

THIS Company, which is incorporated by Letters Patent from the Governor-General of Canada, under authority of the Canadian Joint-Stock Act, 1877, was formed in 1878 by a number of wealthy gentlemen in Peterborough, to facilitate the investment of their funds. They had for a number of years been lending money on Mortgage of Landed Estates in that district, and finding that the borrowers frequently wished to repay the loans by instalments, it was arranged to form this Company, so that Shareholders might have a permanent investment, while the Company could take payment of the loans as desired, by instalments, and reinvest the funds as repaid.

Peterborough is the Capital town of the County of Peterborough, Ontario. It is situated in the centre of a large and flourishing agricultural district, and was one of the earliest, and is considered one of the best, settlements of Canada West. The farms in the surrounding country are owned by the farmers themselves, and are in a high state of cultivation, hence offering first-class security for advances which are required by these farmers for further improvements, and for settling their families in new districts, &c.

By this arrangement this Company was at the outset placed in a more advantageous position than is generally the case with such institutions, the Directors of which usually find at the beginning a large amount of money placed in their hands, for which they cannot find immediate investments, to enable them to pay a Dividend. In the case of this Company it was very different, since it started with large investments previously effected on first-class securities yielding a good rate of interest, which have enabled the Directors to pay dividends at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum for the wears the Company has been in existence, and in addition to carry a balance to the credit of Reserve Fund.

The whole of the shares offered in Canada have been taken up; indeed applications were received for considerably more shares than the Directors could allot.

No promotion money has been paid in connection with the Company.
