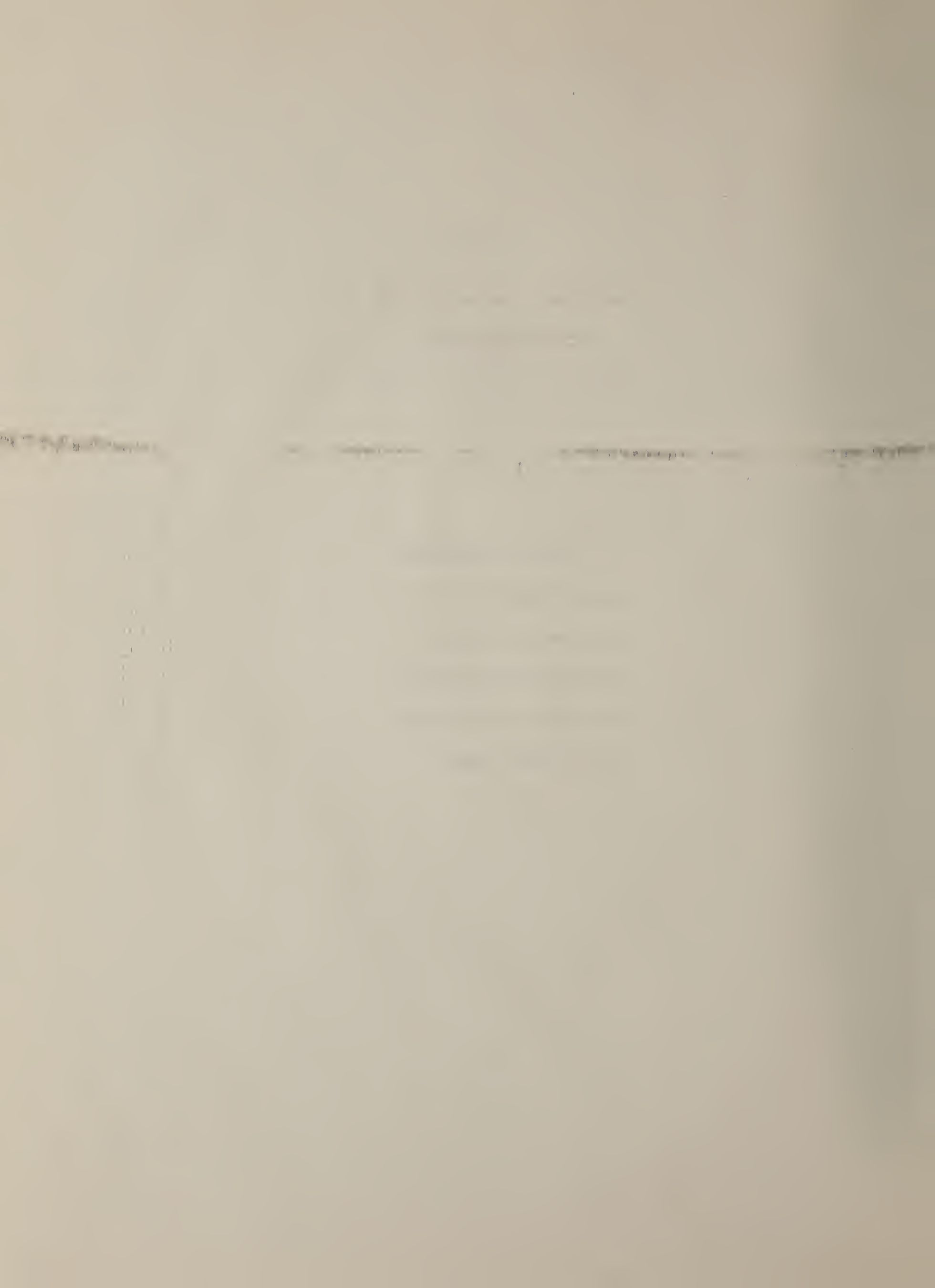

P R E F A C E

This GENEALOGY was begun about forty years ago, when Esther Kliever, writing from dictation by her father, John J. Kliever, prepared the manuscript, "Our Family Record." THE PETER KLIEWER GENEALOGY

1760 to 1960

Instructions

Before attempting to read this genealogy, it is suggested that one read carefully the following instructions. This genealogy is arranged in four indexes, each serving a special purpose: 1. The Numerical Index; 2. The Alphabetical Index; 3. The Geographical Index; and, 4. The Birthday Index.

1. The Numerical Index.--This is the index by families. Each individual receives a number. The number of digits in the number indicates in which generation since the original ancestor that individual appears. If a person's number has three digits, that person is in the 3d generation; if five digits, that person is in the 5th generation since the first ancestor. Peter Schmidt, the first ancestor, therefore, is No. 1, and is considered the 1st generation. His first child is No. 11; his second child, No. 12, signifying the 2d child of the 1st ancestor. Thus, in each family: the first child gets the number of the parent, plus his own digit, 1; the second child gets the number of the parent, plus his own digit, 2. The tenth child would be 0. The eleventh child is numbered A, the twelfth child is B, etc. (This was necessary because there are only ten digits available for one generation.) An adopted child has its own individual digit as does a natural child, but the digit is underscored. Note that underscoring does not mean legal adoption only, but any child that lives with a family as one of them; also, it includes children brought in by one person in a marriage from a previous marriage. If a person goes by one of his given names but not the first one, the name he goes by is underscored. If a person has a nickname or a name of endearment by which he is commonly known other than his given name, such a name is shown in parentheses and in quotation marks: thus, Alice Gwendolyn ("Wendy"). The Numerical Index shows whether an individual had any descendants and how many: thus, No. 126 1 Marie Nachtigal, had four descendants: Nos. 126 11 to 14. A comparison of numbers alone indicates relationships: thus, Nos. 122 833 and 123 632 appear to be third-cousins--since Nos. 122 and 123 were brothers, their children (digits 8 and 6) were then cousins; their children (digits 3 and 3), therefore, second-cousins; and their children (digits 3 and 2), third-cousins

2. The Alphabetical Index.--This lists every name, including those who married into the bloodstream--the in-laws. It also cross-indexes nicknames, and names an individual goes by. Abbreviations used are: m., married; m.(1), first marriage; m.(2), second marriage. Dates of the in-laws and the names of the children are listed under the parent who is in the bloodstream, but are not repeated in the paragraph for the in-law. The information given, if known, is: birth date, death date, marriage date, whether 1st or 2d marriage, to whom married, children, present address, and other biographical data. Addresses for in-laws are given with the name of the spouse in direct line and are not repeated in the biographical data for the in-laws. The reader will find it most helpful, to get a picture of the early life of any individual, to study the life of the parents, as well as the lives of other members of the family. To find the parent's name, consult the Numerical Index, locating the number of the individual in question minus the last digit. For the life-story of any married girl in direct line, see also the life-story of her husband.

3. The Geographical Index.--This shows the states and cities in which persons (households) in this genealogy live--whether in the direct line of descent or

in-laws or adopted, but only the heads of the households are listed, except where children live independently from parents, in which case (if known) they are also listed at their individual address. The purpose of this index is to facilitate spotting relatives in a given area; it should be helpful in planning trips or making contacts in a given area by mail.

4. The Birthday Index.--This shows by months and within the month in date order the birthdays of living persons in this genealogy, and the year of their birth, whether in direct line of descent or in-laws or adopted. Names of SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE TO YOU may be marked with red pencil or with some other distinctive marking.

This genealogy is made up from material supplied largely by YOU; but it comes from many sources, such as the PETER JANZEN GENEALOGY, 1948; the PETER UNRUH GENEALOGY, 1941; manuscripts, such as C. C. Regier's, "An Immigrant Family," 1932, Esther Kliever Bargaen's manuscript, "Our Family Record," and other sources. Some of it is merely as Esther and Bennie Bargaen remember it. Efforts were made to secure accurate information from everyone, but absolute accuracy is not guaranteed. Your reactions, criticism, suggestions, corrections, and especially more adequate biographical data will be appreciated. Such material can be included in future editions as they appear feasible.--The editor: Bernhard ("Bennie") Bargaen, Box 157, North Newton, Kansas.
