



he greatest minds in software have done some serious cogitating. After months of research, roundtables, and overheated brain work, they've reached an earthshaking conclusion: You'd rather push a button than pull down a menu.

Those comely, 3-D-looking buttons made their debut in *Windows 3.0*. But when they cropped up in *Excel 3.0*, we learned that buttons are more than cosmetic.

The idea is simple. For example, to pick the SUM function using *Excel 3.0*'s standard menus, you have to pull down a menu, bring up a dialog box, and scroll through a list of functions. Using *Excel 3.0*'s button-filled tool bar, one click on the SUM button is all it takes. Buttons for creating charts, drawing lines, and changing text formats also save you from needless mousing around. That's why our spreadsheet columnist, Richard Scoville, grants *Excel 3.0* "the hands-down prize for most usable spreadsheet interface."

In this month's cover story, Scoville looks at 1-2-3 for Windows and discovers that Excel 3.0 has some serious competition. 1-2-3 for Windows takes the button idea a step further: You create your own panel of buttons— Lotus calls it an "icon palette"—from a selection of 70 icons, each of which calls up a program function.

The icon palette makes *1-2-3 for Windows* one of the first programs to let you build your own user interface quickly and painlessly. If you do a lot of budgeting, you can mix in a large proportion of formula-linking and worksheet-consolidation buttons. If your job entails ad hoc analysis, you can swap in a full array of graphics

buttons. Once you've created your personal palette, you can resize it and place it anywhere on screen.

Of course, buttons alone don't make an interface. Scoville maintains that 1-2-3 for Windows can't match Excel 3.0's many niceties—such as the ability to doubleclick on any object and have a dialog box pop up automatically. And for many 1-2-3 veterans, 1-2-3 for Windows' old-fashioned 1-2-3 Classic menus—still available as an option—may appeal more (at least at first) than any number of mix-and-match buttons. Even so, 1-2-3 for Windows marks a big step toward software that works the way you do. In the future, expect more Windows programs that take the "have it your way" approach.







On a normal day, Prime Time Shuttle makes 1,000 trips from four Los Angeles airports, one AMTRAK station, and the San Pablo Harbor, via LA's notorious freeway system, to homes and offices in four Southern California area counties.

At any given moment Prime Time Shuttle has 60 to 90 vans on the road. They track every flight so they know when each passenger arrives. They promise service within 15 minutes of the reservation or the ride is free, a promise they keep 97% of the time.

How do they do it? Back at headquarters, computers are taking reservations, verifying credit card charges, blocking reservations to assign to drivers, tracking the vans along the highways, recording the drivers' commissions as they are earned, and updating management with constant progress reports.

Kory Washburn is the assistant manager of Prime Time Shuttle who set up the computer system. He started December 23, 1990 with one dispatcher's computer. Now he's running 30 machines on a

LANtastic Ethernet system, and expects to add a new computer to the system every week until they reach 50 nodes.

He chose LANtastic because of the flexibility of its peer-to-peer structure. "Instead of a single overloaded server, we broke down the tasks, spread them over multiple servers and still fully interconnect the system with cheapernet cable."

Washburn praises Artisoft hardware and LANtastic software compatibility with other manufacturers' cards and systems. "You can't beat the price. And the speed is incredible, especially the way we abuse the system," he confessed.

"Artisoft tech support stuck with us until they solved our problems. They were great."

## IBM Debuts 386SX PS/2s


AT and MCA Buses Get Equal Billing

The last major vendor to offer desktop PCs with a 20-MHz 386SX c h i p , I B M launched three such machines in June—including two with the AT bus that Big Blue has been trying to squelch for the past four years.

The new Mod-

els 35 SX and 40 SX are in IBM's best-selling segment and will compete with Micro Channel architecture alternatives. Some analysts see this as a strategic retreat from the MCA bus—a suggestion IBM executives deny. AT-bus PS/2s are for personal productivity—primarily DOS applications-while MCA-based PS/2s are corporate machines suited for OS/2 networks, says David Thomas, president of **IBM's National Distribution** Division.

Pricing "is competitive with Compaq and within striking distance of AST and Dell," notes International Data Corporation analyst Bruce Stephen. Even the high-end MCAbased Model 57 SX provides more value than previously offered by the two-year-old 55 SX, the world's best-selling PC. For \$3625, the 57 SX buyer gets more slots and more storage as well as a new 2.88MB floppy drive, 16-bit VGA, and a SCSI controller on the motherboard. A comparable AT-bus-equipped Model 40 SX will run DOS applications just as fast for \$430 less, but the standard configuration has less memory, a 1.44MB floppy, and no SCSI controller.



Successors to IBM's hot 55 SX are faster and more expandable and offer an MCA or AT bus.

A smaller, 40MB AT-bus version, the 35 SX, lists for \$2525. And memory and storage have been upgraded on the veteran \$2745 Model 55.

Thomas insists that for equivalent systems, "there is no premium for the Micro Channel." Even so, IBM needs to give users a reason to choose MCA over the AT standard, analysts say. That reason could be the powerful OS/2 2.0 due this fall.

## TrueImage/TrueType Push On

Microsoft's printing business has been reorganized after the resignation of a key executive, but observers say Microsoft remains on track to deliver the TrueType on-thefly font generator and True-Image page description language it has promised. In fact, recent changes may hasten the advent of technology that could let users print from Windows up to ten times faster than from DOS-based applications, says BIS Strategies International group director Rob Auster. Although this "fast-path" printing is many months away, Microsoft is expected to eventually provide TrueImage printer vendors with display code that will greatly speed the translation of Windows files into True-Image pages.

Microsoft's PostScriptcloning ambitions have been curtailed since September 1989, when it teamed up with TrueType font provider Apple Computer to compete with Adobe. Apple has since put TrueImage on the back burner, and this June Microsoft TrueImage development head Cal Bauer departed.

"But the bottom line is that we will continue to work on TrueImage," says Microsoft unit general manager Steve Shaiman, who has recast Bauer's Printer Business Unit into a Windows support group.

While printer vendors blame Microsoft for continued delays in TrueImage printer shipments, they add that recently released code is stable and will result in fall deliveries. TrueType font scaling has been unaffected by the delays, but this technology won't be truly useful until it's incorporated into Windows 3.1, due around year-end. Then onscreen display will become virtually identical to the printed page, and the stage will be set for fast-path application printing.

## NCR, Grid Offer Notepad Blueprint

Jot this down: By year-end, at least half a dozen vendors will ship notepad PCs, and some analysts expect as many as 300,000 of these powerful penbased systems to be sold in 1992. By summer's end, slatelike systems from NCR and Grid Systems will offer a blueprint of the genre.

Grid plans two 4.5-pound units running at 9.5 MHz one with a 20MB hard drive and a 1MB RAM card slot, the other with two RAM card slots. Since hand-held devices must be even lighter than notebooks, storage capacity will be limited at first. But 40MB to 80MB drives should be common by mid-1992, and 500MB drives are envisioned for 1996.

NCR's 3125 Notepad is more representative of the size and power needed for notepads. At 3.9 pounds and with 20-MHz power, the 3125 lets you walk and do Windows at the same time. That's important since all entrants rely on Microsoft's Pen Windows and/ or Go's PenPoint as the enabling platforms for computeintensive handwriting recognition. Also, the way NCR implements Intel's low-power 386SL could yield up to 6 hours of nonstop use.

Working outside an office

under varying light conditions requires at least a backlit VGA display and built-in communications. The 3125 has an optional 2400-baud modem, but expect that to be surpassed by faster offerings next year. Also, while true notepads offer character recognition, even the best boast accuracy of only 98 percent—and that's for block-letter writing. So look for keyboard options to augment notepads.

While Grid's offerings can be had for under \$3600, the price tags of \$4600 to \$6700 on NCR's six pen-based configurations are more representative. That may seem pricey, but NCR estimates there are some 20 million potential notepad users.

## **Microsoft Ups Support**

Admitting that Microsoft's resources were overwhelmed by the surge of Windows users, Chairman Bill Gates promises to expand Windows tech support through staff increases, road shows, and software enhancements.

After years of lukewarm Windows sales, 4 million copies of Windows 3.0 were sold during the year following its May 1990 debut. Windows application sales tripled to \$400 million even though DOSbased leaders weren't yet rewritten for the environment. Microsoft doubled tech staff to 600 to meet all the support calls—many for simple installation problems.

"Virtually all of these are avoidable," asserts Gates, who figures better developer tools and "literally thousands of improvements" in *Windows 3.1* 

## IBM Sets Superfloppy Standard

BM's long-awaited announcement of a floppy disk drive with 2.88MB of usable capacity virtually guarantees that the "superfloppy" will become the next media standard, say observers. Backwardly compatible with lower-capacity 3½-inch drives, superfloppies should appear at least as options on numerous PCs by COMDEX Fall and on nearly all PCs by early next year.

IBM had hoped to introduce the drive last year but waited for the June shipment of DOS 5.0, which recognizes the format without other drivers. Drive and media makers have long been tooled up and ready to supply the 580,000 drives Jim Porter, president of Disk/Trend, estimates the market will need this year, as well as the 1.2 million he predicts will ship in 1992.

By 1993 the 2.88MB capaci-

ty will constitute 7 percent of

the 35 million microfloppy

drives shipping—a relatively

quick penetration. While the 3½-inch microfloppy was introduced in 1982, it wasn't until 1987 that IBM chose that form factor over other options. Microfloppy shipments passed 5¼-inch drive shipments a year later.

Porter anticipates an initial price premium of \$15 to PC makers and \$25 to end users, relegating the 2.88MB format first to high-end machines. But since it costs only \$3 more to make a 2.88MB drive, the premium will be short-lived, predicts Gene Dougherty, director of sales and marketing at Toshiba America's media and recording division, which holds the primary patents on the 2.88MB recording technique and its barium-ferrite media (disks will cost \$10).

Despite talk of PC makers leaping to 20MB-plus floppies, IBM's decision and higher costs will relegate higher-density drives to backup duties for a while, says Porter. will cut the initial load in half when 3.1 ships around yearend. A new \$14.95 Windows Resource Kit offers a variety of utilities and tips on how to avoid the most common Windows problems.

But general manager of product support Patty Stonesifer expects new titles such as 1-2-3 for Windows and Word-Perfect for Windows to keep help requests high. She promises to double end-user tech staff again if necessary and increase the number of developer and corporate support coordinators to whatever level is needed.

Stonesifer claims Microsoft has reduced the phone wait to

under a minute for 85 percent of callers, but Gates insists all calls be answered in less than a minute. Bill Lodge, corporate systems analyst for New York City's Turner Construction, says he no longer experiences the 10-minute waits of last spring, but "they still have a little ways to go."

Microsoft also plans a series of technical seminars throughout the nation and is examining ways to leverage the support efforts of other *Windows* vendors. These programs cost millions of dollars, says Stonesifer, but cost isn't a showstopper since *Windows* revenues are increasing faster than the phone calls.

## **50-MHz 486 Lines Up Against RISC**

The 50-MHz version of Intel's 486 chip—the next plateau for PC power users and a major weapon in Intel's struggle against Reduced Instruction Set Computer (RISC) chips has arrived. Well, almost. While both chip and systems based on it debuted in June, Intel won't deliver the 486/50 in quantity until the fourth quarter.

Like its slower compadres, the 486/50 is a high-powered 386 superset with 8K of cache and an integrated math coprocessor. It is priced fairly aggressively at \$665, considering that a 486/33 costs manufacturers \$445.

As it did with the 486/25, IBM became the first vendor to unveil a product based on the new chip: a processor swap-out for XP models that should boost system prices past \$15,000. By ship time, expect just as many 50-MHz PCs from Compaq, Dell, and others. All will carry a hefty price premium and appeal initially to a small handful of users running client-server network applications, CAD packages, and other CPU- hungry software.

That means Intel is throwing its new champion up against the RISC onslaught, notes Computer Intelligence analyst Dan Ness. In fact, the 486/50 beats the market-leading Sparcstation 2 in some benchmarks and "will be very competitive against all comers," promises Intel marketing manager Tim Keating.

Intel "has been able to keep up with RISC processors in integer performance, but it's somewhat behind in floatingpoint," notes Michael Slater, editor of the *Microprocessor Report*. He expects RISC chips shipping later this year to be significantly faster and predicts Intel's next play in this power game will be the 586 rather than a faster 486.

While most 486 machines remain specialty items, Keating points out that a million have shipped to date, and Intel expects to double that by yearend. But most new sales will be of relatively inexpensive 486SX PCs, says market researcher Instat, which predicts shipments of only 10,000 486/50 PCs this year.



Why IBM and Apple Should Be Friends

> A marriage of the two PC giants would be more natural than you'd think.

C journalists had a field day recently over news that IBM and Apple were holding peace talks. Predictably, officials from both companies said little about the subject, but just one whiff of those discussions was enough to set keyboards clattering everywhere including here at *PC World*.

As crazy as it sounds, Apple and IBM are discovering plenty of reasons to cooperate. Both PC titans are in the throes of major crises. IBM is losing ground to less expensive, high-power clones. Apple is gaining users but losing profits with its new, low-price product line. Both companies are feeling the heat from workstation heavyweight Sun Microsystems. And both are plenty worried about mutual archrival Microsoft and its smash hit, *Windows*.

But shared worries alone don't make a relationship. Apple and IBM actually have a great deal of PC innovation to offer one another, and their combined technologies could set the pace in emerging areas such as pen-based PCs, multimedia, and graphical workstations. Most of all, an alliance between Apple and IBM could add a new element of choice to the PC arena, furnishing perhaps the only credible alternative to the Bill Gates *Windows* strategy now on the horizon.

## **New Software for New PCs**

To get out of their rut, Apple and IBM need to sell more PCs-lots of them. But industry standards—DOS, and now Windows-have made it virtually impossible for either vendor to lock up the majority of PC purchases. So together IBM and Apple are heading toward areas where Windows hasn't vet taken root. In pen-based PCs, for example, the behemoths appear to be lining up behind Go Corporation's PenPoint operating system, versus Microsoft's Pen Windows or a special pen version of the Mac system software. Since Pen-Point features a more advanced, easierto-use interface than either Windows or the Mac, it may prove a meeting ground for software that unites the companies' desktop PCs, too.

In multimedia, both Apple and IBM are feeling enormous pressure from a Microsoft-led coalition of hardware vendors who have agreed to build Windows-compatible multimedia PCs and peripherals. Many believe that PCs capable of juggling sound, animation, and video stand a good chance of ushering in a new era in home computing—just the ticket to revive IBM's and Apple's profits. Moreover, multimedia can merge with networking to spawn new kinds of business applications—integrated voice mail and E-mail, for example. Tandy, AT&T, NEC, Philips, and Zenith have already thrown their weight behind multimedia Windows, so Apple and IBM may find cooperation necessary for sheer survival.

The hardware giants face an even more severe challenge on the workstation front. Low-price workstations like Sun's represent the future of office desktop PCs-graphical, fully networkable, capable of integrating information from throughout an organization. So far, Microsoft has succeeded in uniting a consortium of far-flung competitors like Compaq and DEC behind a standard based on a future version of Windows that supports high-speed RISC chip technology. With OS/2 and its own RISC chips to promote, IBM desperately needs a hardware partner. With a version of the Mac operating system for RISC systems, Apple may find a willing collaborator in IBM.


Elsewhere, Apple and IBM may be able to exploit Microsoft's weaknesses to their advantage. It's no secret, for example, that *LAN Manager* has been a failure compared to Novell's NetWare or even Apple's own *AppleTalk*. IBM has tied the knot with Novell but could still use some help to network PCs in small organizations that don't need the power or the hassle of NetWare. With a broad, integrated product line, IBM, Apple, and Novell would form an invincible networking bloc.

## The Payoff: A Bigger Marketplace

In contrast with the wild-and-woolly days of the first PC clones, this new era of cooperation between industry giants (continues)


## **Losing Your Changes** With 1-2-3 2.2

your charge of faulty DEC terminal emulations; we've always considered them among *Procomm Plus*'s strongest features. Author Judy Heim's vague criticisms of backspace and function key behavior are particularly surprising, considering that users can remap the keys to fit their needs. I have no record of *PC World* calling our technical support to discuss these problems, and I suspect they relate to user settings rather than any bug in the program.

I tested the DEC emulations on each program using the default settings. I called a VAX and ran a variety of editors and data base software. Procomm Plus 2.0 was the only package that displayed backspace and function key problems. With backspace in destructive mode, for example, characters I erased disappeared from the screen but remained in the edited file. And none of the function keys worked properly in VT220 emulation: While connected to a VAX running Ingres' ISQL terminal monitor, I couldn't even execute a command. I apologize for my oversight in not discussing these problems with Datastorm's technical support. But users shouldn't have to remap keys to achieve adequate terminal emulations. —Judy Heim





#### Avoiding Conflicts With Tiffany

If you need to take a Windows screen shot with Tiffany, but Tiffany conflicts with the application you're running, use Windows' built-in screen dump feature. Press < Print Screen > to capture the entire screen to the Windows Clipboard or <Alt>-<Print Screen> to capture the active window. Open the Clipboard, and save the image to disk as a CLP file. As there's no utility that reads CLP files, load Tiffany (set to save images in color PCX format), load the Clipboard, and maximize it to full screen. Then load the CLP file, and press <F11> to save the image as a PCX file. Unfortunately, you'll also get the Clipboard's menu bar. To do away with it, load the PCX file into Windows' Paintbrush and just wipe out the menu bar. Voilà—you have a screen shot. Robert Luhn Senior Editor



#### **DOS TSRs and Windows**

**Q.** Is there a way I can use different drivers and TSRs (memory-resident utilities) with the DOS applications I'm running under Windows 3.0? When running my CAD program under Windows, I'd like to be able to pop up PC Tools' memory-resident DOS shell and calculator and also be able to use the third mouse button (which requires a special driver), but I can't get this setup to work properly.

**A.** Loading a set of memory-resident programs to use with a DOS application

under *Windows* isn't too difficult. The trick is to set up a PIF file to run a batch file that loads the TSRs and then runs the program. If you can't install your mouse driver from the DOS prompt (and therefore, from a batch file) but must use a DEVICE = command in your system's CONFIG.SYS file, do that first.

To create, say, CAD.PIF, call up the Windows PIF Editor. For the Program Filename, enter c:\batch\cad.bat (if you don't keep your batch files in C:\BATCH, replace that string with the appropriate drive and directory). For the Window Title, enter My CAD Program. Set the memory requirements as needed, and if you're running Windows in 386-enhanced mode, click the Advanced button and set those options as appropriate.

Now create CAD.BAT; its list of commands should load your mouse driver (unless you've already set the DE-VICE = command to do so) and TSRs and then start the CAD program itself. Save CAD.BAT in the directory where you keep your batch files. Finally, use the Program Manager's File New Program Item command, entering **cod.pif** in the Command Line text box, to create an icon for launching your CAD application.

If your application needs more environment space, you can modify CAD.PIF so that it runs COM-MAND.COM and then the batch file: For the Program Filename, enter c:\command.com; for Optional Parameters, enter /e:512 /c c:\batch\cad.bat. The '/e:512' gives the DOS session more environment space, and the other parameters cause DOS to run CAD.BAT.

When you're through working in your CAD program, exit it and then

press **<Ctrl>-C** to unload the TSRs and end the DOS session.

#### Improve 1-2-3's Memory Management

**Q.** I have 2MB of RAM in my computer, yet 1-2-3 sometimes gives me a 'Memory Full' message when I load a spreadsheet of only 520K. What takes up the other 1.5MB?

**A.** When you get that message, you probably have nearly 1MB of expanded memory still free. The problem is that 1-2-3 2.2 and earlier versions require a "pointer" in base memory for each cell that's stored in expanded memory. After you load DOS and 1-2-3 (without a spreadsheet), there's less than 300K of base memory left, so pointers can use it up long before you run out of expanded memory. (Later versions of 1-2-3 avoid the problem through more efficient memory management.) For 2.2 and earlier releases, installing Intex Solutions' Beyond 640 add-in lets you avoid the pointer problem and use 4MB of expanded memory.



puter. We'd like to be able to search for documents by customer name or case number, then view them. Is our 286 clone with 640K of RAM, a 40MB hard disk, and Hercules graphics up to the job? What software do we need?

Betty Chin Seattle, Washington

A. Hotshot Imagebase is one application we've found that lets you easily organize and display scanned images. But it doesn't support Hercules graphics, so you'll need to upgrade to a VGA video board and a VGA monitor. If your photographs are black and white, you won't really need color-a monochrome VGA monitor will do fine. Because each fullpage scanned document can take up to 180K, you'll need about 18MB of free hard disk space for each 100 images. For 2000 scanned documents, you'll need a 600MB hard disk (a 300MB disk would probably hold only about 1500; the next size up is 600MB).

So, your system would be able to handle the job—once you have upgraded its hard disk, video board, and monitor. Given today's prices, consider selling your AT clone and buying a system that's configured to meet your needs. Also, if retrieval speed is not critical, consider an internal or external Bernoulli, which uses 44MB removable cartridges. You may find the savings over a 600MB hard drive attractive.

#### Delete Unneeded Copy Protection Files

**Q.** I've been trying to remove an old copy-protected program from my hard disk. I used a freeware utility to reveal its hidden files, but when I try to delete them I get the message 'Access denied'. Is there some way I can get rid of these files?

**A.** Those files are not only hidden, they're probably also set as "read only." Use the DOS command ATTRIB to shut off the read-only attribute, and you should be able to erase them. For example, if the troublesome file is called PRO-TECT.FIL, you'd enter **attrib** -r **protect.fil** at the C> prompt. If you're using an old version of DOS without ATTRIB (it was added in 3.0), try a shareware or commercial collection of disk utilities; most can also reset the read-only attribute.

#### **Break Up an Alphabetical List**

**Q.** To make an alphabetical list of names more readable, I insert a blank row between the A's and B's, B's and C's, and so on. Can I use a Quattro Pro macro to automate this task?

**A.** The five-line macro shown in **FIGURE** I does the trick. You'll need to assign one cell in the worksheet as a work area for the macro. Here we've used A1, but you can replace that with any cell or one-cell range name in the worksheet away from the list of names, or a cell or range name in the file that holds your macro library. Be sure that you don't add any characters, including trailing blanks, to any of the macro lines.

To use the macro, make sure there are no blank lines before the end of the list and that the list is sorted. Then position the cell pointer on the first cell of the name list, and run the macro. First, the macro copies the contents of the current cell to the work cell. To avoid getting into an endless loop, it then checks to see if the work cell is a number (since a blank line is seen as a zero), in which case it stops running. Otherwise, it moves down to the next cell in the list. The next command checks to see if the first character of the work cell is "less" (has a lower ASCII value) than the first character of the now-current cell. If so, (continues)

#### List All of the Directories All the Time...

You can list most subdirectories by entering dir \*. at a directory's DOS prompt, but your list will include files without extensions and won't include subdirectories with extensions. Enter dir find "<DIR>" at the DOS prompt if you want to list the names of all the subdirectories in the current directory. To make the process even easier, put the command in a batch file with a memorable name, such as SUB.BAT or SUBDIR.BAT.







the pointer is at the beginning of the next alphabetic section, and the macro inserts a blank row and moves down a cell. Then it loops back to continue running the macro from the beginning. (If you don't want to name the macro NAMELIST, revise the last line to branch to the name you want to use.)

1-2-3 users can also use this macro if they make one modification: Replace '{/ Row;Insert}~' with /WIR~ to tell 1-2-3 to insert a row.

#### **Crossing Borders in 1-2-3**

1-2-3's Worksheet Titles Horizontal, Vertical, and Both commands help keep your place by displaying titles on the edges of the screen as you scroll through large worksheets. But they also prevent you from getting into the titles area using just the cursor keys. To move your cursor into the titles area, press the GoTo key (<F5>) and specify the address cell. #### NETWORK Q&A

#### Make Moving Your LAN as Safe and Painless as Possible

#### Keith Nickerson

**Q.** We're moving to new offices at the end of the year, and I'm worried that our server and workstations won't survive the trip intact. I'm also concerned that the LAN might not work properly at the new location. Can you give me any advice on how to avoid trouble?

Barbara Gunderson Council Bluffs, Iowa

**A.** Moving a LAN isn't easy, and without proper care it can become a frustrating ordeal. Here are some simple steps you can take to smooth your move.

Choose a mover that's specially equipped to move computers. Most large moving companies do have the proper padded cabinets to house and protect your machines during the move. Also, note that some computers' warranties require you to move the system in its original packing.

Hire an established, reputable company to lay the network cables in your new location or to check those already in place (it's easier to check disconnected cable segments for faults than it is to troubleshoot problems after everything's connected). Cut corners here, and you'll burn up more time and money fixing problems than you would have spent on a quality job in the first place.

Be sure you have adequate phone jacks, power lines, and ventilation in your new file server room. If you aren't planning the move yourself, make sure the planner is aware of and understands your requirements. If your new building has professional management, they should be able to calculate the required cooling from a list of how many and what types of machines you'll be housing there (the temperature should not exceed about 75 degrees). Large floor fans are a bad idea, as they spread dust and dirt that can seriously damage your machines.

Plan to take down your server at least one day before the move so the equipment can cool overnight. Warn your users well ahead of the appointed hour, and make sure they understand they may lose some of their work if they're logged in and have files open on the server when you take it down. Also, remind your users of their responsibility to back up their local hard drives. You don't want to be blamed for any data being lost during the move.

Fifteen minutes before you power down the server, use NetWare's SEND utility to warn users to save their work and log out. Send two more messages at 5-minute intervals before you finally shut down. Enter **disable login** at the file server console to prevent users from logging in, then use FCONSOLE (in NetWare 2.x) or MONITOR (in Net-Ware 3.x) to log out any users still connected.

When all user connections have been terminated and all files are closed, make at least two complete, verified backups of the file server.

Be certain all the workstations' hard drives are "parked" before you unplug them for packing. Most newer PCs do this automatically when the machine is shut down, but with older machines you'll have to park the drives manually.

Tape all power cords and other cables to the appropriate CPU or printer before the movers pack them away. That way you won't have to hunt for them when you're unpacking.

Keep an eye on your file servers as the movers pack and unpack them. Movers are often not fully aware of the delicacy and value of the equipment they're moving, and a word of advice at the right time can save expensive trouble later.

Even with the best of planning, something can always go wrong. Be sure all your equipment is properly insured against damage during the move.

Finally, allow plenty of time to get things up and running again in your new offices. It's almost certain to take longer than you expect. 章

#### **POWER TIP NO. 196**

#### Save Space and Display Large Values in Excel

When a column isn't wide enough to display formatted values in a worksheet, Excel fills the column with '####'. But if you convert the value to text using the TEXT function, it will display in a narrow column, with the excess displaying if the cells to the right are empty.

Suppose you want to display the current date and time at the top of your worksheet but don't want to set a column wide enough to display 'January 15, 1991, 11:05 PM' as a value. Just enter the formula =text(now(),"mmmm d, yyyy,\ h:mm am/pm") into a cell of any width greater than zero, and then align the text as you wish. The date will be displayed in its entirety, allowing you to maintain narrow columns.

#### But Cellular Nets Need Data Enhancements Mobile Professionals Gain Portable Offices

Wireless Links Complement Notebook PCs



With a notebook and portable printer, Bridgestone salespeople can close deals faster, says analyst Mike Withers.

These days we barely notice the telltale antenna of a cellular car phone—except, of course, when the driver is engrossed in conversation rather than the morning traffic. But cellular phones and other communications advances are hooking up with portable PCs to make sales, accounting, engineering, and other mobile professionals as productive on the road as at the office.

Well-publicized and dramatic advances in notebook PCs are being followed by related developments in peripherals and communications. Printers weighing less than three pounds, pocket-sized fax/modems, cellular modems, paging devices that download messages to a PC— the pieces are starting to fall into place for the mobile professional, says Bill Lempesis, who publishes *The Lempesis Report* newsletter in Pleasanton, California.

#### **Communications A-Go-Go**

At Bridgestone Tires, of Nashville, all 175 district and territory sales managers are equipped with a Toshiba notebook with an internal fax/ modem, a portable Kodak Diconix 150 Plus ink jet printer, and a pager. They can log on to the company's mainframe to download E-mail messages or get detailed reports about customers they'll be visiting; send and receive faxes to customers and the home office; and print out contracts and promotional literature from virtually anywhere.

"The key word is timeliness," says Bridgestone spokesperson John Taylor. "Under the old system, it might be several days before salespeople could get information to customers. In the past, deals have not happened because they did not happen quickly enough."

Other companies rely on wireless communications to give them even tighter links. Claims adjusters for one Northeast insurance company drive minivans outfitted with a PC, a printer, a video camera, a cellular phone, and a fullsized cellular modem. They visit customer sites, assess vehicle damage, and send reports with photos back to the home office via the cellular modem. They can write out checks for repairs on the spot. In the past, the process took two weeks.

#### Walk Before You Run

Companies of all sizes have compelling uses for wireless products and services, says International Data analyst Bruce Stephen, but the commercialization of wireless communications devices remains in its infancy.

Pocket cellular fax/modems are cheaper, but "cellular networks are still too messy for good data transmission," says Dataquest analyst Larry Cynar. Uneven geographical coverage, crowded communications channels, and the low quality of most networks plague customers trying to make the cellular leap. Fax/ modem hardware advances combined with Microcom's new MNP 10 communications protocol should help considerably, says Lisa Simpson, product line manager for Rockwell International's Digital Communications Division.

Despite problems, computer companies see communications as an important element of future PC sales. AT&T is pushing harder than most with its Safari notebook, which features an optional cellular modem and portable paging device for downloading messages to the laptop. The potential market, says AT&T vice president Ed Cote, is 26 million professionals who spend most of their day out of the office. —*Roberta Furger*

#### It's Not Products That Keep IBM on Top

Buyers Choose Stability and Support Over Price

n the Birmingham IBM PC User Group in Birmingham, Alabama, only two members own IBM PCs—old PCs at that. The group's other members bought compatibles because they "are aware there are better alternatives," says President Everett Huffman.

But customers keep buying from IBM—a lot of customers. IBM sold more than 1.5 million PCs last year in the United States alone, according to International Data Corporation estimates. "IBM has a strong presence in virtually all

market segments, even the home market, and we anticipate it will remain the leading PC vendor," says IDC analyst Bruce Stephen.

#### **Achieving High Comfort Levels**

Why do so many users still choose to pay a premium for what many reviewers and customers agree are middle-ofthe-road PCs?

First and foremost is the peace of mind that comes from dealing with the largest vendor. "This is particularly valuable at a time when there's so much uncertainty in the marketplace," says Bruce Johnson, PC manager at New York City law firm Sullivan & Cromwell. In these troubled times, it's comforting to buy a machine with those three magic letters on it, says Johnson.

Second comes service, particularly at large "True Blue" companies. "There are things more important than saving money," says Avery Cloud, manager of technical services at Bowman Gray/Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. An IBM representative is assigned permanently on site, and "the legendary IBM service and support are a reality for us," says Cloud.

For Oil-Dri of America, a Chicago mineral mining and manufacturing firm with six remote sites across the country, a single service contract that covers all PCs is essential. And, says MIS director Sam Colello, IBM was the only choice. "If I have a problem with a PC at a remote site, night or day, I make one call, and the problem is fixed," he says. "There's no finger pointing because I have nonstandard equipment. The support and service IBM gives us when something goes wrong exceeds the \$500 or \$1000 we'd save buying a clone."

Smaller firms also can share benefits from buying IBM. Not only can they get a machine repaired anywhere in the country at virtually a moment's notice, the repairs generally are cheaper because standard IBM parts are widely available. Moreover, the annual maintenance contract for an IBM PS/2 is usually several hundred dollars less than a contract on a no-name clone.

#### Connectivity and Compatibility

Additionally, connectivity remains a major issue. At First Security National Bank &



First Security's Brian Williamson can't connect with clones.

Trust in Lexington, Kentucky, PC services manager Brian Williamson admits that his organization "pays a penalty for buying IBM, and we know it." Still, says Williamson, as the bank's systems are increasingly being connected via networks, he's glad that he stuck with IBM. "As simple and economical as it sounds to buy from the low-cost provider, as soon as you try connecting clones, everything falls apart," he explains.

Mike Balog, president of PCI Engineering in Timonium, Maryland, admits that "the productivity-per-dollar ratio is probably lower than what you'd get with an Everex." However, Balog invested in five high-end PS/2s for his engineering consulting firm because of compatibility concerns. "As consulting engineers, the last thing we need to do is chase down software


#### bugs," he says.

IBM's recent attempts to be more of a technology leader have won the company some grudging fans. "To be honest with you, I don't like IBM," says Hank Swan, owner of Atlantic Automobile Repairs in Baltimore. "As a small buyer, you're cut off from direct contact with the manufacturer and literally at the mercy of the local dealer." However, he bought IBM's portable 386 PS/2 because of its "technical punch."

Even IBM diehards see room for improvement. First Security's Williamson laments that IBM is often slow to get important products to market. Sullivan & Cromwell's Johnson wishes he didn't have to wait in line at his dealer for certain machines. And Oil-Dri's Colello voices what seems to be an age-old complaint: difficulty in prying product information out of Big Blue. But none are miffed enough to change brands. *—Alice LaPlante*

Percentage of 1990 U.S. unit shipments of personal computers



#### **Entry-Level Nets Pay Off**

Users Like Simplicity, Lower Cost



NetWare's requirements were "mind-boggling," says RhoMed's Dan Swearingen, who chose an inexpensive network alternative.

**E** ver feel you're being persuaded to throw more technology at a problem than it warrants? That may well happen when you put together a local area network. Powerful net software like Novell's Net-Ware is well-suited to moderate-to-large installations, but for small organizations, it's like trying to swat a gnat with a sledgehammer.

Fortunately, other networking products allow a half dozen or so PCs to share files and printers quite adequately and don't require a computer science degree for installation and maintenance. What's more, these net hardware/ software combinations cost quite a bit less than full-featured systems. That has translated into substantial sales: Category leader Artisoft of Tucson, Arizona, claims more than 300,000 nodes.

#### **Simpler Solutions**

At RhoMed, a research and development firm in Albuquerque, New Mexico, ten PCs are linked over an *Invisible Net*  LAN from Invisible Software, of Foster City, California. Scientists and attorneys run standard applications such as *WordPerfect* and *Paradox*, says Dan Swearingen, the company's controller, and this capability was essential. The network transmits data at rates of up to 3 million bits per second (Mbps) over twistedpair cabling.


"With Novell, it was mind-

boggling what we'd have had to get—a dedicated server, consultant, cards, and software," Swearingen says. "We were told it would cost about \$10,000." In comparison, the company spent just \$2500 on its *Invisible Net* LAN, he says.

The package was relatively easy to install, and it has been modified recently to be even easier, says Swearingen. Ongoing support is cheaper as well because the manufacturer doesn't charge for technical support. And the package doesn't require dedicating a PC as net server. "I'm really glad we don't have that kind of setup," he says now. "Ours is a lot more flexible."

In Phoenix, Cullen/Burr Associates Architects turned to LANtastic products, says Mike Montgomery, CAD manager. The company chose LANtastic for its slim memory usage and its manufacturer support. "Originally we had two CAD stations, and we wanted to be able to share the drawing files," Montgomery explains. The company now has seven PCs and runs applications such as WordPerfect over the network as well. With 2-Mbps adapters, the total came to less than \$250 per PC.

"Of course you're making a trade-off for speed; we knew



Local area network products that aim for ease of use and low cost, such as Artisoft's LANtastic, offer many benefits. Performance and upgrade paths, however, may be restricted. that going in," says Montgomery. The company's 200K to 300K drawing files transmit in about 15 seconds, which he says is acceptable.

SED Systems, a space engineering company in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, employs *LANtastic* to allow its four secretaries to share word processing files. "We wanted a real quick system to network our secretarial staff," explains network coordinator Tom Dzubin.

Dzubin confirms that LANtastic is "very inexpensive"; total cost with an Ethernet adapter was \$300 per PC. The networks are also easy to set up. "It took me 15 minutes for the first two nodes and 3 minutes for the last nodes," he says. Performance is acceptable, according to Dzubin, with a 1MB file transmitted in about 15 seconds.


#### **Net Disadvantages**

Low-end networks may suffer from other drawbacks. Foremost among these, the nets generally don't scale well. Swearingen, for example, was told that Invisible Software doesn't recommend more than 15 PCs on a network. So if your network needs grow, you essentially must trash the network software and start over, though you may be able to keep the network adapters. LANtastic, however, lets you install multiple servers and connect nets via a hub.


For small organizations, these products can satisfy limited network requirements with a minimal investment of time and money. "What we like about [the small net] is, it's no more sophisticated than we are," explains Swearingen. —Sharon Fisher



#### **PC Futures: Price Push Comes to Shove**

AST's Premium II 486SX/20 debuted at a strikingly low price in May and is the desktop Bargain of the Month<sup>2</sup>, while Zeos's Notebook 286 garnered portable PC Bargain of the Month honors. IBM's veteran PS/2 Model 55 SX continued to reign on the bestseller charts, although Compaq held more of the top ten slots. Price continues to drop throughout the industry. IBM slashed prices as much as 38 percent during its second round of cuts within a month, and many other vendors followed suit. For example, the base price on Compaq's Deskpro 386s dropped 20 percent, and street pricing fell 19 percent; IBM cut list price 11 percent on the PS/2 Model 55 SX-061, and street pricing slid 8 percent. Prices on 386 machines should be whittled further as models built around Intel's new 486SX chip ship in volume. Vendors will continue to feel strong pricing pressure during the rest of the year as market growth remains slow.



**STORY** number one Windows application is still Solitaire. Despite the availability of many other excellent Windows-based applications, such as Microsoft's Excel 3.0, most buyers have been patiently waiting for the other shoe to drop before they make their next move.

Well listen up, folks—Lotus just dropped one. And it's a

#### real beaut.

1-2-3 for Windows packs the formidable power of 1-2-3 release 3.1+—including 3-D worksheets, high-end data management, and a nonlinear solver-into a unique version of the Windows interface ablaze with icons. You can create polished output easily, thanks to full-featured business graphics and scalable fonts. And the environment provides a continuous view of the final product as you work.

Does the new Windows interface mean you're in for another trip to the training center? Not at all: When you hit the slash key, up pops a freefloating box with the familiar 1-2-3 Classic menus inside. Until you're comfortable with the new system, you can keep on working the old way-and the Classic menus promise 100 percent macro compatibility with previous releases.

#### **Icons to Suit Your Taste**

The optional Classic menu is a great idea, but most users will soon want to move on to the picturesque new world of 1-2-3/W's icon palette—a set of 70 3-D mouse buttons that

execute a variety of common commands. Like Excel 3.0's tool bar, the palette lets you quickly justify text, format cells, make a graph, and sum data. But it contains a host of other shortcuts that sort tables, traverse worksheets, copy and move data, preview reports, and much more. 
clearly the state of the art in icons.

You can even build your own icons and attach custom macros or C programs to them. Developers can store icon palettes in named files and link multiple palettes into a custom interface, putting custom tools and applications gently into the hands of occasional users.

#### Cutting Back the Menu Tree

The endlessly branching menu system of release 2.3 and 3.1+ has been (mercifully) pruned named reports and setup strings. This is good news for application developers who need to produce multirange data base reports—the flexibility of the old system makes it much easier to automate these complex print jobs.

Range selection in 1-2-3/W is somewhat more flexible than in *Excel*. As in *Excel*, you can preselect a range before executing a command, but you can also change your selection freely from inside a dialog box —the dialog boxes magically


into a manageable set of pulldown menus and welldesigned dialog boxes. The result is faster access to controls—for example, the ninelevel menu sequence for search and replace is replaced by a single dialog box containing four fields.

To maintain continuity with its DOS forebears, 1-2-3/W puts a slight spin on the Windows interface. In some cases, the offspring manifests a hybrid vigor. For instance, the printing system is now sensibly organized into standard Page Setup and Print dialog boxes, but 1-2-3's old /Print system retains an independent, ghostly existence in the Classic menus, complete with dissolve and reappear as you click on the spreadsheet to make a range selection.

In other cases, 1-2-3/W's Windows translations are less fluent. There's no intuitive way to select a 3-D range with the mouse: You must start with a 2-D range, then reach for the keyboard or click on an icon to shift into the next page. Also, to apply a style (a named collection of format features) to a range, you select it from the Style menu, but you must remember to clear it from a separate Edit Style menu.

#### **A Good Family Member**

Except for the icon palette and a few *Windows*-specific features, 1-2-3/W offers few func-

tional innovations above and beyond release 3.1+. The good news is that release 3.1+ is a very capable program, and 1-2-3/W matches it step for step.

For starters, 1-2-3/W offers the nonlinear solver. This superb analytical tool lets you work backward from a projected outcome to quickly find optimal solutions. For example, the solver could help you find the biggest profit projection in a range of marketing strategies.

1-2-3/W also shares 3.1+'s relational data base management and external data links,

which make it simpler for developers and power users to organize raw data from reports. A 3-D work space lets you divide a large worksheet into separate pages for easier handling. For developers, the macro language includes new commands to manipulate windows, manage the Clipboard, and establish Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links with other Windows applications.

1-2-3/W makes it easy to create great output. You can dress up reports with scalable fonts, thanks to the bundled Adobe Type Manager. And you can format your reports



quickly by creating styles and attaching them to new ranges.

Need graphics? You can create a variety of charts from pies to bars to mixed line-and-bar graphs—and even add 3-D effects. A gallery of chart styles, similar to *Excel*'s, helps you choose the best graph for your data. A separate module (with an interface similar to Lotus's *Freelance*) enables you to add lines, arrows, and text to worksheets and charts.

#### Which 1-2-3 for You?

If you've already upgraded to 1-2-3 3.1+ or even 2.3, switching to 1-2-3/W may seem unnecessary. After all, the lion's share of 1-2-3 for Windows' features—including graphics, scalable fonts, and continuous page preview—have already appeared in 3.1+ and 2.3.

No matter. If you have the hardware to handle *Windows* (a 386SX or better), switching to *1-2-3 for Windows* is definitely worthwhile. The DOS versions of *1-2-3* have many of the same features, but after years of revisions, the old interface is beginning to collapse under its own weight. Even WYSIWYG releases 2.3 and 3.1—lacking scroll bars, radio buttons, and other convenient tools—are far less elegant than 1-2-3/W. 1-2-3 for Windows superbly illustrates the principle that features alone don't make an excellent program—it's how easy those features are to use.

Easy access to spreadsheet power isn't the only benefit. Once you learn 1-2-3 for Windows, you'll find learning other hot Windows applications like Ami Pro or Word for Windows much more intuitive. You'll also benefit from easy font manipulation, superb printer support, multitasking, and automatic data transfers between Windows applications that use DDE.

If you're still wary of taking the Windows plunge, remember that 1-2-3 for Windows won't immerse you in a sea of pulldown menus and radio buttons before you're ready. Just hit that slash key, and you're back on familiar ground.

#### **One-on-One with Excel**

1-2-3 for Windows is a step ahead of the DOS 1-2-3s, but what about its new Windows rival, Excel? Both packages target the same broad audience—including management users and high-end analysts and developers. Despite 1-2-3/W's innovative icon palette, its interface can't quite match Excel's smooth, intuitive personality. For example, with Excel 3.0, you can double-click on almost any worksheet element—a formula, say, or a graph item —and the dialog box that controls it appears, ready to edit. With 1-2-3/W—and every other program in existence —you must go to an icon or menu to open the box.

But mostly it's a lot of little things *Excel* does that make the difference. For example, *1-2-3 for Windows* lacks *Excel*'s ability to let you preselect a group of columns and set their width with the mouse. And it can't consolidate multiple worksheets automatically or save them as a group. All these niceties add up to increased productivity.

#### That Ol' Slash-Key Religion

But ultimately, many 1-2-3 users making the inevitable switch to *Windows* couldn't care less how good *Excel* is. It doesn't offer *1-2-3/W*'s slashkey training wheels; end of story. For these people, the optional Classic menu box will be worth more than all *Excel*'s shortcuts.

Where does that leave 3.1+? With hardware requirements almost as high as 1-2-3/ W's—and a similar feature set—it provides little reason to keep power users from moving on to Windows' smoother interface. Release 3.1+'s only advantage is a small potential speed advantage over 1-2-3/W. Release 2.3, on the other hand, seems a good alternative along with Quattro Pro—for users without the hardware to handle Windows.

1-2-3 for Windows is a major step forward for 1-2-3 users. Soon, 1-2-3 for Windows will replace Solitaire as the mission-critical application for thousands of new Windows converts. €

#### **POWER TIP NO. 197**

#### Fine-Tuning Crosstalk's VT100 Emulation

When communicating with a VAX host using VT100 terminal emulation, you'll find that Crosstalk's remapping of the PC's keyboard is somewhat flawed. VT100 users normally press <Backspace> to send a delete character and <Ctrl>-<Backspace> to send a backspace character. But Crosstalk's emulator maps these keys in just the opposite way.

You can easily reverse these key assignments and set Crosstalk straight. At Crosstalk's command line, type FK 1 ^ H, press <Enter>, type save, and press <Enter>. When prompted, type the name of the XTK parameter file for the system you'll be calling.



For many users, Ami Pro 1.2 looked a bit too much like a paint program—they preferred the more corporate look of Word for Windows' sculpted ribbon bar. A smattering of design details lends the new Ami Pro a more professional look, but Ami Pro's festive nature lives on with the enhanced color controls offered in this latest version.

Each icon is smaller, so you

can fit more icons along any side of the screen. You can also float any number of icons freely in a box of any shape. Icons and buttons now sport the 3-D push-button effect popularized by *Excel 3.0*. Previously, you could set up macros as bare-bones buttons, but now you can also create custom macro icons, importing any metafile or BMP file to be the picture. The images scale to size automatically.

Even Ami Pro's styles are more stylish. You can now select paragraph styles and font sizes from *Excel*-like pull-*up* menus that open from the bottom status line. This approach is more convenient than the floating styles box, which obscured the screen. Some other good news—you can now create styles by example—basing a style on previously formatted text. And because Lotus will bundle a copy of *Adobe Type Manager*, all your fonts will look sharp.

If you work with several documents at once, you'll appreciate the improved windowing. Version 1.2 let you open multiple windows, but the process was awkward, and a new menu bar in each window ate up real estate. Now you can open and resize windows easily, with a minimum of screen overhead, and cut and paste freely. You can even minimize documents into icons that sit at the bottom of the screen.

Other changes are less spectacular but add up to



heightened convenience. An interactive tab ruler includes tab icons, so you can designate a right-justified tab without working your way through a dialog box. Like Symantec's *JustWrite, Ami Pro* recognizes and converts alien file formats on the fly when importing documents. And like *Word for Windows, Ami Pro* displays the names of the last several documents opened on the File menu.

#### **Outline for Success**

Ami Pro devotees had to wait a long time for an outliner, but now they've got a good one. This fully integrated outliner lets you expand and collapse nine levels of headings by clicking on an icon bar along the top. As with Word for Windows' outliner, you can integrate and hide text and copy hidden text simply by copying the heading.

Another catch-up to *Word* for *Windows* is the addition of group editing features. *Ami Pro's* redliner marks suggested deletions and additions in a specified color or attribute, and you can accept or delete edits individually. If your editor failed to use the redline feature when finessing your document, you can resort to a Compare feature that compares two versions of a document to create edit marks automatically in the current version.

Lotus has upgraded the table editor with multipage features. In a text table format, if you have rows with more than one line, you can now break pages between lines. Previously, you could end up with a blank space on the bottom of a page because *Ami Pro* forced the entire multiline row onto the next page. You can also easily repeat the headings along the top of each page.

Additionally, *Ami Pro* has improved long-document features, offering a master-document function similar to the one in *Ventura Publisher*: You can keep "chapters" in separate files yet treat all the files in a tagged group as a single document. To update page numbers, you run one update instead of processing each chapter file separately.

Scientists and technical users should be happy with the equation editor, which is based on the Tex mathematical typesetting language. You build and manipulate equations by selecting icons on the main editing screen rather than in a separate editor.

#### **Grabbing Greater Graphics**

Ami Pro's already capable charting and drawing features are getting downright sophisticated—enough to steal some sales from low-end desktop publishing packages or maybe even from Lotus's Freelance. Frames have always been fundamental to Ami Pro's success with graphics—all text and graphic elements reside in these discrete holding areas, making it easy to manipulate them without affecting surrounding text. But now the frames don't have to be boring old rectangles-you can add rounded corners, create oval frames, apply automatic shadows, or shade them with any color. Additionally, you can place clip art in text and watch the text wrap while you edit.

In the old charting module, the miniature example chart in the dialog box was a dummy. Now it's live so you can manipulate it directly, avoiding lengthy screen refreshes and keeping you closer to the controls. Like the latest charting packages, *Ami Pro* offers 16 color schemes, and you can now chart negative data values and manually adjust chart perspective.

Lotus has also upgraded the drawing module. You can draw lines and arrows directly on a chart, draw freehand, sketch Bézier curves, and manually rotate both images and text in any direction without a dialog box detour. *Ami Pro* now ships with over 100 clip-art symbols instead of the previous handful. Not only can you save objects as BMP files and metafiles, you can completely edit a clip-art graphic after you've imported it.

#### At Play in the Fields of Power

Ami Pro's new power fields appear to do everything Word for Windows' automated templates do—more if you combine them with macros. Power fields are essentially variables that you place within crossreference marks embedded in the text. Power fields can also analyze other variables, sort of like conditional mail merge within your main document. For example, you can use a power field for numbering charts in sequence—it can automatically check to see what page a chart is on, determine its position relative to the other charts, then number it accordingly.


You gain further dexterity when you combine a power field with a macro. An IF...THEN statement connected to a power field in the text could check a sales figure from a table, perform a calculation, select from a list of phrases, and finally insert the words "encouraging results."

Advanced users can link power fields to macros to create intelligent forms that respond with pick lists, generate contact management systems, or develop hypertext doorways that sling you into other documents via Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links. As with *Word for Windows*, you can create stock templates of these power fields, saving them as style sheets.

Finally, the macros themselves are more versatile. Unlike with *Word for Windows*, you can attach macros directly to framed images, so clicking on a picture brings up additional information.

At least until the new version of *Word for Windows* comes out this fall, *Ami Pro* will reign as the premier *Windows* word processor. It's still somewhat easier to apply formats and manipulate graphics in *Ami Pro* than in Microsoft's baby, and *Ami Pro* is no longer missing major checklist items. It also carries the Lotus label, which should give buyers a sense of security.



You just acquired *Windows*, but you don't want to spend dollars or disk space on multiple stand-alone programs. Spinnaker Software, which recently bought Software Publishing's integrated packages, has been thinking about you. Its PFS:WindowWorks gives owners of small businesses, portables users, and others easy entry into the Windows world by integrating a word processor, a spreadsheet, a chart editor, a communications terminal, a data base manager, an address book, and a label maker in one package.

#### **Seven Easy Pieces**

The word processor—the most used module in any integrated package—is *Window*- Works' strongest feature. It tops a very capable set of word processor features with entrylevel desktop publishing abilities such as manual kerning, line drawing, and text wrapping. Spinnaker throws in Atech's on-the-fly font generator, *Publisher's Powerpak*, which comes with three WY-SIWYG fonts to make creating newsletters or presentations easier at print time.

For number crunchers, Spinnaker's spreadsheet provides ample features. It offers 40 basic mathematical, statistical, and financial functions and imports *1-2-3* WK1 and WKS files. To see a spreadsheet in graph form, simply cut and paste to the chart editor, where you can view your profits in nine chart styles. If you change the spreadsheet, the chart editor updates its graph, thanks to *Window*-*Works*' "hot links." If you dropped the graph into the word processing document, it's updated there too.

Unlike many integrated packages' communications modules, *WindowWorks*' is more than minimal. It supports the XMODEM and YMODEM protocols, and you can save log-on sequences using its scripting language.

A dBASE-compatible data base manager stores 32,000 records, and you can generate ten reports per data base. The package includes an address book and a label maker, which work with the data base for mass mailings and mergings.

Intuitive Integration

How does Windows aid Win-

dowWorks? You'll find desktop publishing enhancements; WindowWorks' menus are more consistent than its DOS predecessors'; and you needn't close or minimize one module before opening another. You also can share your work via the Clipboard with other Windows packages, such as Excel, although DDE links aren't supported.

WindowWorks takes up 2MB on your hard disk, and you may like its performance on less than a 386SX with 2MB of memory. But if you're moving to Windows and lack the budget or time to tackle full-blown applications right away—or if you simply want a taste of Windows applications—WindowWorks should do the trick.

#### The Norton Utilities Version 6.0

#### A Grab Bag of Data-Saver Utilities



The latest Norton Utilities sports a more descriptive menu with an Advise option that suggests possible solutions to your disk and DOS problems.

Unless you're an absolute newcomer to PCs, you've heard of *The Norton Utilities*—a comprehensive package of data savers best known for restoring erased files and recovering files from disk disasters. The latest release does all that better, sports an improved interface, and includes a powerful substitute for COMMAND.COM.

The Norton Utilities 6.0 is a veritable grab bag of goodies that includes more than two dozen programs. The utilities are grouped into four general categories: data recovery and disk repair, system performance enhancement, data security, and a miscellany of tools that make your time at the DOS prompt more productive.

If you spend a lot of time there, you'll be well served by *Norton*'s NDOS.COM replacement for COMMAND-. COM. An enhanced version of the 4DOS shareware product, NDOS.COM works just like COMMAND.COM except it implements four little-used DOS commands differently. It also adds a ton of features, among them on-line help and command history recall and editing. In addition, you get more flexible directory listings and command syntax (such as multiple commands on one line) and vastly improved batch file handling. All told, you have about 50 new commands at your disposal.

As in previous versions, the programs can be executed from the DOS prompt (Norton fully supports the new DOS 5.0) or launched interactively from a new master menu that's a significant improvement over the previous Norton Integrator. It boasts an optional graphical interface plus extensive customization capabilities. For example, you can add other programs to the menu, remove those you don't need, and modify the help screens. You can also specify a password to prevent access to some of the potentially destructive programs.

Although advanced users will certainly benefit the most from the product, novices will appreciate its lucid manuals and the on-screen help that always explains what the program is doing—and provides ample warnings of dangerous consequences.

Particularly handy is the new Advise menu option that proposes solutions to specific disk problems, DOS errors, and CHKDSK errors. Besides explaining what might be causing the problem, it guides you to the appropriate utility. The product is *Windows*aware and warns you if you attempt to perform operations such as disk defragmentation while *Windows* is active.

Other version 6 enhancements include speedier disk defragmentation, a Windows 3.0-compatible disk caching program, and expanded/extended memory support for the RAM-resident utilities. The Prune and Graft feature lets you relocate a directory easily, along with its subdirectories and files—with only a few keystrokes or mouse clicks. Version 6.0 lists for \$179, and \$39 for upgrades. —John Walkenbach



By year-end, MailMan should offer new options that integrate electronic forms. Current E-mail packages lack the intelligent fields needed for forms, and current form packages lack routing and tracking. MailMan should bridge this gap.

The later version should let you select a form such as an

expense report, fill it out, and send it to your boss, who electronically signs it for approval and sends copies to the appropriate people. By applying intelligent rules that you can base on content, the form will know where to route itself. For example, if the loan amount field is over \$10,000, the form is automatically forwarded to a senior bank officer.

Even without forms, *Mail-Man*'s friendly interface appears to make network E-mail easier to use. —*Eric Brown*

#### **Novell Consolidates NetWare Line**

**S**hopping for NetWare just got a lot easier, because the confusing array of NetWare flavors has merged into two.

For servers with many users, heavy traffic, or clientserver applications, there's NetWare 386 3.11 (see June's *Product Outlook*). For those with lesser demands, NetWare 2.2 offers easier installation and better memory management than the old NetWare 286 line, along with price breaks for smaller nets.

NetWare 2.2 combines all the features of the old ELS, Advanced, and SFT products (see "Can You Do Better Than NetWare?" March 1991). That means not only transaction tracking and the backup security of disk mirroring for highpowered servers, but also a nondedicated server option for small LANs and easy installation for do-it-yourselfers. Net-Ware 2.2 also supports Macintosh workstations, and new Mac utilities ease network management on mixed nets.

Veterans who've mastered the arcane Netgen installation process will appreciate the painless new installation routine and quick-start instructions, while new users will just assume that's how things ought to be done. You can say good-bye to that huge, timewasting pile of 360K floppies, too: NetWare 2.2 comes on the short stack of your choice, 1.2MB or 1.44MB disks.

Another welcome 2.2 feature is improved memory management. In previous versions, many functions made memory demands that, on heavily loaded servers, sometimes produced 'out of memory' errors that couldn't be fixed simply by adding more memory. In 2.2, NetWare's use of memory has been reorganized to give overburdened servers more breathing room.

NetWare 2.2 costs \$895 per

server for 5 users, \$1995 for 10, \$3495 for 50, and \$5495 for 100. Upgrades from earlier versions range from \$395 to \$4995. —*Robert Lauriston*



#### **Image Compression Packs a Wallop**



Squeeze those huge graphics files to  $\frac{1}{30}$  their original size without noticeable loss of image quality, or even smaller if precision isn't vital.

Shortly after you buy your first scanner, your hard disk starts looking about the size of something on the end of a toothpick. Even medium-resolution images fill up your platters PDQ. You could always buy another hard drive (if you have the space and don't mind switching between volumes), or you can try to squeeze more files onto the one you have with an image compressor.

*Picture Packer* gives you two ways to pack a picture. This \$79 program squashes disk-filling images down to <sup>1</sup>/<sub>30</sub> their original size without noticeable deterioration or down to <sup>1</sup>/<sub>50</sub> if you're willing to sacrifice image quality. The process is fairly quick: On a 20-MHz 386 computer, it takes 20 to 25 seconds to compress a 500K file to as little as 10K.

If you're a serious desktop publisher or presentation maker working with a superabundance of large graphics files, you can cut compression time down to less than 5 seconds by adding *Picture Packer*'s \$595 accelerator card, which uses a Texas Instruments digital signal processor. A \$100 coupon in every copy of the software means you won't be penalized if you try the software first and go for the accelerator card later.

*Picture Packer* will compress TARGA, TIFF, PCX, and GIF, a lineup that should cover most of the formats used for desktop presentation, publishing, and animation applications. However, *Picture Pack*- *er* converts them to TIFF or TARGA format, as you choose, so it outputs only those formats after decompression. It comes with an interface for DOS and one for *Windows 3.0*.

Like most programs of its ilk, Picture Packer utilizes Joint Photographic Experts Group (JPEG) compression to save time and space. No problem for graphics files, even when you intend to print them at 300 dpi. But the manufacturer doesn't recommend Picture Packer for compressing data base or text files. Also, you won't want to use the higher-compression sampling technique on scientific or color prepress graphics applications, where every pixel is precious. But you can set Picture Packer to save every bit and still get compression of 5 to 1.

Decompression integrates smoothly with your day-to-day applications, thanks to a memory-resident utility that requires only 19K of conventional memory. When you call up a compressed TARGA or TIFF file, the package automatically decompresses it for you without making you leave your application.

Video & Image Compression includes a royalty-free utility you can give to friends in case you want to speed your modem transmissions by sending compressed files. You need at least a 286-based PC for either version of *Picture Packer*, plus DOS 3.0 or later. —*Mark Henricks*

### SBT Database Accounting Library Professional Series Package Targets the High End

**H**oping to capitalize on the trend toward smaller systems, SBT has released a high-end accounting package for PCbased networks. *Database Accounting Library Professional Series* is for the company that wants to move its accounting system from a mini or mainframe to a PC net.

The *Professional Series* features pulldown menus and pop-up dialog boxes for easier data lookup. The program includes memo fields for keeping detailed notes on individual customers or vendors and customizable context-sensitive help.

Currently, only seven mod-

ules are available: general ledger, accounts receivable, accounts payable, sales order, purchase order, inventory control, and the required system manager module. But SBT plans a wider range of modules, as well as contact and communications manager options—both of which are currently available for the firm's *dBASE*-based Accounting Library Series Six. (SBT wrote the latest version in Fox's faster FoxPro.)

Professional Series requires 540K of memory (expanded memory is recommended), DOS 3.1 or later, 7MB of storage for the system manager, and 3MB for each module. A 386 is highly recommended. Individual modules sell for \$1295, except the inventory control module, which retails for \$395. Source code is included in the purchase price. —*Roberta Furger*





Microsoft invented Windows but did little to make programming in the environment anything but a chore. It took archrival Borland's Turbo Pascal for Windows and Borland C++ to make Windows program development—with traditional languages and

EXE file results—a reasonable undertaking. Microsoft is firing back with a relatively easy-to-use compiler, *Visual BASIC*.

Visual BASIC is easy to learn and use. It's intended for the part-time programmersomeone who needs something more versatile than Asymetrix's ToolBook but who isn't ready for Turbo Pascal for Windows. Visual BASIC is a screen painter with a BASIC compiler attached. You design a window with buttons, graphics, text boxes, whatever. In another window, you write BA-SIC code to define what occurs when an event (such as a click or keystroke) happens to that object.

The package feels a lot like *ToolBook* but produces EXE files that can be run inside *Windows* without a run time, and you're a step ahead if you

already know BASIC. However, unlike most language products, *Visual BASIC* leaves you stuck with the bundled editor because the source-code files contain binary graphic information as well as BASIC code. And the program can't do everything a C or Pascal compiler can; it doesn't support a lot of the weirder *Windows* events and functions. *Visual BASIC* is open ended so new capabilities can be added, but you'll probably need C to do it.

Visual BASIC requires Windows 3.0 and lists for \$199—as inexpensive as development tools for the nonprofessional should be. —Lincoln Spector

f keyboardless computers are to take their place alongside their keyboard-equipped cousins, they must be more than novelties. Thanks to ample processing power and extras like a touch-sensitive screen that responds to pen or finger, the Datellite 300 is powerful but won't tie you down.

With a 20-MHz 386SX CPU, the \$5995 Datellite 300 packs desktop-style punch. It lacks an internal floppy, but standard features include a math coprocessor socket, 2MB of memory expandable to 16MB on the system board, and a 40MB hard drive. There's no expansion chassis, but you can make connections through its SCSI port to a CD ROM drive or to external VGA monitors and keyboards through dedicated ports, and you may start asking yourself if you need your desktop.

At 6.6 pounds with battery, the Datellite is notebook light. Because the keyboard has been jettisoned, you rely mostly on the unit's VGA, 9-inch diagonal, backlit LCD screen with a touch-sensitive membrane that you tap with a stylus or your finger. You use the bundled DataSlate application generator to create applications for on-the-road data entry, and phrases for use in short memos, in concert with an on-screen "keyboard."

Driven by a finger instead

of a mouse, the Datellite 300 runs DOS applications and even *Windows 3.0*, so you can build your applications under both environments. The company claims that programs from other slate computers, including Grid's GridPad, can be ported without much trouble.

You can't create long documents on the Datellite 300 screen yet because it lacks handwriting recognition software. However, MicroSlate promises to support the recognition capabilities of Microsoft's *Pen Windows* and Go Corporation's PenPoint when these products appear.

Options include an external

1.44MB floppy for \$350, a 19ms internal 120MB SCSI hard drive for \$1000, a \$300 internal 2400-baud modem, and additional \$198 battery packs, each rated at 4 hours. —*Mark Henricks*

#### dBASE Finally Goes SQL—Sort of

Ashton-Tate has been talking about SQL support in *dBASE IV* for as long as it's been talking about *dBASE IV*. With the *dBASE IV Server Edition*, it's turning talk into action.


This version of *dBASE IV* lets you access SQL data off a server, in addition to working with standard DBF files. The initial release supports the Microsoft/Sybase SQL Server; Ashton-Tate promises that future versions will support other SQL dialects.

You can access SQL data through a combination of dBASE and SQL commands, either in programmed applications or interactively at the dot prompt. But that's as easy as it gets; *dBASE*'s excellent query-by-example data-retrieval method doesn't work on server-based data. And even when you've given up on menus and are programming your queries, you can't use such familiar dBASE commands as FIND and LIST WHILE with SQL tables.

What you can use is a hybrid language that combines the very different dBASE and SQL languages. For instance, you can use dBASE variables and functions in SQL statements, gaining more freedom than SQL itself allows. Other enhancements let you exploit SQL features—unheard of in dBASE—such as triggers and stored procedures that control the way data is written in a multiuser environment. Another feature lets you manipulate SQL data one row at a time, emulating dBASE's record orientation.

*dBASE IV Server Edition* is by no means a flawless integration of two very different ways of handling data, but for the time being, if you're committed to Ashton-Tate *dBASE* and wish to move on to *SQL*

Hayes has created a 3-ounce, 3-inch modem that you can easily slip into the pocket of your coat, your laptop carrying case, or your briefcase—and it lets you hook up to your own laptop or a PC you find at your destination. Moreover, the Hayes Pocket Edition 2400 comes in at \$179-a bargain compared with the \$300 price tags of some competitors.

The Pocket Edition proves an even smarter buy if you take advantage of its bundled *Smartcom EZ* software to send and receive faxes through an information service such as MCI while on the road. This method of faxing costs less than \$1 per page instead of the \$5 a page you pay at some hotels. Faxing from your own computer is more private and assures you of more legible transmissions. Smartcom EZ also contains other friendly features like the ability to dial and answer data transmissions from numbers in your own personal phone directory, an unlimited number of keyboard macros, and the ability to connect directly to a mainframe or mini. You also get on-line help.

Using an XMODEM protocol, Smartcom EZ steps down data speeds from 2400 baud to 300 baud as necessary. If XMODEM doesn't have enough error correction for your tastes, you can get a ZMODEM protocol by upgrading to Hayes's Smartcom Exec modem software. (The regular \$55 upgrades to Smartcom Exec are only \$35 through July 31.) However, even Exec lacks MNP-5's more powerful compression and error correction capabilities.





Unfortunately, the first release of *Norton Backup for Windows* doesn't support tape backup systems, although Symantec says that capability should be available in an upgrade due out this fall.

Everything else you would expect to find in a backup program is provided. You can perform both full and incremental backups. You can save your setup files for future backups, specifying the file types to back up by extension, date, and a number of other characteristics.

The program provides an attractive directory tree for selecting and excluding spe-

cific files. You can even view file contents on the fly to determine whether you want to include a specific file in the backup process.

But the slickest thing about Norton Backup for Windows is the interface. The program implements the Windows interface completely, with nicely designed scroll boxes, 3-D push buttons, and the like.

Operations are all point and shoot. The automated install

routine, for example, lets you select a different drive for installation by pointing to a drive icon instead of typing its name. And every step of the way, *Norton Backup* gives you complete information about the operation that's in progress.

The program works on Net-Ware (version 2.12 or later) and LAN Manager networks and costs \$129. —Patrick Marshall

#### **ZyIndex for Windows 1.0**

#### **How to Find Anything in Windows**

The old text-retrieval standby ZyIndex works like magic to sort and retrieve text files speedily, using whatever keywords you can recall. But it's always required an irksome routine of regular file indexing. The new Windows version of ZyIndex cuts through that bother by performing updates in the background while you go about your other business (and you can program Zy-Index to do this automatically at a given time each day or week).

In making the move to Windows, the already comprehensive ZyIndex gains new benefits while retaining a fairly modest 2MB memory requirement. ZyIndex for Windows can search on date ranges and perform quorum searches—that is, display files that contain, say, three terms out of a possible five. It also does away with the DOS version's file limitation: This program can search as many files as you can cram onto your hard disk.

ZyIndex enables you to write two lines of search conditions and use wild cards for a fuzzy search. You can set up Boolean conditions, and you can even conduct synonym searches using the program's on-line thesaurus.

ZyIndex's speed comes at a cost. The program needs to generate and regularly update an index of your word processing files. The index usually requires 20 percent of the volume of the original files, meaning that indexing 20MB of word processing files can require another 4MB of disk space.

A few niggling limitations mar the program's otherwise powerful set of features. Though ZyIndex for Windows can index and search pretty much any word processing file, your spreadsheet, data base, and desktop publishing files remain out of reach unless you save them in ASCII format. And the Windows program lacks DOS-based ZyIndex Plus's report generator though this is a quibble for a program that costs only \$395. —Matthew Lake



## Screen Gems: Super-VGA Boards

Select the right souped-up VGA board from the ten reviewed here, and enjoy a sharper, flicker-free image with a magnitude more colors.

hether you're tired of your old monochrome display or you're finding plain EGA or VGA too confining, now is the perfect time to upgrade your display system to super VGA. For just a few hundred dollars, a new display board can dramatically improve the look of your screen and take the strain off your eyes by reducing screen flicker.

At all-time low prices, most of today's video boards can give you more pixels than plain VGA's 640 across by 480 down. What makes super-VGA boards super is their two extra modes, 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768. With these higher resolutions, *Windows* will be able to fit more windows on the same monitor, and spreadsheet users can view more cells with less scrolling. And wait till you feast your eyes on graphics at 1024 by 768 with 256 colors—they're not photograph quality, but they come remarkably close.

The only drawback to running applications at these higher resolutions is slower performance. But unlike the last generation of super-VGA boards, this batch sacrifices remarkably little speed—typically less than 10 percent—a trade-off that most users seem perfectly willing to live with.

Many super-VGA boards offer another bonus: ergonomic benefits in the form of reduced flicker. Much of the eyestrain and fatigue you feel after staring at the screen for long periods can be traced to flicker from two sources—slow *refresh* and *interlaced scanning*. Refresh refers to the number of screens the board draws per second; the more the better. Interlaced scanning which is an issue only at 1024 by 768—is a cost-saving technique that unfortunately increases sensitivity to flicker.

Many super-VGA boards provide noninterlaced scanning and a screen refresh rate of 70 or 72 Hz—an eyepleasing combination that can increase productivity. If your monitor supports these enhancements, you'll notice the benefits immediately. Even if it doesn't, since these features add virtually nothing to the price, we recommend selecting a board that offers them should you switch to a better monitor (see the sidebar "Make Your Monitor Flicker Free").



#### **Getting Beyond VGA**

The secret to super-VGA resolutions and colors lies in the software drivers that come with each board. A driver enables a board to work with a specific application at a fixed super-VGA resolution; you need a separate driver for each application and each super-VGA mode. Without one, you're stuck with plain old VGA.

Most of the boards reviewed here provide an excellent selection of super-VGA drivers for the most popular business applications, including 1-2-3 and Windows. The advantage for Windows users is loading only one 800 by 600 or 1024 by 768 driver to run all Windows apps at that resolution. For text applications, most boards also have a 132-column mode, giving you more work space.


You can install a super-VGA board in virtually any PC, but some boards make the job easier than others. Those that force you to set jumpers or DIP switches are the most difficult. If you're upgrading from a monochrome display or if your PC has built-in VGA, you may have to set DIP switches or jumpers on the PC's motherboard too. However, walk-through instructions in each board's manual take much of the sting out of installing the hardware. In most cases, you can plug and play, but only two boards—ATI's VGA Wonder XL and Boca's SuperVGA—can promise that for any situation.

To help you select the best super VGA at the lowest price, we probed and prodded ten super-VGA boards. We checked out their screen flicker and benchmarked them for performance. In the speed tests, we found little to differentiate between the boards at 640 by 480 resolution, so we confined our benchmarks to 800 by 600 and 1024 by 768. Even then, only the *AutoCAD* tests—and to a lesser degree the *PowerPoint* tests—split up the pack. We also assessed the boards' ease of installation and the manufacturers' warranty and support.

We were pleasantly surprised to find that the software compatibility problems that beset earlier super-VGA boards were no longer in evidence. Two of the boards in this roundup, the ATI VGA Wonder XL and the Boca SuperVGA, merit a Best Buy. A couple of other boards are notable smart buys, and as a whole it's hard to go wrong.

#### Super VGA: The Eyes Have It

Super-VGA boards give you two extra-sharp resolutions and 256 colors instead of 16. To take advantage of these enhancements, the board you buy must include software that specifically supports the application you want to use.

#### **ATI VGA Wonder XL**



**PROS:** Switchless setup, menu-driven software installation, mouse included

**CONS:** Middle-of-the-road performance

With menu-driven hardware and software driver installation, the ATI VGA Wonder XL is the easiest board to install and configure. Furthermore, it comes with a mouse port and a threebutton mouse yet sells for a mere \$259 on the street with 512K of RAM making it a clear Best Buy.

The VGA Wonder XL is the only board in this roundup to provide flickerfree 72-Hz screen refresh at all resolutions, even with a large, expensive, flicker-free monitor.

If you use *PowerPoint* or *AutoCAD*, however, you might want to consider a faster board. In our *PowerPoint* speed tests, the VGA Wonder XL fell far back in the field. In the *AutoCAD* benchmarks, it consistently ran in the middle of the pack.

The ATI VGA Wonder XL is an excellent board to have around as flicker-free high-resolution monitors get cheaper. It's a truly switchless board and has the smoothest driver installation of the bunch—a boon for those who frequently switch between DOS applications. It's a distinct Best Buy, especially if you don't already have a mouse.

#### **Boca SuperVGA**



**PROS:** Lowest price, switchless hardware installation

**CONS:** Menuless driver installation

With a street price of \$160 with 512K of RAM, Boca's SuperVGA is the bargain of the roundup. Even at this price, the board doesn't skimp on drivers, and it's

the only one besides the ATI with switchless installation.

800 X 600 X

The SuperVGA delivers flicker-free 72-Hz screen refresh at all resolutions except 1024 by 768. This makes the board a cost-effective match for topquality 14-inch multiscan monitors that can run at 72 Hz at 800 by 600, such as Seiko's CM 1440.

As with the ATI, you can plug and play the SuperVGA—even on a networked machine. Without its rival's menu-driven driver installation, however, switching between DOS applications in extended modes will require a bit more work.

For a board with the lowest price in town, the SuperVGA shows a lot of spunk and sparkle. It was a bit faster than the ATI in the *AutoCAD* tests, hardware installation is just as easy, and it even comes with a five-year warranty. Unless you plan to buy an expensive monitor that's flicker free at 1024 by 768, this is the Best Buy board for you.

#### **Buying Smart**

Good news! Unlike the VGA boards of yore, today's super-VGA boards seem devoid of serious compatibility problems with either hardware or software. They're also considerably faster. If you want to use high-resolution super-VGA modes, though, the board you buy must specifically support the application you use.



#### **SOFTWARE SUPPORT**

Without a special super-VGA software driver for

your application, you'll see that application at standard 640 by 480 VGA resolution with 16 colors. All the super-VGA boards in this review come with drivers that enable them to run at the two super-VGA resolutions—800 by 600 and 1024 by 768-with Windows, 1-2-3, Auto-CAD, WordPerfect, and Ventura. Other boards add support for Word, WordStar, OS/2, and more. Make sure the board you buy has the driver you need.

Colors are just as important as a sharp image, and whether you get 16 or 256 depends on the driver and the amount of RAM on board. If you have a graphics-intensive task in mind—say, previewing a color slide in PowerPoint or working with more than 16 layers in AutoCAD—a 256color image at a full 1024 by 768 may be in order. To get that many colors at that resolution, you'll need 1MB of RAM—and some boards hold no more than 512K.

Note that super-VGA life is easiest under Windows. Load a single super-VGA Windows driver, and that's it. Along with the environment itself, all Windows applications benefit from the enhanced resolution and colors.



#### FLICKER-FREE SUPPORT

The latest, greatest feature of these boards is flicker-free operation. Standard VGA boards drive a monitor at 60 screens per second (or 60 Hz), creating a perceptible flicker. You can plug all but one of these boards into a standard multiscan such as the NEC MultiSync 3D and run the monitor in standard VGA resolution at 70 or 72 Hz. That's fast enough to prevent most users from noticing the flicker, making the screen easier on the eyes.

The same boards that give you flicker-free operation at standard VGA resolution can also offer that performance at 800 by 600—but for that you need a better multiscan, such as Seiko's CM 1440. Monitors of this type also perform 60-Hz noninterlaced scanning at 1024 by 768. Noninterlaced scanning reduces the user's ability to perceive flicker—but at 60 Hz, it's still noticeable.

Only the ATI VGA Wonder XL and the Genoa SuperVGA 6400A offer true flicker-free performance at 1024 by 768. You have to spend at least \$1000 on the street to buy a monitor that can give you that. But by the end of this year, the price for monitors in this class may come down. Look for flicker-free performance at 1024 by 768 if you see a top-of-the-line monitor in your future.



#### EASE OF INSTALLATION

Ideally, installing a super-VGA board should be a plug-andplay operation. The ATI VGA Wonder XL and the Boca SuperVGA sense your hard-ware configuration and basically install themselves. But most boards require that you flip a couple

of DIP switches or move a jumper, depending on whether a network board is present, how much RAM is installed, whether you opt for flickerfree performance, and so on.

Once you've installed the card, you need to install a separate driver for each application you want to use at super-VGA resolution. If you plan to soup up several applications, you'll need to switch drivers frequently; look for a board that offers menu-driven driver installation.



#### PERFORMANCE

We found little speed difference between

boards with most of the applications we tested. The exceptions were in the AutoCAD and PowerPoint benchmarks. If you plan on using either of these applications, pay close attention to the two tests.

The biggest performance variance shows up between modes rather than between boards. Expect about a 10 percent performance hit when you upgrade from standard VGA resolution to 800 by 600, and an additional 5 percent when you switch to 1024 by 768. With an application like PowerPoint that actually uses 256 colors, expect another 5 percent slowdown in any mode when you switch from 16 to 256 colors.



#### SERVICE AND SUPPORT

Access to new drivers is a prime service issue for most super-VGA users. Being able to

download the latest versions from an electronic bulletin board service is a great benefit. For installation problems, toll-free tech support is a big plus, and technical fax support is helpful for quick-fix answers.

#### **Everex Viewpoint VRAM**

**PROS:** Excellent Windows performance **CONS:** Expensive; difficult installation

The Everex Viewpoint VRAM is harder to install and configure than most boards. Combine this with a \$392 street price—the highest in the roundup and you'll wonder whether the board's fast *PowerPoint* and *Excel* performance make the Viewpoint an appealing purchase.

One way of curbing the board's high price is to buy it configured with ordinary RAM instead of video RAM (VRAM); this can save you either \$100 (for 512K) or \$200 (for 1MB). The tradeoff is a slight decrease in speed.

Installation can be difficult for two reasons: You have to install software drivers without a menu, and you may need to set both DIP switches and jumpers. Even when you follow the manual's instructions, you may need to make additional changes. During testing we had to reconfigure a hard disk controller card before the system would boot. Fortunately, the company's toll-free technical support proved extremely helpful.

It's unfortunate, though, that calling Everex's 800 number may be necessary. High price and potentially tricky installation make the Viewpoint less appealing than many.

#### Genoa SuperVGA 6400A

**PROS:** Flicker-free operation in all modes **CONS:** No 1MB version, one-year warranty

The Genoa SuperVGA 6400A goes for a moderate \$248 on the street and offers flicker-free 70-Hz screen refresh all the way up to 1024 by 768. With a RAM limit of 512K, however, you can enjoy that resolution with only 16 colors.

A growing number of *Windows* applications use 256 colors, allowing you to preview color slides and run monitorbased presentations. You can get 256 colors from this board—but only if you never go beyond 800 by 600. As for performance, the board fell well below the

#### **Make Your Monitor Flicker Free**

#### Eric Knorr

You've been staring at the screen for hours. Your eyes are so tired, the image on your monitor seems to be flickering. Well, guess what? It is.

Standard VGA monitors take onesixtieth of a second to create a complete image of 480 lines. That may sound fast, but it's not quite fast enough to fool your eyes into seeing a perfectly stable image.

You probably wouldn't notice flicker on a screen displaying 60 screens per second (or 60 Hz) of text on a black background. But with a light background—typical of so many *Windows* applications—you can see it. Even if you don't notice, the flicker affects your eyes, causing them to strain and tire over time.

Studies show that the faster the screen refreshes, the fewer people sense flicker. Most of the super-VGA boards in this review can drive a monitor at either 70 or 72 Hz welcome news for sore eyes.



You need the right monitor to take advantage of a super-VGA board's flicker-free performance. A standard VGA monitor won't do it's fixed at 60 Hz. But many of today's color monitors are *multiscans*, which means their screen can be scanned at any speed within a given range. For example, any multiscan, including NEC's ever-popular Multi-Sync 3D, can be driven at 70 or 72 Hz at standard VGA resolution, 640 by 480. Many newer multiscans—not the 3D, however—can also run flick72 Hz

er free at 800 by 600.

If you want flicker-free performance at the top super-VGA resolution, 1024 by 768, be prepared to pony up some big bucks for the monitor. Fortunately, support for 70 or 72 Hz at any resolution costs next to nothing on the board side (the ATI VGA Wonder XL and the Genoa SuperVGA 6400A are the only boards reviewed to offer flicker-free operation at 1024 by 768). Better, the cost of high-resolution, flicker-free multiscans promises to plummet in the near future.







mean in both the AutoCAD and Power-Point tests.

At 70 Hz, the SuperVGA 6400A displays two screens fewer per second than 72-Hz boards. But unless you have oscilloscopes for eyes, you won't notice the difference.

Genoa's warranty expires after one year, and the SuperVGA 6400A's speed won't thrill you. Flicker-free performance across all modes is this board's main selling point. If you want a flickerless 1024 by 768 image from a 16-inch monitor such as NEC's MultiSync 4D, this board and the ATI VGA Wonder XL are your only choices.

#### **Orchid ProDesigner II**

**PROS:** Fast AutoCAD performance

**CONS:** Expensive

The most outstanding feature of the Orchid ProDesigner II is speed—it tied for first place in the key AutoCAD tests. Other than that, the board has an average set of features and a fairly high \$304 street price.

Like most boards in this roundup, the ProDesigner II offers flicker-free 72-Hz performance at all resolutions except 1024 by 768. That may limit your options, but on today's 14-inch multiscans, most people won't experiment beyond 800 by 600 anyway.

The board isn't quite plug and play, but unless a network board is present, you probably won't have to mess with the board's handful of jumpers. Driver installation involves issuing commands from the DOS prompt instead of simply choosing menu options.

Thanks to its speedy performance, AutoCAD users may want to consider this board seriously. In addition, by the time you read this, Orchid will be shipping a new version of the ProDesigner II (the IIs) that will list for \$120 less and purportedly will offer the same speed, 70-Hz refresh at 1024 by 768, and a special upgrade that will support over 32,000 colors under Windows. These new features should make the Pro-Designer IIs one of the hottest super-VGA boards around.

#### Paradise VGA 1024

PROS: Easy hardware setup

CONS: No 1MB version, no flicker-free modes, slow AutoCAD performance

Like the Genoa SuperVGA 6400A, the Paradise VGA 1024 tops out at 512Kand at \$254 on the street, it sells for about the same price. It's the only board in the roundup that won't refresh the screen at 70 or 72 Hz in any mode.

The board is easy enough to install; there are no jumpers to set, just two DIP switches. However, switching drivers could be simpler-you have to do it from the DOS prompt instead of from a menu.

The board includes drivers for all the usual applications, but the memory cap means you won't find any 256-color drivers for 1024 by 768 operation-a disappointment if you're a business graphics user interested in previewing slides. Furthermore, compared with the other entries, this board performs slowly with AutoCAD.


For beyond-VGA graphics, the Paradise VGA 1024 falls short. You can do better for less.

#### SigmaVGA Legend

**PROS:** Easy driver installation **CONS:** One-year warranty

The SigmaVGA Legend has two things going for it: menu-driven driver installation and the second-largest assortment of software drivers in the roundup. Its shortcoming is a scant one-year warranty.

The Legend is one of three boards reviewed that have easy, menu-driven driver installation. And while hardware installation isn't completely switchless, it comes close. The only jumpers you have to set are for the 72-Hz screen



refresh (which tops out at 800 by 600) and the interrupt jumper (if the board coexists with a network card).

Two things may limit this board's longevity. First, it's one of two boards that come with only a one-year warranty. Second, it won't support flicker-free 72-Hz refresh at 1024 by 768. When new low-cost 72-Hz monitors emerge, you won't be able to take full advantage of them.

All factors considered, this board falls squarely in the middle of the pack. Easy software and hardware installation and a moderate price earn the SigmaVGA Legend a solid recommendation. At press time, Sigma announced the Legend II, which promises faster operation as well as more colors or faster screen refresh rates for its various resolutions.

## STB PowerGraph Ergo-VGA

**PROS:** Low price, fast AutoCAD performance

**CONS:** Menuless driver installation

At a street price of \$201 with 512K of RAM, STB's PowerGraph Ergo-VGA is one of the three least expensive boards reviewed. It's an attractive buy, offering both fast performance and nearly switchless installation.

The PowerGraph tied for first place in the AutoCAD tests. CAD performance hounds should note that this board lists for \$200 less than Orchid's equally speedy ProDesigner II.

As with the SigmaVGA Legend, you may have to move a jumper or two: one for 72-Hz screen refresh at 800 by 600, and the other to avoid conflicts with your network card. When you install drivers, there are no menus; you must do so from

If you use *AutoCAD* and you're looking for a fast VGA board at a bargain price, the PowerGraph is an excellent choice.

## Trident Impact III

**PROS:** Low cost, widest software support **CONS:** Slow performance

The Trident Impact III costs only \$12 more on the street than the rock-bottom Boca SuperVGA. Amazingly, for that low \$172 price, you get the widest selection of drivers in the roundup.

Trident provides 132-column drivers for *Word* and *WordStar*, plus 256-color drivers in all super-VGA resolutions for both *Windows* and *AutoCAD*. You don't get a menu for swapping drivers, though, and hardware installation isn't switchless.

The board's speed could be better. In most of the key performance benchmarks, the Impact III hovered in the bottom third.

If you like the idea of 132-column word processing in *Word*, this board is your best choice. Otherwise, bargain hunters would do better to opt for the superior performance, switchless installation, and even lower price of the Boca SuperVGA.

## Video Seven VRAM II

**PROS:** Top Windows performance, easy software installation

**CONS:** Expensive, no 256-color AutoCAD drivers

The Video Seven VRAM II zips through *Windows* like there's no tomorrow—it came in first in every *Excel* test and won two out of three *PowerPoint* tests. At \$370 it also has the second-highest street price, which buys you a very generous seven-year warranty.

The board also offers the second-best selection of drivers and a menu-driven utility to load them. However, the lack of 256-color *AutoCAD* drivers and the lackluster *AutoCAD* performance should discourage users of that application.

Unique among the boards reviewed, the VRAM II requires a special daughtercard when you upgrade from 512K to 1MB. The daughtercard lists for a whopping \$200, and unlike with the Everex Viewpoint VRAM, you can't swap in ordinary RAM to save money.

This is a fast, top-quality board for *Windows*, with the longest warranty we've seen, but the price may deter you.

## **A Bevy of Smart Buys**

Super-VGA technology keeps getting better. The boards in this roundup are

faster; easier to install, and more reliable than last year's models, and most add flicker-free operation for easier viewing. All but one earn a Good overall rating or better.

The bar has been raised, and ATI's VGA Wonder XL and Boca's SuperVGA come away with Best Buys because they soar just a little bit higher. They're the only boards to offer the ease of truly trouble-free switchless installation. ATI piles on the features—including a mouse, menu-driven driver installation, and flicker-free performance for even the best monitors—while Boca slaps on an unbelievably low price and a reassuring five-year warranty.

One final note before you snap up one of these winners: Make the salesperson at your local PC retailer earn his or her pay. Find the board you want, and hook it up to your monitor or to the one you plan to buy. Run it with every application you plan to use, in every super-VGA mode. With the right combination, you'll see lovely, flicker-free images that will stand you in good stead for years to come. 章





## All-in-One Business Software

If you're an occasional user or a laptop jockey, one of these low-cost integrated packages can handle all your word processing, spreadsheet, data management, and communications needs.

George Campbell

hat's the first thing you do after acquiring a computer? You buy a collection of applications to go with it, of course. Combined, they can be almost as expensive as the computer itself. And learning how to use one program will in no way help you learn the others: They all behave differently.

And what if that new computer is a laptop with a small hard disk—or no hard disk at all? If you try taking all those programs on the road, you may find yourself shuffling floppies like a talentless magician trying a halfremembered card trick. If you seem to need more software than you can afford, store, or learn, you've got another option. A single, inexpensive, integrated package can provide word processing, data management, a spreadsheet, modem communications, and desktop utilities, all for less than \$200. And integrated programs are truly cheap dates, working just fine on floppy-based, XT-class machines with a minimum of disk space. If you don't need the heavy power of stand-alone programs and you're looking for an easy way to coordinate all your computing jobs, one of these packages may be the answer.

At their best, the various modules in an integrated package work together much better than separate programs do, even *Windows* applications. The better integrated programs use the same menus as you go from one module to another, making them easy both to learn and to use. They also let you exchange data easily—five of the six programs reviewed here, for instance, let you merge data directly from your data base to your word processor. Such magic is still a dream in *Windows*.

## What's In, What's Out

You'll find all the essentials in these packages, but not the complicated extras. Consider the module most people use more than any other, the word processor. You can check spelling and do some basic editing, but don't expect to create the fancy reports and newsletters you can in *WordPerfect*. The other modules tend to be similar: You can crunch numbers, maintain data base records, or get on line, but don't look for back-solving spreadsheet analysis or complex data base file linking.

If these limitations seem too confining but you still want a tightly integrated package, you have another option—a more powerful, more expensive integrated program such as *Lotus Symphony* or *Framework*. But if you need the additional power, you'll probably be happier with one of the standalone programs that are designed to do one thing and generally do it very well.

We looked at six inexpensive integrated packages and found one Best Buy—*Microsoft Works*. It's outstandingly easy to use, offers excellent integration between modules, and its all-important word processor stands clearly above the rest.

## Eight-in-One 2.03

**PROS:** Low cost, good word processor, excellent desktop utilities

**CONS:** Little data exchange between modules, limited spreadsheet and data base tools, no macros

Spinnaker's *Eight-in-One* isn't as powerful as most of its rivals, but its amazingly low \$59.95 price makes it a good buy if you need a capable little word processor backed up with a welldesigned calendar, calculator, and other desktop tools.

*Eight-in-One's* desktop accessories

could succeed as a stand-alone utility collection. The outliner lets you attach extensive notes to each heading, and the alarm clock includes a timer and stopwatch.

Overall, the program is easy to learn and use. The function you need is usually where you'd expect to find it, and the menus remain consistent from module to module. On-screen, mouse-clickable buttons and easy-to-remember <**A**lt>*key* shortcuts make common options handy. But it's the only program in the roundup that won't let you automate common tasks with macros.

Although they use similar menus, *Eight-in-One*'s modules are hardly aware of each others' existence. You can't even send data from the spreadsheet or data base to the word processor—without going through an intermediary file.

*Eight-in-One* has a competent word processor. You can preview pages, and you can insert PCX-format commercial clip art. But some of the typing conventions are odd; the keystrokes you use to move the cursor, for instance, are neither conventional nor sensible.

The other modules are less powerful. The spreadsheet lacks named ranges, so you can't name a section of a worksheet for easy reference elsewhere, and the simple, nonrelational data base won't even let you view records together in a table so you can browse through and find the ones you need.

*Eight-in-One* is a so-so value if you crunch numbers or manage data. But its exceptional desktop tools, capable word processor, and low price make it a superb value for light word work.

## Enable BP 1.0

**PROS:** 3-D spreadsheet, pop-up lists aid data entry

**CONS:** Inconsistent interface, no mouse support, no thesaurus

If you're looking for a powerful spreadsheet, the \$199 *Enable BP* is a bargain—provided you don't mind an old-

## **Buying Smart: Making an Integrated Choice**

If you opt for one inexpensive program to cover all your tasks, you want it to be easy to learn, well integrated, and relatively powerful, at least in the modules you're likely to use most (generally the word processor). You can't expect an integrated module to have the features of a good stand-alone program, but you should demand the features that will help you get your job done.



## **EASE OF USE**

If you can't do your job without digging into a

pile of manuals, you've got yourself a productivity problem. Look for logically designed pulldown menus that can help you find what you're looking for. You'll also want keyboard shortcuts and easy-to-record macros to help speed up your work. If you use a mouse, you'll want that supported as well.

## INTEGRATION


For all its parts, an integrated program should

work as a whole, letting you move--and move your data--easily between modules. Look for a consistent menu structure and the ability to view multiple modules on screen and cut and paste between them. Macros should work across modules, and the word processor should print charts from the spreadsheet and merge information directly from your data base. You should be able to print in the background so you can go about one job while putting another on paper. Finally, the program should integrate with the outside world, reading and writing files from popular, stand-alone programs.



## WORD PROCESSOR Most users process

words more than they do numbers or data, so this module is the most important. All the programs reviewed have a spelling checker, but look also for a thesaurus and the ability to select fonts from a menu. You'll also want to see formatting choices on screen as you edit, and preview your page graphically before printing it.



## DATA BASE

plex task, and these packages don't pretend to offer the power of a Q&A, let alone a Paradox. Still, a good integrated package should give you the tools to create a simple mailing list or contact manager. All the programs offer capable form and report designers, but you'll also want to view multiple records in an on-screen table or one record on a form and to query by form. For instance, you should be able to type 'CA' in the form's state field to get information on everyone who lives in California.

Other tools can come in handy as your data needs grow. If a program offers relational lookups, you'll be able to reference data from one data file in another, for instance, to check a company address that's saved separately from a contact's name.



## SPREADSHEET

You'll use the spreadsheet module for bud-

gets, expense accounting, and financial planning. If you can assign names to data ranges, your formulas will be easier to read and write; TOTAL SALES + (TOTAL SALES\*TAX) certainly makes a lot more sense than @SUM(B8..B18)+(@SUM(B8..B18)\*E64).

Graphs from your spreadsheet data can help you see—and express ----the trends in your numbers. Look for several chart formats and, if you need to impress others, access to multiple fonts from inside your charts.



## COMMUNICATIONS

If you have a modem, you'll want to let it do its job without making a big fuss. Most important: Look for a dialing directory that lets you place a call by picking a service from a list. You'll also want a script language (or at least a "record" feature) that lets you automate the log-on procedure for each service. An on-line text editor, something all these programs have, will help you move incoming data to other modules while connected. All these programs support the ubiquitous XMODEM file-transfer protocol, so you'll have no trouble sending and receiving files. Only a few of these programs, however, support faster protocols like YMODEM and ZMODEM.



## **DESKTOP ACCESSORIES**

These handy tools let you work all day without

leaving your integrated package. Look for a calendar and to-do list for scheduling, an alarm clock to remind you of appointments, and a pop-up calculator for simple math. Other useful tools include a file manager that lets you avoid the DOS prompt and an outliner to help you organize your thoughts before you put them down in your word processor.

fashioned interface. Even a simple task like marking a range of cells requires multiple key presses rather than a simple click and drag with the mouse. Mastering that spreadsheet will be of little help if you try using *Enable BP*'s other modules—each one has a different interface.

Learning *Enable* is a challenge. Many tasks—viewing a list of files, for instance—require more keystrokes than they should. To do any but the simplest data base or communications tasks, you need to put on your nerd cap and start programming. And as if to flaunt its complexity, the program comes with nine manuals—a laptop user's nightmare.

Fortunately, the capable spreadsheet handles a full array of powerful number-crunching chores. You can even reference a cell or range from another worksheet to, for instance, read sales commission figures from one file into a sales report in another. And when you import a *1-2-3* or *SuperCalc* file, the macros still work. If you want to produce charts, your options include 3-D charting and exploded pie charts.

For only \$199, *Enable BP* offers plenty of spreadsheet power, but its clunky interface will put off many users.

## Framework XE 1.0

**PROS:** Tightly integrated modules, five communications protocols

**CONS:** Complex interface, undocumented command language

With its powerful programming language, *Framework XE* is well suited for work groups with at least one technically proficient person. And thanks to the everything-but-the-kitchen-sink communications module, members of those work groups will be able to take their jobs on the road. But going it alone, you'll be hard-pressed to learn *XE*'s arcane interface.

Concepts like *frame trays*, *in and out keys*, and *containing frames* make this program a tough study. For exam-

## Is the High End a Dead End? Susan Lusty

At first glance, a high-end integrated program like Symphony or Framework may seem like a wise choice. Even though it costs about four or five times as much as the programs in this roundup, it's much cheaper than a collection of separate applications. It's also more powerful than a low-cost integrated package, although still no match for a good stand-alone program.

Yet, high-end integrated packages have some drawbacks. One key reason to buy any integrated package is to get productive as quickly and easily as possible, but high-end integrated packages aren't nearly as easy to use as their less expensive siblings. It's worth noting that Enable BP and Framework XE, the two programs in this roundup to inherit their interface from high-end software, are the most difficult we reviewed.

One reason for the recent growth of the low-end packages is the boom in laptop sales—these small-footprint programs are perfect for users who don't want to be caught on the road without a full tool kit. But the high-end packages take too much disk space for optimal laptop use especially if your laptop still lacks a hard drive.

In addition, you'll likely wait a long time between upgrades with the high-end packages. Due to the difficulty of upgrading multiple high-end modules and a lack of sales, most high-end packages have fallen behind the times.

Meanwhile, vendors are actively pursuing (and upgrading) the low end. As noted, Enable Software and Ashton-Tate have both shipped scaled-back versions of their Enable and Framework packages, while Lotus Development, the maker of Symphony, acquired the smallerscaled Alpha Works, renaming it Lotus Works.

The growing number of Windows applications, which offer a unified interface and easy data exchange between programs, are hurting the sales of high-end packages. Even DOS users have alternatives: "families" of programs---such as WordPerfect, DrawPerfect, and DataPerfectthat use a common interface and can be linked together with common macros. What's more, stand-alone applications are becoming more inclusive-WordPerfect, for instance, has crude spreadsheet abilities, and word processing add-ins are available for 1-2-3.

With the steady flow of new users, and especially new laptop users, low-end integrated packages have a bright future. But the high end appears to be going...going...gone.

ple, to customize the program by writing a macro that pauses for input, you must master a full programming language—and you have to buy *XE*'s big brother, *Framework*, for the documentation. When creating a data base, you have to tell *Framework* how many fields you'll need before you name them,

and the option to define field types (text, numbers, dates, and so on) is hidden away on the Numbers menu.

If you can master the front end, you'll find that all of *Framework XE*'s pieces fit together nicely. You can cut and paste easily between its multiple on-screen applications, and size and move its windows for a good look at what you're doing.

If you just look at features, *Framework XE*'s communications module can't be beat; you even get modem-only support for Novell's Message Handling System (MHS) E-mail standard, so you can phone into your LAN for messages. But if you try the module, you'll find a clumsy design makes it extremely difficult to set up. For instance, to add an entry to the dialing directory, you have to exit *Framework* and use the install program.

Like its big brother, *Framework XE* is well integrated and highly configurable. If your company is already using *Framework*, this low-end version is a good choice for staff with lesser demands. Otherwise, the program's strengths don't offset the learning curve.

## Lotus Works 1.0

**PROS:** Powerful data base and spreadsheet, selectable menu styles

**CONS:** One font per document, difficult data base searches

Known as *Alpha Works* before Lotus Development acquired it, *Lotus Works* provides strong spreadsheet and data base modules. *Lotus Works* is a fairly good integrated package, but *Microsoft Works* covers the same territory better and is easier to use.

You can get going quickly in *Lotus Works* without using the manual, and if you have problems, the program comes with six months of toll-free technical support, the most generous in the roundup. Another plus: You can switch easily between pulldown and *1-2-3*-style menus. If you're sharing data with coworkers' nonintegrated programs, *Alpha Works* is a great choice. Its native spreadsheet and data base file formats are the WKI and DBF standards.

But the program's quirks may slow you down. For instance, you can't use your mouse to mark a block without pressing a key first, and even in the word processor, the slash key brings up the menu bar—you have to press it *twice* to type a slash. The menus differ more than is necessary from module to module.

Not surprisingly, *Lotus Works* has a very good spreadsheet, complete with named ranges and a full set of functions. Graphing options, on the other hand, are the most limited in the roundup.

The other modules vary in quality, but each lacks an important feature. The communications module supports the speedy YMODEM protocol, but there's no dialing directory. And while the data base has some powerful filelinking capabilities, searching for data is complicated; to find John Jones, you'd have to type LastName = "Jones" + FirstName = "John". The word processor limits you to one font per document.

Lotus Works has a fine spreadsheet and some other good tools. But a disappointing interface and word processor make it only a fair value.

## Microsoft Works 2.0



**PROS:** Easy interface, onscreen windowing, font support, easy data searches

**CONS:** No dialing directory, background printing, or outliner

Microsoft Works backs up a superb interface with powerful tools. The program bears a family resemblance to Windows, so you'll have no trouble switching either way. Fully mousable, Microsoft Works also works just fine rodent-free, with easy-to-remember <**Chrl>**-key shortcuts for most operations. Some of its rivals may offer online tutorials, but only Microsoft Works lets you take a lesson from the Help menu. Unless you demand top-notch communications, it's a clear Best Buy.

Integration between modules is excellent, with a consistent menu bar serving all modules. To select data for cutting and pasting between modules, you simply drag the mouse or use shifted



**Microsoft Works 2.0** comes out on top as a Best Buy, with its easy-to-use Windows-like interface, full integration, and excellent word processing module. **Eight-in-One**, with solid word processing, a full set of desk accessories, and a low price, comes in a distant second.

**Spreadsheet** rates the program's ability to calculate, analyze, and graph numeric data. Ta receive an Excellent rating, a program must let yau name ranges of cells. It must also let yau create at least eight chart farmats, and affer a minimum af four fants for titles and labels.

**Communications** ratings cansider how well yau can communicate by modem or network. An Excellent rating requires a dialing directory that lets you add new entries withaut exiting the pragram, at least ane file transfer protocol besides XMODEM, the ability to edit text while an line, a script language, and at least five terminal emulations.

**Desktop accessories** evaluates additional tools that can increase productivity. An Excellent rating demands a pap-up calculatar, a calendar, a to-do list, an alarm clack with reminders, an autliner, and a DOS file manager.

**Overall value** is averaged fram the abave ratings, with extra weight given ta ease of use and, to a lesser extent, integration and word processing. The price of the pragram is also taken into consideration.

cursor keys. Sharing data with other programs is not so easy; the program can't handle or directly import documents in any popular word processing format—even *Microsoft Word*.

The word processor is by far the best of this group's, with full font control and easy block operations. The data base may not have the file-linking power of *Lotus Works*, and the spreadsheet lacks *Enable*'s 3-D references and ten chart types, but both modules offer everything else you'll need, and they're easy to use.

You won't be so happy with the communications module, however. There's no dialing directory, limited terminal support, and just one transfer protocol.


These flaws aside, *Microsoft Works* is an ideal Best Buy. It's perfect for novices, laptop users, and just about anyone who needs an integrated package.

## **PFS:First Choice 3.1**

**PROS:** Most modules easy to use, strong integration, good data base

**CONS:** Poor spreodsheet, few desktop tools

With its easy interface and tight integration, *PFS:First Choice* is a quick start. But the program's unremarkable word processor and eccentric spreadsheet limit it to a fair value.



Microsoft Works' page preview makes it easy to see the final format of any document, replete with charts and pasted-in spreadsheet data.

The name *PFS* has long meant *easy* to use, and *First Choice* lives up to that reputation. Mouse support, well-designed pulldown menus, context-sensitive help and logical *<Alt>-key* shortcuts make it easy to get up to speed. The program is well integrated, with consistent menus and macros across modules, but you can't open multiple windows on the screen.

Applications are limited, even for novices. For instance, the word processor restricts you to just one font per document, and you can't even insert a blank line without a menu command.

First Choice's spreadsheet will drive

you crazy. You can't put numbers or formulas in the left-hand column, you address cells with codes like C1R1—much clumsier than the conventional A1—and even entering a formula is confusing. While it can import 1-2-3 files, *First Choice* doesn't understand the ubiquitous @SUM function.

Beginning users might appreciate *First Choice*'s easy menus. But they will soon balk at its limited word processor, funky spreadsheet, and weak desktop tools.

## **Putting It All Together**

Making a good integrated program is apparently a difficult job—most of the programs reviewed here are only fair. Fortunately, we did find one program we can recommend without hesitation: *Microsoft Works*' friendly face and first-class word processor make it an unbeatable Best Buy. €


n a perfect world, every user would have access to a high-speed laser printer. But let's get real—most users aren't networked, and even an "affordable" laser like Hewlett-Packard's LaserJet IIP can run you almost \$1000, once you add necessities like paper trays and extra RAM. If you run a small business or need to outfit several users in your work group with printers, you should consider two older yet sometimes wiser choices: dot matrix and ink jet printers.

A 24-pin dot matrix printer offers high-quality text printing at a price between \$350 and \$1000, plus wide-document and multipart-form printing—two features you simply can't get from a laser. If you need to print graphics too, ink jets provide laserlike output as well as quiet operation and greater portability (see the sidebar "Affordable Graphics Printers— Pretty in Ink"). Dot matrix and ink jet printers can also give you color output on the cheap (see "Buyers' Guide: Color Peripherals," June 1991).

We've uncovered 50 monochrome 24-pin and ink jet printers you can buy for less than \$1000. This Buyers' Guide shows you how to find the right printer, whether you're looking for a lowcost machine to put on your desk or a somewhat more expensive wide-carriage model for your work group.







In the laser printer era, the 24-pin dot matrix printer is doing more than holding its own—it's performing business tasks no laser can. And ink jets make great silent partners.

## **Pinning Down the Differences**

Why buy a dot matrix printer? Three reasons: multipart forms, wide-carriage printing, and bargain prices. Only a dot matrix printer can give you draft and letter quality text for under \$500—or \$600 and up if you need a wide-carriage model for printing big (11-by-17-inch) spreadsheets.

Dot matrix printers work by striking an inked ribbon with a series of pins. Draft mode uses fewer pins per character, resulting in text printing speeds up to three times faster than with letter quality (LQ) mode but far less readable output. In LQ mode, most 24-pins produce text whose quality approaches laser printers', fine for in-house documents and most business correspondence. Graphics are another story—you're likely to see jaggy curves and visible bands across solid areas. Still, a 24-pin is handy for quick drafts of charts whose final destination is the office laser.

Unless you shell out big bucks for a high-speed line printer (not included here), your dot matrix device will generally be slower than even a 4-page-per-minute laser. The maximum speed ratings shown in the table (measured in characters per second, or cps) are vendor estimates—expect actual performance to be 15 to 20 percent slower.



If all you need is draft output, it doesn't matter what fonts come with the printer. If you want to print out correspondence and reports, however, you'll want at least three built-in fonts, plus the ability to add more via optional font cards or downloading. (Most 24-pins come with a limited supply of typefaces in fixed sizes, though Epson's new LQ-570 and LQ-870 let you scale fonts from 8 to 32 points.) Usually, the bigger the print buffer, the better. You'll want at least an 8K buffer to spool large print jobs; demand




32K or more if you want to download software-based fonts. If you value your sanity, top-notch paper handling is a must. Automatic paper advance means you won't need to roll the fanfold forward and back every time you tear off a sheet. Form parking saves you from having to unload the fanfold paper every time you need to print on a single sheet of letterhead. Also look for the capability to print envelopes and labels—or be prepared to keep a typewriter nearby.

Even the best laser can't print on multipart forms. Most shipping labels, invoices, and other standard forms require an impact device that can leave a strong impression; ideally, your 24-pin printer should be able to handle at least fourpart forms (one original plus

Most of us can't live by text alone. And while you can print a pie chart or clip art on a dot matrix, you may be less than thrilled with the results. When you need to print graphics as well as text and can't afford a laser, an ink jet is a excellent compromise.

Though a tad more expensive than their dot matrix cousins, ink jets are also generally smaller and quieter perfect for cramped desktops where the printer sits right next to the phone. On the other hand, they can't print multipart forms, and only the Canon BJ-330 and the IBM Exec-Jet can handle wide paper.

Like dot matrix printers, ink jets print pages one line at a time, and at comparably slow speeds. But instead of striking an inked ribbon, an ink jet sprays fine streams of liquid ink onto the page, creating laserlike text and graphics.


The primary issue is output quality, which can vary depending on the type of paper. With some paper, the ink seeps into the fibers, creating fuzzy text and wrinkled solid areas. Before you buy, be sure to print out samples on the types of paper you're likely to use.

Output durability is also key. In the old days, if an ink jet page got wet, it looked like a Jackson Pollock painting—a series of blotchy smears. HP's new water-resistant inks reduce the problem for DeskJet users, but for others the quality varies. To gauge smearing, lick your thumb and rub it across a freshly inked page.

Most of the rules for buying dot matrix printers also apply to ink jets. You'll want a healthy selection of font options, but since all the ink jets handle single cut sheets, paper handling and control panel options are generally less important. All the printers deliver solid software compatibility by offering Epson or IBM emulation.

Finally, consider portability. The Canon BJ-10e and the Kodak Diconix 150 Plus weigh in at under 5 pounds each—slightly less than the lone dot matrix luggable, the Seikosha LT-20. For printing on the road (as well as on the desktop), an ink jet may be your best bet.

The good old 12-MHz 286 PC is still a bargain, especially for workat-home users—and 16-MHz units make surprisingly fast Windows machines. Here's how to choose the best from 73 models.







Even a 12-MHz 286 is sufficient for tasks like word processing, where speed isn't critical. And the 16-MHz speedsters deliver unexpectedly strong performance with *Windows* (see the sidebar "286— Windows Spoken Here").

We've divided this Buyers' Guide of 73 286 systems into two sections based on CPU speed. Although the 16-MHz chip runs as reliably as the 12-MHz version, major vendors seem to prefer the 12, so if company size and stability are more important to you than performance, a 12-MHz system from one of those companies may be a better choice. Here are the key issues that you need to consider before you buy.

## LIST PRICE

Prices are based on a configuration designed to run *Windows* or RAM-hungry DOS applications like *1-2-3*: 4MB of RAM, an 80MB to 120MB hard disk, a floppy drive, one parallel and one serial port, a VGA color graphics card, a VGA color monitor, a 101-key keyboard, a mouse, and DOS 3.3 or a later version. When you buy through a dealer, expect a discount of 20 to 30 percent off list price.

## CPU SPEED

The speed of your applications depends on many factors, including your hard disk and video board, but, all else being equal, the faster the CPU the faster the PC.

## FAST RAM

Eventually, most users will want to install at least 4MB of *fast RAM* (memory that runs at the same speed as the CPU). Many of today's highpowered DOS applications not to mention *Windows*—use a lot of RAM. You can always add RAM by placing it on an expansion board, but this degrades performance.

## EXPANDABILITY

Most 286 PCs boast a small, 16-by-16-inch footprint that's just right for crowded desktops, but the compact size means fewer expansion slots and drive bays. If you're going to network your 286 and share the server's hard disk and peripherals, this may not be a problem. But for stand-alone computing, make sure you get at least four free 8/16-bit slots (after the disk controller and video card are installed) to accommodate peripherals like scanners, fax-modems, and network boards. For standalone computing you'll also want at least four drive bays, with three externally accessible to hold two floppy drives and a tape drive. And unless you're definitely going the workstation route, don't buy anything smaller than an 80MB hard disk-you will find 40MB drives are not significantly cheaper.

## DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Conveniences like front-panel power and reset switches are nice, and with a switchless setup you can make changes—in memory size, for instance without fiddling with jumpers or DIP switches. Since preferences in keyboard touch vary, type a few paragraphs before you buy.

## WARRANTY AND TECHNICAL SUPPORT

All the vendors listed provide at least a 12-month warranty, but 24 months is even better as long as it doesn't cost extra. Free on-site service and a central tech support line can be godsends, especially if you're at home or in an office with no support technicians. If the vendor handles service and support via local dealers, look for dealer training so your questions will be answered correctly.

The 286 may be aging technology, but it can still do the job and do it economically. Whether you're in the market for a 12-MHz workhorse or a 16-MHz thoroughbred, if you choose the right 286 you'll enjoy years of useful service. 章



Conventional wisdom holds that while a 286 system is fine for single-task DOS-based applications like word processors, you need a fast 386 for Windows. As a general rule, we agree—but there are exceptions, notably fast 16-MHz 286s, where low price and high performance come together.

PC World Test Center benchmarks show that Windows actually runs a hair faster on a 16-MHz 286 in standard mode than on a 16-MHz 386SX in enhanced mode. Of course, standard mode lacks a few Windows niceties, such as virtual memory and multitasking: You can't type a memo in WordPerfect, for instance, while Quattro is recalculating a worksheet in the background. But if you'll settle for context switching (flipping between applications without having to quit and save first), or if you want to run just one Windows application like Excel, a 286 may be your best deal. Of course, most DOS applications run a bit slower on a 286 than on a 386.

Most bargain hunters probably won't care, since these 286s average about \$1500 less than comparable 16-MHz 386SXs.

#### Methodology

We tested the camputers with 4MB RAM and 80MB hard disks. Timing begins and ends at the DOS prompt. Finally, the macro launches *Micragrafx Designer*, opens a drawing, displays it an screen, and exits to DOS.





### On Site: Making the

Clone

Darrell Driggs stretched his company's computing budget by installing low-cost desktop systems.

Many companies want 386 power but can't afford name-brand prices. Shrewd investment in low-cost technology helped this lumber wholesaler double sales and revolutionize customer service.

Commitment

few years ago, Darrell Driggs had a dream: to set up departmental LANs in all 11 divisions of North Pacific Lumber. The problem was, buying 300 brand-name desktop systems all at once was just too expensive. The solution? In a word, clones. Driggs, the company's data processing operations manager, decided to stray from IBM and buy 386-based PC-compatible systems from a local vendor. The decision has paid off in spades, saving the company more than \$123,000—a savings the company invested in completing the installation of 11 interconnected departmental networks. Profits are up, customer turnaround time has been drastically reduced, and employee productivity has more than doubled.

Computers are critical to North Pacific's business for one reason—speed. The atmosphere in the company's Portland, Oregon, trading offices rivals that of Wall Street—frantic traders shouting prices into phones and to each other, buying lumber in all shapes and sizes to resell to customers around the world. "The lumber wholesale business is a competitive one," explains Phil Myers, vice president of the company's Pole and Piling Division. "The faster you can get an order confirmation out to a customer, the faster you can get to the next customer."

Before the advent of the LANs, traders wrote quotes by hand, typed order forms, and then rekeyed them into the company's mainframe-based account-

ing system—an arduous and repetitive process. They also spent hours looking up rail freight costs and schedules in big, unwieldy rate books.

In 1985, the company's data processing department developed a customized accounting program to run on a small network of 8088-based IBM PCs in a single division. Instead of taking several hours to handle a transaction, a few lucky traders could finalize a deal in a few minutes while the customer was still on the phone. But with a price tag of nearly \$3500 each, the new PS/2 workstations that Driggs wanted were too pricey for North Pacific to purchase en masse for each of its 300 traders. That left most of the company still working the old-fashioned way.

#### **Slow Going**

Gradually, Driggs was able to expand the company's PC collection. Because traders need all the desk space they can get, Driggs chose to purchase small IBM PS/2 Model 25s. Although the traders liked the systems' compact size, a problem surfaced: The machines didn't dissipate heat well. "It has been a headache," says Driggs. "The internal heat brings the unit down. Circuit boards have to be replaced." In one year alone, Driggs had to replace 7 out of 23 PS/2s.

In the meantime, the company's business was growing and changing. Traders needed to be able to run the company's custom applications—including accounting, inventory, and freight rate systems—along with off-the-shelf word processing and spreadsheet programs. "When customers call, traders need to be able to jump quickly between, say, the spreadsheets they're working on and an order form," Driggs explains. "The multitasking capabilities of a 386 allow them to do this."

Because of the problems with the PS/2 Model 25s and the desire to upgrade as many workstations as possible to multitasking 386s, Driggs decided to see if he couldn't get reliable products for much less than he'd have to pay IBM —or Compaq, for that matter.

"I felt that the newest 386 generation of clones was much closer in quality to the name-brand PCs than the 286 generation was," he recalls. "Novell had started authorizing many types of clones as nodes on their networks."

Network file servers, Driggs points out, are a different animal than singleuser PCs; they require greater reliability and better performance. (North Pacific's older file servers are Compaq Deskpro 286s. Driggs is now buying ALR 25- and 33-MHz 386 machines to act as servers on newer networks.) Although Driggs was willing to take a bigger risk on the workstations to save money, they still had to meet the company's strict standards for compatibility and reliability. Early attempts to locate a reliable vendor proved disappointing. Of three machines Driggs bought from one East Coast mail-order vendor, only one was configured correctly. "We couldn't get a response from the tech support staff," says Driggs, who has little patience with unresponsive suppliers. Another machine that failed North Pacific's network test was a "home-brew" computer built in the Portland area. Although Driggs describes the machine as "frighteningly cheap" (under \$2000 for a full-bore 386 with VGA graphics), it was incompatible with the company's network standards.

#### **Filling the Bill**

After the failed experiments with mailorder and home-brew dealers, Driggs was still looking around. In April 1990, a salesperson from Bridgeway Computer in Portland brought him two Leading Technology 386SX units to evaluate. In spite of Leading Technology's national distribution, many would consider the Beaverton, Oregon-based company a third-tier clone manufacturer. But Driggs didn't mind "as long as the PCs worked."

First, the Leading Technology machines were put through a series of rigorous tests on the network. North Pacific systems/program supervisor John Deen, who helps Driggs evaluate machines, stresses the importance of testing PC compatibles in a real work environment, because "clones that work well in a stand-alone situation may have problems on a network." The Leading Technology machines passed the network test with flying colors.

The reliability of components was also a critical consideration. Driggs examined the parts carefully, believing that many clones contained parts that could become obsolete quickly. Leading Technology was appealing, says Driggs, because the manufacturer seemed to stick to familiar parts suppliers. The company uses the renowned Phoenix BIOS and a VGA board from Oak Technology, which manufactures them using an alternative to the Paradise chip set.

"We'd had those boards in several different machines even before we started doing business with Leading Technology, and they'd always been quite reliable," Driggs says.

Local support was also important. Driggs believes the dealer responsible for tech support, Bridgeway, gets better response time from Leading Tech because it's also local. And, he adds, Bridgeway's role as a local vendor is crucial. "When you call a software publisher or a hardware manufacturer as an end user, you can spend a lot of time waiting on the line to get an answer to your question," he says, adding that it's better to be able to rely on your dealer for help.


After a 60-day evaluation period, Driggs was sold. "We paid the invoices, and since then we've purchased 35 more SXs."







had a few boot failure problems," he says. But because the Leading Technology machines come with a standard one-year warranty, boot failures don't upset Driggs too much. "As long as the machine is under warranty, I just ship it to the dealer and let them handle it."

What if one of the Leading Technology machines goes kaput after the warranty expires? It turns out Darrell Driggs is pretty handy with a screwdriver. If a machine has a minor problem, such as a bad power supply, he fixes it himself. However, he adds, "supplier support would definitely be more critical if I couldn't do repairs myself." He suggests companies without on-staff technical wizards or with machines whose warranty has expired should ask a dealer lots of questions: how quickly they can get a replacement model; whether the dealer does repairs inhouse or ships them out to third parties; and what the per-hour charge is for repairs. "Getting a third-party company to do your maintenance is also a good idea," he notes.

#### **Boosts in Profits, Productivity**

How much money did North Pacific save

by going with the low-end 386SX clones instead of IBMs or Compaqs? From the price quotes he got, Driggs figures 386s from Compaq or IBM would have cost the company \$3000 apiece. The 386SXs cost \$1400 each. "The savings are better than 50 percent. I get two for one."

That savings allowed North Pacific to complete installation of NetWare networks in the few remaining divisions that weren't automated. For example, automating the Pole and Piling Division network—including an upgrade to a Compaq 286 server, ten 386SX machines, network boards, software, and installation—cost a mere \$17,750.

All this automation has boosted both productivity and profits, says Kurt Hutton, vice president and business manager for the Shelter Products Division. "Our traders' productivity has doubled since we set up these systems," he notes. "The traders in our division have jumped from average annual sales of \$2 million per trader to \$3.7 million per trader." In addition, job satisfaction and job knowledge on the part of traders and their assistants has "gone through the roof."

Traders are also able to provide much better customer service. They can access the inventory, order entry, bookings, and freight rate systems over the network. As a result, they can respond quickly to fluctuating market conditions, "bundle" shipments with other traders to achieve a low price for their customers, and keep track of inventory and orders. Eventually, an image processing capability will allow traders to scan in order forms from customers and attach the electronic forms to their own word processing or spreadsheet files, which will eliminate a heavy burden of paperwork.

Vice President Myers is also glad Driggs did some comparison shopping. "We wanted to go with the best and the latest. Darrell convinced me that these 386s will be the right machines for at least the next four or five years." And, Myers adds, the value of the computers has proved immeasurable. "We can have a purchase order to a customer in 5 minutes that used to take two weeks," he says. "It's amazing." 章

# PC Buyers Say Yes to Clones

Price-conscious PC buyers have turned to clones, and few regret the choice.

#### The word is out.

Clones are no longer the risky proposition they were a few years ago. Now organizations of all sizes are opting to buy from the socalled second-tier vendors.

The competitive pricing offered by companies such as AST, Dell, Everex, and Gateway 2000 is what makes most PC buyers turn to clones in the first place, according to a *PC World* satisfaction survey of 250 recent PC purchasers; value and price topped their list of priorities when buying PC compatibles.

Relative newcomer Gateway 2000 boasts the largest installed base of any single vendor among our respondents. No one PC maker, though, claims a commanding lead in this area, with surveyed buyers having purchased PCs from 31 different companies (we present information here on the top ten).

Respondents reported purchasing everything from XTs to full-blown 486s, with the majority (59 percent) buying 386-based systems. Satisfaction is con-

a surprisingly large number of respondents said they wouldn't choose the same system again. Twenty percent of those who bought a system from Dell said they wouldn't purchase the same product. Eighteen percent of the NEC buyers thought better of their decision, as did 17 percent of the purchasers of CompuAdd and Wyse PCs. In contrast, all the respondents who purchased a Packard Bell system said they would buy the same product again. €





# New Feature Feature Data

Like most companies across the country, Maritz Motivation Company in St. Louis wants to improve its managers' access to critical data. Maritz provides motivation, travel, communications, training, and research services to clients. Currently, several of Maritz's many field offices report their sales data every night to a VAX minicomputer located at the company's headquarters, where the data is then consolidated. But that wealth of information is difficult for top executives to access directly.

"Right now, the obstacles in getting to information mean that people are managing by the seat of their pants—by hunches and gut feel as opposed to facts," says John Roth, Maritz's manager of executive support systems. Roth is not alone in attempting to solve a problem that has plagued the business world for years: How do you provide employees with effortless access to valuable corporate data—data that is usually stored somewhere on an inhospitable minicomputer or mainframe?

In the past, employees had to rely on the corporate MIS department to retrieve the data they needed. Or they could use *terminal emulation* software, which enables PCs to act like IBM 3270 and DEC VAX terminals. But this software forces users to grapple with complicated emulation modes and main-frame application interfaces, and it requires expensive connectivity hardware.

At Maritz, a new executive information system due this fall will change all that. PCs will run an application developed with *SQLWindows*, a development tool from Gupta Technologies for creating graphical interfaces. The application will allow Maritz executives to use a *Windows* front end to query an *Oracle* data base on the VAX without having to jump through hoops. Instead of asking an analyst to research a question about sales prospects or forecasts, an executive will be able to click a button and access the information in an easy-to-understand format. "We're doing this to improve executives' access to timely information, which will help us sell more and sell better," says Roth.

#### Power to the Manager

New data access technologies are finally making the dream of enterprisewide access to information come true. Soon, it will be possible for managers to get all the critical data they need, whenever they need it—regardless of where that data is stored on the network. Data access tools are founded upon a "clientserver" architecture, which separates processing functions from user interfaces. These tools tie together disparate users, applications, and systems with a common, comprehensible interface. By bringing critical data to managers and translating it into timely information they can use, these products can make a difference in the company's bottom line.

Not surprisingly, *Windows* is the favored environment for data access tools, chiefly because it's easy to work with. "People with *Windows* front ends can access inhospitable hosts and get to data that was traditionally kept from them," says Richard Holcomb, vice president of marketing for Pioneer Software, which sells the data access tool Q + E (see the review in this section).

Q+E and many products like it gather data from corporate data bases and present it on an easy-to-use front end. An executive can request data simply by pointing and clicking; the data access program translates the request into a standard data base query, often in Structured Query Language (SQL), the Esperanto of data base languages. The SQL command extracts the results from the SQL data base, which can reside on a mainframe, a mini, or a super-powerful, dedicated 386 or 486 PC. The data base, in turn, sends those results back to the executive's *Windows* application.

Besides ease of use, a key reason for the popularity of *Windows* as a home for data base front ends is its ability to create *hot links* between applications. With *Windows*' built-in Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) capability, developers can set up links to transfer and update data automatically between, say, a SQL-capable *Windows* product and *Excel*. Managers can then see the numbers change in the spreadsheet in "real time" as the actual data changes.

Windows data access and development tools cross a wide spectrum. Some, like Forest & Trees, are simply front ends aimed at executives who need to look at data in existing data bases. Others, like Access SQL, include a front end along with a data base server, allowing specified users to update data and developers to create forms-based applications for end users. Still others, like Easel/Workbench, are full-blown development tools for programmers, providing maximum control in creating front ends as well as in structuring a data base from the ground up.

#### Innovative Applications

At present, most organizations that are implementing *Win*dows-based data access applications are still in the design stage. At the Rand Corporation in Santa Monica, California, programmers are working on an integrated modeling system for military clients that embraces PC applications such as *Excel, PowerPoint*, and *Word*; relational data bases on minicomputers and mainframes; and matrix computations written in C language that run on Sun workstations.

When completed, the application will allow users to model the future of the military's personnel, incorporating information such as what percentage are likely to be promoted or leave the service. "We have plans to reduce the size of the military force, and we need to figure out the effect of different policies," says Rand economist Jonathan Cave. With the application, Cave will be able to use *Excel* as a front end to access statistics stored in the relational data base on the server, such as personnel records and numbers of reenlistments. He can then pull the data together in an *Excel* spreadsheet.

Improving executives' access to information is the goal at the business systems consulting group of Arthur Andersen Company in Boston, where partner Mark Tino is designing applications that give executives timely access to their own company's data base, so they can get a clearer sense of the direction the business is taking. Once completed, the application will deliver data about such critical success factors as the quality of customer service or the profitability of certain divisions. It will also let executives use *Lightship*, a *Windows*based management reporting system, to do what-if modeling and help them locate problem areas.

The main purpose of Tino's application will be to "help clients think through what business information is important and how to look at it." The beauty—and the difficulty—of the process is that it requires figuring out what crucial information is lacking. "When you get executives to rethink their needs, many of them realize that the information they really need isn't available. It doesn't exist because they've never asked the questions before," says Tino.

#### Grappling With Data Integrity

Naturally, data stored on a mainframe or a minicomputer is well protected partly because it's so difficult to reach. Granting easy to access to just about anyone, on the other hand,



causes concern among MIS directors, who need to make sure that critical data remains both uncorrupted and secure.

Their concern stems from the update features of most data access tools, which allow users to make changes to live data on the server. Another potential source of worry is user access to sensitive or classified data. In order to deal with these questions, administrators must be very careful when deciding who is allowed to access or update certain kinds of data; these privileges can be controlled using the traditional methods of establishing data entry and data access rights for each user.

Many MIS directors are cautiously implementing pilot projects to test the limits of the new software, which is usually designed to make it easier for IS managers to set up multiple levels of security. Software Publishing's *InfoAlliance*, for example, provides built-in, mainframelike data integrity and security features that allow administrators to set up read-only views for some people, while providing others with both read and write privileges.

#### A Bright Future

Given the cost of redesigning corporate data systems, not to mention the "political" issues that often emerge in the whoowns-the-data struggle, it's going to be a while before systems that provide enterprisewide data access really take off. But in the long run, these systems have the potential to give managers new and ingenious ways of viewing and using their data. By turning hard-to-get-at data into viable information, data access products promise to change business computing dramatically for the better. Eventually, managers will be able to identify trouble spots, make more accurate projections, and solve problems more creatively—based on a better understanding of the inner workings of their business.

Your wholesale auto parts operation seems to be held together with baling wire. You keep inventory data in SQL format in IBM OS/2 Extended Edition and your customer list in *dBASE*. To take an order, your salespeople have to print out the inventory data and then move to another PC to input part numbers and prices manually in an order form. To find out how forecasted inventory levels compare with actual inventory, you load 1-2-3 and then jot down the comparisons to input elsewhere. The result: slow and inaccurate data entry and reduced ability to track and analyze trends in your data.

Until *InfoAlliance* appeared, the only way to organize this crazy quilt was to start from scratch, painstakingly restructuring your data within a single data base. Now, with *InfoAlliance*, you can gather this data in the same customdesigned application and print out invoices, reports, and marketing letters. You don't even have to know where the data you want resides or what its file format is. You simply specify that you need the inventory file, and *InfoAlliance* delivers it to your screen.

Originally shipping late last year as an OS/2 Presentation Manager program, *InfoAlliance* will soon offer a *Windows* front end that can work with existing *Presentation Manager* front ends on a network. The *Windows* version will provide all the same features, including querying, reporting, and form creation tools, and an impressive application generator. The smooth windowing interface is also nearly identical, offering well-designed dialog boxes, pulldown menus, and icon shortcuts.

As with Xerox's *FormBase*, you use graphical on-screen forms to enter, query, and view data. When you're ready to analyze the data, you can create simple, predefined columnar reports or design elaborate form-based reports—and even use bit-mapped graphics (a company logo, for example).

An updated version of the core product, due out in late August with the *Windows* front end, will support Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) and Microsoft's *SQL Server*, for improved data sharing with other *Windows* applications. Currently *InfoAlliance* can draw upon *dBASE*, 1-2-3, IBM OS/2 Extended Edition Database Manager, and

#### native InfoAlliance data.

Keep in mind that *InfoAlliance* is a major department or company investment. The price is likely to be steep (the previous Presentation Manager version cost \$8500 for 10 users), and you'll probably need a part- or full-time administrator. But it's one of the few programs that can make sense of information scattered throughout different data bases.







A manufacturing executive at a large company types a memo in *WordPerfect* under *Windows 3.0.* Suddenly, an alarm issues from his PC and a note pops up, warning him that inventory of a key material has fallen dangerously low. The name and phone extension of the appropriate buyer also appear in the note, so the manager can instruct the buyer to correct the problem, averting a potential disaster in the nick of time.

Forest & Trees for Windows, a SQL front end by Channel Computing, can gather such critical information from disparate sources—PCs, minicomputers, mainframes—and combine it into a single customized on-screen report.

Forest & Trees' Query Assist feature allows users to set up simple SQL queries using a point-and-click interface. For complex queries, however, most executives will probably turn to an inhouse developer. Using the program's application generator, a developer can set up a series of queries and display their results in a customized dashboard of "views"—windows that display vital signs like cash position. Clickable icons set up by the developer let users update the query rapidly to obtain the latest data, read and write notes, display graphs and reports, or show an information "tree" that depicts a given view's relationship to other data.

*Forest & Trees* offers an alarm that can include a calculation of, for example,

how far off budget this week's figures are. Visual alarms can be set to pop up if expenses exceed budget by more than a given percentage. With *Forest & Trees'* timed-query capability, the information can be gathered automatically, every Monday morning, say.

When it's time to analyze the results of a query, managers can take advantage of *Forest & Trees*' report-generation and graphing capabilities. You can build an impressive array of graphs and even display them on your "dashboard." However, to print graphs, you must export them or move them via the *Windows* Clipboard to other applications.

At press time, *PC World* learned that the upcoming version 2.0 of *Forest* & *Trees* will allow users to perform certain complex SQL functions, such as joining tables, by pointing and clicking instead of typing in commands. Additionally, users will be able to display entire tables in views instead of only single columns of data. A free upgrade will be available to all registered users.

Forest & Trees' Standard Edition costs \$495 and allows you to access data in 1-2-3, Excel, dBASE, R:base, Paradox, flat files, and ASCII files. Version 2.0 will provide a \$1495 Client/Server Edition that bundles support for Oracle Server, Microsoft's SQL Server, and Gupta's SQLBase. An optional interface is available to DB2, IBM's mainframe data base, through Micro Decisionware.

Unlike data base server front ends such as Q + E and Access SQL, Forest & Trees can't add or update records in a data base. It appeals to managers who continually need to monitor fast-changing data stored on a LAN, a mini, or a mainframe. It's especially good for executives who want a data access program that converts critical corporate data into meaningful information.



A purchasing executive for a chain of supermarkets orders fresh produce every week. Using *Excel*, she forecasts purchasing requirements, runs what-if scenarios, and creates graphs to use in contract negotiations. But the process has a weak link: The executive can't obtain timely sales figures from the stores. The data she needs resides in an *Oracle* data base on a minicomputer, and requested reports don't reach her for at least a week.

Q+E's main strength is working as an ad hoc query tool, and it makes creating queries as easy as *Access SQL* does. You create a query by pointing and clicking; the actual SQL statements are built for you behind the scenes. After you open a table, you can refine the query by simply highlighting specific columns or cells. More complicated querying, such as the purchasing executive needed, must be set up by power users familiar with DDE and *Windows* application macros.

In addition to querying data bases, Q+E allows you to update, delete, and add records as well as create and define new tables and data bases. Some important built-in safeguards help data base administrators manage all this power. At installation, they can choose full ca-

pabilities or limit Q+E to a read-only version. Anyone working with a fully capable copy must select an Allow Editing option in order to modify data in a query window. This step prevents users from inadvertently writing changes to the underlying data base.

Q+E can draw data from a healthy menu of sources. Its \$199 standard edition accesses dBASE and compatibles and Paradox, as well as ASCII text files and Excel files. A \$299 server edition adds Microsoft's SQL Server, Oracle Server, Sybase, IBM OS/2 Extended Edition Database Manager, IBM's mainframe data base (DB2), and Novell's NetWare SQL. Additionally, Microsoft makes its own add-in version of Q+E available free to registered Excel 3.0 users. This version supports only SQL Server, dBASE, and ASCII files.

Unlike Access SQL, Q+E is not designed for developing customized, menu-driven Windows applications to hand off to executives or nontechnical end users. Q+E offers no menu-building feature, and its data entry forms capability has few customization options. However, Q+E finds its niche as a versatile querying tool that's especially recommended for users who need to link SQL and other data sources on one side with friendly Windows applications on the other.



At a busy mail-order company in New York, the linchpin of the entire business is a customer information data base. In the sales department, telephone sales reps enter each customer's name, address, and order information into an electronic form, automatically updating the central data base. This information is accessible in the executive office, where a top manager clicks on a customdesigned menu option that delivers an up-to-the-minute list of the top ten customers. Meanwhile, somewhere in Albuquerque, a sales manager uses a custom laptop application to tap into the same data base and update it with that day's sales leads.

Access SQL allows this kind of enterprisewide access to a central data base. Access SQL is a front end that can act as a stand-alone data base management system, thanks to a built-in copy of Gupta's SQLBase server engine. The program allows users to view, manipulate, and update information in a SQL data base and, unlike Forest & Trees and Q+E, it's geared to organizations that want to create custom applications for end users.

Review

Like Q + E, Access SQL allows you to create complex SQL statements merely by pointing and clicking on standard Windows menus, buttons, or boxes, making it easy for managers with little training to perform ad hoc queries, view and modify tables, and access reports.

Taking full advantage of the product, however, requires a developer's services. But instead of requiring the developer to use a programming language, Access SQL is designed specifically as a forms development environment for creating applications such as the telephone salesperson's order entry tool.

The first step in designing a form is creating queries, which define what data will be accessible to the user. Queries can all be defined in advance or

created individually and linked to different sections of a form or other application. Access SQL helps out with a default form layout, or you can customize the form with options like buttons, popup pick lists, and drop-down menus.

Although Access SQL has no graphing capabilities, its excellent report generation allows users to pour in data from numerous sources and to use calculated fields. Like InfoAlliance, Access SQL offers sophisticated data security, sure to appeal to administrators. Features include assignable passwords and privilege levels, automatic logging of data base transactions, and backup utilities.


All this power comes at a price. Access SQL costs \$695 for the single-user version, which allows developers to build applications without being on a network, and \$1595 for a network version that supports four developers. Run-time versions are extra, as are Gupta gateway products that provide back-end communication with Oracle Server and IBM's DB2. An interface for Microsoft's SQL Server is under development.

Unlike Forest & Trees, Access SQL is designed for businesses dependent on a data base that is regularly accessed and updated by several departments. Its unique benefit, compared with a tool like Q + E, is its ability to create customized applications, providing users with push-button access to the data they need to get the job done.

**Road Test** 

Users are the ultimate consumer advocates. In a new PC World series, users report from the trenches on their real-life experiences-this month with Windows 3.0.

First impressions aren't everything.

Only after living with a product for several months do you begin to get a real sense of its pluses and minuses and to know whether it's going to meet your needs. That's why we're instituting a new feature-the PC World Road Test. Each month, we'll put several users in the reviewer's seat and feature their first-person assessments of hardware and software products.

Our road testers bring to their evaluation a level of use and experience not generally found in magazine reviews. They've all used the product day in and day out-learning shortcuts, identifying strengths and weaknesses, and discovering firsthand whether it works for them. Each month, you'll be able to learn what a product is *really* like from people whose productivity and effectiveness depend on it—and you can make informed buying decisions as a result.

This month's Road Test reports the experiences and assessments of six users of Windows 3.0. We've selected a cross section of users who work in different professions and represent various levels of PC expertise.

Only two features got a fairly consistent review from users: the graphical user interface and the file manager. After years of experimentation, Microsoft seems to have figured out how to design an appealing and useful GUI. The same can't be said for the file manager, however, which received a barely passing grade from several of our road testers.

Read on to find out more about the features users love and the ones they can live without.

#### **John Kirkpatrick**

John is a longtime Macintosh user. He used Windows sparingly prior to 3.0's release. He uses his PC to write, edit, and format reports.

As a corporate operating environment, Windows is barely adequate. It's slow and cumbersome, and it doesn't

really do the things it's proclaimed to do. But Windows has its purposes: It introduces users to a quasigraphical environment, allows them to do rudimentary task switching, and prepares them for the more complex operating environments, such as OS/2, that are on the way.

Windows' graphical interface barely makes the grade. It's extremely slow and takes an extraordinary amount of overhead. It's a little more intuitive than DOS, but that's it.

The main reason I use Windows is because of its task-switching capability. But without the help of Quarterdeck's QEMM-386 5.1, this would be a much weaker feature, since Windows does such a poor job of managing its extended and expanded memory for DOS programs.

#### **Mary Maki**

Mary's been a Windows 3.0 user since June 1990. Her job duties include developing and producing internal documents such as newsletters, manuals, forms, and fliers.

Once you know Windows' limitations, you can probably get value out of it, but it didn't work for me. After using it for eight months, I gave up.

My main problem with Windows was how it worked—actually, didn't

work-with Ventura Publisher. The PostScript driver didn't support the paper sizes I use with my Linotronic typesetter, and a number of Ventura's features weren't usable under Windows, even though they worked fine under GEM.

The multitasking aspect of Windows isn't a big improvement over DOS. I rarely got the cursor back while something was processing in the background. The file management system also needs work. It's so confusing that for a long time I thought I was doing something wrong. Then I realized it was just poorly implemented.

For me, Windows' strongest feature was being able to cut and paste between applications. But I can't say Windows improved my productivity. I lost a lot of time because of all the bugs.

#### **Munir Mandivawalla**

Munir became a "regular" Windows user after the introduction of version 3.0. He uses his PC primarily for word processing and for tracking and tabulating student grades.

Windows is still a fairly primitive environment, but with the advent of 3.0it's usable for most business purposes.

The graphical interface is getting there, but it needs to be more object oriented-like Hewlett-Packard's NewWave. I'd like to be able to put together documents from different applications and interact with them directly.

Under Windows there'll always be some applications that won't work the way others do. I guess we'll just have to live with the inconsistencies.

The cut-and-paste feature is fine for anything that has to do with text. But for graphics, some formats make it impossible to do smooth cuts and pastes.

A lot of people have said that their productivity increased tremendously because of Windows. I'd put a different spin on it: My effectiveness has increased. The things I now do, using Windows, I just wouldn't have attempted before.

#### Mark McNally

Mark has been using Windows 3.0 since it debuted last spring. He uses his PC primarily to manage his investment portfolio.

Right from the beginning, I was amazed at how easy it was to maneuver and navigate through Windows. I was able to pick up Word for Windows and Excel almost immediately and start cutting and pasting text between them.

The WYSIWYG feature is especially important. Before, I had to print things several times before I got them right. Now, with Print Preview, I can see how things are going to turn out before I print them.

But DDE is probably the key feature that Windows offers. I used DDE to write a program that allows Crosstalk for Windows to call up Dow Jones News/Retrieval, cut out the stock quotes I need, and automatically download them into an Excel spreadsheet. Then, Excel performs the necessary calculations and creates a chart, which is there waiting for me in the morning.

My biggest complaint? There's not enough information about DDE. I had to figure it out and teach it to myself. It took a lot of trial and error, which kind of wasted my time. In the end, however, it was worth it.

#### **Sharyn Pendleton**

Sharyn never used a PC before Windows 3.0 was introduced. She uses PageMaker to create a calendar of classes offered by the city of San Carlos.

I like Windows, but I needed a lot of training to get where I am today-and I still don't understand all the features. I'm still a little intimidated. Anyone who says you can use Windows immediately even if you don't know anything about PCs is dead wrong! Still, Windows makes using the computer less intimidating. It lets me do my job and insulates me from having to understand the technical stuff.

The cut-and-paste feature is my fa-

vorite. It's a real improvement over actually cutting and pasting strips of paper that come out of a printer! But the WYSIWYG feature isn't perfect. We bought a PostScript cartridge for our LaserJet, and the document isn't coming out the way it looks on the screen. So I have to print things out over and over again until I get it right.

I haven't had the nerve to try the multitasking feature yet. I'm nervous I'll lose what I'm working on. I've come a long way—I used to be afraid to touch anything on the keyboard.

#### **Bob Raeside**

Bob's been using Windows since version 2.0 was released, and switched to version 3.0 last spring. He uses his PC to write reports, review documents, and track budgets.

The difference between working in a *Windows* and a non-*Windows* environment is like night and day. The obvious strong point is that *Windows* applications all look and feel the same. In just a few minutes you can get up to speed on a program you've never seen before.

But multitasking is really why you

buy *Windows*. I'm constantly going back and forth between applications from a graphics package to a spreadsheet and back to E-mail.

The cut-and-paste feature just doesn't hack it in non-*Windows* applications, though. It's not a smooth operation. I don't care for the file manager, either. It's cumbersome, and nothing follows intuitively. There's also no easy way out of the thing. I use *Norton Commander* instead.

Making the switch to an entirely Windows environment isn't easy. I consider myself fairly adaptable, but I just couldn't give up 1-2-3. I think until more Windows packages are available, a lot of users won't want to switch: It means they have to relearn everything.

## Create Spreadsheet Reports With Style

Need to get a message across with numbers? Here's how to create effective spreadsheet reports using tried-and-true desktop publishing techniques.

**Spreadsheets** 

What happens when one of the new graphical spreadsheets joins forces with a laser printer? Depending on the user's knowledge of design, the result can be an attention-grabbing document—or a forbidding report likely to land in the "read it later" pile.

In the past, formatting a spreadsheet report involved little more than underlining titles and adding dollar signs and decimal places. Today, the process includes specifying fonts, attributes like italics, type size, borders, shading, and even clip art. This article presents basic layout and design tips to help you produce visually effective reports without overwhelming your reader.

#### Clarity Is the Goal

The purpose of a spreadsheet report should be immediately obvious to anyone who looks at it. To avoid losing the reader in endless columns of numbers, you should support your message with titles and explanatory text, as shown in our first example.

To emphasize your main points, it's useful to set off headings and titles by shading them. But boldface the text so it's legible.

Although colored backgrounds and text might look great on screen, background colors are often converted to patterns of dots on a black-and-white printer. Run some tests before you spend too much time manipulating colors.

If your spreadsheet supports embedded images, you can use clip art—as long as it really adds to your message. As shown in our second example, clip art can easily make a serious report look frivolous.

Another design flaw is putting too much information on a page. If you can, spread lengthy reports across several pages, and avoid the temptation to reduce margins to squeeze in a few extra columns or rows.

On the other hand, you don't want to push only a few lines onto a second page. The Print to Fit features in *Quattro Pro* and 1-2-3 can help: They squeeze your report by using smaller fonts. In *Quattro Pro 3.0*, you can accomplish this by selecting /*Print* followed by *Print to fit.* In 1-2-3, release 2.3, use :*Print Layout Compression Automatic.* 

#### Working With Fonts

In the first example (above left), a clear, concise spreadsheet report presents a personalized message at the top and elaborates with numbers below. The second example (top right) uses less text and too many enhancements, which give the report a frivolous look and make it difficult to understand. The absence of formatting in the third example makes it, quite simply, an undifferentiated sea of confusion.

limit most documents to two typefaces.

Use different type sizes and enhancements to set off titles, headings, and subheadings. But don't go overboard: Too many enhancements make a report illegible. Use bold, italic, and underlining only for titles and headers; sans serif fonts such as Helvetica or Swiss make numbers easier to read.

A good photocopier can extend your printer's capability. For example, if your report format is landscape and your printer has the fonts you need only in portrait mode, specify smaller type in portrait mode, and use the copier to reorient the page and enlarge it.

#### Consistency Is Critical

If you design multipage reports, you'll want elements to be consistent from page to page. The reader's eye should focus on the message, not the design.

Many spreadsheets provide a style option to maintain a coherent look. You define a style using fonts, type size, enhancements, colors, and borders; you can apply it to given cells or globally.

It's easy to set up a style. In *Excel 3.0*, select a cell formatted to your liking, then click on *Format*, click on *Style*, and type a name for the style. To apply the style, select the cells you want to format, then click on the arrow next to the current style in the tool bar.

In 1-2-3 2.3, you can format by selecting any of the WYSIWYG format commands. Then select :Named-style Define and specify one of eight styles provided. Select the formatted cell, and give the style a name and description. To apply the style, select :Named-style, choose the number from 1 to 8 that represents the style you defined, then select the cells you want to format.

*Quattro Pro's* styles don't apply across worksheets, but you can "define" up to eight fonts for the same worksheet. Select /*Style Font Edit-fonts*, then choose any of eight predefined fonts to edit. Menus guide you through the definition of typeface, size, color and attributes. To use a defined font in a cell or range, select/*Style Font*, choose the font number, and select the cells to format.

When printing a multipage report, you'll want your output to be consistent, too. Selected row and column titles should automatically appear on each page. In *Excel 3.0*, simply select your header row or column, then click on *Options*, and select *Set print titles*. In *Quattro Pro*, use /*Print Headings*; in 1-2-3, select /*Print Printer Options Borders*, and choose columns or rows.

Creating an attractive spreadsheet report involves some trial and error. Since you usually can't see an entire page at once, use the page preview to save trips to the printer. By using these rules, you'll create a well-designed report with maximum impact.

#### Tips for getting the most out of your word processor

This month: Address letters quickly with your word processor's boilerplate text features, and import data base files of addresses into Word and WordPerfect.

f you're typing addresses from your Rolodex into letters or other documents, you're wasting the power of your word processor. Instead, why not simply insert addresses electronically? Using any word processor's boilerplate text feature, you can create a list of frequently used addresses for instant insertion.

#### **Using Word Glossaries**

In all versions of *Word* prior to version 5.5, you can use the glossary to insert an address automatically. After entering an address and salutation, highlight the text. Press **<Esc>c**, type any abbreviation to stand for the address, and press **<Enter>**. To make the shortcut permanent, save the glossary by pressing

#### <Esc>tgs<Enter>.

In Word 5.5, follow the same steps but press <Alt>-EO, type the abbreviation, then press <Alt>-D to store it.

Now you can insert the address at the cursor position in any document. Just type the abbreviation and press <**F3**>, or press <**Esc**>i<**F1**> and choose from a list of abbreviations. In *Word 5.5*, press <**Alt**>-**EO** to pick from a list.

#### WordPerfect 5.x Block Saves

*WordPerfect* doesn't offer glossary files, but it's easy to create address files, then merge them into your documents. Type an address and salutation, move the cursor to the beginning of the first line, press <Alt>-<F4>, and mark the block. Press <F10> to save the address, and type a name for it.

Insert an address block in a letter by positioning the cursor, pressing <Shift>-<F10>, typing the block's name, and pressing <Enter>. If you have forgotten the name, press <F5> <Enter>, choose the file, then press r.

#### **Automating Long Address Lists**

If you work with many addresses, you'll have a hard time remembering all those

#### **Importing Addresses from Data Base Files**

If you have addresses stored in a data base, your *WordPerfect* address list is halfway completed. All you have to do is convert and format the text.

Start by exporting your data in comma-delimited or mailmerge format from within your data base. You'll get an ASCII text file, with records surrounded by quotation marks and separated by commas. Export just the fields you'll use in the address blocks, in the order you'll use them.

To bring the file into *Word-Perfect*, press <**Ctrl>**-<**F5**>**tr**, type the path and file name for the exported data, then press <**Enter>**. Save the file under a new name in case you make an error.

To format the address list, you need to add codes to the imported data base file. To format the file while it's still loaded, do the following keystrokes, step by step:

1. <**Alt>.<F2**>n<**Alt>.**

- <Home><Cursor Up>
- 2. <Alt>-<F2>n<Enter> <Alt>-<F2><Enter><Enter>

- 4. <Alt>-<F2>n<Alt>-

5. To save the new file, press <**F10**> <**Enter**>**y**.

If your original data base used separate fields for first and last names, or for cities, states, or ZIP codes, you'll have to do a little editing to finish the job. abbreviations. Fortunately, you can use your word processor's documentswitching and split-screen features to make address selection easier.

Start by creating your address list. Type the addresses in a blank document just as they will appear in your letters, separating each address with a blank line. Then follow these steps:

1. Split the screen or switch documents.

2. Load your address list in the second document.

3. In the address list screen, search for a name or other text.

4. Mark the address as a block.

5. Switch back to your letter document and paste the block in at the cursor position.


#### Word 4.0/5.0 List Tools

Here's how the process works in *Word:* Open a blank screen (for the letter), then follow these steps:

1. To split the screen, press <Esc> wsh12<Tab>y<Enter>.

2. To load the list, press <**Esc**>**tl**, type the list's file name, then press <**Enter**>.

3. Press <**Esc**>**s** to open the search function, enter a name or other informa-

tion you want to find, and press <**Enter**>. *Word* will locate the address.

5. Select the address text. (If you used <**Shift>-<Enter>** within the address, you can press <**F10>** to select the entire address.)

6. Press <Delete><Insert><F1><Insert> to paste in the block.

#### **WORD SHORTCUT**

#### Importing a Data Base File to Word

If you have a data base file containing addresses, you can turn it into a *Word* address list. Start by exporting the comma-delimited data base file as an ASCII file. (If your data base has more than 500 records, you'll have to break it into smaller chunks.) Then load the exported file into a blank *Word 4.0* or *5.0* screen. Save the file under a new name.

To convert the file for use as a *Word* address list, complete with

proper formatting, press the following keys:

1. <Esc>r<Tab><Enter>

<Esc>ts

2. <Esc>rp<Tab>pp<Enter> <Esc>ts

3. <Esc>r<Tab>n<Enter> <Esc>ts

4. <Esc>r<Tab><Delete> <Enter><Esc>ts

You'll have to do some editing if names, cities, states, or ZIP codes are broken into separate fields in the original data base.

#### **WordPerfect Address Lists**

Users of *WordPerfect 5.0* or later versions can follow a similar approach:

1. To split the screen, press <Ctrl>-<F3>w12<Enter>.

2. Press <Enter><Shift>-<F3> to switch back to the document window.

3. To load the address list, press <Shift>-<F10> and type the list's file name.

4. To search for an address, press <Home><Home><F2>, type the search text, and then press <F2> again. If you need to continue the search, press <F2> twice to repeat the process.


5. Move the cursor to the beginning of the address, press <Alt>-<F4>, then highlight the block with the cursor keys.

6. To copy the block to the letter, press < Ctrl>-<F4>bc<Shift>-<F3><Enter>.

With other word processors, you can follow similar steps, substituting the appropriate keystrokes for your program. In *Word* and *WordPerfect*, you can also record macros to further automate the job. **章**

#### Practical tips for building better worksheets

This month: What if...?

#### **Richard Scoville**

Survival in business hinges on making smart financial decisions; your spreadsheet program can improve on your intuition by letting you explore options before taking the plunge. This column introduces sensitivity analysis in 1-2-3 release 2.2—a general what-if method for evaluating cost benefits of various scenarios based on one input variable. Our example is purchasing a cellular phone service, but you can apply the same steps to adopting a pricing policy, for example, by projecting profits or to selecting optimum investment plans by projecting returns.

In our scenario, we assume you've already chosen the model of cellular phone you're going to buy. Even more important is which billing plan to select. Most plans charge a base amount each month, which covers a specified amount of airtime. Once you've used up that time, you pay by the minute. You anticipate using the phone for about 75 minutes per month; the salesperson suggests the Value plan. It sounds reasonable, but you'd like to know how the bill would look if you used the phone more or less than you've projected.

The worksheet in **FIGURE 1** shows a prototypical approach. It consists of a data entry area containing pricing criteria for each plan based on the single input variable of 75 minutes' monthly usage, a table (generated with the Data Table command) to compare charges for different usage levels, and a graph to provide clear comparisons.

To build the model, begin with a blank worksheet and use the following steps to keep all the numbers consistent: Select /Worksheet Global Format, and press < Enter >. Enter the labels and numbers in A1..F8, and the label in A10. To highlight the data entry cells, move

to cell B3 and select /*Range Unprotect*, and press **<Enter>**. Repeat the procedure on the range B6..F8.

Now compute the monthly charges. Move to B10 and then enter the formula @IF(\$B\$3<B7,B6,(\$B\$3-B7)\*B8+B6). In English, this rather tricky formula means that if the number of minutes used (\$B\$3) is less than the number of free minutes per month (B7), then display just the base fee (B6); otherwise, calculate the number of minutes used in excess of the free minutes (\$B\$3-B7), multiply it by the per-minute price (B8), and add that figure to the base fee (B6). The dollar signs denote absolute cell addresses to ensure that when you copy the formula, all the copies refer to cell B3 instead of the equivalent in other columns. After entering the formula in B3, select/*Copy*, press <**Enter**>, move to

C10, press <**Period**>, use the cursor keys to highlight the range C10..F10, and press <**Enter**> again.

By plugging various values into B3, you can compare the cost of the plans for a given amount of airtime; the next step is to build a table to lay out the plan costs for an array of minutes. Start by building the list of minutes: Move to cell A11, select /Data Fill, press <Period>, use the cursor keys to highlight the range A11..A20, and press < Enter>; enter 0 for the Start value, 50 for the Step value, and 450 for the Stop value. Next, the table of charges: Put the cell pointer on A10 and select /Data Table 1, press <**Period**>, highlight the range A10..F20, and press <Enter>. Then, enter B3 for the input cell.

The table gives you an idea of how costs vary under each plan. To make things clearer, turn the table into a line graph. Put the cell pointer on A11 and (in 1-2-3 release 2.2 or 3.x) select/Graph *Group.* Press < Period>, use the cursor keys to highlight the range A11..F20, and press < Enter >. Select Columnwise, and the graph ranges are set to display the plan costs. To set up a graph legend, select Options Legend Range, move to cell B4, press <**Period**>, highlight the range B4..F4, and press < Enter >. Select Color to display your graph in color. Choose *Titles* to label the *x*-axis Minutes used and the y-axis \$ charged. Select Quit to return to the Graph menu, then View to see the data.

Now you've got the big picture. The Economy plan is cheapest when airtime is less than about 50 minutes per month. If airtime is between 50 and about 180 minutes, you'll want the Introduction plan; between 180 and about 375, the Professional plan; above 375, the Executive. For your projected use of 75 minutes, the choice is clear: the Introduction plan. It's interesting that there's always a plan less pricey than the one they recommend.  $\equiv$

#### **SPREADSHEET TOOLBOX**

#### **Allowing for Uncertainty in What-If Analysis**

If you've ever drafted a budget and suspected you were just guessing at the numbers, you'll appreciate Delta Manager 1.11's frank approach to uncertainty. Instead of the single value a 1-2-3 sensitivity analysis can handle, this add-in lets you enter a range of values. For example, if you think sales will be \$80,000 plus or minus \$10,000, you enter 70000<x<10000. Delta Manager assumes your data is based on a normal distribution and takes your high and low values to be the standard error. From then on, all your calculations reflect the appropriate range of uncertainty, which you can adjust to a 68, 95, or 99.7 percent confidence interval. So you might find

out, based on your input uncertainty, that profits will likely range from \$5000 to \$8000 but could go as high as \$12,000 or as low as \$1000!

Like all statistical procedures, *Delta Manager*'s can mislead naive souls who violate its underlying assumptions—for instance, that the input variables for which you've estimated uncertainty are statistically independent. But *Delta Manager* beats guessing, and it can give you a real sense of the range of results you can expect.

#### **EXCEL SHORTCUT**

#### **One-Step Graph Title Updates** *Ralph Soucie*

If you update a worksheet and chart each month—for a sales summary, for example—you can change both titles at once by linking the title cells. To illustrate the technique, open a worksheet and enter a title in cell A1. Enter some sample numbers and select the range containing them, then choose *File New* and select *Chart*.

When the chart file opens, select *Chart Attach Text* and choose the *Chart Title* option. Type an equal sign, =, then change to the worksheet window and point to cell A1. The cell address appears in the formula bar. Press **<Enter>**; the text entry in the worksheet appears as the title of the chart. Any changes to the contents of cell A1 will be reflected automatically in the chart title. You can link other chart text objects (such as axis labels and unattached text) to worksheet cells in a similar manner.

#### Tips and techniques for managing your data

This month: The dating game

#### Steve Cummings

When is as important a business question as what or how much, and learning your data manager's daterelated capabilities can help you find the answer. Whether you want a tally of all your receipts from last October, a list of employees hired after August 1, 1990, a warning to pop up two weeks before a deadline, or the average price you paid for pencils during the past 30 days, you can make good use of some simple functions that identify and manipulate date information.

Let's start with a simple example: suppose you keep a to-do list similar to the one I described in the June column, where every task has a date field called Deadline. Think of how convenient it would be (albeit depressing) to quickly pull up your most pressing chores those due today or (even worse) yesterday. Thanks to your program's *current date* function, you can easily do just that.

#### No Date Like the Present

Every data manager can read the current date from your PC's system clock. In *dBASE* and its derivatives (like *Al*pha Four, FoxPro, and Clipper) the function for doing this is called DATE(), and you would use it in a command like LIST FOR Deadline  $\leq$  = DATE(). In the friendlier dBASE IV environment, when you create or modify a query, you would type <=DATE() in the box below the Deadline heading, then press <**F2**> to get the results. Outside the dBASEworld, the function has other names: In Paradox, it's called TODAY(); in Q&A, @DATE. R:base doesn't have a function for this job, but its predefined variable **#DATE** can be used similarly.

Whatever they call their functions, all data management programs let you calculate dates in the same way: When you add or subtract numbers, you add or subtract days. If your Deadline field contains the date 08/20/91, the formula **Deadline – 7** produces the date 08/13/91. And to tell your customers their bills are past due after 30 days, your invoice could include the text **Your bill is delinquent after**, followed by a calculated field that adds 30 to the current date; in *Paradox*, you'd use **TODAY() + 30**.

#### Weeks, Months, and Years

Want to look at the orders you received in a given calendar year? Most data managers have a function that extracts

Ask *dBASE III* or *IV* or any of their clones what the contents of a date field are, and the answer you'll get back will be something like '08/05/91'; fine for your own information, but not for a report. A combination of date and string functions, however, can make the dates in your reports look just the way you want.

For instance, to print a date like 'Monday, August 5, 1991', you would use the statement CDOW(date field) + ', ' + CMONTH( date field) + ' + LTRIM(STR(DAY( date field))) + ', ' + LTRIM(STR( YEAR(date field))) in a calculated field in your report.

That looks horribly complicated until you know how it

works. CDOW() reads a date and writes the day of the week; CMONTH() does the same with the month. To get the day's number in a format you can mix with text, use LTRIM(STR(DAY(Date field))). The DAY() function reads a date and writes the day of the month as a number, 5 in our example. The STR() function reads a number and writes a 10-digit text string, so the 5 becomes ' 5'. LTRIM() removes the extra blanks, returning the text string '5'. LTRIM(STR(YEAR(date field))) does the same job for the year.

The full statement may be large, but it gives you a nicelooking date.



the year from the full date, ignoring the month and day. *dBASE* calls this function YEAR(); typing **YEAR(ORDERDATE)** = **1990** in the *dBASE IV* Query Design screen's condition box (brought up with the *Condition Add condition box* option) finds all the orders placed in 1990. *Paradox* calls this function YEAR() too, while in *R:base* it's IYR() and in Q&A @YEAR(). Similar functions typically extract the month as a number from 1 to 12, the month as a text string ("August"), the day of the month (in numbers), and the day of the week (as a number or name).

To handle these calculations, your data manager stores dates in a format all its own. If you want to mix a date with standard text—say, to index on Name and Purchase Date together, or to include a date in a sentence—you'll need to convert the date to a text string first. Most data managers have a function for this. In *dBASE* the function is called DTOC(), for Date To Character;

#### PARADOX SHORTCUT

Monthly Summaries Celeste Robinson

Reports, particularly annual ones, are often divided by month. A report of last year's sales, for instance, might contain a subtotal for each month. Luckily, the *Paradox* report generator makes displaying a monthly subtotal easy.

Enter the report generator, and arrange your fields in a Form or Table band as you would for any other report. To create another band for the subtotals, press **<F10>** and select *Group Insert Range*. A menu bar will display the fields in your table; select the date field. You'll next be prompted to group by Day, Week, Month, or Year; select *Month*.

Next, you must place the new band. Move the cursor into the Page band above or below the form band and press <Enter>. You now have a new band that prints whenever the month in your date field changes. To place monthly sales subtotals in this band, move the cursor into the band, press <F10>, and select Field Place Summary Regular. Select your Sales Amount field, then Sum PerGroup. When you print your report, your sales will be grouped, and totaled, by month.

statement like 'This item was sold to you on 08/05/91.'

But that's not the nicest way to display a date. What if you prefer to say 'This item was sold on Monday, August 5, 1991'? Printing a proper-looking date in *dBASE* involves a complicated statement with functions inside of functions (see the sidebar "dBASE Shortcut"). Luckily, other programs offer simpler ways to do this; Q&A, for instance, lets you select from a wide range of data formats—from 8/5/91 to 5.08.1991 to August 5, 1991—when you define your data base. However, you'll still need to use a few functions to get Monday, August 5, 1991.

Date functions are useful tools for focusing on the information you really want in your data base. Don't overlook their power. €

#### Expert advice for creating high-impact documents and presentations

This month: creating color presentations, and speeding chart redraws in Freelance

#### **Richard Jantz**

Unless you're Woody Allen, putting out your message in black-and-white puts you at a disadvantage. Color helps get your point across more quickly and effectively—a color pie chart is far easier to grasp than one using gray shades or cross-hatching. But choosing the right colors for your overheads or 35mm slides is a lot trickier than flipping open a box of Crayolas.

It's no secret that different colors produce different moods and effects, and that some color combinations look better than others. Top presentation programs like Software Publishing's *Harvard Graphics* and Microsoft's *PowerPoint* provide predesigned *color schemes*—sets of coordinated hues for backgrounds, text, borders, and such elements as the bars in a bar chart. But they don't tell you which scheme is appropriate for a particular type of presentation or help you create attractive custom color schemes to make your message stand apart from the crowd.

This month we discuss the art of mixing and matching colors to produce effective presentations. For a handy visual guide to colors that work well together, take a peek at the *color wheel* shown in **FIGURE 1**. Then follow these simple guidelines to choose the right colors for your slides, overheads, and on-screen presentations.

• Choose colors that play a meaningful part in your message, such as those used in your company's logo or product packaging. On the other hand, if you're presenting a bid to, say, Kodak, you may want a color scheme that goes well with that company's yellow-and-red logo.

• Choose colors that reflect the emotional mood of your presentation. For a serious business discussion, use *cool* colors—shades of green, blue, or violet—to evoke a sense of trust. If you're launching a new product line, *warm* colors like red, orange, and yellow help generate excitement.

• Use a consistent color scheme throughout your presentation. If you incorporate existing slides in your presentation, make sure the color schemes match.

• Adjust the color scheme to match

your output medium. For example, dark backgrounds and light text work great for color slides and screen shows, but you'll want light backgrounds and dark text for overheads.

• Avoid using too many colors or color contrasts in a chart. Although some programs offer as many as 16 hues per color scheme, the most effective charts use only 4 or 5. If you must add more say, to represent a dozen bars in a bar chart—use light, medium, and dark versions of a small set of hues.

• Use the color wheel to select harmonious color combinations. To create subtle contrasts (for example, between the shaded areas of a 3-D chart), pick colors that are adjacent on the color wheel. For striking contrasts—to set off the most important part of a chart choose colors from opposite sides of the wheel.

• If you add color clip art (such as a logo) or scanned images to a slide, make sure the image's colors don't clash with or blend into the other colors in your chart. A picture of the United States flag may add a patriotic touch to a chart, but it won't show up well against a dark blue or red background.

• Avoid using red and green shades to display chart data such as the different sections in an area chart. If members of your audience are color-blind as are from 6 to 10 percent of the male population—they'll have trouble distinguishing between the red and green sections.

Finally, if color presentations play a starring role in your job, consider adding a color reference book to your library. Two good resources are *The Power of Color in Design for Desktop Publishing* (MIS Press, Portland, Oregon, 1990) and *Color Harmony: A Guide to Creative Color Combinations* (Rockport Publishers, Rockport, Massachusetts, 1987). €

#### **Fast Chart Redraws in Freelance**

If you use *Freelance Plus*'s drawing tools to enhance your presentation charts, you know how annoying it is to wait for the screen to redraw. The screen refreshes every time you use the View command to change page views and whenever you return to the current page after using the Print Preview command.

Fortunately, there are ways to speed things up. First, you don't have to wait for *Freelance* to redraw the screen completely. By pressing **<Esc>** or the right mouse button, you can stop redrawing the screen whenever you want. Second, *Freelance* redraws objects faster if you first turn off the highlight indicators (small squares that identify a selected object). Just press <**F8**> or use the Options Highlight command to conceal the indicators before the screen redraws.

Finally, you can always move part of a complex drawing to *Freelance*'s alternate work space ('Page 2 of 2') while editing, and then move it back to the current page when done. It takes less time for the screen to redraw only part of an image.

#### Practical advice on mastering Windows 3.0

This month: Learn to tune up WIN.INI.

Model T owners had to be part mechanic to keep their tin lizzies going. It's not that bad for *Windows* users, but knowing what goes on in WIN.INI, a key part of the *Windows* engine, doesn't hurt.

WIN.INI is an initialization file, a sort of combined AUTOEXEC.BAT and CONFIG.SYS that tells Windows and its applications at start-up how the environment is configured, where resources like printers are, and more. If you just need basic transportation, you won't have to dig into WIN.INI, since many of its functions can be managed from the Windows Control Panel. But if you want to auto-load programs, fine-tune performance, run Windows on a network, or otherwise customize the environment, this is where you start (for a guide to WIN.INI functions and settings and how they relate to Control Panel options, see the figure).

#### **Checking Under the Hood**

Since WIN.INI is an ASCII file, you can edit it with any text processor. Or if you double-click WIN.INI in *Windows*' File Manager, it will automatically be loaded in the Notepad.

Poke around, and you'll see that WIN.INI is divided into sections, each with a heading in square brackets. Many of these sections correspond to Control Panel icons. Applications like *Excel* also add sections during installation that specify where a program finds its fonts, dictionaries, and so on.

In each section are statements in the format function = value. The value (words or numbers) represents the function's setting. For instance, Spooler=yes tells *Windows* to use Print Manager whenever a *Windows* application prints a file.

#### Let's Do Launch

One simple modification you can make

to streamline operations is having WIN.INI launch one or more programs every time you run *Windows*.

First, make a backup of WIN.INI. Then open WIN.INI, and at the top of the [windows] section, locate the run= and load= statements. To run a program automatically, type in its full path and executable file name after run=. To load one as an icon on the desktop, use the load= line. To start multiple programs, separate the names with either a *single* space or a comma—but not both. The limit per line is 127 characters.

For example, if you wanted WIN.INI to automatically put *PageMaker 4.0*'s icon on the desktop and open *Excel* and *Windows*' Clock utility, you'd set up the file as follows:

load = c:pm4pm4.exe

run=c:\excel\excel.exe clock.exe

This trick also works for a DOS program. Simply type in its path and either its executable file name or the name of

#### Save Those Program Groups!

Setting up *Windows* so that everything—applications, desktop colors, fonts, and so on—is just the way you want it can take some time. Don't let a system crash, or even the installation of a new *Windows* application, destroy your work. Religiously back up all initialization (INI) files, especially WIN.INI and SYSTEM.INI. When fate strikes, you can restore your backup copies to *Windows*' subdirectory and save yourself a lot of trouble. Don't forget to back up PROG-MAN.INI too. This file stores the configuration of all the program groups you have laboriously crafted. Just remember that it doesn't include the actual group files (with the extension GRP). If a crash destroys any GRP files, restoring PROG-MAN.INI won't help much--you'll still have to re-create each group from scratch. So be doubly safe and back up all the GRP files as well. In the event of a disaster, you'll be prepared.

#### WIN.INI Starts Windows the Way You Want It

Here's a guide to the major sections of WIN.INI, Windows' customizable start-up file.

the program's PIF file. Note: If two or more full-screen DOS applications are listed on the run = line, only the last one will open full screen.

#### **Auto-Opening Data Files**

Automatically opening a specific data file into a *Windows* or DOS application is almost as easy to do. The first trick is associating the file's extension with the application; the second trick is listing the data file (*not* the application) after the run= or load= statement.

The easiest way to associate a file's extension is by running the File Manager. If you want to associate a TXT file, for example, open a directory window and select *any* data file with the TXT extension, then open the File menu and pick the *Associate* command. In the dia-

log box, type in the executable file name of the program you want to associate the data file with (such as C:\WIN-DOWS\WRITE.EXE), and press <Enter>.

If you need to associate more than one file extension with a program, you can do it faster by opening WIN.INI and going to the [extensions] section. The statements here follow the format  $nnn=program.exe \land .nnn$ , where nnnis the data file's extension and program.exe the name and path of the executable program file.

For example, to associate all TXT files with *Windows Write*, you'd type txt=c:\windows\write.exe ^.txt

(A side benefit: Once you've associated the TXT extension with *Write*, doubleclicking any TXT file in the File Manager will force *Write* to load it.) When you've made the necessary file associations, you can finish creating an auto-loading file. Go back to the run= or load= line and type in the name of the desired data file. For example, to load TODO.TXT into Write automatically when you start Windows, type run=c:\windows\todo.txt

Save WIN.INI, restart *Windows*, and you're in business.

You've learned the basics—stay tuned next month for some advanced WIN.INI tinkering, including automatic font downloading. €

#### On-line resources for business and professional users

This month: Find out if Dow Jones News/Retrieval is worth the price, and discover another way of legal networking via the Electronic Bar Association Network.

ow Jones News/Retrieval (DJN/ R) is a comprehensive on-line source of business information, offering up-tothe-minute stock quotes along with access to the full text of 350 business newspapers and magazines. Its only flaw is sky-high pricing. Dow starts at \$7.60 an hour (300 baud at night), but when you add daytime access fees, surcharges for certain services, and a nasty per-character charge, you can end up paying \$171 per hour-plus an \$18 annual service fee. Some surcharges are lower, but most of the useful features hover uncomfortably close to that \$171 price point.

**Q.** What's available on Dow Jones News/Retrieval? **A.** DJN/R consists of four main data bases:

• Business and World Newswires holds the Dow Jones business news wires, plus the *Wall Street Journal*, *Barron's*, and Japan's Kyodo news wire.

• Dow Jones Text Library contains the full text of 350 national and regional business publications.

• Company/Industry Information offers a wide range of data—including earnings forecasts, company reports, and analysts' reports—on all publicly traded companies in the world.

• Quotes, Statistics, and Commentary delivers current and historical stock quotes as well as mutual fund reports.

Best of all, DJN/R is easier to search than a newspaper stock quote listing. You can choose a fast command-line interface or well-designed menus. To search the full text of news wire and publication holdings, simply enter the words you want to search for, and (if you like) a date range. Dow checks its files and returns a list of headlines. Once you select those that interest you, full text scrolls across the screen. **Q.** What does DJN/R offer that you can't get anywhere else?

**A.** It's the only on-line source for the four Business and World Newswires, plus full text of the *Wall Street Journal*, *Barron's*, *Business & Finance Report*, and *American Demographics*. Also exclusive: transcriptions of the TV show *Wall \$treet Week* and up-to-the-minute reports on SEC filings. But Dow's main draw is its up-to-the-second stock quotes. CompuServe, GEnie, and Prodigy also offer stock quotes, and for a lot less, but only with a 15-minute delay.

**Q.** Can I find any of the nonexclusive information on DJN/R elsewhere for less?

**A.** Yes, indeed. GEnie offers daily and historical stock prices for just \$4.95 a month, if you log on at night.

CompuServe (CIS) offers a variety of useful financial features. For instance, Rategram lets you search for securities and certificates of deposit with the highest return, and several other features make it easy to analyze your investment portfolio. CIS also offers Vestor Buy/

#### **ON-LINE SHORTCUT**

#### **Choosing the Fastest Error Correction Protocol**

If you're downloading files from CompuServe, always use its proprietary error-checking protocol, CompuServe-B. This protocol is really fast, mainly because of its large block size and because it doesn't pause between blocks for an acknowledgement. On other on-line services, YMODEM or ZMODEM are your best choices. The former gains speed thanks to the large blocks in which it sends data; the latter sends information in highly efficient data streams instead of blocks (but falls back to block format if it encounters line noise). Sell Recommendations and Money Magazine's Info Center.

Basic hourly charges on CIS range from \$6 to \$12.80, plus \$2 per month. True, some CIS features have surcharges, but they are generally much lower than you'll find on DJN/R. For example, Money Magazine's Fund-Watch Online actually offers more details than you'll find on DJN/R, and it costs only \$21 to \$27.50 an hour. On DJN/R you pay \$36 to \$171 an hour, plus per-character charges.

#### **Q.** Will DJN/R track news on particular companies that interest me?

**A.** You bet—if you're willing to pay the price. DJN/R's clipping feature, which also costs \$171 an hour (2400 baud during the day), lets you create up to ten folders with five search phrases in each. It culls all appropriate news from the DJN/R news wires; then every time you log on, the scoop is waiting for you. DJN/R's tracking feature lets you keep tabs on stock prices as well as breaking news on 25 companies or industriesand it costs the same \$171 an hour plus an additional \$82 a month. But remember, almost every on-line service, including CompuServe, GEnie, and NewsNet, offers similar capabilities for a whole lot less.

#### **Q.** If I decide DJN/R is worthwhile for my business, how can I keep my bills down?

**A.** Log on after hours. DJN/R's evening rates and surcharges are dramatically lower than its day rates. And invest in a 2400-baud modem (the fastest DJN/R supports), which lowers your bit-per-second cost. That way if you really need up-to-the-second quotes and other exclusive goodies from DJN/R, you'll know you're getting them at the best possible price. **€**

If your legal firm is counting pennies, or if you're a law student who can't yet afford to fly first class, check out a new lowcost on-line service for lawyers: the Electronic Bar Association Network.

Like the better-known ABA/ net, EBA/net offers on-line conferences, E-mail, legal forms, and access to research data bases. Unfortunately, EBA/net is somewhat underpowered. Its message conferences are sparse, and you can't send E-mail to outside services. Since it has fewer members, opportunities for networking are thin too. And while the price is low, it's not that low.

Still, EBA/net is only a few steps behind ABA/Net. Its access to essential data bases like Lexis/Nexis, Dialog, BRS, Vu/ Text, and NewsNet is just as strong. And you'll find more than 900 legal forms—including promissory notes, contracts, bankruptcy forms, corporation forms, and litigation-related forms—in the format of every leading word processor. The forms are available on ABA/net too, but only uncompressed and costing \$400 per hour at 2400 baud. EBA/net offers compressed ZIP files at no extra cost. And if you're looking for on-line access to the popular *Law MUG Newsletter*, you'll find it here, exclusively.

A subscription to EBA/net is \$10 per month, plus hourly charges that range from \$11 to \$17. ABA/net's hourly charges are about the same—but while there's no monthly charge, you're stuck with a \$30 monthly minimum and hefty surcharges. For very small firms, especially those that don't need to be on line every day, EBA/net's cost savings will be welcome. But most legal outfits will probably be happier with ABA/net with its bigger subscribership and wider choice of forums.



#### Around the Block Again With WordPerfect

Tired of running around the block in *WordPerfect* every time you need to make more than one change to a section of text? There's an easy way to avoid manual reblocking after boldfacing, underlining, or moving text. Once you have marked the original block and, say, underlined the text, just press <**F12**> or <**Alt**>-<**F4**>, and then press <**Ctrl**>-<**Home**> twice. The block will be rehighlighted, and your cursor will snap back to where you began the block.

#### **Mouseless Ami Pro Word Deletes**

Windows word processing jocks get so accustomed to using a mouse, they sometimes overlook more efficient keyboard solutions. Sure, it's great to be able to delete large blocks by highlighting with the mouse and pressing <Delete>. But when you have to remove a number of single words in one section of a document, this method can actually slow you down. It's often easier to jump the cursor a word at a time with <Ctrl>-<Cursor Right> or <Ctrl>-<Cursor Left>, a sentence to the right with <Ctrl>-<**Period**>, or a sentence to the left with <Ctrl>-<Comma>. Place the cursor on the first character of the word you want deleted, and use <Ctrl>-<Shift>-< Delete > to clip the word with any trailing spaces. You'll get the job done quickly while keeping your hands on the keyboard.

#### Copy AUTOEXEC.BAT for Protection

If your system starts misbehaving, check AUTOEXEC.BAT-the file in your root directory that initializes your system when you boot up. Software you've recently installed may have changed it. If you're on a LAN, for example, adding a PATH command to the end of your AUTOEXEC.BAT may wipe out the network drive mapping, preventing you from working with the LAN as you're used to. Other changes can be more subtle; some programs don't even let you know they're making them. If you're like most users and have only a nodding acquaintance with your AUTO-EXEC.BAT, it can be hard to spot changes.

Right now, while everything is working the way you want, archive a copy of AUTOEXEC.BAT. You should have a separate \DOS directory for all DOS files on the C: drive of your hard disk. Enter copy c:\autoexec.bat c:\dos. Then, if you experience problems with your system, enter comp c:\autoexec.bat c:\dos. If the two files are different, print them to see what's changed in the new one.

If you can't spot an obvious troublemaker, use an ASCII editor to remove all the new lines except the first. Reboot, and if everything works all right, add another line and boot again. Repeat the process until you have identified the problem instruction. Remove the offending line, and call the software vendor's technical support to help find a work-around that will let you use the program in your environment.

#### A Neat Wrap-Up for Long Text Fields in Paradox Reports

If your *Paradox* tables have fields from 80 to 255 characters in length, you can't show their contents in single lines on a

standard screen or in a letter-width report. But you can use WordWrap in the *Paradox* report generator to print long fields out on a few neat lines.

Press rd\* < Enter> and select the name of the table. Highlight the number of an unused report, press <Enter>, type a description, and press f to design a freeform report. You'll see a design screen containing every field in the table in a vertical column. Delete any elements you don't want: Press fe and place the cursor on fields you want to erase; you can remove nonhighlighted text elements if you like, with <Backspace> and <Delete>.

Press <F10>fp and select the field type; you'll bring up a list of the fields of that type in the table. Select the field you want to wrap, and cursor to where you want to start. Press <Enter>; the cursor will go to the right end of the line. Hold down <Cursor Left> to move to where you want the right margin. Press <Enter><F10>fw, and press <Enter>. Answer the prompt and enter the number of lines sufficient to display the contents of the field. A notice will appear at bottom right letting you know the word wrap value has been recorded. Select any other fields you want to include in the report, and then take a look at the output: Press <**F10**>o and select *Print*er, Screen, or File for your report. You'll get clean, professional results.



#### To Boldly Go Where CHKDSK Can't

Every time I use CHKDSK.COM, I want it to tell me just two things: how much space is left on my disk and how much memory is free. On a fast machine this information comes quickly, but on an early PC or one with a slow hard disk, the wait can be intolerable. This problem led me to develop Freespace (FS.COM). It's many times faster than CHKDSK, produces a clearer display (in color on most machines), and needs less than 4K of RAM, as opposed to CHKDSK's 40K.

I've tested Freespace on 8088s,

80286s, and 80386s using DOS 3.0 to 3.3. To use it, type fs d: where d: is any valid drive. If you type just fs, the program uses the default drive.

Editor's note: Mr. Mowers doesn't mention one of the best applications for his program: networked drives, where CHKDSK, which needs exclusive access to the physical drive, doesn't work at all. I altered his original code to let the program work on disks larger than 64MB and to fix a few minor bugs.

To create the program, type the seemingly senseless text in LISTING 1 into an ASCII text file called FS.DAT. Double-check the code for errors. At the DOS prompt, type debug<fs.dat to create your FS.COM program file, which you should then move to a directory listed in your PATH command.

If you compare FS.COM's memory estimate to CHKDSK's, you'll see that it's more conservative. The reason: CHKDSK adds back its environment space and FS doesn't. FS's number is probably closer to the actual amount of memory a program will have available when it runs.



after you delete records from a Q&Adata base as before. For instance, I had an employee information data base named PERSON with 440 records in it. A directory listing showed a 675K DTF file and a 343K IDX file. After using Q&A's *File Remove* command to remove all but 20 of the entries, as far as DOS was concerned I still had nearly 1MB tied up in those files.

To remedy this problem, copy the contents of your old data files to new ones, then rename the new ones: After deleting a large number of records, select *File Copy Copy design with IA info* from the *Q&A* main menu, and call your new files something like PERSON2. Next, select *File Copy Copy selected*

RM lets you delete many files by specifying them all in one command line, such as rm fhm.\* \*.doc \*.dat test.drw \*.dwg, something DEL could never dream of. To bring this old UNIX friend into the DOS world, I developed a batch file, RM.BAT [see LISTING 2]. Put this file in a directory on your path, and you can delete up to nine files or wild-card file groups. Note that if you're using an earlier version of DOS than 3.1, you need to remove the @ sign at the beginning of the 'Echo off' command in this file.

Editor's note: This batch file is an excellent demonstration of the DOS SHIFT command, which "steps" through a list of batch file arguments so %2 becomes %1 and %3 becomes %2, allowing you to process up to nine parameters in a loop. The OS/2 shell's ERASE and DEL commands already allow multiple file specs, but Microsoft hasn't added them to DOS for fear of creating incompatibilities.

#### **To ERR Is Electronic**

In a *1-2-3* worksheet, I have to calculate the difference between two numbers as a percentage of the second one. I used to do this with the formula (B12-C12)/C12. But if cell C12 was empty, which it was if I hadn't yet typed a value, the formula produced an ERR value. That didn't suit me; if C12 was blank, I wanted the cell with the formula to be blank as well.

To solve the problem, I replaced the formula with a new one, @IF(@IS-ERR((B12-C12)/C12)," ",(B12-C12)/C12), which leaves the formula cell blank if C12 is empty. The @ISERR function evaluates the original formula and returns a true value if the result is ERR. @IF puts a blank in the cell if @ISERR is true or does the calculation again if @ISERR is false.

#### **BASICS: DOS 5.0**

**How it works:** When you start your PC, DOS's command processor, COMMAND.COM, starts autamatically. This program brings DOS's internal commands into memory ready for you to run by typing their names at the DOS command line or prompt. Commonly used internal commands include CD, COPY, DEL, DIR, MD, and RD. In addition, DOS provides external commands, each with its own executable file, which you should store in a directary named \DOS on your hard disk. These files have EXE or COM extensions, for example, CHKDSK.COM, COMP.COM, and XCOPY.EXE. A BAT, or batch, file is a text file in which you list a sequence of commands, each an its own line. If named AUTOEXEC.BAT and stored in the root directory of the boot drive (A: or C:), it executes automatically whenever yau start yaur PC.

#### **ENTERING DOS COMMANDS**

You can run an internal command (and any file with an EXE, COM, or BAT extension) by typing its name (without the extension) and pressing **<Enter>**. You can define some commands more specifically with the use of switchescharacters or words that follow a command, often separated from it by a farward slash (/). DOS provides the following command line options:

Don't execute the command Pause a command Stop a command



Editor's note: You can make this trick even easier by placing the formula that might produce an error in a cell that's outside the range of what you see and print. 

# DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

#### **Two Great Programming Books**


#### **Brett Glass**

The tools of the programmer's trade include more than just software and hardware; every codesmith needs a good library of reference books on languages, operating systems, data structures, algorithms, and program-building techniques. *Zen of Assembly Language* and *Undocumented DOS* are two books that belong on every PC programmer's bookshelf.

Michael Abrash's work, Zen of Assembly Language Volume I, Knowledge, starts off with the assumption that you are at least somewhat familiar with 80x86 assembly language programming, and it doesn't bother with explaining basics such as registers or addresses. Instead, it helps you to write superb, rather than merely adequate, assembly language code.

Abrash first introduces a set of routines for taking precise measurements of your program's execution time. He then delves into the secrets of the PC's architecture, showing why code that *seems* to be efficient on paper may not be in the real world. There are chapters on "cycle eaters" (hardware pitfalls that slow down programs), efficient (and inefficient) memory addressing modes, jump instructions, and optimizing for the more advanced 386 and 486 processors.

Zen was originally intended as the first of two or three books on advanced assembly programming. At this date, however, only one volume is out, and no others are on the drawing board. This is a pity; Abrash's examples and advice are eminently practical, and his keen senses of humor and irony make the book fun as well as instructive. Why "Zen"? Says Abrash, "Zen is a technique that brings intuition and nonobvious approaches to bear on difficult problems and puzzles." Highly

recommended.

Undocumented DOS is an excellent text for anyone who's curious about the innards of MS-DOS, and a must for anyone who writes TSRs, network redirectors, or other programs that work with DOS internals. Written by half a dozen knowledgeable authors, including editor Andrew Schulman, Undocumented DOS covers "the body of functions and data structures that can reasonably be considered part of DOS, yet are either unmentioned in the documentation or marked 'Reserved.'"

The first two chapters discuss the reasons for, and logistics of, using undocumented DOS features. The next few chapters cover DOS's data structures and contain fascinating and enlightening discussions of the way DOS allocates resources, uses files, and connects to networks and non-DOS file systems (such as CD ROM drives). If you wish to do advanced memory management, add a new kind of storage device, or create a network driver for DOS, this information will help you do the job right.

Subsequent sections cover features that let you write TSRs, command interpreters, and debuggers. The last chapter gives you a script-driven, eventdriven debugger—in a combination of C and assembly—that shows you how DOS and its utility programs access undocumented features.

Undocumented DOS is a collaborative work that draws on years of collective experience and experimentation as well as on hundreds of pages of on-line discussion. Before this book was published, the only way to gather this information was to disassemble DOS yourself. Now, at last, programmers can spend less time reinventing the wheel and more time producing useful products.

The practical guide to home/office computing

Get the overalls, Honey, I'm doing it myself

Steve Bass

The old saying "The heart is willing, but the palms are sweaty" is only half true. My heart was pounding as well. I had decided to repair my old 286 clunker and discovered I could save almost \$500 by replacing the system board myself instead of taking it in for service. So I wiped the sweat from my palms and went at it.

Despite my early trepidation about venturing into unfamiliar territory, I discovered PC "repair" to be relatively straightforward. It took me only 4 hours —much of it spent fiddling with my CONFIG.SYS and AUTOEXEC.BAT files. I learned plenty about my computer, chose the system board *I* wanted, and even impressed my wife. And let's not forget I saved a few bucks.

I figured as long as I was popping the hood, I might as well install a faster engine. I wanted enough speed and memory to run *Windows* easily. After comparing the specifications of more than 20 different 386 boards, I decided on AMI's 386/486 Mark III Convertible because while I can only afford the 33-MHz 386DX version right now, I can upgrade with a 486 processor card later.

The Mark III with 4MB lists for \$1475, but nobody ever pays list price.

You can get one for about \$1200.

On the day of reckoning, I cleared the desk, turned on the answering machine, and opened my copy of Aubrey Pilgram's *Build Your Own 80486 PC and Save a Bundle.* 

If you're doing it yourself, there are some precautions you *must* take. First, the obvious but most important: Unplug the computer before you take off the case. Controlling electrostatic discharge is essential. If you don't, you risk frying the system board or other components. I wore a \$3.79 antistatic wristband from Radio Shack. I also used Curtis's Touch Me First antistatic pad.

You'll need small Phillips and flat-



blade screwdrivers plus a pair of needlenose pliers. Tiny screws invariably drop from your fingers and hide under the floppy drive, so have a small flashlight handy and a pencil with a bead of Silly Putty at the point. I used one of those plastic boxes with all the compartments to hold the multitude of screws and system board brackets.

My anxiety peaked as I began working my way down to my old motherboard. There were dozens of wires and cables snaking from here to Taiwan. To avoid confusion, I had sketched out a diagram of both motherboard assemblies *before* removing anything.

As I removed each add-in card, I noted where it came from on the old computer diagram and where it would go on the new one. I used masking tape and a felt pen to mark each wire and flat cable with a number, recording what it was connected to and the direction of the connector's pins. Ditto for the power supply, floppy drives, battery, speaker, reset button, and other components. If you can, leave the floppy and hard drives in their cages with the cables attached.

Two last screws, and the system board slid out. I removed the white plastic brackets, used them with the new system board, and reversed the entire procedure. After some minor tweaking with the SETUP program, I rebooted and—by golly, it worked.

While I'll never go into the repair business, I'm glad I took the risk. It was fun and, with the \$480 or so I saved on parts markup and labor, I got a faster computer with lots more memory.






