

INTRODUCTION

SCIF RULES, CLASSIFICATIONS AND RATES FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE

This Manual provides rules, classifications and rates utilized by the State Compensation Insurance Fund (SCIF) and is an adaptation of the Basic Manual of the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) to the specific requirements of the Montana Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Acts.

The rates for occupational disease are incorporated in the published SCIF rates for workers' compensation.

GENERAL RULES

I. GENERAL

A. Underwriting

- This manual of rules, classifications and rates governs the underwriting of workers' compensation and occupational disease insurance by the Montana State Compensation Mutual Insurance Fund (State Fund).
- 2. The general rules apply to and control the writing of all State Fund policies.

B. Effective Dates

 Rules and rates in this manual become effective at 12:01 a.m. on the date specified on the manual pages and supercede all previous rules and rates

Changes in any rules will be designated by an asterisk (*) on a reprinted page.

3. Changes in classifications

a. July 1, 1991 and prior: effective on the date specified at the top of each manual page and designated by an asterisk.

b. Subsequent to July 1, 1991: effective on the date the change is approved by the State Fund Board of Directors as indicated by a footnote designated by one or more asterisks.

II. DEFINITIONS

A. Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease: The statutory obligation of an employer to provide benefits for employees under the Montana Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Acts (Title 39, Chapter 71, MCA and Title 39, Chapter 72, MCA).

B. State Compensation Mutual Insurance Fund (State Fund)

1. A state operated workers' compensation and occupational disease insurer.

Also known as Compensation Plan 3 under the Montana Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Acts.

C. Employer/Insured

 A single legal entity, as further defined in 39-71-117(1), MCA, which may be an individual, partnership, private or public corporation, association, joint venture or other entity.

2. The entire operation of each separate legal entity shall be covered by a

single policy.

A policy shall not be issued to cover only a portion of the employer's operation or employees.

JANUARY 1, 1990

- D. Risk: The entire operation of one employer within this state.
- E. Principal Business: The business with the greatest amount of payroll, excluding standard exception or general exclusion operations.
- F. Secondary Business: An undertaking or enterprise separate from the principal business of the insured.
- G. Pending Effective Date: A conditional effective date determined by the date State Fund receives an approved application and all payroll reports and premiums from any previous coverage periods.
- H. Initial Deposit: An amount, required to secure future premium payment, as further defined in Rule IV.

I. Policy Period:

- 1. The effective date is established on the date an approved application, all reports and premiums from any previous coverage periods and an initial deposit have been received.
- 2. Policies remain in effect continuously until cancelled (see Rule XI). Policy renewal is not required.
- J. Report Basis: Time periods assigned for each employer to report employee earnings for premium purposes:

1. Monthly

2. Quarterly -January 1 - March 31

April 1 - June 30 July 1 - September 30

October 1 - December 31

3. Semi Annual - January 1 - June 30

July 1 - December 31

K. Fiscal Year: A 12-month period beginning July 1st and ending the following June 30th.

L. Anniversary Date: July 1st of each year.

M. Anniversary Rating Date:

- 1. The normal anniversary rating date for policies which qualify for experience modification is July 1st of each year.
- If the policy carried a previous anniversary rating date of other than July 1st, the anniversary rating date will be changed to the next appropriate July 1st
- N. Classification Code: A description of operations involved in an employer's business identified by a code number and further defined in Rule VII.
- Payroll: Total gross remuneration or earnings as further defined in Rule VIII and 39-71-123(1), MCA.
- P. Premium: Manual, standard, modified, earned and minimum premium as further defined in Rule IX.
 - Q. Claim Liability: Estimated costs of medical and compensation benefits for each injury claim.
 - R. Margin: Earned premium minus claim liability.
 - S. Loss Ratio: Claim liability divided by earned premium.

III. LIMITS OF LIABILITY

- A. State Fund assumes the entire liability to employees of State Fund insureds under the Montana Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Acts.
 - B. State Fund does not defend any suits or actions for which it does not provide benefits under the Workers' Compensation or Occupational Disease Acts, including but not limited to tort or contract actions against the insured.
 - C. A State Fund policy does not provide employer's liability insurance (Coverage B) unless specified by endorsement to an individual policy.

IV. INITIAL DEPOSIT

A. Definition and Purpose

- 1. An amount required to secure future premium payment.
- Based on a percentage of estimated annual premium:
- a. Monthly Report Basis 25% of annual premium
 - b. Quarterly Report Basis 50% of annual premium c. Semiannual Report Basis 75% of annual premium
- Semiannual Report Basis 75% of annual pre
 Subject to a minimum and periodic adjustment.

B. Payment Establishes Coverage Effective Date

- Coverage will become effective on the pending effective date provided the full initial deposit is received within 15 days after the billing date.
- If payment is received from 16-60 days after the billing date, coverage will be effective the day full payment is received.
- After 60 days, the pending coverage file is closed and a new application must be submitted.

C. Payment Methods

- 1. Cash, check or money order.
- Subject to monetary limitations shown in the Miscellaneous Values:
 - a. Čertificate of Deposit, made payable to the insured and State Fund and accompanied by an Assignment Agreement.
 - b. Surety Bond.
- D. Payment With Dishonored Check: Coverage will be voided retroactive to the effective date.

E. Held Until Policy Cancellation

- The initial deposit and any subsequent additional deposits are held in a separate account and may not be credited as premium during an active policy period.
- 2. When the policy is cancelled, all deposits are credited to final premium and any remaining deposit amounts are refunded to the employer provided minimum premium has been paid during the policy period.
- If the employer fails to submit payroll & premium report forms after cancellation, State Fund will retain the full deposit and may credit the deposit to premium based on estimated payroll. (see Rule VIII-C-2)

V. COVERAGES

A. COVERED EMPLOYMENTS (39-71-401(1), MCA)

Election

a. An employer may request an application for coverage by mail, telephone or in person.

b. Coverage will not be extended to any employer who has not submitted all payroll & premium reports and premiums for any prior coverage periods.

c. All applications are subject to approval.

d. The policy effective date is determined by the date the initial deposit is received. (See Rule IV-B)

Binder

a. Coverage may be bound by establishing a pending effective date of 12:01 a.m. on the day following a telephone request or on any other future date.

b. Coverage will become effective on the bound date provided the following requirements are met:

all payroll & premium reports and premiums for any prior coverage periods have been received;

a completed application is received within 15 days of the request; or, if the employer requests the application, within 15 days of the date the application is mailed to the employer;

the application is approved; and

full payment of the initial deposit is received within 15 days of the billing date.

B. EXEMPTED EMPLOYMENTS (39-71-401(2), MCA) AND CORPORATE OFFI-CERS (39-71-401(4), MCA)

Election or Rejection

a. An employer may request optional coverage endorsements or corporate officer rejections by mail, telephone or in person, at the time of application for covered employments (see Rule V-A) or at any time thereafter.

All endorsements and rejections are subject to approval.

c. An endorsement or rejection must be attached to an active policy.

d. The endorsement or rejection effective date will be:

i. the policy effective date if the approved endorsement or rejection is received on or prior to the initial deposit billing due date (see Rule IV-B);

ii. the date the approved endorsement or rejection is received by mail, if that date is after the initial deposit billing due date;

- the day following the date the approved endorsement or rejection is received in person, if that date is after the initial deposit billing due date; or
- iv. the pending effective date related to a binder. (See Rule V-B-2)
- Approved endorsements and rejections remain in effect until the employer or the corporate officer request termination in writing or the policy is cancelled.

Binder

- a. Coverage for an exempted employment endorsement or rejection for a corporate officer may be bound by establishing a pending effective date of 12:01 a.m. on the day following a telephone request or on any other future date.
- Coverage or rejection will become effective on the bound date provided the following requirements are met:
 - a completed endorsement or rejection is received within 15 days of the request; or, if the employer requests the endorsement or rejection, within 15 days of the date the endorsement or rejection is mailed to the employer; and
 - ii. the endorsement or rejection is approved.

C. Assignment/Death

- An insured may not assign its interest in a policy without the express written consent of State Fund.
- If an insured dies during a policy period, the policy will extend to the insured's legal representative, provided State Fund receives written notice within 30 days after the death.

VI. POLICY FORMS

A. Application

- 1. Contains information submitted by the employer sufficient to establish underwriting costs, classifications and policy provisions.
- 2. All applications are subject to approval.
- A new application is required if delinquent payroll & premium reports or premium, from a previous coverage period, are not received within 60 days of the date the new policy or re-enrollment application was received.

B. Policy

- Contains general insuring agreements; excluded employments and risks; and conditions applicable to insureds.
- 2. Issued when coverage becomes effective

C. Initial Deposit Statement

1. A billing specifying the deposit amount required to initiate coverage.

2. The coverage effective date for each employer is determined by the date State Fund receives the initial deposit. (see Rule IV.)

D. Coverage Declarations

1. Contains information specific to each insured: policy number, effective date, initial deposit amount, report basis, entity type, mailing address(es), business names and locations, elected optional coverages and coverage status of business owner(s).

2. Issued when coverage becomes effective and when above policy specifics, except address(es), change.

E. Classification and Code Schedule

1. Lists complete descriptions of all classification codes assigned the insured.

2. Issued when coverage becomes effective and when assigned classification codes change.

F. Endorsements

To elect coverage for excluded employments under 39-71-401(2), MCA.
 To reject coverage for corporate officers under 39-71-401(4), MCA

3. To elect participation in the medical deductible program as further defined in Rule IX-C.

4. All endorsements are subject to approval.

G. Application and Survey

1. To apply for participation in the construction industry premium credit pro-

gram as further defined in Rule IX-E.

2. The application is subject to approval.

H. Payroll & Premium Reports

1. Provided to insured at the end of each reporting period (monthly, quarterly or semiannual).

2. Insured must report gross remuneration of all employees for which coverage is mandatory or elected (see Rule VIII.) and calculate premium (see Rule IX.)

3. Insured must submit calculated premium with each report.

CLASSIFICATION PROCEDURE VII.

A. General Explanation

1. The object of the classification system is to group employers into classifications so the rate for each classification reflects exposures common to those employers. This is generally accomplished by assigning one basic classification which best describes the business and includes all the various types of labor. It is the business which is classified, not the separate employments, occupations or operations within the business.

JULY 1, 1992

The "Classifications" section of this manual contains complete descriptions of each classification.

The "Numeric Sequence" section of this manual contains brief descriptions of each classification.

 The "Rate" section of this manual contains manual rates for each classification.

- B. Basic Classifications: Include all classifications in this manual, other than the Standard Exception classifications. (see Rule VII-D.)
- C. Governing Classification: The classification, other than a standard exception, which produces the greatest amount of payroll.

D. Standard Exceptions

 Some occupations common to many businesses are described by standard exception classifications.

a. Clerical Office Employees - Code 8810 - are employees engaged exclusively in bookkeeping, record keeping, correspondence, or other office work where books and other records are kept or correspondence is conducted. This classification applies only to employees who work in areas physically separated from other operations by structural partitions and in which work of clerical office employees, as defined in this rule, is performed exclusively. If such an employee has any other duty, the total payroll of that employee shall be assigned to the highest rated classification of operations to which the employee is exposed.

b. Drafting Employees - Code 8810 - are employees engaged exclusively in drafting and confined to office work. The entire payroll of any such employees exposed to any other operations shall be assigned to the highest rated classification of operations to which they are exposed.

c. Drivers, Chauffeurs and Their Helpers - Code 7380 - are employees engaged in such duties on or in connection with a vehicle. This classification also includes garage employees and employees using bicycles in their operations.

Vehicles Under Contract: If vehicles with drivers, chauffeurs or helpers are engaged under contract and the owner of such vehicles has not furnished evidence that the workers' compensation obligation has been included as payroll of such drivers, chauffeurs or helpers shall be included as payroll of the insured employer which contracted for such vehicles. Such payroll shall be assigned to the classification applicable

in that risk to drivers. If that payroll cannot be obtained, 1/4 of the total contract price for the vehicles shall be considered as payroll of the drivers, chauffeurs or helpers. If the owner of a vehicle under contract also is a driver and is entitled to workers compensation benefits and has not furnished evidence that such workers compensation obligation has been insured, 1/4 of the contract price for that vehicle shall be included as payroll of the insured employer which contracted for the vehicle. When the contract price does not include the cost of fuel, maintenance, or other services provided to the owner-operator of a vehicle under contract, the value of such goods and services shall be added to the contract price before determining the 1/4 amount.

d. Salespersons, Collectors or Messengers - Outside - Code 8742 - are employees engaged in such duties away from the employer's premises. This classification shall not apply to employees who deliver merchandise. Employees who deliver merchandise shall be assigned to the classification applicable in that risk to drivers even though they also collect or sell. If they walk or use public transportation, they shall be assigned to the governing classification.

Standard exception classifications apply, even if the basic classification includes phrases such as "all employees" or "all operations", unless the basic classification specifically includes them.

E. General Inclusions

1. Some businesses include operations which would be classified separately if the operation were a separate business. When these operations are a part of the main business, they are included in the basic classification for that

a. Aircraft travel by employees, other than members of the flying crew.

b. Commissaries and restaurants for the insured's employees. Such operations shall be assigned to a separate classification if conducted in connection with construction, erection, lumbering or mining operations.

c. Manufacture of containers such as bags, barrels, bottles, boxes, cans, cartons or packing cases by the employer for use in the operations insured by the policy.
d. Hospitals or medical facilities operated by the insured for its employees.

Maintenance or repair of the insured's buildings or equipment by the

insured's employees.

Printing or lithographing by the insured on its own products. 2. A general inclusion operation shall be separately classified only if:

a. Such operation constitutes a separate and distinct business of the insured as provided in Rule VII-G below, or

b. It is specifically excluded by the classification wording, or

c. The principal business is described by a standard exception classifica-

F. General Exclusions: Some businesses include unusual operations which are excluded from basic classifications and are classified separately, even if the basic classification includes phrases such as "all employees" or "all operations", unless specifically included in the basic classification:

1. Aircraft operation - all operations of the flying and ground crews.

- 2. New construction or alteration work by the insured's employees or contrac-
- 3. Sawmill operations sawing logs into lumber by equipment such as circular carriage or band carriage saws, including operations incidental to the saw-
- 4. Commissaries and restaurants for the insured's employees if operated in connection with construction, erection, lumbering or mining operations.

5. Employer operated day care services.

G. Assignment of Classifications

Additional basic classifications

a. A basic classification may require certain operations or employees to be separately rated. The additional classification must be assigned unless it is prohibited by wording of that classification or any other classification assigned to the policy.

b. An additional basic classification shall be assigned for a secondary

business if the following conditions exist:

i. the secondary business is conducted as a separate undertaking or enterprise;

ii. separate payroll records are maintained for each business;

iii. each business is physically separated by structural partitions and is conducted without interchange of labor; and

iv. assignment of the separate classification is not prohibited by wording of that classification or any other classification assigned to the policy.

c. If the conditions in b. above do not exist:

i. All employees shall be assigned to the classification applicable to the principal business if that classification carries a rate which is the same or higher than the rate of the secondary business classification.

ii. The secondary business shall be assigned the classification which describes that business if the rate for that classification is higher than the rate of the principal business.

JANUARY 1, 1990

2. Classifications limited to separate businesses: Certain classifications are limited to separate and distinct businesses because they describe operations which frequently are integral parts of a business described by another classification.

3. Business not described by a manual classification: If there is no classification which specifically describes the business, the classification which most

closely describes the business shall be assigned.

4. Principal or secondary business described by a Standard Exception Classification: All employees not included in the standard exception classification shall be assigned to the separate basic classification which most closely describes their operations.

5. Construction and Erection operations

a. Each distinct type of construction or erection operation at a job or location shall be assigned to the classification which specifically describes such operation provided separate payroll records are maintained for each operation.

b. Any such operation for which separate payroll records are not maintained shall be assigned to the highest rated classification which applies

to the job or location where the operation is performed.

c. A separate construction or erection classification shall not be assigned to any operation which is within the scope of another classification assigned to such job or location.

6. Mercantile business: A classification is determined separately for each store

or dealer location.

H. Payroll Assignment - Multiple Classifications

1. Miscellaneous employees

a. Payroll of employees who perform duties common to separately assigned classifications shall be assigned to the governing classification.

b. Such employees include general superintendents, watch persons, maintenance or power plant employees, elevator operators, shipping or receiving clerks and yard workers.

2. Interchange of labor

a. Some employees, who are not miscellaneous employees, may perform

duties directly related to more than one classification.

b. The entire payroll of employees who interchange shall be assigned to the highest rated classification representing any part of their work unless one of the exceptions for construction, erection, part-time aircraft or trucking as a secondary business apply as defined in Rule VIII-G.

JANUARY 1, 1990

I. Classification Wording

- Headings: Words or phrases preceding a classification or a group of classifications apply to and are a part of each classification.
- Notes: Notes following a classification or a group of classifications are part of the classification wording and control its use.
- 3. Common words and phrases: A number of words and phrases are used throughout this manual and have the following meanings:
 - All Employees, All Other Employees, All Operations or All Operations to Completion. If a classification includes any of these phrases, no other classification shall be assigned (even though some operations or employees are at a separate location) unless;
 - i. classification wording requires assignment of another classification,
 ii. a standard exception or general exclusion classification applies, or
 - iii. an additional basic classification applies as defined in Rule VII-G-1.
 b. Clerical means clerical office employees and drafting employees as defined in Rule VII-D-1 a and b.
 - c. Drivers means drivers, chauffeurs and their helpers as defined in Rule VII-D-1-c.
 - d. Includes or &: If a classification contains "Includes" or "&", the operations or employees which are so designated shall not be assigned to a separate classification even though such operations or employees are described by another classification or are at a separate location.
 - No or Not: A classification which includes a restrictive phrase beginning with "no" or "not" shall not apply to any risk which conducts any operation described in the restrictive phrase except for separate locations for:

 mercantile businesses, such as dealers or stores,
 - ii. mining businesses, or
 - iii. construction or erection operations.
 - f. NOC means not otherwise classified. A classification designated "NOC" shall apply only if no other classification more specifically describes the insured business.
 - g. Or: Or also means and.
 - Salespersons means salespersons, collectors and messengers as defined in Rule VII-D-1-d.
 - To Be Separately Rated: If a classification requires operations or employees "to be separately rated", all such operations or employees shall be separately classified subject to the conditions of Rule VII-G.

JANUARY 1, 1993



- A. Computation: Premium shall be computed on the total gross remuneration. earnings or payroll paid or payable by the insured for services of employees covered by the policy.
- B. Payroll, Remuneration or Earnings
 - 1. Definition: Money or substitutes for money.
 - 2. Payroll, remuneration or earnings include:
 - a. regular salary or wages,
 - b. commissions,
 - c. bonuses.
 - d. extra pay for overtime worked (limited by Rule VIII-D),
 - e. holiday, vacation or sick pay received,
 - f. payments on any basis other than time worked, such as piece work, profit sharing, or incentive plans,
 - g. employee expense payments or allowances other than those specifically excluded in Rule VIII-3-f,
 - h. payments by the employer of amounts required by law to be paid by
 - employees, such as social security, etc., actual value of meals, lodging, rent or housing provided by the employer to employees as part of their pay,
 - value of store certificates, merchandise, credits or any other substitute for money provided employees as part of their pay,
 - k. tips or gratuities received by employees and documented for federal tax purposes, and
 - 1. employee contributions to insurance, retirement, pension, deferred compensation or cafeteria plans.
 - 3. Payroll, remuneration or earnings exclude:
 - a. employer contributions to employee group insurance or pension plans,
 - b. special rewards for employee invention or discovery,
 - c. tips or gratuities received by employees in excess of those documented for federal tax purposes,
 - d. dismissal or severance payments except for time worked and accrued vacation or sick leave benefits,

JANUARY 1, 1993

e. vacation or sick leave benefits accrued but not paid,

f. employee expense reimbursements:

i. payments made to reimburse employees for ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in the course and scope of employment, provided all four of the following conditions are met:

(a) the amount of each employee's reimbursement is entered sepa-

rately in the employer's records;

(b) the employee could reasonably be expected to incur the expenses while conducting the business of the employer;

(c) the reimbursement is not based on a percentage of the employees' wages nor is it deducted from wages; and

(d) the reimbursement does not replace the customary wage for the occupation.

ii. reimbursement methods:

(a) meals and lodging:

actual expenses, supported by receipts; or

a flat rate based on corresponding rates for state employees in accordance with Section 2-18-501, MCA (see Miscellaneous Values) unless, through documentation, the employer can substantiate a higher rate; or

for drivers employed by a motor carrier with interstate operating authority, a flat daily rate for each calendar day worked in a travel status (see Miscellaneous Values).

(b) mileage for a passenger vehicle provided by the employee:

actual expenses, supported by receipts; or

(i) (ii) a per mile rate not to exceed that allowed by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service for the preceding year (see Miscellaneous Values).

(c) equipment, other than a passenger vehicle, at its reasonable rental value, subject to limitations (see Miscellaneous Values) for:

heavy equipment such as logging or semi trucks, bulldoz-(i)

(ii) chain saws and related timber falling expenses.

JANUARY 1, 1990



1. The employer shall provide an estimate of annual payroll on the application for calculation of deposit and estimated annual premium.

2. State Fund may estimate payroll, based on information previously obtained from the insured, if the insured fails to report payroll as required

D. Overtime

1. Definition: Hours worked at an increased pay rate

- a. work in any day or in any week in excess of the number of hours normally worked.
- b. hours worked in excess of 8 hours in any day or 40 hours in any week.

c. work on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays, or

d. hours worked in excess of the number specified in a guaranteed wage agreement.

NOTE: Forms of incentive pay commonly referred to as "shift differential" or "premium pay" associated with working other than normal day shift hours during the standard work week are not to be considered overtime.

2. Exclusion of overtime payroll: Extra pay for overtime may be excluded from payroll as indicated below, provided the insured's books and records show overtime payments separately by employee and classification.

a. if the records show separately the extra pay earned for overtime, the

entire extra pay shall be excluded.

b. if the records show the total pay earned for overtime (regular pay plus overtime pay) in one combined amount, 1/3 of this total pay shall be excluded. If double time is paid for overtime and the total pay for such overtime is recorded separately, 1/2 of the total pay for double time shall be excluded.

E. Corporate Officers

1. Definition: Officers of a private corporation elected or appointed in accordance with the charter and bylaws of the corporation.

2. Coverage requirements: All corporate officers who reside and work in Montana are covered unless:

a. they qualify for exclusion under Department of Labor and Industry rules. and

b. State Fund approves rejection forms submitted under 39-71-401(4)(a)(ii), MCA.

STATE FUND UNDERWRITING MANUAL JULY 1, 1992

 Reporting requirements - covered officers: Actual earnings as described in Rule VIII-B, subject to a minimum and maximum each fiscal year (see Miscellaneous Values):

a. Minimum: \$500 per month.

- Maximum: one and one-half times the state's average weekly wage, rounded to the nearest \$100.
- Compensation benefits for job related injury covered officers: Based on actual earnings unless actual is less than the minimum. In that case, benefits are based on the reported minimum.

F. Owners and Partners

 Definition: The owner of a sole proprietorship or working members of a partnership.

2. Coverage requirements

- a. Sole proprietors and working members of a partnership are excluded from coverage under 39-71-401(2)(d), MCA.
- b. Sole proprietors or working partners devoting full time to the business may elect to be covered as employees under 39-71-118(3), MCA. Such election is subject to approval under 39-71-401(2), MCA.
- Reporting requirements covered owners and partners: Assumed earnings elected in advance by the owner or partner, subject to a minimum and maximum. (see Miscellaneous Values):

a. Minimum: \$900 per month.

- b. Maximum: one and one-half times the state's average weekly wage.
- Compensation benefits for job related injury covered owners or partners: Based on elected assumed earnings:
 - Maximum time-loss benefits are available if maximum assumed earnings are elected.
 - Proportionately reduced time-loss benefits are available if assumed earnings of less than the maximum are elected.
- G. Payroll Division: The entire payroll of each employee shall be assigned to the highest rated classification representing any part of his or her work and may not be divided between two or more classifications unless one of the following exceptions applies:

EXCEPTIONS:

- 1. Construction and Erection
 - a. The payroll of an individual employee may be divided among construction and erection (divisible) manual classifications and other non-restricted basic manual classifications provided the entries on the original records of the insured disclose an allocation of each individual employee's payroll.



Divisible classification codes are identified.

i. on the Classification and Code Schedule issued with the policy, and ii. by a 'Y' preceding the code number in the numeric sequence section

of this manual.

d. Codes 8810 and 8742 are not available for division of payroll.

2. Part-Time Aircraft Operation - Code 7421

a. When the rate for an employee's normal classification is less than the rate for code 7421, payroll must be divided, with payroll for the duration of the entire trip being reported in code 7421.

b. When the rate for an employee's normal classification is more than the rate for code 7421, payroll may not be divided.

Code 8810 is not available for division of payroll.

3. Trucking as a secondary business

- a. When a trucking operation is conducted as a separate enterprise and secondary business, the payroll of an individual employee may be divided among non-restricted basic manual classifications provided the entries on the original records of the insured disclose an allocation of each individual employee's payroll.
- b. An estimate or percentage allocation of payroll is not permitted

c. Codes 8810 and 8742 are not available for division of payroll.

4. Any other payroll division exceptions must be specifically approved.

H. Uninsured Subcontractors: When an insured contracts work to another contractor or subcontractor who has not secured compensation insurance, the insured must pay premium on the entire contract price unless the written contract or other records detail labor versus other costs such as materials or other non-labor items.

RATES AND PREMIUM IX.

A. Manual Rate

A unit of premium for each \$100 of payroll, shown opposite identifying class.

code numbers in the rate section of this manual.

2. There are variable rates for each class code. Each fiscal year, an insured is assigned a rate category based on policy effective date, premium level in the most recent complete fiscal year, combined loss ratio of up to three of the most recent complete fiscal years and qualification for experience modification in the next fiscal year. The rate categories are:

a. Preferred - the category with the lowest premium rate.

b. Select - the category with the middle premium rate.

c. Equitable - the category with the highest premium rate.

STATE FUND UNDERWRITING MANUAL JULY 1, 1992

- 3. An insured may be placed in a category with a higher premium rate for reasons which include but are not limited to timeliness of payroll reporting and premium payment, a previous forced cancellation or insolvency, increased risk, refusal or failure to adequately implement or maintain a loss control program, work is primarily performed at locations other than the insured's principal job site or place of business and the insured does not have control over the job site or place of business, a history of preventable losses or a prior history with any insurer where the most recent experience modification factor is greater than 1.00.
- 4. A rate designated by the symbol "(a)" must be established by State Fund.
- **B. Manual Premium:** Payroll, divided by 100, multiplied by the manual rate equals manual premium.
- C. Modified Manual Premium: Manual premium may be modified by a factor derived from the Medical Deductible program.
 - 1 Definition
 - An elective program which allows an insured to pay a portion of the medical costs on each claim incurred during one fiscal year in exchange for a premium discount.
 - Per claim deductibles are offered at these levels: \$500, \$1,000, \$1,500, \$2,000, and \$2,500.
 - c. The State Fund pays the medical benefits, then bills the insured for reimbursement up to the chosen deductible amount.
 - 2. Qualification
 - An insured must apply for the program prior to the beginning of the next fiscal year,
 - b. have a policy effective date prior to the beginning of the most recent complete fiscal year,
 - have annual prémium which equals or exceeds the chosen deductible amount, and
 - d. not have a poor premium payment history.
 - 3. Calculation
 - Manual premium multiplied by the medical deductible factor equals modified manual premium.
- D. Standard Premium: Modified manual premium may be further modified by application of the mandatory Experience Modification program
 - 1. Definition
 - A factor derived from an evaluation of payroll and accident experience in previous policy periods
 - b. Based on the formula of a national rating organization.

2. Qualification

Sufficient manual premium in the most recent completed year or averaged over the previous two or three completed years (see Miscellaneous Values)

3. Application

a. The factor is normally applied on its effective date, however.

b. any factor may be applied retroactively regardless of whether the factor increases or decreases the premium due. Reasons for retroactive application include:

factors calculated late because of insufficient data or other reasons;

i. factors calculated late because or insumicion.
ii. factors received to correct previously applied factors, or iii. factors recalculated due to an audit resulting in payroll and/or classification code changes.

c. any factor revised by a national rating organization due to a misclassification identified through an inspection may be applied the same date as the classification changes are endorsed onto the policy.

d. factors may be revised to include the experience of an acquired entity and applied to premium for reporting periods after the acquisition date.

Combined Entities

a. Separate policies are combined for experience modification when common majority ownership of two or more entities exceeds 50%.

b. Manual premium of the combinable entities is totalled to determine qualification

c. A single factor, based on total payroll and accident experience, is applied to all combinable policies.

5. Ownership Changes/Transfer of Experience: When ownership changes, prior experience will be transferred to the new owner unless each of the following conditions are met:

a. 100% of the ownership changed or the collective ownership of all those having an interest both before and after the change was less than 33 1/3% before the change and less than 50% after the change;

b. there is a change in operations sufficient to change the governing classification; and

the process and hazard of the operations also changed.

6. Calculation

Modified manual premium multiplied by the experience modification factor equals standard premium.

E. Modified Standard Premium: Standard premium may be further modified by application of a factor derived from the Construction Industry Credit Program. 1. Definition

> An elective program to provide a premium credit for one fiscal year to insureds in the construction industry who pay their workers wages in excess of the state's average weekly wage.

JULY 1, 1992

2. Qualification

- a. An insured must have an active policy effective on or before August 1 of the year preceding the fiscal year to which the factor will be applied, and the policy must remain active through the remainder of the survey period fiscal year:
- apply for the program by submitting an application and survey form before November 1 of the year preceding the fiscal year to which the credit will be applied:
- maintain accurate individual employee records of the total hours worked and payroll by class code during the July 1 through September 30 survey period and make those records available for verification and audit:
- d have paid an average hourly wage equal to or in excess of the state's average weekly wage; and
- e. have at least 50% of the manual premium during the survey period attributable to one or more of the eligible construction codes
- 3. Calculation
 - Standard premium multiplied by the construction industry credit factor equals modified standard premium.
- F. Earned Premium: Modified standard premium may be reduced by Volume Discount.
 - 1. Definition
 - An annual (fiscal year July 1st through June 30th) percentage reduction based on premium volume. (see Miscellaneous Values.)
 - 2. Calculation
 - Modified standard premium minus volume discount equals earned premium
- G. Minimum Premium
 - 1 An amount sufficient to cover the cost of administering each policy of insurance. (see Miscellaneous Values)
 - Charged for each policy period within each fiscal year (July 1st through June 30th) only if actual earned premium is less than the minimum and may not be prorated
 - H. Final Premium: The greater of minimum or earned premium as described in F and G above.
 - Audit: The insured's books and records, relative to remuneration earned by employees, are subject to audit during the policy period and at reasonable times thereafter

JULY 1, 1992

X. DIVIDENDS

A. Based on Loss Experience

- After July first of each year, State Fund will determine its total loss experience for the prior fiscal year by comparing earned premium to administrative expenses and claim liabilities.
- Claim liabilities include, but are not limited to, actuarially sound reserves for:
 - a. medical and compensation on reported and unreported accidents
 - b. catastrophe
 - c. rate stabilization
 - d. recovery of any unfunded liability for prior years
 - e. other miscellaneous reserves recommended by State Fund's actuary.

B. Premium Excess

- If total loss experience for the prior fiscal year shows an excess of earned premium over claim liabilities for all years and administrative expenses, the excess funds will be returned to qualified employers as a dividend.
- 2. Dividend percentage factors for the year will be based on total funds available for distribution, policy size and policy loss ratio.
- **C. Qualification:** An employer may qualify for a dividend if, during the prior fiscal year:
 - 1. the policy loss ratio was less than 75%;
 - all payroll & premium reports, premiums and any billed deposits have been received; and
 - 3. annual earned premium exceeded \$500.

D. Distribution to Qualified Employers:

- A percentage of the individual policy margin (earned premium in excess of claim liabilities) for the prior fiscal year.
- 2. Distributed before the end of the current fiscal year.
 - a. Credited to accounts receivable for active policies.
 - b. Checks will be issued for cancelled policies.
- 3. Not be issued for less than \$10.00.

XI. CANCELLATION

A. Ceased Operations

- The employer must notify State Fund when it withdraws from business or ceases operations.
- Cancellation will be effective on the date the employer withdraws from business or ceases operations.

JULY 1, 1992

B. Transfer Coverage to Another Carrier

1. Notice is required:

a. from the employer; or

- a Notice of Issuance or Certificate of Insurance, filed with the Employment Relations Division of the Department of Labor and Industry, by the replacement carrier.
- Cancellation will be effective on the date replacement coverage becomes effective.

C. No Employees For Which Coverage Is Required

 The employer must notify State Fund when it no longer has workers for which coverage is required by Montana law. (see 39-71-401, MCA)

Cancellation will be effective on the date the employer notifies the State Fund there are no workers for which coverage is mandatory.

D. Change of Ownership or Sale of Business

- The employer must notify State Fund of all changes in ownership of a
 privately owned business entity (sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, etc.), whether the change is partial or total. Cancellation is dependent
 on the percentage of common majority ownership before and after the
 change.
- 2. Cancellation will be effective on the sale or change date if:

a. 100% of the ownership changed; or

b. collective ownership of all those having an interest, both before and after the change, was less than 33 1/3% before the change and less than 50% after the change.

EXCEPTION TO 1 AND 2 ABOVE:

When an ownership change takes place among immediate family members, the existing policy will **not** be cancelled but will be updated to reflect the new ownership. For purposes of this rule, members of an immediate family include spouse, father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, step-brother, step-sister, step-child, step-parent, grandchild and grandparent.

E. Forced

State Fund may cancel coverage for:

failure to submit payroll & premium reports, premium or additional deposit by the due date.

b. material misrepresentation,

c. failure to cooperate in an audit, or

d. failure to reimburse for expended medical deductible amounts.

Notice of intent to cancel must be mailed to the employer at least 30 days prior to the effective date of cancellation.




