

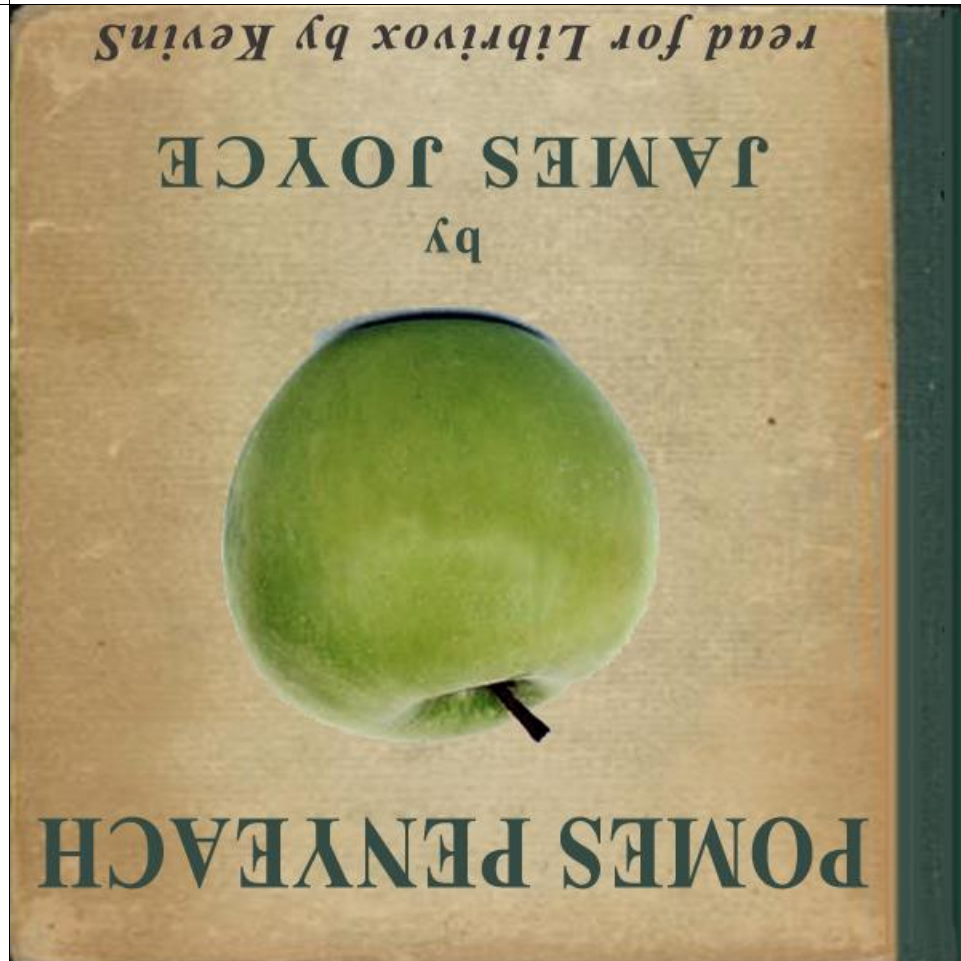
Origami CD Case
