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This family claims descent from Eustace de Monte Alto, surnamed "The Norman Hunter," who was in the train of Hugh Lupus, palatine Earl of Chester, and in requital of his services received the lordship of Montalt and the castle, lordship, and manor of Hawarden, co. Flint. A member of this family, Amsonar or Aylmer de Monte Alto, in 1174 accompanied the expedition against William the Lion, and had the good fortune to make the Scottish monarch prisoner, and conveying the royal captive to King Henry 3, then at Falaise, was granted, instead of his ancient ensigns, "a lion gu." (the lion of Scotland), *debrused by two bars sable* to denote captivity.
In 1827 John Maude, Esq., of Moor House, copied from a stained glass in the staircase window at West Ryldesden Hall, a curious heraldic representation of the arms "the lion debrused by the bars," surmounted with the letters "RTIUR DE MAHU."

The name is variously spelt—Montalt, Monhault, Mahaut, Moald, Maude or Maude.

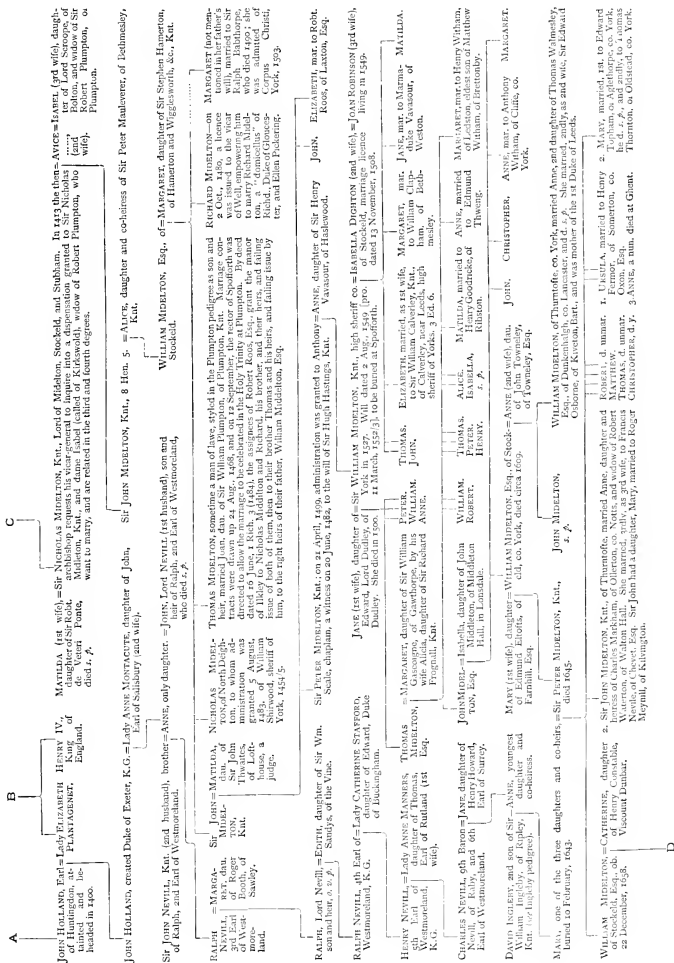

At what precise period the Otes family first settled in Yorkshire is uncertain, but it is of considerable antiquity in the county. NOTE.—The name of Reygate is said to be derived from a place in Normandy, and that the family first settled at Reigate, in Surrey, to which place they gave their name, and whence they migrated north to Yorkshire, in the twelfth century. The same arms were borne by them *temp.* Henry 3, as is shewn by a seal of that period.



For their issue (who were lords of Steveton) see Foljambre pedigree.

The Estates in Milford, Lumby, &c., and the Manor of Steveton, remained in the Foljambre family for nearly three hundred years: the House at Steeton being, however, only used as a residence by one of them, viz., Peter Foljambre, who lived there from 1542 till his death in 1668. He had succeeded his cousin, Sir Francis Foljambre, and only enjoyed the Steeton estate, for the Walton and Derbyshire property had been sold by Sir Francis, and his widow held Aklwarke for her life. Peter Foljambre was buried in the chapel attached to the Manor of Steeton, at Sherburn, and four of his children, who died young, viz., Godfrey, Woodroffe, Henry, and Jane. His wife, Jane, eldest daughter and co-heiress of Ellis Woodroffe, of Hope, co. Derby, Esq., who died 4 September, 1659, is buried at Ledsham. The estates were sold in 1800 by Francis Fernand Foljambre, Esq., in lots to several purchasers. The Manor of Steeton, with the ancient mansion, and 200 acres of the estate, were purchased by the Rev. Christopher Alderson, of Axon, co. York. In 1807, Mr. Alderson resold it to the Rev. Richard Paver, of Ledsham. He died in 1813, and was succeeded by his son, Christopher Paver, who died in 1855, bequeathing the Manor, &c., to his son, William Paver, Esq., the present possessor of it.

THE SLINGSBYS' HISTORY.

Mar. 1916.

AN ANCIENT YORKSHIRE FAMILY.

THEIR ANCESTRY AND ASSOCIATIONS.

Yorkshire has a special interest in the judgment which was delivered yesterday in the Slingsby appeal case, although, in point of fact, neither the present owner of the estates in question nor, of course, his brothers, the appellants, can claim direct descent from the Slingsbys of Scriven Park, Knaresborough, to whose possessions it was claimed the child, Charles Eugene Edward, was entitled to succeed in the ordinary course of nature. As will be seen in the following outline of the family history, the estates in the year 1899 passed, under the will of the last male representative of the line, to a cousin by marriage, namely, the Rev. Charles Slingsby Atkinson (father of Commander Charles Henry Reynard Slingsby, R.N.), who thenceforward assumed the name of Slingsby. The Slingsby records, nevertheless, are so notable a part of local history that no excuse is needed for reviewing briefly their salient features.

One of the oldest families in Yorkshire, the Slingsbys descended from a race of park rangers who held office under the Crown in the ancient Forest of Knaresborough. It is recorded that in the year 1311 a William Slingsby was made Warden of the Manors of the Knights of Ribblesdale, and he it was, probably, who by marriage with Johanna, heiress of Henry de Scriven, founded the line of the Slingsbys of Scriven. The De Scrivenes were people of even greater importance. The story runs that in the time of Henry III. there was one Gamellia, to whom and his heirs was granted the stewardship of the Forest, and whose posterity took the name of Scriven or Scriven from the place of their habitation, the word meaning a cave. The appointment apparently was ratified when Johanna de Scriven married William de Slingsby, for there is evidence that when Edward III. was at Knaresborough in 1333 he selected this William de Slingsby as leader of the Foresters in the campaign against Berwick.

The first representative of the two families mentioned in Burke is John de Slingsby, who died in 1513 from wounds received in Flodden Field. Several of his immediate descendants distinguished themselves in the service of the State and were knighted, but it was reserved for the fifth of the line—Sir Harry, the loyal Cavalier, whom Cromwell beheaded in 1658—to begin the line of baronets which was extinguished on the death of Sir Charles Slingsby, the tenth baronet, in 1869. The story of that tragic event has often been told. Sir Charles, as Master of the York and Amstey Hunt, was one of the ill-fated sportsmen who, while in full chase of a fox, were drowned in the Ure near Newby Hall by the capsizing of the ferry-boat. His horse, Saltish, becoming restive, caused the upset, and in the confusion of horses and men that followed there was great difficulty in effecting rescues. Sir George Wombwell was among the saved, but the Master was carried down stream, and is thought to have been seized with cramp while trying to swim ashore. Nearly 300 years earlier, a similar fate had befallen the eldest son of one of his ancestors, who was drowned in the Nidd while endeavouring to save the life of a servant of the house.

As the last baronet was unmarried, Scriven passed to his sister, the last remaining Slingsby of Scriven, who espoused Captain Thomas Leslie. She, however, left no issue, and on her death in 1839, her cousin, the Rev. Charles Slingsby Atkinson, succeeded to the estates and took the name of Slingsby, under the will of her brother. Mr. Atkinson was the eldest son of the Rev. Thomas Atkinson (rector of Kirby Sigston, North. allerton), brother of the 10th baronet's mother. Thus, there is no blood relationship with the Slingsbys, the Atkinsons, indeed, on their part, tracing their descent from a common ancestry with the Atkinsons of Morland and Temple Severn, who settled in the northern counties about the time of Henry I. The connection with the Slingsbys is shown in the following table—

who, being expelled the House of Commons, and having all his goods confiscated by an Ordinance of Parliament, nothing else remained for him to do but to endeavour to save his soul. He suffered on the 8th day of June, 1658, in the 57th year of his age, on account of his fidelity to his King, and attachment to the laws of his country; beheaded by order of the tyrant Cromwell, he was translated to a better place.

At Red House, Moor Monkton, which the Slingsbys acquired by purchase from William Fairfax, Sir Henry had grandfathered Charles I. many years earlier, namely, in 1633, when the monarch attended the races on Accomb Moor, and saw his host's horse win the Plate. To Red House also came the Duke of York in 1665, when the estates had been restored, and Sir Thomas Slingsby, the second baronet had succeeded his father, Sir Thomas, like others of his line before and after, sat in Parliament for Knaresborough, and besides being High Sheriff for Yorkshire, he held office as Constable of Scarborough Castle. He died in 1673, and was in turn succeeded by his eldest son, Henry, whose brother Thomas became the fourth baronet, and left three sons to bear the title. The first of these left no issue, and the others died unmarried, so the title and estates went to Thomas Turner Slingsby (the 8th Baronet), named in the above extract from the family tree, who was the son of the 4th Baronet's youngest son. Thus, still without a break from father to son, the title descended until the 10th Baronet's melancholy end in the River Ure brought the male line to an end. The eldest daughter of Sir Thomas the 10th Baronet, by the way, married in 1714 Thomas Duncombe of Helmsley, from whom the Earls of Faversham are descended.

The last of the Slingsbys to inherit the Scriven estates was, as we have seen, the 10th Baronet's sister. In the 232 years that had elapsed since the baronetcy was granted there had been seven generations of the family at Scriven; and no fewer than five of the ten holders of the title died unmarried or without issue. Here is another interesting fact. At Harrogate, as we have seen, one of the Slingsby race discovered the Old spa waters, and it was at Harrogate, too, that Charles Slingsby, younger son of Sir Thomas Turner Slingsby made a discovery of another sort, for he there first met Miss Atkinson, the lady who became his wife, and thus established the connection with the Atkinson family, a member of which on the death of his daughter (the last Slingsby of Scriven) entered into possession of the estates. Staying with her at the old Dragon Hotel was her sister, and the married Sir William Ingleby, whose title also became extinct before many years had passed.

Beyond the heirlooms it contains, the Hall at Scriven Park has little or nothing to show its association with mediæval times. It is a stone-built mansion dating apparently from the beginning of the 17th century, and occupying the site of the ancient building which Sir Henry Slingsby, the Royalist, described in his diary as "that rotten house at Scriven," when he visited it in 1639 from Red House. His purpose, he wrote, was "to order the repair of Sir so unsatisfactory was its condition that he had to borrow furniture from his tenants before he and his wife and daughter could settle down for the night.

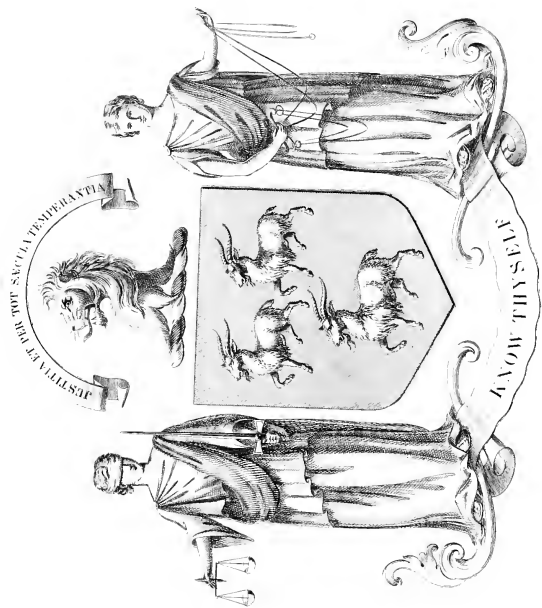

This family claims descent from the family of Stansfeld, of Stansfeld Hall. The first on record is Wyens Maryons, lord of Stansfeld, who, it is stated, came over from Normandy with the Conqueror. His son, Jordan de Stansfeld, was seised of the township of Stansfeld and Halifax; later on we find an Oliver Stansfeld living at 23 Edward III., constable of Pontefract Castle, and to whom was granted the manor of Lanchester by Henry de Lacy, but of this we find no further mention. The Ferrer's (Baron of Wenme) coat is here differentiated by a lion.
3. The quarters in small capitals are those of the baronesses who married into the Watson, Wentworth, and Gascoigne families; the right to bear those placed in italics is questionable.
4. The quarters from 29 to 42 inclusive are not in the first Wentworth shield in Harl. MS. 1047, although Annora Unfraville (who married Stephen Walsey) is given as an heiress in the pedigree. The authorities referred to are Harl. MSS. 1047, 1415, 1571, 6070, 245, 1233, 1411, but they are contradictory as to the alliances. If the daughter and heir of Lord Clare married Dupier instead of the daughter and heir of St. Quintin, the quarters between parentheses 36-39 would be borne.
5. In Baron Vernon's achievement (Edm., vol. v., p. 492) the following appear, amongst others, as Wentworth quarters: 1. Bigod, Earl of Norfolk; 2. Marshall, Earl of Pembroke; 3. JOAN, daughter of = Sir Richard York, was admitted to the freedom of the city of York, by purchase, in 1456, chamberlain = 1460, sheriff 1465/6, lord mayor in 1469 and 1482, and was M.P. for the city in six parliaments. In 1462, he and his wife became members of the merchants' guild, and he was master of that guild, and of the company of merchants and mercers in 1475. On 15 January, 1466/7, being then mayor of the staple of Calais, he was one of the guests at the great installation feast of Archbishop Neville. When King Henry visited York in July, 1487, "in the Vigil of Saint Peter, called Advincle, he 'dubbed my Lord Maier, called William Todde, and Richard York, alderman, knights,' they being the only citizens on whom he conferred that honour.—Note by Mr. Skaife, *Test. Ebor.*, vol. iv. p. 134. Sir Richard died 25 April, 1498, and was buried in the church of St. John, in Micklegate, York, where were many memorials of him and his family.
