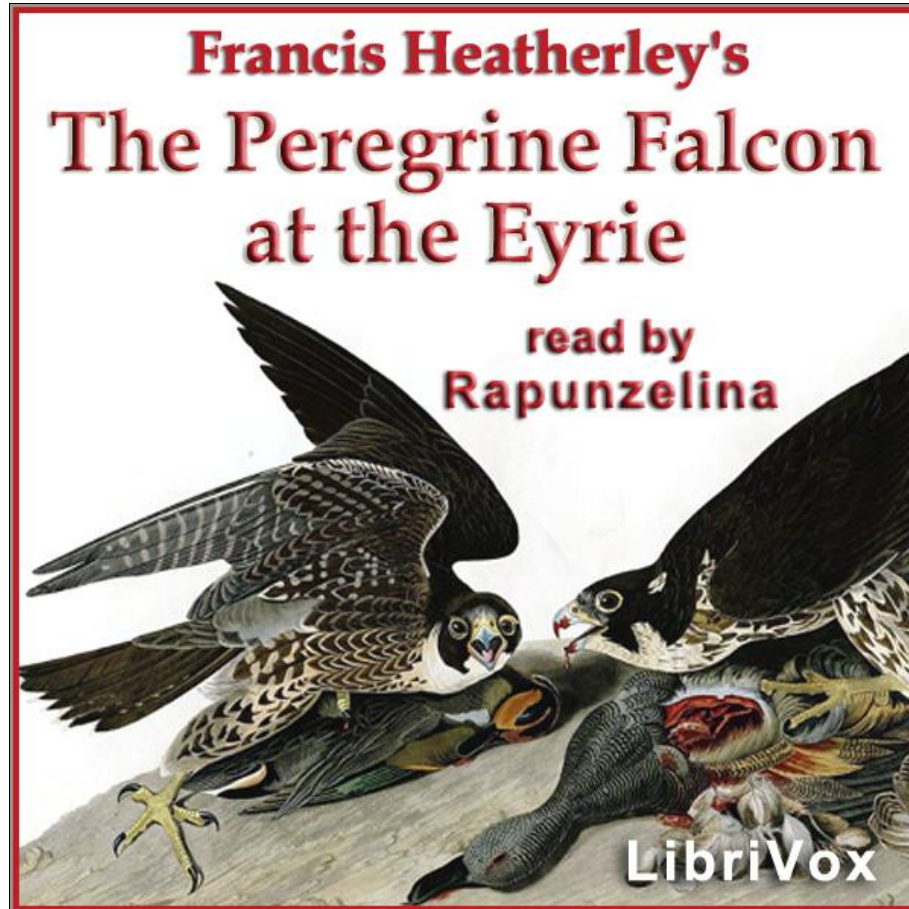


3-in-1 CD CASE INSERTS (1. FRONT, 2. BACK) and 3. ORIGAMI PAPER CASE, with folding instructions.

Page 1. **Front cover for CD Jewel Case**, 4.75" x 4.75"

Cut on outer black lines, fold along center line and tuck into front of Jewel Case
