## Preface to the Journey

This is a carefully prepared handloook setting forth the possibilities of an automobile trip from the city of Chicago to South Bend. Ind., the return journey and such side trips as are afforded. The photographic riews and their underlined notes clearly indicate guide posts, and the descriptive matter calls attention to every point of interest and attraction, insuring the traveler the best and most convenient roads and enabling him to enjoy all the pleasures to be had on such an excursion.

The route selected is not only the most direct, but it is the safest for the motor car and is laid out through beautiful landscape all the way. The distance from Chicago to South Bend is usually computed as being ioo miles, but a reliable Warner Speedometer attached to the map-maker's machine added something like six miles to the century score before the garage at South Bend was reached. This is also verified by other reliable makes of speedometers of which there were three on the car.

Briefly, it may be said that the course is in the shape of a crescent, with Chicago at one point. South Bend at the other point and the lower end of Lake Michigan in the bowl of the half circle. The trail leads through Chicago's beautiful parks and boulerards to the Indiana state line and thence through Lake, Porter, La Ponte and into St. Joseph comnties, passing en route the cities of Hammond, Highlands, Hobart. Wheeler, Valparaiso, Westville, La Porte and New Carlisle.

The roads are aniformly level and generally fast. There are occasionally places where the machine must

be slowed down in deference to the neglectful road supervisors, but at no point is there dangerous grades or serious obstacles, while straight five and ten-mile speedways are frequently encountered.

After leaving Hammond nearly every crossroad offers an opportunity for side trips. At the end of the first quarter of the journey, as inclicated on the map, a run may be made to Cedlar Lake and Crown Point. Farther on, at IVestville, the course may be left temporarily for a spin to Michigan City, and then resumed at La Porte, which is reached from Michigan City over a splendid highway. From La Porte there is a good road to Kokomo and points southward and a choice of several andiliary trips is afforded after reaching South Bend: Niles, Nich., being eleven miles distant, and Elkhart. Ind., less than twenty miles. Long distance tourists will find the roadway open to Toledo, Cleveland, and Detroit at the east, and to Indianapolis and Cincinnati at the south.

Along the way there are convenient accommodations for both the tourist and his car, be the cause thirst, hunger or accident. Garages are located at Valparaiso, La Porte and South Bencl, and there are good hotels at each of these places. South Bend is especially well equipped for the entertaimment of visitors, and there is ample opportunity there for rest and recuperation before the start upon the return trip or a continuation of the journey beyond.

Most pleasant of the features of this journey are the delightful scenic attractions. There are fields and meadows, handsome farm estates, pretty country homes, tree-arched lawns, shady groves, silvery lakes and sleeping villages.

## Instructions for Using PhotoAuto Maps

The best way to use the Photo-Auto Maps is to follow the route by the topographical map and refer to the photographs only to make sure that you are turning at the right place. Use your meter at all times to get the distances between turns. The distances given between turns will vary with different machines. as a slight difference in size of tires, different conditions of the roads and many other things tend to vary the register. Three meters were used and an arerage taken to get the distances given. The numbers in the squares and circles give the number of the photographs at the turns and the figures outside of them give the distance to the next photograph. The compass on each plate should be uised to get correct directions. This map is not drawn to scale, but is made to show the turns to the best adrantage. Where turns occur close together the map is enlarged and where there is a long straight run it is condensed, so do not judge distances by the appearances of the map. fio entirely by the meter readings. Distances between closest points only are given to insure the smallest variation. The distances given are the arerage obtained from three different makes of speedometers.

## CHICAGO FROM THE CHAUFFEUR'S SEAT

Because of her smooth topography, wide streets and excellent pavements, conditions in Chicago are naturally fayorable for the pleasurable pastime of automobiling and nowhere else in the world, probably, is there so much interest shown by citizens in this greatest of all out-of-door sports. If Chicago is not already, the day is not far distant when she will lead all the cities of the world in the number of privately orrned auto rehicles.

Automobile Row on Michigan avenue, extending from the river far out into the residence district, is among the busiest centers of activity in Chicago. For dozens of blocks, on either side of the avenue, there are the establishments of automobile dealers, houses for the supply of automobile equipment and garages where are sheltered some of the most costly machines the world has yet produced. Millions are invested in these enterprises and the automobile industry has within a very few years grown to be one of the most important branches of business in the great commercial metropolis of the west.

It is one of the sights that the Chicagoan points out to the visitor with visible pride-a great thoroughfare thronged with moring palaces of varnish, leather and brass, an ever-moring cavalcade of restless, throl)bing self-propelling cars and carriages. Such is Automobile Row, the motor mart and rendezrous of Chicago autoists.

As has been said, the level earth which nature gave to Chicago for a building site, the far-sightedness of the forefathers in making the wide streets, and the

civic pricle of later generations in improving and beautifying the thoroughfares has had a fostering influence upon the pastime of automobiling, but there has been other encouragements in the fact that Chicago has half a clozen of the most beautiful parks in the world and that these are joined together by a most wonderful system of boulevards, reaching into every part of the city.

It is possible for the autoist to enter the city at its extreme northern gateway, proceed along beautiful driveways to Jackson Park and thence along the lake shore to Michigan avenue, which thoroughfare skirts the city's sky-scraper section, passing Grant Park, the Fine Arts museum and the terraced lake front on the left. Leaving Michigan avenue at Thirty-third street and turning into Grand Boulevard, a wide course is open to the North gate of Washington Park, which is connected by a broad esplanade with Jackson Park at the city's southern border.

Thus may the automobilist traverse the city's entire length with no less pleasing landscape than trees. lawns, flowers, statuary and stately buildings to delight the eye. In the same manner there has been created, by the joining together of parks with well made boulevards, a similar driveway through the western portion of the city, from North to South.

Leaving Jackson Park, the car may be directed through the Midway to Washington Park, out of the latter at the Garfield Boulevard entrance and over Garfield past Sherman Park to Gage Park where a turn is made northward into Western avenue. The course leads over this street past McKinley Park and across the drainage canal to Thirty-first street and Marshall Boulevard, and into Douglas Park, the latter being connected with Garfield Park by Douglas

boulevard. From Garfield Park the drive is continned orer Franklin Boulevard to Humboldt Park, on Humboldt Boulevard through Palmer Square and Logan Place, across the north branch of the Chicago river and along Diversey arenue to Lincoln Park at the north.

The two routes described may be combined and a thirty-five mile circuit formed, taking in all of the principal parks and many of the most attractive streets in the city. Jackson Boulevard, extending west from Grant Park to Garfield Park, bisects the circularshaped boulevard system and is the principal outlet for automobile traffic in that direction.

Surrounding Chicago is a country as level as the city itself and the public highways leading to the suburbs are of the kind that entice the automobilist from the city out into the broad open country. Fort Sheridan, the United States military post, is one of the farorite nearby attractions. The fort is reached by following the Lake Shore drive, after crossing the Chicago river at Rush street, to Sheridan road and on this thoroughfare through Edgewater, Evanston, IVilmette, Glencoe, Highland Park and Highland to Fort Sheridan.

Austin and Oak Park are reached by a drive out Jackson boulevard, through the center of the city, to Garfield Park and west on Washington boulevard. Longer journeys are possible to Waukegan, Elgin, Aurora. Joliet and the city's other neighbors north, south and west, while those who can give a greater portion of a day to such an outing think nothing of making a run to Milwaukee, Springfiekl. Peoria or South Bencl.

## CHICAGO TO SOUTH BEND, IND.

Michigan avenue, or, to be more exact, Automobile Row, is the tourist clearing house in Chicago and a description of the South Bend trip should necessarily begin at some point on this thoroughfare. The Auditorium Hotel on Michigan avenue offers a good place from which to start and the makers of maps and charts assembled there for a pot of black coffee before starting upon their path-finding expedition at the delightful hour of six in the morning.

A balmy breeze fresh from the lake, tempered by the warmful glow from the rapidly-rising sun, promised a pleasant day for the undertaking. The Morgan \& Wright tires were tested and found to be strong and sound, the useful speedometer was properly set and the Prest-O-Lite air and gas tanks inspected as an assurance that the bearings would not suffer from a lack of these primary essentials. The Kingston spark coil caught the fumes at the slightest touch, the throbbing of the machine spoke its impatience at further delay and in a moment all are aboard and off-for breakfast at Hammond, twenty miles away, and lunch at South Bend.

As early in the morning as this there are not many "cops" abroad, and the Chicago speed law is not so rigidly enforced as later in the day. On Michigan avenue to 33 rd street and thence to Grand boulevard the auto-driver feels his way slowly that the occupants of the car may get comfortably settled in their seats and that the running gear of the machine may be tested.

Once in Grand boulevard there is two miles of as pretty parement as there is in the world, with a wide course for traffic and no obstacles. It is the first challenge to speed and the car seems of its own accord to catch the spirit and lurch ahead, but the driver is cautious and keeps speed register and the city ordinances in harmony. At Fifty-first street you enter IVashington Park, the statue of the Father of his Country greeting you at the park gates.

Then by the left hand road you pass quickly behind the bank of trees and are lost to riew among the white roadways and green landscape. Keep to the left, using the tall smoke stacks of the power house as your guide. You will notice the Refectory on your right and as you follow the driveway out of the park, the spires and domes of a Sixty-third street summer garden tell you that you are crossing Cottage Cirove arenue and are passing into the Midway Plaisance.

Take the south road upon entering the Midway and proceed eastward a straight mile. The buildings of the University of Chicago and many of Chicago's handsome homes are now within view. On passing from the Miciway into Jackson Park turn to the left toward the dome of the Marshall Field Museum, and then to the right orer the lagoon bridge and to the lake front, passing the German building on the right.

Along the water front for a mile the route gives one the only riew of the lake afforderl. Next the Caravels! The fleet of the Jackson Park yacht club, anchored in the Basin! Past these and out of the park you skirt the grounds of the South Shore clutb and turn to the left at the railroad station in 7 ist street. The roads are a little rough here and continue to be until the factory district is passed and the country highways are reached beyond the city limits. The

Illinois Steel Company's plant is straight ahead. At 79 th street slow up for rough cruising over car tracks. That is Russel Square, a children's school and playground on the right at 83 rd street. A block further on, at the end of Bond avenue, turn to the left and then to right on North Superior avenue. Follow the car tracks to Ninety-second street and Buffalo avenue, cross bridge and continue along car tracks. It is quite rough for a few blocks over wooden pavements. Look out for the cars at 99th street, fast trains frequently passing.

Turn on Indiana avenue the first block to the left after crossing the railroad tracks at 99 th street. The road is better, but dusty. Next the Indiana State line. The bridge is over Wolf river. At Wolf river club house turn to the right and follow car tracks on Hammond Pike. You are now out in the open country. That is Calumet Lake on the right. Turn at the car barns and enter the town of Hammond over Homan avenue, passing the city park and library on the left.

## HAMMOND

Parties leaving Chicago before the brealfast hour usually stop here for a repast at the Majestic Cafe on Homan avenue. Leaving Hammond you turn to the left at Sibley street and have a mile speedway to Lafayette school house, where you turn to the right on Calumet avenue, a wide macadamized thoroughfare. There is a railroad crossing one block beyond and another six blocks beyond. Another half mile of road when you turn to the left: The road you leave groes to Cedar Lake and Crown Point.

Hilf-a-mile beyond there is a turn just after crossing the railroad tracks and, passing an ice house on

the left, then two miles of such road that makes one wish he had a roo-horse power machine. There are hay fields and truck gardens upon either side of the road and splendid opportunities for the kodak. Turn to the left at the old house shown in Photo I8. The road to the right also leads to Cedar Lake. Here is another straight-away run of two miles, through a tree-arched lane before Highlands is reached.

## HIGHLANDS

Upon the approach to Highlands the road dips slightly to permit a grade crossing over the railroad tracks. This point should be approached with caution as the view of the tracks is obstructed by embankments. Enter the village by its main street and turn to the right at brick store shown in Photo 19. Turn east before reaching the railroad tracks, and follow the telephone wires. Seven miles of straight road are before you and nobody should pass you on the way.

## HOBART

Just before entering Hobart there is a parting of the roads as shown in Photo 2I. Take the left hand and proceed one-fourth of a mile to the main street of town and turn to left. Cross the railroad tracks at the Pennsylvania depot and turn to right; a block further turn to the left and at the next block to the right on the macadamized pike. Follow the wires. Three miles of straight road are ahead. See Photo 23 for next turn. Turn to right and follow wires.

## WHEELER

Going into Wheeler there is a large sign threatening dire vengeance upon the autoist who violates the village speed law. On leaving Wheeler there is an "S"

turn just after passing the old store on the left. Follow railroad. It is four miles to the next turn, with two railroads to cross. Just beyond Wheeler the traveler can see in the distance the church spires and court house dome of Valparaiso. Turn to right at signboard as shown in Photo 27. Three miles west of Valparaiso there is a guide post for the information of travelers from which it is learned that Chicago is 42 miles west. Hobart io miles west, Hammond 28 miles west, Valparaiso three miles east, La Porte 25 miles east. South Bend 48 miles east, Parker II miles north, McCool 8 miles north and Cossettsville 7 miles north.

## VALPARAISO

This is one of the points along the journey where it is worth the visitor's time to tarry awhile if sightseeing and not a speed record be his purpose. The Hotel Lafayette at Valparaiso is one of the best between Chicago and South Bend and there is a garage one block from the hotel. Valparaiso is a prominent educational center and here is located a State Normal attended by from 2,000 to 3,000 students.

The automobilist enters the city at the point-illustrated in Photo 28, a triangular bed of flowers being his guide post. Turn to the right and follow railroad to Main street. The course lies straight through the city, past the Court house and hotel. Valparaiso is the half-way house in the journey to South Bend.

Leaving the town you make two turns as indicated in Photo 28 and proceed two and a quarter miles. Keep to left at next turn. There is a stretch of unmacadamized road beyond and after rains the track may be a little rough. Railroad crossing one-half mile from turn. Roads are still rough. Turn to right just after passing church and crossing bridge. The

sand hills are ahead. Keep straight ahead at next road crossing, but turn to left as at Photo 33, always following the wires when in doulbt. Half a mile of saind and a slight climb. Keep straight ahead at next turn. Three miles and Westrille.

## WESTVILLE

A burying ground on the left announces the approach to Westville a half mile before the town is reached. Turn under railroad and pass into village over thie first macadam road seen since learing Valparaiso. From Westrille there is a good road to Michigan City and an opportunity for making this detour and resuming the South Bend course at La Porte is here offered. For South Bend proceed straight through the town to the point indicated in Photo 35. There are eight miles of good road ahead. In passing through the village of Heston be cautious of the railroad crossing at the east limits and take the left hand road at the turn beyond.

Turn to the left at the large sign board shown in Photo 37 and follow the wires. The roads are good from here into La Porte and for a mile sprint you can move the throttle up a notch.

## LA PORTE

Here is anotner city that will interest the autoist for there are many opportunities for side trips and sightseeing about La Porte. There is a fast road from this point to Michigan City, i4 miles north, and a good road to Plymouth, Kokomo and points south. Pail Lake. Cedar Lake, the Chautauqua grounds and golf grounds offer pleasant recreation for the tourist. This is probably the oldest town along the route. The name was given to it by the early French

settlers because it was the gateway for the Indians to the interior country.

Eight miles beyond La Porte the car may be turned off the regular course at what is known as Boot Jack Crossing, and a visit paid to Hudson Lake, a favorite fishing place some two miles away. Turn to the right at little school house for Hudson Lake.

The South Bend course extends directly through La Porte, past the court house and business section to the fartlier side of the city: The route is plain and the roads good. Follow the wires and keep straight ahead. The villages of Rolling Prairie and Terre Coupee are passed. The latter is an Indian name, meaning "cut earth," and the roads are so good along here that the autoist usually cuts some earth going through the sleepy village.

## NEW CARLISLE

A graveyard on the left signifies that New Carlisle is just ahead. This town has shady streets and is noticeable for its cosy cottage homes. There is reported to be good fishing and hunting in this vicinity. Going out of New Carlisle there is a sharp down grade at the foot of which is a railroad crossing. Caution!

There is a fast road now all the way into South Bend. Seven miles from the city you leave the level prairie lands and climb to higher altitudes in the hill country, where the scenery is more beautiful and the roads are just as level. Three miles farther on you catch the first glimpse of the court house dome and it is a nice spin from this point into the city. You enter South Bend via Michigan avenue and proceed thence to Main street and on Main street to the Oliver Hotel on the Court house square. The garage is on South Lafayette street, one block south.

Golf Club, while an eight mile dash out Michigan aventue brings the traveler to the Chain of Lakes.

Navarre Place is another of the pleasant home sections of South Bend, and well worth the ride to it. This is the site of the city's first settlement, the log cabin home built there in 1820 by Pierre Frieschutz Navarre being preserved by the Northern Indiana Historical Society as one of the most interesting of landmarks. In early times the Indians were wont to encamp in the valley along the St. Joseph between Leeper Park and Chapin Park, and the trail left by them is what is now known as the North Shore Drive. "A blanket of smooth macadam," says a writer. "has covered the footprints of the past!" The sinuous currents of the river are on one hand and the solemn hills on the other, with the beateous plain between. In going from the business district of South Bend to Navarre Place the automobilist has a free pass, there being no railroads to cross or other objectionable features. North Michigan avenue, the wiclest thoroughfare in South Bend, leads directly to it and is paved the entire distance.

St. Joseph river is the source not only of South Bend's greatness, but' of much of its beauty. Whether in his touring car or afoot the visitor to South Bend soon learns that one of the things he must see before leaving is Pin Hook, a level spot high up on the river bluffs where the romantic inclined sojourn at the pleasant hour of twilight and listen to the chimes from St. Mary's Academy on the opposite shore. At this point the river is rery swift and the rush of the waters, mingled with the rustling of the trees, combines with the musical notes of the bells in producing upon the mind a most reverent impression. Pin Hook is reached by leaving the city over Portage

avenue and following that thoroughfare as it is transformed from a city boulevard into a country lane, until the silent little graveyard at the outskirts of the city, is reached, where the road turns to the right and follows close beside the river.

The same road leads farther on to the Four Mile Bridge and across the river to the site of the historic Cider's Mill, a painting of which adorns the curtain of the South Bend Auditorium. This scene inspired the poet, Ben King, to write these lines:

> For my soul, it seems caught In Time's undertow, And I'm floating away Down the river St Joe.

From the old mill the journey may be continued to Mosquito Glen, a famous picnicking place, on to St. Mary's Woods and farther on to Notre Dame, returning to the city by the Notre Dame road. On this route a fast pilgrimage may be made across several fields to the ancient burying place of the Pottawattomie Indians.

It is a splendid road and only eleven miles from South Bend to Niles, Mich., and the distance can be driven in less than half an hour in any kind of weather. The Niles drive can be extended to Dowagiac and Berrian Springs, places largely patronized during the outing season by Chicago people.

There is a good road out of South Bend to Elkhart, twenty miles distant on the east. To the southward there is a smooth course to Plymouth. There is an open way and free traffic from South Bend to all directions and tourists from east and west and north and south meet there to exchange gossip and rest from their journeys.

## South Bend to Chicago

For the benefit of those who will first make the Chi-cago-South Bend trip in the direction opposite to that described. a photographic map of the course from South Bend to Chicago is given. This reverses the order of towns as follows: South Bend, New Carlisle, La Porte, Westville, Valparaiso, Wheeler, Hobart, Highlands, Hammond and Chicago. There are 110 variations in the route as mapped out for the journey from Chicago to South Bend, and no possibility of losing the way if the photographs are referred to when in doubt. A safe injunction is to follow the telephone wires and keep the beaten path. There is sufficient automobile traffic along the route to blaze the way. As to the attractions along the way, localities may be referred to under their captions in the description of the east bound trip.

To return by the same route as the one followed in going is interesting enough, but if one seeks new scenes the course can be raried in many instances, as will be explained.

## Via Michigan City

Going west the tourist may leave the mapped route at La Porte, proceed northward to Michigan City and resume the journey to Chicago at Westville or Hobart. To make this trip leave Main street in I.a Porte two blocks west of the Court House and follow the car line to Pine Lake and the Chautauqua grounds, keeping always to the left. Here is some of the most beautiful scenery anywhere in the Middle West. Taise particular note of the landscape when your reach the little church about six miles out of La Porte.

Cross the car tracks at Homan Park, leaving that resort to the right and turn to the right at Coal Springs Mill, where you will see a pretty lake and more delightful scenery. The road is the very finest all the way and the best of speed can be made. The distance is 14 miles.

You enter Michigan City with the street cars and, if no stop is to be made, turn to the left at Tenth street and out to the end of the paving, passing the state prison on the left. Turn to the left on cinder road and head through the woods in the direction of Furnaceville. There is about seven miles of sand before the macadam is reached, but this part of the journey is not to be feared. Follow the macadam into the town of Chester and turn to right on Second street, just after crossing the railroad tracks. Run south in the direction of the red roof of the big gless plant, to Wood street. Turn right at Wood street and cross railroad tracks into town of Porter. Pass through this village and half a mile beyond turn to the right at school building. Here is a beautiful twomile speedway and you can move up the throttle with perfect safety. Turn to the left to cross railroad and

Follow the made road with all of its crooks and turns to Lake Station two miles beyond. Turn to left at hotel and cross river. Keep the older road beyond the bridge and you will soon be within sight of the smoke of FTobart's brick yards and tile works. There is a warning sign to autoists at the Hobart city limits and it must be respected. Turn to the left of tile works for Hobart and to the right for Hammond and Chicago. At this point the regular route has been resumed and the photo map may be followed to the end of the journey.
