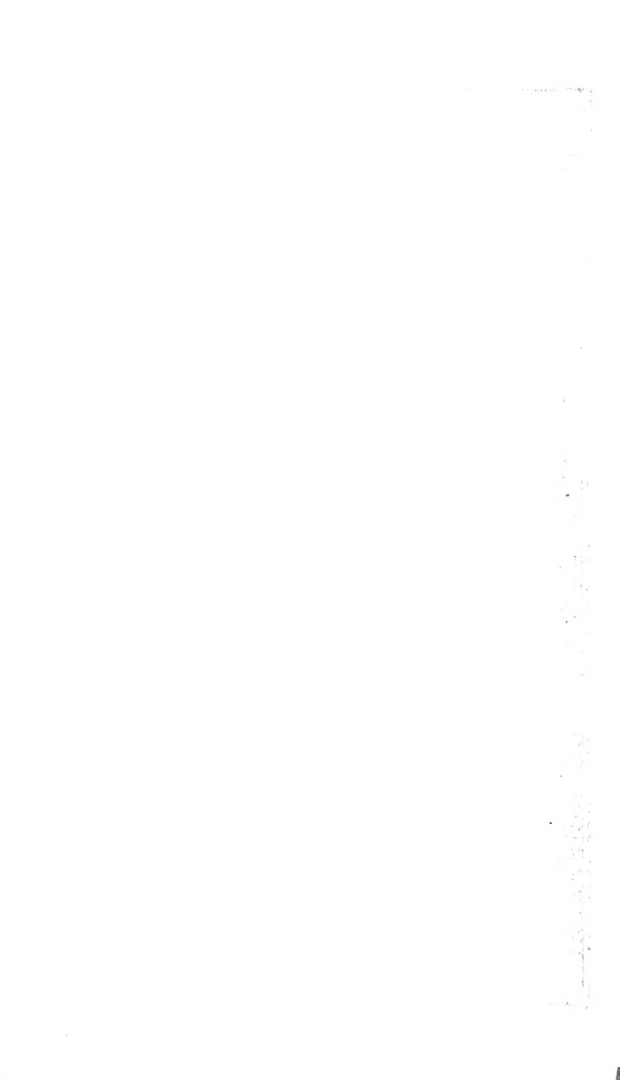

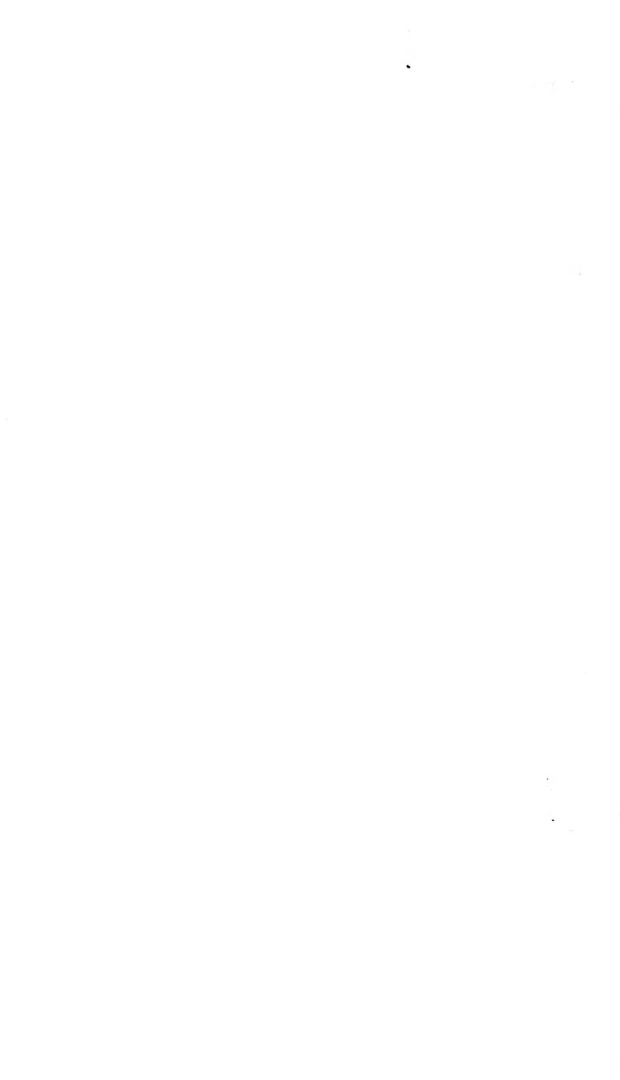

The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Is a voluntary Association, embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, in the afternoon of the last Wednesday in May, annually, at five, p. m. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational Clergymen.

The Officers of the Convention at present are —

Rev. George Ripley, of Boston, Treasurer.

Rev. George W. Blagden, of Boston, Scribe of the Convention.

Rev. Prof. Stuart, first Preacher.

Rev. Samuel Gile, second Preacher.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention, there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of her children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?
5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?
6. What is her income?
7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable, that she should have aid this year?



General Association in Massachusetts.

This body was organized in June, 1805. It is composed of delegations from particular Associations of

Its members "admit as articles of faith, the doctrines of Christianity, as they are generally expressed in the Assembly's Shorter Catechism," and consider these doctrines which have been generally embraced by the churches of New England, as the "*basis of their union.*" This body wholly disclaims ecclesiastical power or authority over the churches, or the opinions of individuals. The essential objects, as expressed in their Constitution, are "to promote brotherly intercourse and harmony, and their mutual animation, assistance, and usefulness as ministers of Christ."

Medical School in Boston.

The Massachusetts Medical College, an edifice belonging to Harvard University, was erected in Boston in 1815; and is situated in Mason Street, near the Boston Common and Mall.

In this building are contained the cabinet of anatomical preparations, consisting of more than a thousand valuable specimens; the chemical apparatus, which is complete and costly; the apparatus and specimens used in the lectures on midwifery, and materia medica, and a medical library.

The *Medical Lectures* of Harvard University begin in this building annually, 3d Wed. in October, and continue four months. The students attending the Lectures are admitted to the Medical and Surgical practice of the Massachusetts General Hospital, and to Clinical Lectures by the Professors of Surgery, and Theory and Practice of Physic, without fee. Board in the city can be obtained at \$3, per week. The fee for a whole course of Lectures is \$70. The students have opportunities for practical Anatomy.

TARIFF OF DUTIES.

The Massachusetts Register for 1833 contains the Tariff of Duties upon goods imported into the United States after the 3d of March, 1833, as established by Act of Congress, July 14, 1832.—The new Act on the Tariff is here inserted.

An Act to modify the Act of the 14th of July, 1832, and all other acts imposing duties on imports.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That from and after the 31st day of December, 1833, in all cases where duties are imposed on foreign imports by the act of the 14th day of July, 1832, entitled "An act to alter and amend the several acts imposing duties on imports," or by any other act, shall exceed twenty per centum on the value thereof, one tenth part of such excess shall be deducted; from and after the 31st day of December, 1835, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted; from and after the 31st day of December, 1837, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted; from and after the 31st day of December, 1839, another tenth part thereof shall be deducted; and from and after the 31st day of December, 1841, one half of the residue of such excess shall be deducted; and from and after the 30th day of June, 1842, the other half thereof shall be deducted.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted, That so much of the second section of the act of the 14th of July aforesaid, as fixes the rate of duty on all milled and fulled cloth, known by the names of plains, kerseys, or kendal cottons, of which wool is the only material, the value whereof does not exceed thirty-five cents a square yard, at five per centum ad valorem, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed. And the said articles shall be subject to the same duty of fifty per centum, as is provided by the said second section for other manufactures of wool; which duty shall be liable to the same deductions as are prescribed by the first section of this act.

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted, That until the 30th day of June, 1842, the duties imposed by existing laws, as modified by this act, shall remain and continue to be collected. And from and after the day last aforesaid, all duties upon imports shall be collected in ready money;

and all credits now allowed by law, in the payment of duties, shall be, and hereby are abolished; and such duties shall be laid for the purpose of raising such revenue as may be necessary to an economical administration of the Government; and from and after the day last aforesaid, the duties required to be paid by law on goods, wares, and merchandise, shall be assessed upon the value thereof at the port where the same shall be entered, under such regulations as may be prescribed by law.

SECT. 4. And be it further enacted, That in addition to the articles now exempt by the act of the 14th of July, 1832, and the existing laws, from the payment of duties, the following articles imported from and after the 31st day of December, 1833, and until the 30th day of June, 1842, shall also (be) admitted to entry, free from duty, to wit: bleached and unbleached linens, table linen, linen napkins, and linen cambrics, and worsted stuff goods, shawls, and other manufactures of silk and worsted, manufactures of silk, or of which silk shall be the component material of chief value, coming from this side of the Cape of Good Hope, except sewing silk.

SECT. 5. And be it further enacted, That from and after the said 30th day of June, 1842, the following articles shall be admitted to entry, free from duty, to wit: indigo, quicksilver, sulphur, crude saltpetre, grindstones, refined borax, emory, opium, tin in plates and sheets, gum Arabic, gum Senegal, lac dye, madder, madder root, nuts and berries used in dyeing, saffron, tumeric, woad or pastel, aloes, ambergris, Burgundy pitch, cochineal, camomile flowers, coriander seed, catsup, chalk, coculus indicus, horn plates for lanterns, ox horns, other horns and tips, India rubber, manufactured ivory, juniper berries, musk, nuts of all kinds, oil of juniper, unmanufactured rattans and reeds, tortoise shell, tin foil, shellac, vegetables used principally in dyeing and composing dyes, weld, and all articles employed chiefly for dyeing except allum, copperas, bichromate of potash, prussiate of potash, chromate of potash, and nitrate of lead, aquafortis, and tartaric acids. And all imports on which the first section of this act may operate, and all articles now admitted to entry free from duty, or paying a less rate of duty than twenty per centum ad valorem, before the said 30th day of June, 1842, from and after that day may be admitted to entry subject to such duty, not exceeding twenty per centum ad valorem, as shall be provided for by law.

SECT. 6. And be it further enacted, That so much of the act of the 14th day of July, 1832, or of any other act as is inconsistent with this act, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed; *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent the passage, prior or subsequent to the said 30th day of June, 1842, of any act or acts, from time to time, that may be necessary to detect, prevent, or punish evasions of the duties on imports imposed by law, nor to prevent the passage of any act prior to the 30th day of June, 1842, in the contingency either of excess or deficiency of revenue, altering the rates of duties on articles which, by the aforesaid act of the 14th day of July, 1832, are subject to a less rate of duty than twenty per centum ad valorem, in such manner as not to exceed that rate, and so as to adjust the revenue to either of the said contingencies.

CITY REGISTER.

City of Boston Incorporated February 23, 1822.



CITY HALL.

This edifice, now in the occupancy of the Municipal Officers of the City, was erected in 1714. The expense was borne equally between the then Province and Town of Boston. By a severe fire, in 1747, it became necessary to entirely rebuild the interior: again, the Province paid one half of the expense, the County of Suffolk one quarter, and the inhabitants of Boston were assessed for the remainder. On the 21st of November 1832, the City Hall accidentally took fire again, from a spark, it is supposed, from a building on fire on the north side of State Street, directly opposite. Though considerably damaged in the roof, the public records were not injured, nor much of the furniture of the public offices. Three thousand five hundred dollars was appropriated to make the necessary repairs. After the Revolution, it was the place of meeting for the General Court, till after the completion of the State-House, near Beacon hill. From about that time, to the year 1830, (thirty years,) the lower floor and cellar, were used by various tradesmen, Insurance Offices, &c. At the close of 1830, having been thoroughly repaired, it was, by an ordinance of the City Government, called the CITY HALL,—by which name it is hereafter to be designated. It stands at the head of State Street, and on the line of Washington Street, the Broadway of the Metropolis of Massachusetts. Its length is 112 feet, by 36 in width, with a tower, overlooking most of the city and harbour, rising from the centre of the roof. Being in the very focus of business, and nearly in the centre of the city, the use to which this venerable pile is now devoted, appears to give universal satisfaction.

On the first floor are three large rooms: that facing Washington Street, is the Post-Office. At the other extremity, looking down State Street, is the Marine News Room, one of the best conducted establishments, for the accommodation of Merchants, in the United States. The middle room, a lofty apartment, supported by pillars, is the exchange, and common thorough-fare to the Public Offices.

From this central room or Merchants' Exchange, is a flight of winding stairs, leading to a suit of apartments, in the second story. Directly over the Post-Office is the splendid Hall of the Common Council. Opposite, over the Merchants' Exchange Room, is the no less richly and tastefully ornamented Hall of the Mayor and Aldermen. In this room, the Chief Magistrate of the City, together with the City Clerk, remain through the day, in the discharge of their ordinary duties. The Board of Aldermen hold their meetings on Monday evenings.— Around the circular area of the stairs, are a series of Offices, viz. the Auditor's, Treasurer's, Clerk of Common Council, and the Health Office, which latter accomodates the City Marshal, Superintendent of Burial Grounds, Captain of the Watch, Superintendent of Lamps and the Commissioner of Streets.

Another flight of stairs leads to the third story, in which is the Office of the Chief Engineer of the Fire Department, City Land Commissioner, Messenger, a Committee Room, Post-Master's private apartment, and a large Hall, in which is a recently organized public Vaccine Institution, for the gratuitous inoculation of the poor, during the winter months.

The whole is lighted with gas, as well as the lamps at the four corners of the building. Besides being highly ornamental to the city, the concentration of so many important offices under one roof, renders the City Hall an object of peculiar interest.

Benjamin Gorham entered 1820, member 7 years. John Reed entered 1813, member 16 years. John Davis and Edward Everett since 1825, 8 years.

Rhode Island. Burgess and Pierce have been members since 1825.

Conn. N. Barber since 1821, 12 years. S. A. Foot entered 1819, member 4 years, and in the Senate 6 years.

New York. C. C. Cambreling, member since 1821, 12 years. H. C. Martindale entered 1823, member 8 years.

Penn. A Stewart entered 1821, member 10 years.

New York is the most distinguished for sending new members, and Virginia and Connecticut for retaining the old members.

In the House, there is a much larger proportion of new and young members this congress than usual.

Legal Knowledge in the Relation of Husband and Wife.

In law, husband and wife are considered as one person; and, on this principle, all their civil duties, rights, and disabilities rest.

The wife cannot sue in her own name.

If she suffers injury, or wrong, in her person or property, she can, with her husband's aid and concurrence, prosecute for redress; but the husband must always be the defendant. In criminal cases, however, these relations assume a new form. The wife may, in criminal cases, be prosecuted and punished.

The wife can make no contract with the husband, nor the husband with the wife. This disability is involved in the first principle, which makes them legally one. But they may contract, through the agency of trustees, the wife being under protection of the husband.

All contracts made between them before marriage, are dissolved upon that event.

The husband cannot convey lands or rent estates of his wife directly, but he may settle them upon her through a trusteeship. The wife may release her dower to his grantee. As it respects the right of bequest, the husband can always devise real estate to his wife.

Upon marriage, the husband becomes possessed of all right and title to her property, whether personal or real; and, at the same time, he becomes liable for all debts, and must fulfil all her contracts made prior to their union.

If the wife die before the husband, and there be no issue, her heirs succeed to her real estate.

But in case of issue, the husband remains in possession of her lands during his life time only; and, at his demise, they go to the heirs of his wife. All debts due to the wife, become, after marriage, the property of the husband, who becomes invested with the power to sue on bond, note, or any other obligation, to his own and exclusive use. The powers of discharges and assignments, and change of securities, are involved in the leading principle.

If he dies before the recovery of the money, or the change of securities, the wife becomes entitled to the debts in her own right.

All personal property of the wife, such as money, goods, movables, and stocks, become absolutely the property of the husband, upon marriage, and on his death, to his heirs.

Property may be secured to the wife, by deed or marriage settlement, in order to secure to the wife a comfortable competence against the vicissitudes of life, or the extravagance, vices, or cruelty of her husband.

Property may be settled on the wife, after the marriage, by the husband, provided he be solvent at the time, and not made with a view to defraud creditors.

The wife cannot demise lands; but any personal or real estate settled upon her in trust she may bequeath; or any savings from the property given to her separate use.

The husband is bound to provide his wife with all necessaries suited to her condition in life; and becomes liable for debts contracted by her for such necessaries, but not for superfluities or extravagances.

The husband and wife cannot be witnesses against each other, in civil or criminal cases, where the testimony has the least tendency to favour or criminate each other.

One exception to this rule exists, where the law respecting the personal safety and life of the wife, permits her to give testimony against her husband for her own protection.

COMMISSIONERS resident in other States, who have been appointed by the Government of Massachusetts to take testimony and depositions to be read in the Courts of Massachusetts,—also to administer Oaths and to take the acknowledgment of Deeds, Powers of Attorney, and all instruments under seal to be recorded in said Commonwealth.
