Entered, according to the Act of the Provincial Legislature, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty, by J. O. Côté, in the Office of the Registrar of the Province of Canada.

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This work has been prepared with the view of facilitating references frequently required by Public men connected with the Executive and Legislative branches of the Government, as well as by writers in the Press.

Difficulties often arise while discussing public subjects, which are removed on certain dates being ascertained.

The ascertaining these dates, however, is but seldom readily effected. The noticing that fact during many years of service in a Public Department, has so deeply convinced the compiler of this Pamphlet of the usefulness of some work of this kind, as to induce him to prepare it, with all the care and attention he could command, and offer it to the public men of the Province.

The work being, for the most part, merely a compilation of dates and names, it has been thought advisable—to save expense to its author—to publish it only in one language, and that the English language, inasmuch as persons of French origin who may have occasion for this work, will easily understand it; whereas if published in the French language it could only be read by a limited number of persons of British origin.

Some slight errors may have crept into the work; they will, however, be easily detected, as the work is so arranged that, in most cases, one part is checked by another.

N. B.—By Statute of Lower Canada, passed in 1834, (4 Wm. IV, c. 32,) Members of the House of Assembly accepting any office of profit from the Crown, vacated their seats, but could be reelected. The provisions of this Statute were, by Act 6 V. c. 2, passed in 1842, extended to Upper Canada, where only the acceptance of certain offices, specified in the Statute of Upper Canada, 7 Wm. IV, c. 114, passed in 1837, caused the vacancy of the seat of a member.

By another Statute of Lower Canada, passed in 1831, (1 Wm. IV, c. 42,) Members of the House of Assembly were allowed to vacate their seats, retaining them, however, until their successors were elected. The provisions of the last mentioned Statute were extended to Upper Canada, by Act of 1841, (4 & 5 V. c. 4.) The said Statutes 4 & 5 V. c. 4.—6 V. c. 2, and others relating to the same subject, were amended by the Acts 7 V. c. 65—18 V. c. 86—and 20 V. c. 22. which latter Act was still in force on the 1st January 1860.
