones Hull died at Newark, N. Y., Jan. 8, 1883, and was buried at Berlin, N. Y.

Eighth Generation.

Alma Ann Hull, born in Berlin, N. Y., March 16, 1829. Married Thomas Vars Maxon, Oct. 3, 1849, in Berlin, N. Y., by Rev. James Scott.

Alma Ann (Hull) Maxon died in Adams, N. Y., Nov. 3, 1869. Thomas Vars Maxon resides in Adams, N. Y.




