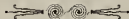

THE REASON WHY!

Personal Explanation.

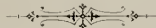


In 1849, when I was a boy of 19, living with my uncle in Honesdale, Pa., my uncle received a letter from a boy of my age in Tennessee, called Sylvester Plumb. He said he was the only son of a Sylvester Plumb, who had died when he was a child, and he only knew his name, and, as he had seen my uncle's name in the *Scientific American*, he wrote to him to ask him if he could tell him anything about his ancestry, who his father was and where he came from, etc. My uncle read the letter to me and said he would go and see his father and mother in Prompton (four miles distant) the next Sunday and ask them about it. I determined to go, too. We went, and grandfather and grandmother, both born Plumb, then past seventy years old, said they were born in Middletown, Conn. They had an uncle, Reuben Plumb, there, who had a son Sylvester who went South about 1800, and had not been heard of afterwards by them; that he was probably the grandfather of this Sylvester. My uncle wrote this down. I listened to all, and, having lost my father by death when a child, and until the year before—1848—never having known any of the name of Plumb, felt impelled to inquire further. I got paper and pencil, and grandfather and grandmother told me their grandfather's name was Wait-still John Plumb; that he lived in Middletown, where they were born. They told me the names of all his sons and daughters, and their cousins, the children of these sons, and what became of them, so far as they knew. They told me the tradition of the family, which was, of course, more interesting than all the rest to a youngster like me then. I kept that paper and often came across it and read it over, and I found in the course of time that I was the only boy who had done such a thing as to gather up the family history and genealogy from an ancestor as far back as a grandfather and write it down for preservation and preserve it forty years. Now, during these forty years it had been

growing upon me that I wanted to know more about my progenitors, and in the fall of 1888 I determined to go to Middletown, Conn., and search the ancient records, notwithstanding this same uncle, above mentioned, still living, told me there was "no use of it," and no money in it. But I was not after money, but knowledge, and went. I found altogether more than I expected at Middletown, and, for a consideration, the son of the town clerk furnished me a number of families from the church records of Milford, and this brought me far on toward the first Plumb in America. I went to New London and gleaned the clerk's office there also. I then had some thirty families of a date previous to 1800, and I came home well pleased. When I came to look at my acquisitions the whole thing seemed a perfect chaos. It was bewildering, but with the help of what I had learned from my grandfather and grandmother I was able to put together our own family well enough all the way back, but I had some 200 names or more, and only about half of them seemed to connect on my family anywhere. But by getting my own into tables in proper form and order I acquired skill, and I digested and analyzed all of them in the course of a month or two and tabulated them all, and then I was so pleased that I felt a great desire to confer my pleasant knowledge on others. I arranged the families in what I thought the proper order and then made some copies and wrote to such Plumbs as I could easily get the address of, and explained the matter and agreed to send a copy of the 15 pages I then had if he would agree to make or have made at least one copy and send to another Plumb, making the same stipulation as to copying, etc., with him, and he was to send me his own family genealogy as far as he knew it. Some did not care about it, but some were highly pleased. I thought in this way in the course of time all the Plumbs would be known. I made eight copies and sent off, among the rest,

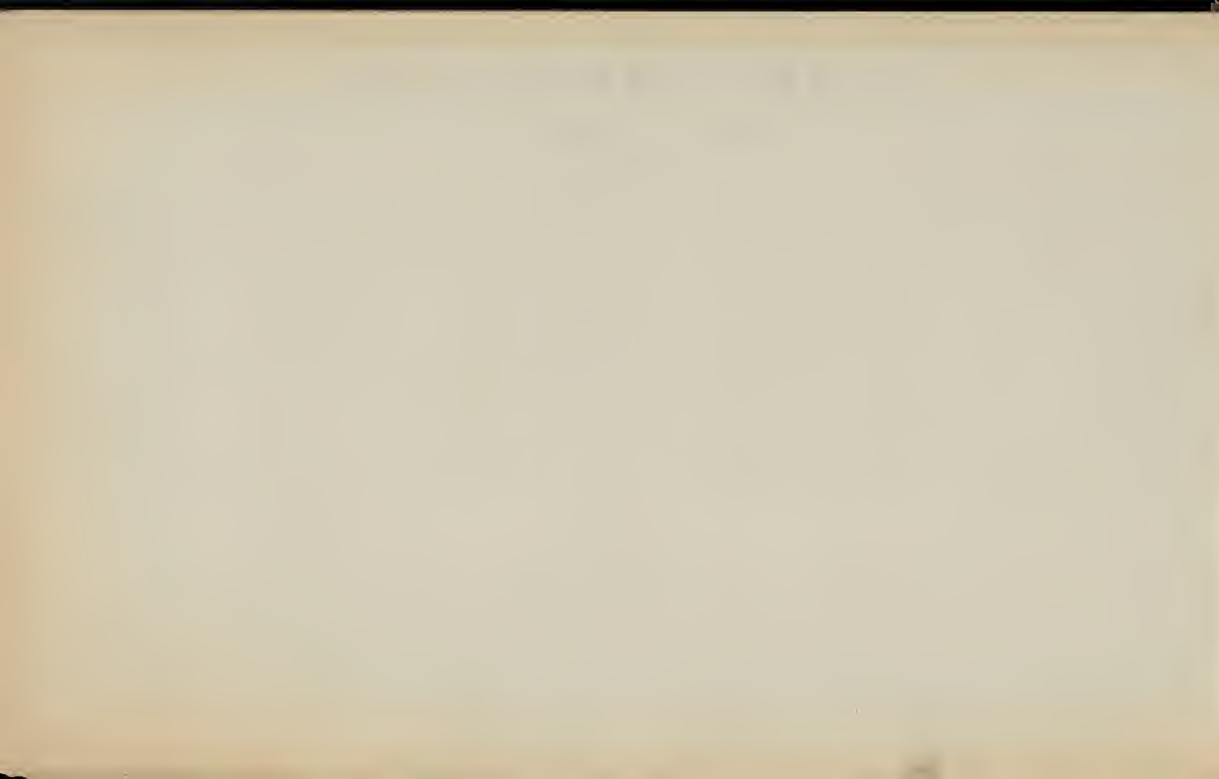
one to Senator Plumb, of Kansas. There he found his own grandfather, and back of him to his grandfather's great-grandfather, and he was highly pleased, and asked if I could not go to Connecticut again and hunt them all the way back and find the connecting links between these now separated, and offered to pay any part of the expenses that I thought right. Well, I had a good deal of a desire myself to know more, and I finally told him I would go, to be gone about 20 days, and to spend only about \$100, and that he might pay half of that; and at once he sent me a check for \$50. That settled it, and I had to go. I went on the 20th of May, 1889, and got back on the 10th of June. I at once began to arrange and systematize the chaos, and there was such an amount of it that I saw I had a great deal of work to do before I could commence to make any copies. I reported my success to Senator Plumb, and he wrote me that he would see the printing paid for if I would do the work of preparing the manuscript and attend to the printing of it, and no other copying need be done. He would have it printed for distribution to get further information. I agreed to do it, and here it is. No literary merit is claimed for it, and I am not to blame for having done it. I am not especially anxious to do work for nothing, but the love of one's family is not, in my opinion, a bad trait. Senator Plumb, and the Hon. Ralph Plumb, of Illinois, pay out their money for love of the family, and why should not I? I have done all the work and paid out nearly as much money as either of them, and if it is a foolish expenditure, I am foolish for wishing to know my progenitors. But I do wish to know even more than I know now; but I don't feel able to go further than from the first Plumb in America, 1635, down to the children of men born previous to 1800. Ralph Plumb pays half the printing, Senator Plumb the other half.

C., during the sessions of Congress, or to Euparia, Kansas, during vacation for a future, more correct and complete edition. We want all the known Plumbs from 1637, or earlier, if there are any, down to the children of men born previous to A. D. 1800. I have here about 800 names. It is quite evident that these run not be more than half the true number. I want them all.



P R E F A C E.

Dates were not always on the record, and, in such cases, where it was obvious that the date was near a certain time, the writer has put in a date in small figures there as his guess at it, and the word "say" to indicate his mere supposition. It may be asked, why not leave the space blank? The answer is that any one interested must, in his mind, assume a date anyhow; why, then, should not the compiler of the work, whose study of the whole thing has made him more familiar with it than any other person can be, put a suggestion of a date in any such place? Dates were sometimes written in figures alone, as: 1-7, 1636, which is read "First of the seventh month, 1636," but it still needs translation into our "New Style" of keeping time, and that is Sept. 1, 1636. March was the first month of the year in "Old Style," and March 25 was the 1st day of the year. Dates are frequently found where there are two figures at the end of the year, as: Mar. 17, 1747-8. This simply means that in Old Style March 17 was in 1747, but in New Style would be 1748. This method of dating may be found till 1752, when it was only kept in New Style, and the months where it was used were from January 1 to March 24, inclusive; from March 25 they

are both alike. From 1752 the new style was according to law, and the 1st of January was the first of the year. All should know that in these double figures the last one is the true one for our present style of counting time. The addition of the 11 days (now 12) need not be noted at all.

Where a husband or wife is in a small print it indicates not a guest, but an uncertainty. Persons of these names are married, but whether this child in this family of that name is the one is, to the writer, uncertain. If, in this respect (or in any other case) he has any one placed wrong, and no doubt he has, if any person who sees a copy of this work and knows the true name will write him and correct the mistake, and tell him how he or she knows it, he or she will confer a favor. These tables are printed now for the purpose of getting all the information possible for another revised, corrected and enlarged edition, knowing that this is necessarily imperfect. Some are born when they should be baptized. In all cases, if any correct dates are in possession of any one, or are procurable, to make corrections, he wishes to have them sent to him as soon as possible, but, in all cases, at any time, to be sent when found, whether be-

fore or after any edition is printed. The words "from the records" mean that the writer has himself searched the original town and probate records, and copied the names and dates, but sometimes other persons' searches are included, so that they are not always wholly his own.

The sign "+" at the end of a name means that his family or children are given further on. The figure in the left hand column is the whole number from the beginning or first one known in America, and will be found afterwards attached to the name of the father of a family of children, if they were found anywhere. The date on the upper left hand corner of the page is the year the writer got the information on that page, or the names at least. Where the date of birth is not known, but the baptism is, the letter "B" is put at before the date to show that it is baptism, and not birth, as there were years between these dates sometimes, though, in general, it was only a few days between birth and baptism. Many were found—birth one day, baptism the next. My work will extend no further than to the children of men born previous to 1800. H. B. P.

HISTORICAL STATEMENT.

The Plumb's are Norman by descent, and can be traced back to Normandy to the year 1688, at least, and in England to 1272. John Plum, the first known in America, came to Wethersfield with the first party of settlers from the neighborhood of Boston, Mass., Watertown, it is supposed. We are informed by history that there was a dispute in the church at Watertown, and in Newtown, and in Dorchester, all in Massachusetts, about some matter, and the church was divided. The minister in each of these places and his congregation left those and removed to Watertown, Newtown and Dorchester, in Connecticut, in 1635, and settled in three separate places on the Connecticut river, which they at first called by the names of the places they came from in Massachusetts, Newtown, Dorchester, &c. There were the first settlers in Connecticut, and numbered between thirty and forty men in each town.

In 1637 the names were changed—Watertown to Wethersfield, Newtown to Hartford, and Dorchester to Windsor. John Plum was with those of Watertown (Wethersfield). His name first appears on the Colonial records there, "17:1636," at a court held at Watertown that day, and among the proceedings was: "Whereas, there was tendered to us an inventory of the estate of Mr. Jo. Old's (Oldham) which seemed to be somewhat uncertainly valued, we, therefore, think meete to, &c. it is ordered that Mr. Jo. Plum & Rich. Gildersleeve, together with the constable, shall survey the sole inventory and perfect the same before the next corte & then to deliver it into the corte." On February 9, 1637, he was a member of the court till 1642. The General Court was the Assembly of the colony of Connecticut. At a court held at Hartford, March 8, 1637, "Mr. Plum" being a member of the court; the business before it was the adopting of some means to buy corn from the Indians, as the inhabitants were in a starving condition. They agreed to pay from four to six shillings a bushel for it. "Mr. Plum" was appointed to receive the corn for Wethersfield. He held various offices, such as marking the boundaries of towns, laying out roads, determining the lines between towns, seeing to the improving of the lands of the several plantations, attending court as a deputy. He was one of the men in Capt. Mason's little army during the Pequot war in 1637, and received a grant of land for his service. In 1643 he was nominated for election as "Assistant," but was beaten by Mr. Swaine. In the spring of 1644 he was appointed to attend to the matters of vessels at Wethersfield, Edward Stebbins at Hartford, and Walter Tyler at Windsor. In the fall of 1644 he sold all his land and houses in Wethersfield and removed to Branford. The records of Wethersfield

have been destroyed by fire some time in the past, and only a small land record of those early settlers exists. It is not likely any of his children were born in America, and no record of any exists except that his son, Samuel, lived in Branford with him when he died. He is found in Branford in 1645, as the "Keeper of the Town's Books." He died there in 1648. His wife, "Mrs. Plum," administered on his estate August 7, 1648, and with "her son Samuel" filed the inventory. Samuel, his son, with others, in 1666, bought lands in Newark, N. J., and Samuel sold out in 1668 in Branford and removed to Newark, N. J.

In 1641, "Mr. Plum, Jr.," in Wethersfield, was appointed to serve on the jury. This was supposed to have been a case of John and his late married John, or he would not have been called on. "Mr. Plum, Jr." He is not known anywhere else. He must have been past 21, and so have been born previous to 1620, at least. He may be the John Plum mentioned in the Winthrop papers as seeing a remarkable meteor in October, 1605, where he says in his letter: "I being then rowing in my boate to Groton," probably from "Sabbrook," at the mouth of the Connecticut river, where his letter was dated. He was then about 45 to 50 years old.

John Plumb, of New London, served in the war against King Philip, the son of Massachusetts, in 1675 to 76. He may have been a son of John, Jr., but he was too young to be John, Jr. himself. He received land for his services, and some of it was probably located in Preston after 1686, and some was perhaps in Voluntown, after 1708. This is the John Plumb that married a Green, and lived in New London after, if not before, the King Philip war, and is probably the John Plumb mentioned by Gordon Saltonstall to Winthrop, which he says, January 2, 1691-2: "At the anniversary feast at Master Plumb's," and August 6, 1696, "at the anniversary feast at Master Plumb's," Saltonstall says: "John Plumb tells me that chest glass is not so good as chest glass."—*Winthrop Papers*. These Plumb's of New London were mariners, and followed the sea, and also ship-building. His son George was wrecked on Plumb's Island and drowned.

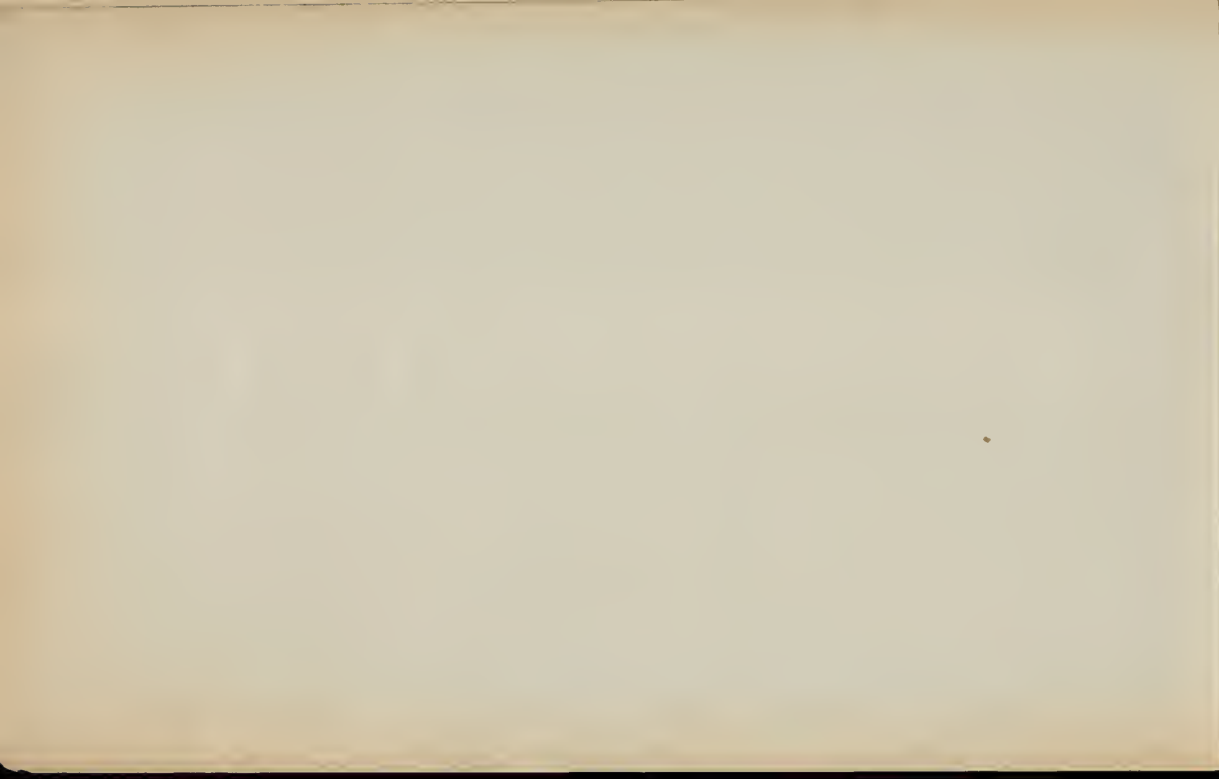
A John Plumb owned a lot in 1667 in Newark, N. J., but left it and it was given to another person, and he is not known there after 1667. He may be the jurymen of Wethersfield of 1641, brother of Samuel. He was probably a ship-master, and never made his home at Newark. The Newark land was bought of the Indians by the settlers in 1666. I would much like to know whether this John ever married and had children. He may be the father of the New London John that married a Green. There

was a John Plum in Dorchester, Mass., in 1680, who seems to have been a poor person, to whom a pair of shoes was given, but it may have been because he had been a soldier in the King Philip's war in 1676. There were two John Plumb in that war, and a John Plum was killed by the Indians, among Capt. Lathrop's men, at Muddy Brook, September 18, 1675, and a John Plumb died in (Essex) Massachusetts in 1669, aged 17. Who were parents of all these, all of Massachusetts?

There was a John Plumb in Hartford, in 1660-1, who was the son of George Plumb, of Inwouth, county Essex, England. The writer found him on the record there in 1665, in a deed to his wife, Elizabeth, for property equal to property he had previously received from her; and a deed of his is recorded there as late as 1722. He was appointed, by letter of attorney in England, in January, 1660-1, to collect debts of persons in Charlestown, Mass., a place near Dorchester. This would rather indicate that he was acquainted there, and he may be the father of Waitling and Samuel Plum, of Dorchester. I rather think he is. John, of Dorchester, now part of Boston, Mass.; had a daughter, Waitling, born "14-9-1657," and a son, Samuel Plum, born 29-11-1659; found by myself, on the record there. The public family records had been destroyed by fire in 1657, and only the book beginning in 1659 was saved. That had these names on it. There may have been older children than these recorded on the books that had been burnt. This is not the John, of Wethersfield, as that John went there in 1635, staid there till 1644, and then removed to Branford, Conn., and died there in 1648, nine years before Waitling Plum was born. It might have been his son John, the jurymen, of 1641. A Samuel Plum was born in Dorchester, December 16, 1669, son of Susanna Hall, probably a son of Samuel, of 1659, and not put on record till after his mother's second marriage.

In 1669, a sloop, belonging to a Plumb, was captured by the French near Martha's Vineyard, and a week afterward, another sloop of Plumb's was captured by the Dutch this time—near Martha's Vineyard, also called Martin's Vineyard, Mass.

There were other Plumb's in Massachusetts besides this John of Dorchester, and, if all the town records were searched, they would probably be found, though it is certain all families did not have their children's births recorded on the public records. The old records would start from the earliest in America, say 1600-1, and all should be searched from the beginning in each town down to 1800. All the coast towns ought to be searched, especially Duxbury, Braintree, Hingham and others, where soldiers or militia were gathered for the war with King Philip.

March 8, 1637, the business of this Court was the appointment of persons to buy corn from the Indians, as the people were in a starving condition. They were to pay 4, 5 and 6 shillings a bushel for it. "Mr. Plum" was appointed to receive the corn for Wethersfield. He is a member of the Court off and on, and holds various other offices till 1644. He ran as candidate for election as assistant to the Gov., March 27, 1643, but was defeated. Feb. 5, 1644 he was appointed to attend to the clearance of vessels at Wethersfield. On the 2nd day, 5th month, 1644, (which was July) he makes a final sale of all his land in Wethersfield, 13 parcels, from 2 acres up to 204 in size, and 2 dwelling houses, and he is not again found on the Wethersfield records. He removed to Branford the same year, 1644. He was one of the soldiers in Capt. Mason's little army of 90 men that marched, attacked, surprised and totally defeated the Pequots at Pequot Hill (in Groton afterwards) in 1637. The name is often written "Jo Plum" by the Clerks, and "Mr. Plum" and "Mr. Plume," but he always wrote it John Plum. His wife is only known as "Mrs. Plume." The original John Plum removed to Branford, Conn., where he died in 1648. The New Haven Probate records say, "Mrs. Plume and her son Samuel," presented an inventory of the estate of John Plum, deceased, Aug. 1, 1648.

Robert is found among the first settlers at Milford, and his marriage, and wife and descendants and death, are known, but it is not known to a certainty that he was a son of John, but at that time there was no other known that could have been his father.

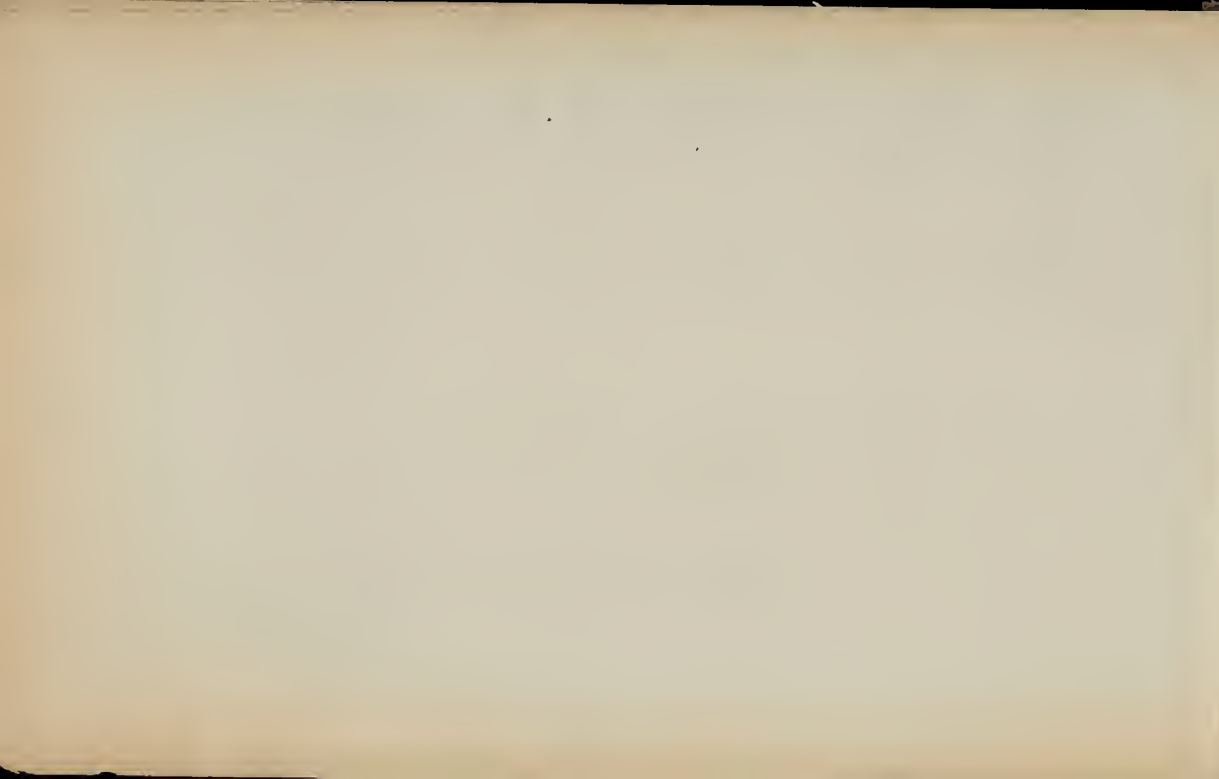
Dorcas is not found on any record by me, but she is named by all genealogists. She certainly married John Lyman, (and had 10 children) but the dates are too confused to be used. One says she married July 12, 1655, another that she married in 1649, another she was born 1648. I put figures in the blanks as guesses, and as some think, the proper dates. Lyman is said to have been born in 1623, and lived and died in Northampton, Mass., 1690.

Timothy is found at Wethersfield in 1671, buying and selling land, and was there till 1694, and is supposed to be a son of John, but may not be nearer than a grandson. So whose son is he? If he is John's son, he was left there with land in 1644, and was 21 years old at least.

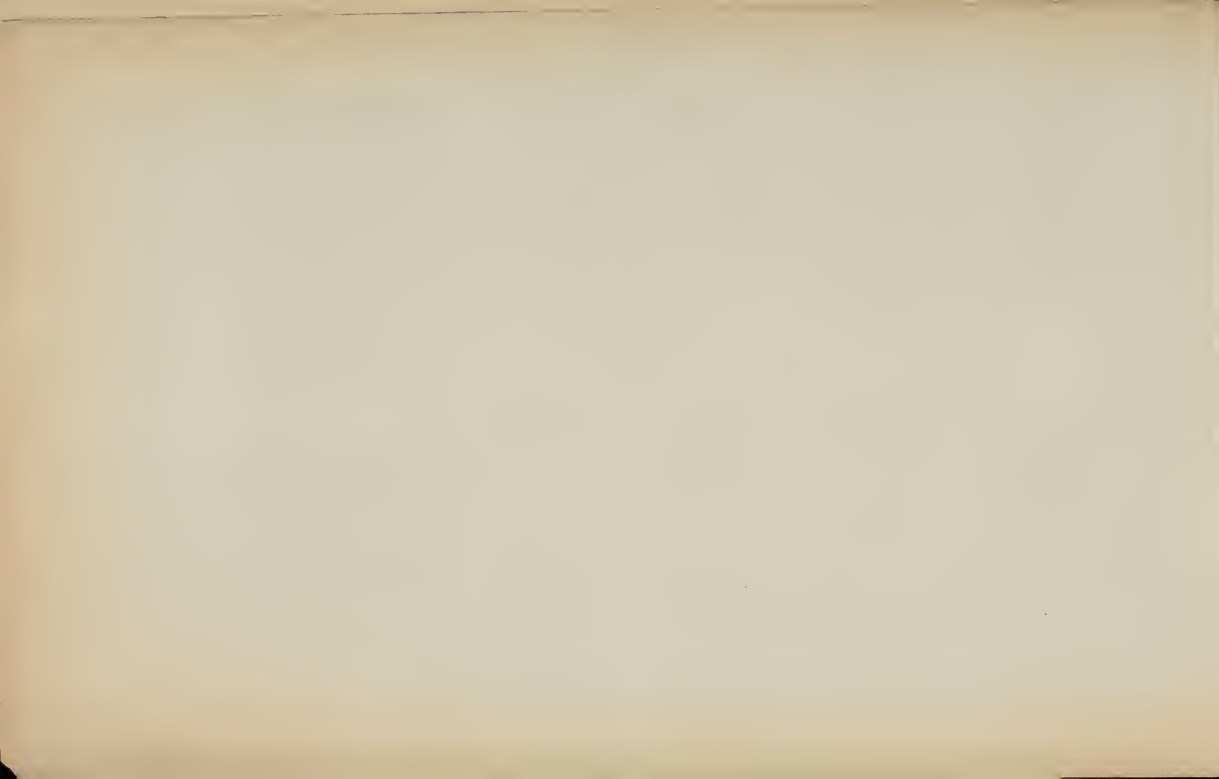
In 1641, on Sept. 2, "Mr. Plum, Jr.," is appointed to serve as a jurymen. This is supposed to be a son of the first John to have been named John, as he was called only "Mr. Plum, Jr." These two are the only ones on the records up to 1644 in Wethersfield. He is not known afterwards.

Nothing is known to a certainty of "John Plum, Jr." after 1641, but it may be well to say that he, from the indications, probably married somewhere and had children. A John Plum had a lot in Newark, in 1667, or before, (as the land was bought of the Indians in 1666) as in 1667, John Plum is mentioned in a distribution of lots in the town, as having owned a lot—"the seventh to John Plume, now William Camp's." He was not afterwards known there, and what became of him is not known. He may be the father of the John Plumb that married a Green, and is found in New London, with a family, in 1677, and who was a soldier in the King Philip Indian war, and received land for his services, which was located in Preston—and some perhaps in Voluntown, Conn. Was he a Mass. or Conn. soldier? This John Plumb and another man had two hundred acres of land given to them by *Owanne*, an Indian chief, for saving his life.

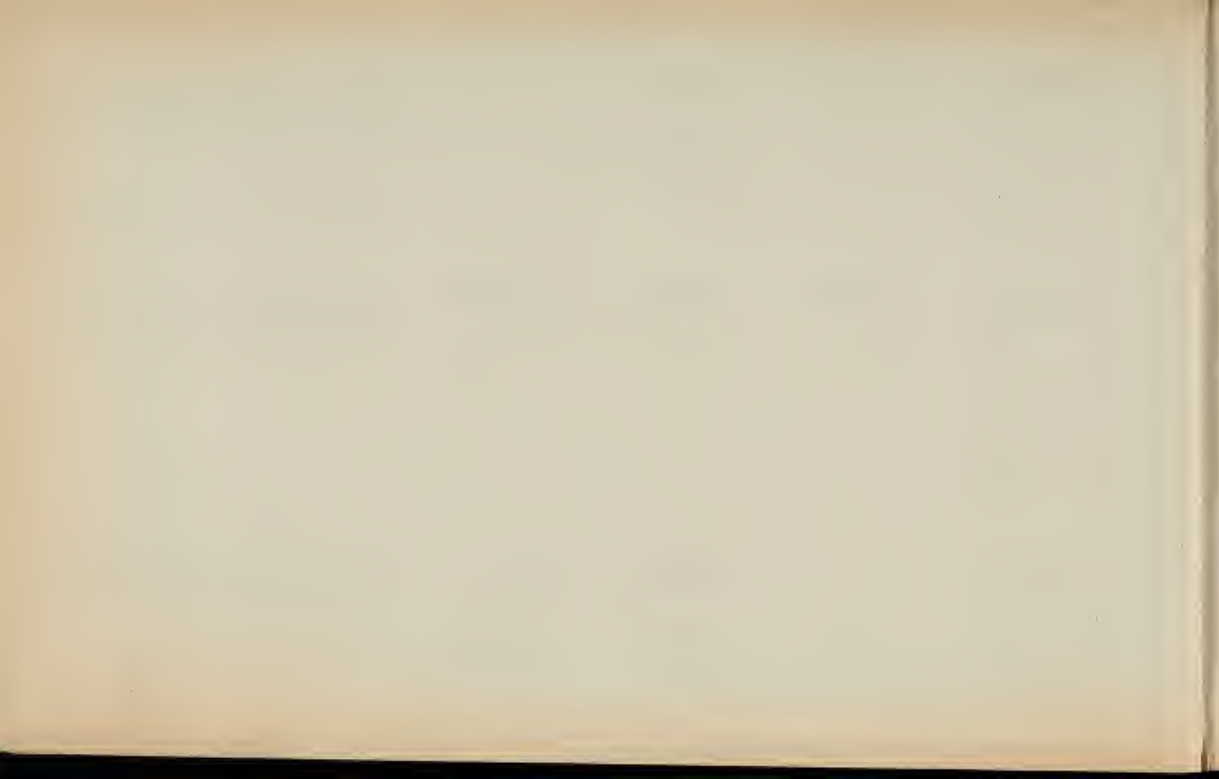
John, junior, may have been married where we first find him in 1641, and have had a number of sons who could have been the fathers of the Johns we find in Mass. in 1669, 1675 and 1676. There are many old town records that ought to be reached, among the rest Northampton, where John, Jr.'s sister Dorcas Lyman lived, and in the neighboring ones in Mass.

An inventory of his father's estate was filed in Court at New Haven, Aug. 1, 1648, by "Mrs. Plume and her son Samuel." Her name is not given, and the name of Samuel's wife is not known. John, the father, was made "keeper of the town's books" in 1645, the earliest date on record, Dec. 75. The record says Totoket (Branford) was settled in 1644, by a church congregation from Wethersfield, and John Plum was one of them. On July 7, 1646, there were 35 of them, and land was divided among them each year, and John Plum received lots each year, each time, the last for him being April 4, 1648, he dying in July of the same year, 1648, and at the last allotment, in April, there were only 29 proprietors. There is a statement in the book that does not seem to be a record, that the Reverend . . . came from Wethersfield in 1644 with his whole congregation, and settled at Branford, and in 1868 he and his whole "flock" removed to Newark, N. J. On June 23, 1668, Samuel Plum sold all the remaining land he owned in Branford—7 lots—and removed to Newark. His children to the number of six (6), I found on the record at Branford. The name of Elizabeth I did not find, but got it with the dates from other genealogists, and consider it uncertain. Sarah, the last child, was born in Newark. She and her husband are mentioned in her father's will. Her age is not given, but her husband was born in 1674, and is presumed to be as old or older than she. Savage has Elizabeth born Jan. 6, 1650. The husbands and wives, and deaths are from S. E. P. Plume, a descendant, of Newark, 1890. The town of Newark was bought by settlers from Milford, New Haven, Branford and Guilford, and lots divided as early as 1667, or even before, and a lot was allotted to <i>John Plum</i> , but he left, and it was given to another in 1667. Who was he?

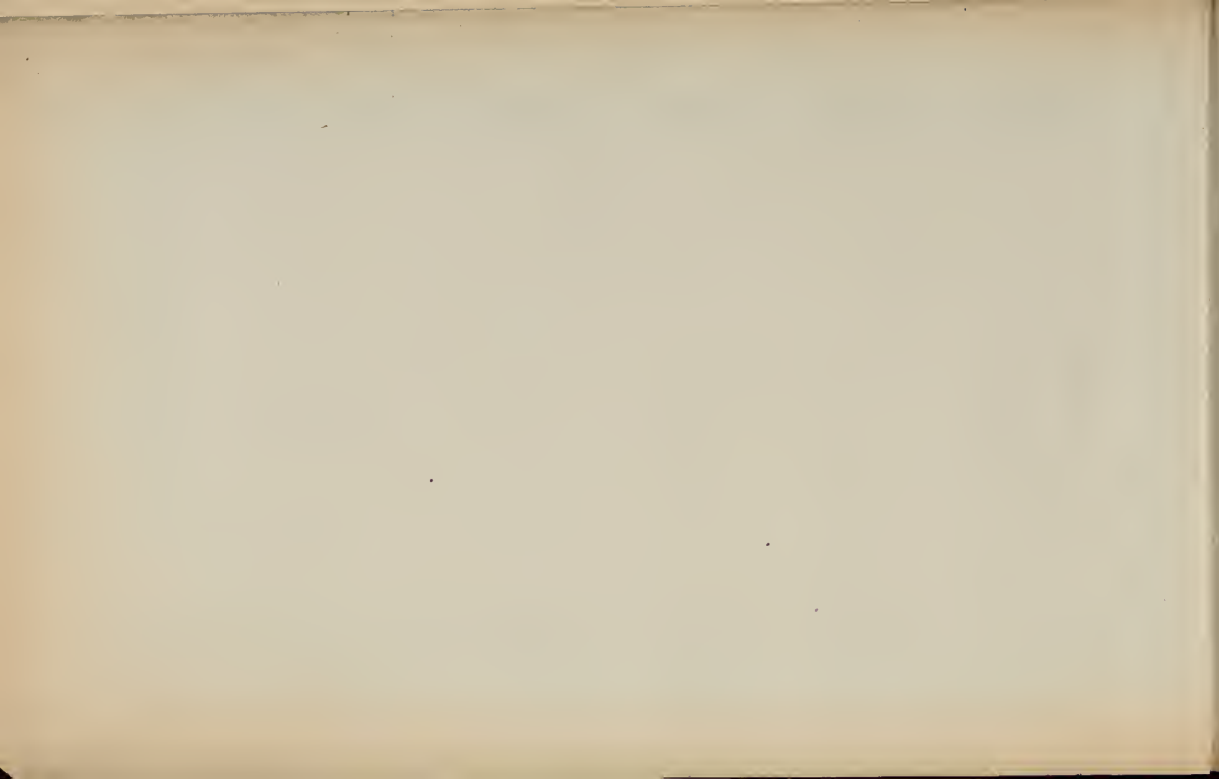

This is the first to spell his name with an "e" after the m—Plume. There are but two dates of births given, and it is difficult to reconcile the names as placed with the dates given. It is very doubtful as to Isaac being the oldest child. Isaac's first child was born January, 1763. So I suppose he was married in 1762.

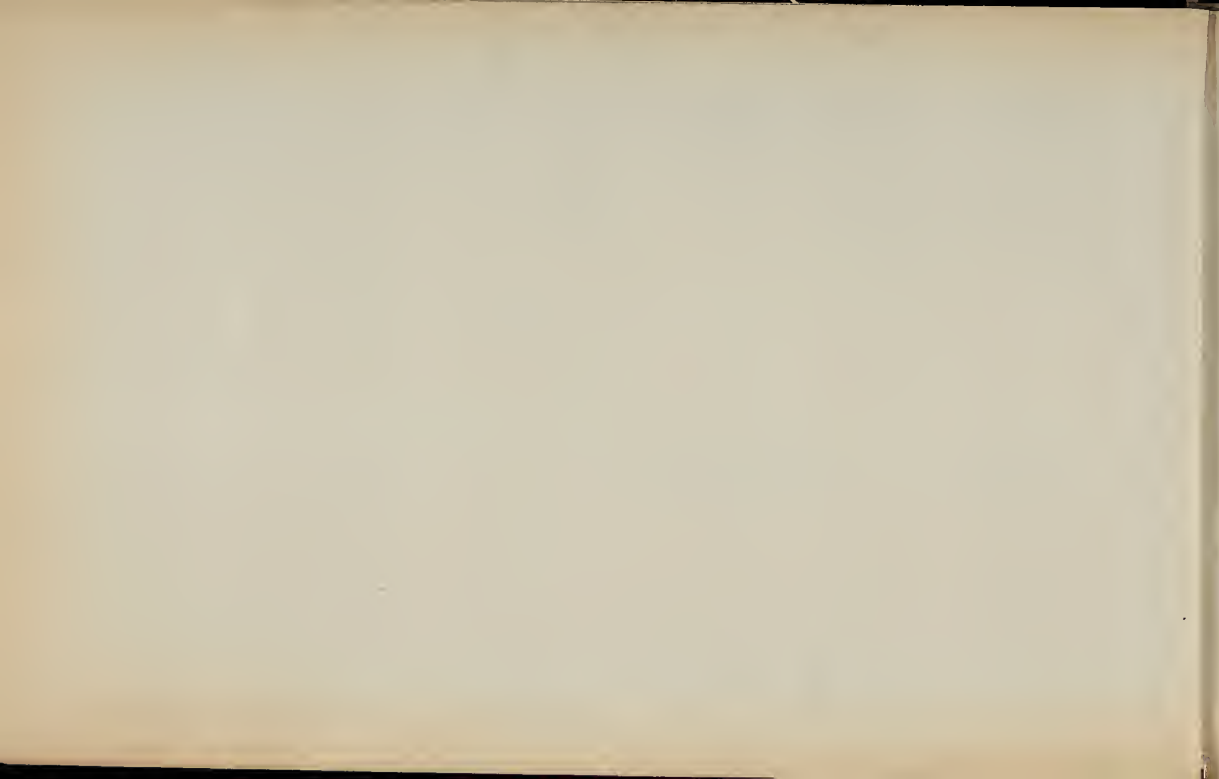

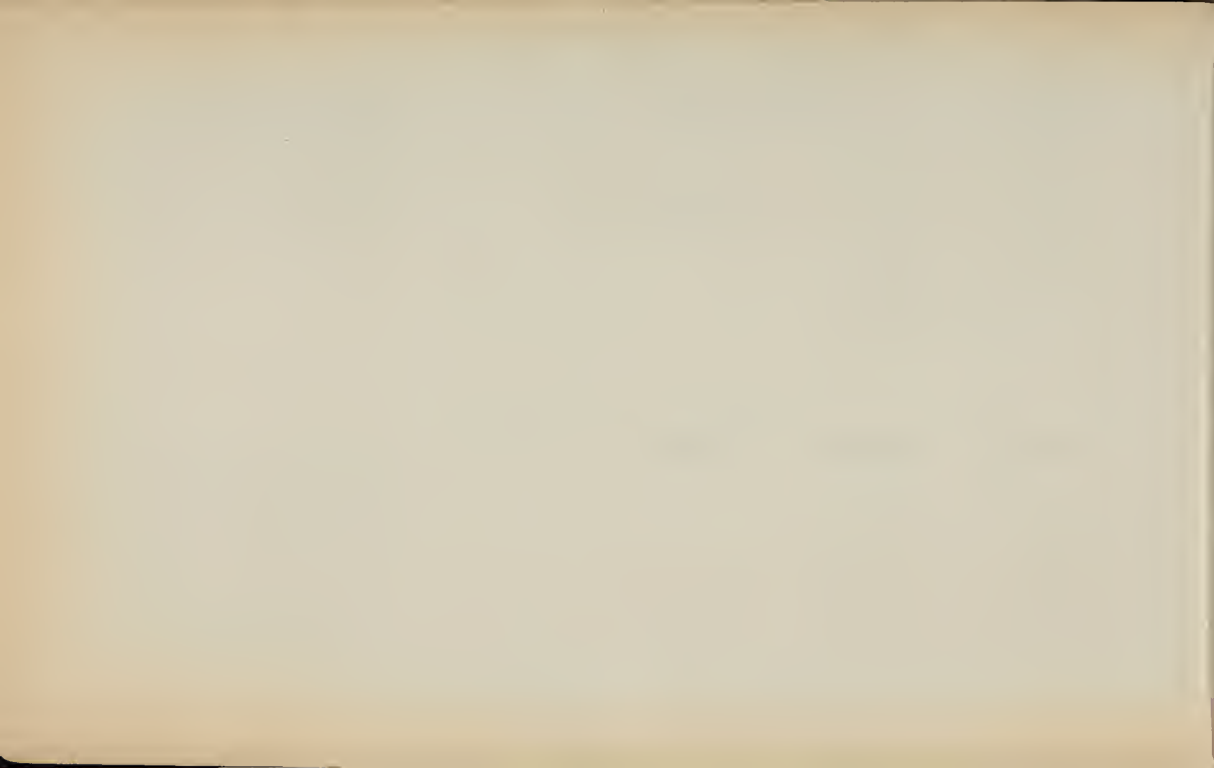

Samuel left no issue so far as known, but he lived to be old enough to marry. Did he marry? Samuel has not been identified elsewhere, but deeds are found from him in 1694. He probably lived many years afterwards, and has a family somewhere. Joseph has not been identified elsewhere. He probably died in infancy, as no guardian was ever appointed for him, at least so far as the record shows. Mary Plumb, the widow of Robert, married as 2nd husband, Wm. East, March 16, 1676, and was alive in 1704, at the settlement of the estate of her son, Robert 2nd. She was at that time more than 83 years old, and was probably again a widow. Her father died on the ship Martin, during his passage to America.

It may be well to state here that church records and Probate records do not always or often, have the double figures at the end of the years in Jan., Feb., and March, but it must be understood as there to be correct.

In 1732 Mr. John Plumble was appointed Judge of Probate. His son John died in 1832. John Plumble and wife joined the church in 1693. This is the son who lived, married and died in New London. His marriage, but not his birth is on record. I get all these names of John Plumble and — Green's children from Miss Caulkins' History of New London, and from a paper left by Mrs. Miles' father, Frederick Plumb, as to the wife Green. Green lived, married and died in New London, though Miss Caulkins says both he and John went to Milford but returned. His birth is not on record. Samuel I assume to be the Milford Samuel, married Mehitable —. Joseph I assume to be the Milford Joseph, married Susanna, and was Senior 1711 to 14. George married, lived in Stonington, and died on Plumb Island. He was a mariner. His baptism is from Miss Caulkins' History.
