And finally, I wonder how the cost of this project is justified on almost worthless land. . . . If this is for the benefit of the Indians, perhaps there would be less uncertainty and more economy in distributing the taxpayers' dollars directly over the reservation. . . .

To answer Mr. Johnston's questions, PSM called upon Clifton Abbott, from whom it procured the original story. Here is Mr. Abbott's reply:

Sir:
As Popular Scierice Monthly said, the grass shown was a "test plot" and was not the result of pellet planting. . . . Test plots are relatively small, never more than a few square feet. They are hand-sown. . . .

The purpose of the pellet material is twofold: to give the seeds sufficient weight to drop directly to the earth without scattering, and to surround them with earth, fertilizer, insecticide and rodenticide so that 99 percent germination will be assured.

Since this eliminates the necessity of burying the seeds, the use of "penetration" is probably an unhappy word choice.

As for the land's worthlessness, it is poor only because it does not grow enough grass to support livestock. In the winter, Army planes have had to drop taxpayers' money over Indian reservations in the form of food and blankets to lessen cold and hunger. Had the land been capable of supporting sheep and cattle, this expense would not have been necessary.

In past years billions of dollars have been spent on dams in Arizona and the South-

AGLASS-TOPPED wrought-iron table in either of the two designs shown here will quickly make a place for itself in the household. Impervious to weather in a terrace, porch, or garden spot, it's equally at home indoors as a serving table, a plant stand, or simply a side table. When not needed, it can be disassembled by removing two bolts and compactly stowed away.

Dimensions on the drawing are for a $24^{\prime \prime}$ by $32^{\prime \prime}$ glass top, but the length can be altered to suit. Whatever size you decide on, get the plate-glass top before starting work. Unless you are familiar with glass work, it's best to buy it cut to size with the edges polished. Legs should be not smaller than $5_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ square mild steel. You'll also need some flat bar stock for rails and stretchers. Aluminum might be used instead if available.

In making the cross-leg design, it's well to lay out a full-sized plan on paper and mark the half-lap joints from this. Cut the legs to length, lay them on the plan, and transfer the lines of the joint, which can be worked out with hacksaw and file. It should be a good push fit, without looseness. Drill through for the stretcher bolt.

If you prefer the half-round legs, lay out a full-size pattern of the curve and check the work against it frequently while bending it to shape. Form feet on the lower sections by heating red hot and upsetting the metal with a hammer to the form shown in the drawings. Join the two halves of each leg by welding, brazing, or bolting as shown in the drawing. In the latter case, fillets may be formed and gaps filled with iron furnace cement.

Both upper ends of either type of leg are

drilled and tapped. Cross rails are fastened with bolts and notched half their width from the top edge to form half-lap joints with the top stretchers. Notch the latter accurately so that the joint beneath the glass is flush. Bent-up tips on both members, formed as shown below, hold the top from sliding off.

The lower stretcher is drilled and tapped at both ends. If means are available, it can be twisted as in the photo above.


Tip up rail and stretcher ends by hammering to form lips that will keep the top from sliding.



Two bolts hold the top rail. The stretcher is secured with a bolt through the half-lap joint.


Notch top rails and stretchers accurately to form a flush joint for the glass to rest upon.


## Copper Drerlay on Clear Plastic Malkes Modern Hool Ends

GLEAMING copper and clear plastic are combined in this distinctive pair of book ends. The contrasting materials and simple design make them an appropriate accessory for use with modern furniture. Two $5^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ pieces of $38_{8}^{\prime \prime}$ clear plastic, two $6^{\prime \prime}$ by $10^{\prime \prime}$ pieces of 16 -gauge sheet copper, and six $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ tubular copper rivets are the required materials.

After cutting, smooth all the edges of the copper and plastic with a file. There will be less chance of marring the plastic if the


Cut the copper to shape on a jigsaw, or if this is not available, a jeweler's saw may be used.
filing is done before removal of the masking paper. If available, a bending brake would be a convenience in bending the copper, but it can easily be done without. Polish the copper, and drill holes in the plastic and copper for the rivets that hold the pieces together.-Doris Aller.


Tubular conmer rivets are used to attach the copper overlay to the piece of $3_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ clear plastic.


Chucked on the table, lathe work can be drilled with holes accurately parallel to the turning axis.

## Lathe Chuck Doubles as Drill Vise

WITH this adapter your lathe chucks and faceplates can be used on the drillpress table, often without disturbing the way the work is chucked or clamped. Lathe work can be transferred to the press with assurance that all drilled holes will be parallel to each other and to the axis of turning, and at exactly 90 deg. to the face. Any desired drilling location can be selected by a combination of table swing and rotation of the chuck or faceplate.

For accurate results the center hole of the table must be bored round and free of taper.


This boring setup enlarges the center hole of the drill-press table. Note the lower bearing.

The setup shown above does this nicely. I used $11 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ bar turned down to $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ at one end for the drill-press chuck, and crossdrilled twice for a $1 \frac{1114}{1 / 1}$ lathe bit and setscrew. A hole in a plate bolted to the base table serves as a lower bearing for the boring bar. I enlarged the center hole to $1^{1 / 8^{\prime \prime}}$, taking a series of light cuts at low speed.

The adapter parts are straightforward machining jobs. Check the dimensions against your drill-press table, and thread the spindle nose to fit your chucks and faceplates. Turn the spindle nose so that it will make a free push fit in the bored-out table hole. Be sure there's at least $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ between the spindle end and locking plate.

Chips can be kept out of a chuck by placing a pap.r "apron" on the work and drilling through it. On through holes, damage to the chuck or faceplate may be prevented by the use of a pad of scrap metal under the work.-John A. Bates.

These three parts are all you need to mount lathe chucks or faceplates on the drill press.



No critical dimensions are involved, and ordinary cold-rolled steel will do as material.


Vise for End Milling. I tried counterboring a hole in a boring bar by holding it on the drill press in V-blocks, but the bit caught on a transverse hole tapped for a setscrew and would not stay true. Finally I gripped the bar in the four-jaw chuck on the lathe tailstock and fed it against an end mill, with good results.-H. L. Phillips.


Shield Illuminates Fine Work. If you have a grinder with an illuminated safety shield, you'll find this ideal for delicate work such as assembly, fine hand grinding, and carving, for it gives needed light and protects the eyes. The one above, mounted on a heavy base, is detachable for replacement on the grinder.-J. P. Arnold.


Drill Used as Floating IReamer. Reaming an undersized hole to finish size with a drill is often disappointing. If the drill is rigidly mounted, a slight bend or misalignment will create a bell-mouthed or tapered hole. However, steel sleeves have been drilled with true holes up to $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ in
diameter by a routine method as follows:
The hole is spotted with a stubby drill reground as shown or with a centerdrill (Fig. 1). It is drilled $1 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ small as in Fig. 2. The reaming drill is mounted in a taper-shank chuck held as in Fig. 3. Floating action permits it to center itself perfectly.


## Scriber Has Mike Adjustment.

An inexpensive micrometer with the frame cut off forms the heart of this scriber and depth gauge. The spindle was annealed, both ends centerdrilled in the lathe steady rest, and the barrel mounted between centers. With a sharp tool and very light cuts it was turned true along s. s" of its length.

The head was rough-turned, drilled $1 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ undersize, knurled, and then reversed in the

## Tailstock Wipers Clean Ways.

 Chips trapped under the tailstock when it's loosened and reclamped may throw it out of alignment or embed themselves in the ways. It's a simple matter to equip the tailstock with wipers like those used on carriages. A band of $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ by $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ stock is shaped to the casting and drilled near each end. Spot the band about $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ above the ways, transfer the holes, and tap $6-32$. Attach the piece with two screws and a strip of felt low enough to ride on the ways. Soak the felt with oil.-Richard Hanscom.

Soft Jaws Stay Put. Slip-on vise jaws used to prevent marring are awkward and always seem to drop off when your hands are busy. Pins set in them end the \% trouble. Spot a hole in each at the same position, clamp both in the vise, and drill the holes through into the vise jaws. Secure the pins in the loose jaws by screwing, riveting, or soldering them.-John A. Blaker.

chuck to finish-turn the face and bore the hole a light press fit for the barrel. This was pressed in and a hole tapped for a setscrew and a hardwood plug that lock the spindle. The spindle was lapped flush with the face at the $1.000^{\prime \prime}$ reading, tapped, and fitted with a spring-steel scriber. Settings are the difference between $1.000^{\prime \prime}$ and the reading. For depth measurements, add the scriber and screw thickness.-Paul T. Clementi.


Sleeve Adjusts Horing Taol. Many boring-bar holders have no height adjustment. The split eccentric sleeve shown gives a good range, a twist raising or lowering the bar while keeping it perfectly level. Turn the sleeve outside, knurl the collar for a finger grip, and chuck it off center in the four-jaw to drill and ream the offset hole. Mill or saw the slot.

## Springy Calipers Give

## By Herbert Pfister

PICK up these spring calipers and you've got a reading before you can say, "What size?" The geared pointer indicates on a magnified scale, making it easier to read small fractions. It's a fascinating job to turn out this toolbox gadget.

You can save time by getting some $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime \prime}$ graph paper instead of drawing the $1_{4}^{1 / \prime \prime}$ squares. On this, trace the patterns for pieces $A, B$, and $C$ by following them from square to corresponding square. Cut out and paste the patterns on $3 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ brass to minimize waste. A metal-cutting bandsaw
or jigsaw will make shoit work of cutang, but if you are patient the work can be done with a stout metal-cutting blade in a jeweler's or a coping saw. Cut the pointer $E$ from $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ brass.

Do all filing, drilling, and tapping on these parts first. Secure leg $B$ to piece $C$ with two 2-56 screws. Place a $3^{\prime \prime}$ gear that has a ${ }^{1 / 1 \prime \prime}$ hole (or is bushed to that size) on ${ }_{4}^{1 / 4 \prime}$ rod set in the hole in piece C. Drill through this and the gear for two rivets. Cut out a $1^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ gear segment with the holes and rivet it on with escutcheon pins.

A detail at the top of the drawing shows how the pointer $E$ is riveted to the hub of


Turned studs $D$ and $\boldsymbol{G}$, which serve as pivots, thread into $\boldsymbol{A}$ and are locked with nuts beneath.

## Quick Measurements

a $5_{8 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime}$ gear. The slotted end of the clock spring is secured with a short $2-56$ screw for which the hub is tapped. The other end hooks around a $2-56$ screw in part $A$, spacer $F$ raising it to the gear hub.

Drill and tap the jaws of both caliper legs to receive two shouldered bits of $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ drill rod threaded 2-56. Turn these up tight and solder; then file them flush all around with the jaws. Fasten two pieces of hardwood to the handle end of $A$ with flush rivets and shape them to it. Polish the brass with fine steel wool and shellac the handle.

Mount the movable leg on the turned stud $G$ and lock with a nut beneath. Put
the small gear with its spring and pointer on stud $D$, meshing with the segment so that the jaw tips touch before the pointer contacts collar $F$. Hook the spring on with just enough tension to bring the tips together decisively. Edge-on views on page 194 show assembly.

You can calibrate the scale by placing pieces of drill rod or other accurately sized stock between the jaws and scribing deeply right along the bevel of the pointer. Use a scale to divide the intervals so obtained into thirty-seconds. Another method is to hold slide calipers locked at steps of $1 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ between the jaw tips to scribe the scale.

Magnet Aids Welder. A magnetic dispenser for use with arc-welding starter powder is made by the Electrical Engineering Company, of Indianapolis. It consists of a weighted base enclosing an alnico magnet, with a conical depression in the top. Placed in the depression, the powaer becomes magnetically charged. When a welding rod is dipped in it, enough powder attaches itself to the tip of the electrode to start an arc. The powder (PSM, April '47, p. 197) helps strike arcs at low amperages.


Sander Is Versatile. A pivoted framework that locks in any position from vertical to horizontal adapts a belt sander made by Grover Products, of Los Angeles, to a variety of jobs. Tension of the standard $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $42^{\prime \prime}$ belt is easily adjusted with a wingnut. Ball bearings provide smooth operation. The sander sells for about $\$ 19$.


Vise Grips Ddd Shapes. In addition to clamping work in the usual way, a bench vise offered by Benjamin Uydess \& Sons, Inc., of New York, includes removable steel fingers that make it possible to grip disks, balls, hemispheres, and irregular shapes of almost any kind in convenient working position. Priced at approximately $\$ 15$, the vise also comes with a ring-arbor attachment that slips over one of the steel fingers. Tubular work is clamped then between the arbor and a second steel finger.


Attachment Turns Metal. With this new attachment, a drill press, wood lathe, grinder, or even a polishing head may be used to turn or cut bar-stock steel, bronze, or aluminum. Priced at about $\$ 12$, it consists of an L-shaped unit with a built-in micrometer feed and locking screw, two guide bushings $8_{8 \prime \prime}^{3 \prime \prime}$ and $1 / 4 \prime \prime$ in diameter, and one bit each for steel, bronze, and aluminum. For wood lathes and grinders, the manufacturer, the Millholland Screw Products Corporation, of Indianapolis, also offers a faceplate chuck for an additional $\$ 4.50$. The bits are self-positioning when they are locked in the micrometer tool slide.

Jeeps Still Have Glamor. For their young owners, there's plenty of excitement left in these pedal-powered composites of the two plans offered PSM readers in Dec. '45. Above, a version of "Bizerte Gertie," made by G. E. Nicholls, of Wanganui, New Zealand, who had to use such Australasian wood as jarrah and rimu. Vernon Jahr, Bemidji, Minn., combined some of Gertie's features with those of the wooden jeep, and his wagon is shown at the upper right. For his first handicraft project, E. Kirchener, of Cleveland, built the mode] at right.


Bell Ringer Plays Music. When William DeWolf, of San Francisco, built his bell-ringer tower (PSM, Dec. '45) he put two phonograph motors to good use. Instead of the ringing mechanism originally described, he uses one motor with an offcenter pivot to pull the bell cord. The second motor plays Christmas recordings into the bell tower. Another adaptation consists of a cross studded with flashlight bulbs.


It's Good Enough for Two. At least that's what John Serina, New York, thought when he completed one of the three-way PSM portables pictured above, so he built a second one as a gift for one of the set's many admirers. The cases are entirely of Mr. Serina's design, being different in most respects from the original two-part cabinet described. ## Fuel Dil Pumped from Cellar to Upstairs Dutlet



This pump unit was rigged up to eliminate the necessity of lugging oil from the cellar every time a kitchen-range tank needed filling. A switch upstairs near the oil outlet turns on the motor.

The pump was obtained from an old furnace oil burner and the $1 / 4-\mathrm{hp}$. motor from a washing machine. By mounting the motor on a hinged base, its own weight was utilized to help keep the V-belt tight. A coil spring under the raised end of the mount takes excess strain off the belt.

## Heater Made More Efficient

If your pot stove is the type that has a water jacket only around the dome, its efficiency can be virtually doubled by winding a continuous length of copper tubing around the firepot and connecting the coil into the household hot water system.

Tubing from ${\underset{8}{\prime \prime}}_{3^{\prime \prime}}$ to $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ can be used. You will need from $20^{\prime}$ to $35^{\prime}$, depending on the stove size and the number of turns you want. Pipe-thread adaptors will provide the connections to the hot and cold water pipes. You will also need two sweat-fitted elbows. In making the connections, remember that the bottom of the coil should connect to the cold return and the upper to the hot-water lead. Fasten wire screening over the coil and on this trowel a ${ }_{12 \prime \prime}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ layer of asbestos cement as insulation to conserve heat.-John Mracek.

## Iens Thues Shoot 'Mill lig

## Bigger-than-life blow-ups are a cinch with these homemade lens tubes.

 They'll work on almost any camera.
## By Charles Smith

PICTURES that show small objects bigger than life size can be taken with almost any camera, provided it has a removable lens. The trick, of course, is to use a lens extension tube. Don't fret if you do not have facilities to machine metal tubes; cardboard tubes do nicely if fitted with care.
Take the lens out of your camera (if you have a between-the-lens shutter, remove the whole unit), and fit a short tube in the hole in the lens mount. If you can't locate a tube of the right diameter, build up one that's a loose fit, using strips of glued paper. It's well to make several tubes of different lengths at the same time-ones $1^{\prime \prime}, 2^{\prime \prime}$, and $3^{\prime \prime}$ long will do as a starter. The lens should be fitted to the outer ends of the tubes, again using glued paper rings if necessary. Coat the inside of each tube with flat black paint, and be sure the tube screws squarely into the camera and the lens screws squarely into the tube.
If your camera has a ground glass, you're now set to try a few shots. If not, the pro-

per focus for each tube must be determined first. Remove the back of the camera and tape a piece of ground glass or tracing paper in the plane the film occupies. With the shutter open, move an object back and forth in front of the lens until you find the sharpest focus. A piece of graph paper is handy for the purpose since it also shows the exact area that can be photographed with a particular tube. Block off on the paper the field that each tube covers. This provides a ready guide as to which tube must be used to cover any object photographed.

After the test object has been brought into sharp focus on the temporary ground glass with the lens wide open, carefully measure the distance from the lens to the object. Make a notation of this, along with the size of the area covered.

Because the distance from the lens to film has been increased, it will also be necessary to compute-and keep a record of-an exposure factor for each tube. This factor may be determined by measuring the distance from the lens to film, squaring this distance, and dividing by the square of the focal length of the lens. This yields the number of times you must multiply the exposure that would be normal for any given lighting condition without the tube.

If at all possible, use a tripod to support

the camera, and if the tube tends to sag, install a prop to keep it at right angles to the camera. Exposures should be made with a cable release, for any vibration will spoil the picture. If you have no cable release, shut off the room lights, open the shutter, and use the light switch for exposures.

Any illumination may be used, but I find a gooseneck lamp very convenient. For contrasty spotlighting, I also sometimes use a slide projector. Masks for spotlighting small objects may be made by placing coins or other objects on a sheet of process film and then flashing with light. After being developed, the film can be cut and fitted in the projector as you would a slide.

Rather than disturb the camera after it has been set up, you may find it more convenient to focus by moving your object toward and away from the lens. For this, a machinist's surface gauge may be adapted
to provide a handy stage on which to pose the object to be photographed. Stick a small block of wood on one of the prongs and glue a square of cardboard to the wood. This little stage may then be tilted to any angle, raised, lowered, and the entire unit may be moved to bring the object into focus.

Exposures are no problem if you use a meter and take into consideration the exposure factor determined for the tube. If you do not have a meter, a few tests will indicate the proper exposure for any particular condition. In any case, it is advisable to go down to the smallest possible stop on your diaphragm because in this work the depth of focus is very slight.

Occasionally you may get bright streaks across photographs of shiny objects. These may be avoided by adjusting your illumination so that light is not reflected directly into the lens.

## Gas-Mask Holder Makes a Convenient Gadget Bag

Light in weight and water-resistant, a gas-mask holder may be easily converted into a bag for carrying a small camera and accessories. Its size makes it particularly suitable for a $2 \frac{1 / 41}{\prime \prime \prime}$ by $3^{1 / 4}$ " Speed Graphic.

In this case, a pocket of waterproof canvas was made to fit the camera snugly. This was then sewn into the bag with $3_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ sponge rubber as lining on four sides and the bottom, protecting the camera from dampness and from bumps or falls. A second pocket was installed to keep six film holders in an upright position, and a third accommodates filters, a lens hood, and other small accessories.

Overlapping flaps secured by snaps protect the contents. A shoulder strap makes the bag easy to carry.-John Trimble.

## Dive for Yonr Photos

SNAPSHOTS under water are easy, inexpensive, and fun. This outfit was built on a South Pacific island and used among the coral reefs in those wonderfully clear waters. You can borrow the idea for future use at your favorite swimming hole.

The equipment consists of a sturdy, watertight box of $3 / 4$ " outdoor plywood holding an inexpensive fixed-focus camera with synchronized flash. Melted tar was used on the joints and around the clear-plastic windows,

and the lid was fitted with a gasket cut from an old inner tube and bedded in tar. The shutter was tripped by pressing a plunger through a loose rubber diaphragm. Bar solder was attached to the bottom to neutralize almost all buoyancy. A partition in the box eliminates internal reflections.

Test the box thoroughly for watertightness, and then, armed with diving goggles, you'll be ready for a new kind of photog-raphy.-Charles E. Dunning.

## Synchronizer Easily Checked.

 An instrument made by Hall-Barkan Instruments, Inc., of Tuckahoe, N. Y., guides adjustment of solenoid synchronizers. The primary mechanism is an up-and-down slide containing a slit that moves in front of a lighted screen of equal width bands of red, yellow, and blue. If the operator, looking through the instrument toward a lamp behind the open back of the camera, sees all bands in full width when the shutter is tripped, there is perfect synchronization. If the top band is partly cut off, the shutter is late. If the bottom one is partly cut off, the shutter is early.In use, the instrument is attached to the lens mount, the lens is set at infinity, the cocked shutter is set at the speed for which adjustment is desired, the synchronizer is connected to the battery and the instrument to the remote control outlet, and a cocking lever on the instrument is raised.


Head Tilts to 90 Deg. Locked by turning a setscrew against a $12^{\prime \prime}$ sliding rod, this tripod head tilts on a $3^{\prime \prime}$ butt hinge that is mounted to leave $1^{\prime \prime}$ space between the two $3 / 3^{\prime \prime}$ by $3 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ wood members.

Slots $1^{\prime \prime}$ deep are centered in one end of the top and base for collars made from $3_{4}^{3 / \prime}$ lengths of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ brass rod, and $\frac{1 / \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ holes are drilled edgewise across each piece for ${ }^{1 / 4 \prime \prime}$ stove bolts on which the collars pivot.

Drilled lengthwise, the collars are tapped for the stove bolts. One is drilled and tapped half through for the threaded end of the slide rod. The other is drilled so the rod may slide, then turned 90 deg., and drilled and tapped for the setscrew.

After $1 /{ }^{1 / \prime \prime}$ holes are drilled, $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ nuts are hammered flush against the inner face of the top and base for $1^{\prime \prime}$ wing bolts to attach the head and camera.-Sam C. Donaldson.


Wallet Holds Filters. The plastic compartments of this wallet were designed to permit quick removal or insertion of filters without getting finger marks on them. Made of leather, it was introduced by Peerless Camera Stores, Inc., of New York, as part of a movie filter kit. The kit also includes a combination lens shade and holder.

Balance Pans Improvised. Even with good care, balance pans supplied with photographic scales often become pitted. As indicated in the photo at right, you probably have several good substitutes at hand. Two plastic saucers, filed until their weights are identical, are one possibility. Waxed cups are another.-David H. Thompson.


Timer Snaps You Too. If your camera is not equipped with one of the de-layed-action devices that enables you to get into the picture, the situation may be remedied with one of the flight timers sold at model-airplane stores. Form a loop in one end of a piece of stiff wire and hook it over the shutter-release lever. Loop the other end around the plunger of the timer so that it will trip the shutter.-F. G. Kxight.


Container Protects Brush. Mounted in an old lipstick case, this lens brush is always protected from dust. The outfit may be made by cutting the handle from a No. 10 or 12 camel's-hair brush, cleaning out the case, and attaching the brush with liquid solder. Let it harden well before using.-Eric Karminski, Jr.


Blower Dries Roll Film. A small blower, a 75 -watt lamp, two cans, and a few scraps of tin are used in this dryer. Located in the taller can, the lamp is wired in series with the 24 -volt blower, thus both dropping the voltage and supplying some heat. An opening cut in the side of the film can admits warm air through a connecting tunnel, and an opposite hole discharges it. The can top is used.-R. B. Goodell.

## PART THREE

SINCE all the essential information needed for building three types of multimeter was given in the two previous issues, you probably have your tester pretty well under construction. The two smaller units illustrated last month present no special problems. Most of this discussion, therefore, concerns the featured instrument.
It was stated that the range of a series ohmmeter cannot readily be lowered
enough to measure very small resistances. To do that a shunt ohmmeter was recommended. The principle of the shunt ohmmeter will be recognized as the same one used to determine the internal resistance of a meter with the aid of a known value of shunting resistor (Oct., p. 204). If we use a 0 to 1 -ma. meter with internal resistance of 105 ohms, and shunt it with an equal resistor while energizing the circuit, a halfscale reading of 105 ohms results. Unlike series-ohms readings, infinite resistance is at full scale and zero is at zero on the dial.
A reading of 105 ohms center scale (higher if a fuse is used in the circuit) is not, however, sufficiently lower than the 450 ohm range to be of great value. In our
circuit, therefore, the meter and fuse are shunted to read 10 ma . in order to provide a center-scale reading of 11.4 ohms. Switch positions are the same as for the lowest series-ohms range, but a test lead is used to short the DC and OHMS terminals. The unknown resistor is then inserted between this jumper and MA-DC. Since accuracy is dependent primarily upon current value, rheostat R16 is turned to "off" position, and current is regulated to full scale-precisely 10 ma.-by R17. This is being done by the screwdriver adjustment illustrated at the upper right.

The resistor under test then shunts the whole circuit, and its value may be calculated from formula 8 (Oct., p. 204). It must be remembered that this formula is only an approximation, and its accuracy decreases as the circuit current is raised. The graph at the right was plotted by calculating a number of points from a more exact formula, and it should hold reasonably well for any meter constructed with the same values as the one shown.

If the graph should prove inaccurate for your meter, you can plot another one with the help of a few feet of resistance or finecopper wire. Measure a dozen or so lengths of wire and calculate the resistance of each from the ohms-per-foot rating of the wire. Then check the wire on the meter and plot scale deflection against known ohmic value. Shunt ohms are represented by the numbers in the left hand margin of the graph; a companion curve for a series ohmmeter crosses it from upper left to lower right and is read against the figures in the right-hand column. The chart is drawn on logarithmically scaled paper, available at most stationers.

As has been pointed out, the reason that ohmmeters are peaked at center scale is that all ranges cover the area from zero to infinity, and therefore both ends of the scale are bound to be inaccurate. The problem of measuring low resistances may be met by the shunt ohmmeter. But what about very high ohmic values? Of what use is a meter that reads, say, 90,000 ohms when you want to measure a resistance of several megohms? The answer seems to be that you can't make these measurements, but in fact the problem is easily solved. All you need is a voltmeter and a source of high voltage, such as the power-supply circuit of an AC receiver.

Measure this voltage-preferably several hundred volts-and then make a second

reading with the unsiown resistor in series with the meter. The unknown value may then be calculated from formula 9, below.

Your AC voltmeter may also be used to measure capacitance, inductance, and impedance with sufficient accuracy for most purposes. An AC power line will serve very well, provided that you take adequate precautions to prevent electrocution. First measure the line voltage; then take a second reading with the unknown element in series with the voltmeter.

Capacitance of condensers is figured from formula 10. Again it may be wise-if any considerable number of readings is to be made-to draw a logarithmic graph in which the voltage readings of your meter are plotted against capacitance. The graph will be useful wherever the same meter is used on the same line voltage. Use a dozen or so accurately known condensers to plot this graph. Capacitance measurements may be multiplied by ten or a hundred if the voltmeter leads are shunted by suitable resistors to reduce the effective voltmeter resistance ( Rv in the formula) to a tenth or a hundredth of its normal value. Alternatively the high ranges may be obtained by using a stepdown transformer (and a lower voltmeter range) to reduce the values of Em and El.

Inductance is calculated approximately from formula 11. A graph of inductance values against meter readings would be accurate only for high " $Q$ " inductances-those
in which DC resistance is small compared to AC inductive reactance.

Impedance is expressed in ohms, and is the tendency of capacitors or inductors to resist the flow of alternating current of any given frequency. When needed, the impedance of a coil or condenser may be obtained with the help of formula 12.

An AC rectifier-type voltmeter makes an excellent output meter for receiver alignment, power-output measurements, measurements of gains or losses of amplifiers, and the like; it may be calibrated in volts or decibels. If any direct current is present in the circuit under test, it should be kept from the meter by a good quality paper condenser of from .5 to 2 mfd . The AC component or "ripple voltage" of power supplies is measured in this manner.

If your meter is built according to all the specifications given in the previous installment, the face of the instrument, including switches and test jacks, will probably resemble that of the larger unit shown on page 204. To read DC milliamperes, then, insert test leads into the DC and MA-DC pin jacks. Note that a narrow pin and adapter is shown in the photos for the latter jack. This is used to lessen the possibility of applying a high voltage to the milliammeter by accident. When making current measurements, always start out with the selector switch indexed to the highest range and back down until an accurate reading can be made. Insertion of a milliammeter into a circuit that

has low resistance and high current will cause a change in the normal current flow. Such measurements should therefore be made on the highest range that will still provide a readable pointer deflection. For greatest accuracy on DC current and voltage ranges, turn R16 to its "off" position in order to keep the $10,000-$ ohm rheostat from shunting the meter.

Voltages are read by inserting the test leads into the DC (or AC) and 1,000 -volt
jacks. The AC-DC switch is also thrown to correspond to the character of the voltage being measured. Index the selector to the appropriate range. When measuring voltages in excess of 1,000 , move the test lead from the 1,000 to the 5,000 -volt jack, and leave the selector on 1,000 . Exercise caution when measuring high voltages. One good practice is to keep one hand in your pocket and perform all necessary manipulations with the other.

WHETHER or not you have built, bought, or borrowed a general-purpose multitester, you will find a place in your electronic tool kit for a midget meter that measures the things you most frequently need to know. If you are a beginner, building it will teach you the principles and uses of multitesters; if you are an experimenter or service man you will find unlimited applications for an auxiliary, pocket-sized instrument both in and out of the shop.

Compact as the meter is, all the components are standard. When buying the resistors or selecting them from your spare-
parts box, you will want to check them for accuracy on a reliable ohmmeter. All resistors are connected in series with the positive side of the midget meter.

The meter itself, a 0 to $1-\mathrm{ma}$. unit with internal resistance of approximately 25 ohms, is of the type developed during the war for use in aircraft equipment. It measures only $1^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter and has a mounting flange $1_{8}^{3 / \prime \prime}$ square. Together with all the auxiliary parts, it is built into a $1^{\prime \prime}$ by $2^{\prime \prime}$ by $3^{\prime \prime}$ wooden box. Near the top of the box panel, drill a hole slightly over $1^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter. Aside from the meter, six phone-

tip jacks and a midget 25,000 -ohm rheostat are mounted on the face. In the edge of the box above the meter place two more jacks for the external battery. This will be in series with the rheostat and a $3,000-\mathrm{ohm}$ fixed resistor.

For both the low and medium-ohms ranges an external battery is required. Use a $4 \frac{1}{2}$-volt supply; three pen-light cells in series are suggested because they will not add very much to the size and weight of the equipment.

The five scales chosen offer a wide variety of uses in radio servicing. The 0 to 10 and 0 to 100 -volt ranges will enable you to check all sizes of A and B batteries, and the 0 to 500 -volt scale will come in handy when you want to know the potential across the plate or screen of most receiver tubes.

Each of the ohms ranges has its own particular advantage. All antenna, RF, and IF coil windings, as well as filter chokes and power transformers, can be tested on the low scale, and this range is also useful as a continuity tester. By touching the two prods to the heater pins on a tube, you can deter-
mine whether the filament is open. If it is, there will be no deflection of the needle. About 80 percent of set failures can be traced to burned-out tubes, and in AC-DC receivers, where tubes are connected in series, it is impossible to tell which is causing the trouble unless the filaments can be checked.

With the medium-ohm meter you can tell whether the high-resistance windings of such parts as high-impedance chokes, output and audio transformers are open or shorted. Higher resistors, such as may be found in plate, screen, or coupling circuits, can't be measured directly, but defects can easily be spotted by checking the voltage reaching the tubes. Both ohms scales can be used to detect shorts in paper-tubular condensers and leakage in electrolytics.

You can read volts directly by multiplying scale markings by 10,100 , or 500 , depending upon range. The ohmmeter is for service checking rather than for accurate measurement. To get approximate values, measure a dozen known resistors and graph pointer positions.-Albert Rowley.

Device Calibrates Voltage. When connected to any oscilloscope, this new Du Mont instrument provides a convenient method for measuring peak-to-peak value of any signal. It generates a square wave which is continuously variable from 0 to 100 volts and which may be directly compared with any signal being viewed.


Add Terminals as Needed. Experimenters can give hand-made equipment a more finished look and make wiring easier by building up terminal blocks from kits produced by the Curtis Development \& Manufacturing Company, Milwaukee. From one to 14 terminals can be assembled in one strip from the parts furnished in the kit.

## Parts Shrink.

 Subminiature tubes are now matched in size by midget capacitors manufactured by Tobe Deutschmann Corporation, Canton, Mass. The paper-dielectric condensers are molded in wafer-shaped phenolic cases to suit the closely stacked assembly of miniature apparatus.

Phono Runs on Spring or AC. One drawback to the production of AC-DCbattery phonograph portables has been the lack of motors that would operate anywhere. Capitol Records, Inc., of Hollywood, combines an AC motor and a spring-drive mechanism with a three-way amplifier to get a truly portable record player.

## How to Silverplate

## By Whiting Evans

PDROJECTS executed in wood, plaster, plastics, or ceramics can be permanently encased in a resplendent metallic sheath that will greatly enhance their beauty.

You'll need a plating tank big enough to handle your work. Calculate tank size by allowing at least $6^{\prime \prime}$ from the object to be plated to the anodes, and at least $1^{\prime \prime}$ from the anodes to the tank sides. But don't go overboard on tank size unless you're prepared to mix up solutions in big quantities. (My P-38 model shown would have required a 30 -gal. tank if I had plated it all at once, but by sawing it in half, I did it in a tank measuring $10^{\prime \prime}$ by $15^{\prime \prime}$ by $20^{\prime \prime}$.) If you wish to build your tank, it can be made of wood lined with either sheet lead or sheet rubber. Perhaps you can pick up a
glass storage-battery tank or a rectangular goldfish aquarium of suitable size. A big crock of glazed earthenware will also do.

As best results in plating are achieved by constant agitation of the electrolyte, it's desirable to feed air through a perforated pipe on the bottom of the tank. Small holes drilled every $3^{\prime \prime}$ or so in a plugged lead pipe will do the job, or rubber tubing weighted down with wire solder could be used. To keep even a drop of oil from the compressor from contaminating the electrolyte, provide an oil trap on the air-input line. This need only be a soup can packed with clean, dry cotton. If you don't have a compressor, any source of low-pressure, low-volume air will do, even a toy steam engine run backward by a small electric motor.

Plating requires a regulated source of low-voltage DC. You may wish to use a

storage battery and rheostat, a battery charger, or a transformer-rectifier unit of the sort used with modern model trains. Perhaps the most flexible rig is the one illustrated, in which a shop motor drives an old auto generator, with a storage battery "floating" across the line to limit voltage. A fairly good voltmeter is a must, and an ammeter handy but not as important. If you don't have a suitable rheostat, use some nichrome wire of the sort supplied as a replacement element for a toaster or electric iron. One lead is connected to the end of the nichrome wire and the other is clipped on as far along as is necessary to get the right resistance.

Be sure that the finish of your project is as perfect as you can make it. Remember that any flaws in the surface will be more conspicuous in the polished metal plating. The plane model shown was carefully lac-

quered, tilled, relacquered, sanded with No. 400 paper, relacquered, rubbed with pumice and oil, and then cleaned with carbon tetrachloride to remove all traces of oil.

Mix about 2 oz . of copper bronzing powder, $1^{1 / 12} \mathrm{oz}$. of clear lacquer, and about 13 oz . of lacquer thinner. Mount several brass rods on the work to support it in the tank, perhaps by drilling holes in places that will be inconspicuous in its finished position. Good electrical contact with the surface may be insured by drilling several tiny holes in inconspicuous spots, placing copper wires in them, and touching up these contacts with a brush dipped in the mixture. Spray the work with an even coat. When it has dried, a finger touched to the surface should show some of the copper powder. If none shows, too much lacquer or not enough thinner was used.

Silverplating is generally preceded by copperplating. Electrolyte for the latter is made by dissolving 27 oz . of copper sulphate crystals in sufficient warm water to make a gallon of solution. Then gradually and carefully add $61 / 2 \mathrm{oz}$. of concentrated sulphuric acid. Increase the quantities proportionately to obtain enough solution to fill your tank. With the tank filled, place two copper or brass rods along the top about $1^{\prime \prime}$ away from the sides. Hang from these rods copper strips having an immersed area at least equal to the area of the surface to be plated. These are the anodes, and should be connected to the positive lead from the eurrent source. Connect the nega-
tive lead to a "buffer" (a small piece of clean copper or brass), suspend it from a wooden bar across the the center of the tank, and open the valve that allows air for agitation to enter. Turn on the current and adjust the rheostat until the voltage is between .75 and 2 volts. Then immerse the work, also connected to the negative lead.

If plating is taking place properly, the lacquered surface will take on a pinkish glow. The buffer sheet can be removed as soon as the object is seen to be plating properly. After 15 min ., remove the work and inspect it carefully. Color should be a light shade of pink. If it is a darkish pink, the plate is "burning"; the burned areas must be removed and the work recoated with the conductive coating. Reduce the voltage and begin again. If the color is right, continue plating until about $1 / 32^{\prime \prime}$ of metal has been deposited. (Thickness can be measured by caliper comparison.)

If during plating little hydrogen bubbles form on the work, wipe them off and increase the amount of air. Should they form unnoticed and leave pockets in the plating, fill the pockets with soft solder, dress the surface smooth, and replate lightly over the solder.

With copperplating complete, the work is carefully smoothed and polished. This may be done by very light filing, buffing with cloth wheels charged with buffing compound, and finally polishing with a clean cloth wheel. Be extremely careful not to go through the thin copper sheath.


Here's the plating circuit. Disconnect the battery when the generator is not being driven.


Agitating the electrolyte with air bubbles is important to getting an even plating deposit.

If this happens, it's possible to solder a piece of thin shim brass over the damage, file it smooth, and replate lightly.

Before silverplating, clean the tank with extreme care to remove all traces of the previous solution, or better yet, use another tank. Silverplating is a two-step process; the work is first immersed in a "strike" solution that firmly bonds the silver to the copper, after which the plating is built up in a different solution. The strike solution consists of 8 oz . of sodium cyanide, $\% / \mathrm{oz}$. of silver cyanide, and 4 oz . of sodium carbonate, plus water to make 1 gal . (Remember that the cyanides are extremely poisonous, and must be handled with great care!) For anodes during striking, use strips of bright steel having a surface area equal to that of the work. The time of immersion of
the work should be no longer than 1 min . at 6 volts. No agitation is needed. The work should now appear a dirty grey lightly tinged with brown.
For the silverplating itself, use a solution made up of 5 oz . of sodium cyanide, 3.2 oz . of silver cyanide, and 6 oz . of sodium carbonate, plus water to make 1 gal . Anodes should be of pure silver, again with surface area equal to that of the work. It's important to keep the voltage down to from .5 to 1 volt. Inspect the work periodically; it should be white with only a slight tinge of grey. If the color is darker, the voltage is too high and the plate may not adhere. If small nodules of silver form on the work, the voltage is too high or the anodes too close. Agitation with air is not essential but helps greatly in securing an even plate. END

## Simple Setup Copperplates Haby's Shoes



A dry-cell current supply with a lamp to limit current are all that's needed for this rig.

Copperplating a pair of baby shoes will not only please a mother for whom they have sentimental value, but will also afford an easy introduction to electroplating.

Mix plaster of Paris and water to a thick paste and fill the shoe to about $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the top. When it has set, apply two coats of waterproof varnish and allow to dry. Obtain a supply of powdered graphite of the sort used to lubricate locks and rub it thoroughly into the leather until the entire shoe is covered with a shiny coat of graphite.

In a fish bowl or other wide-mouth con-
tainer dissolve 27 oz . of copper sulphate in 1 gal. of water, and then carefully add $6 \frac{1}{2}$ oz. of sulphuric acid. Connect three dry cells in series and run one lead through a 200-watt incandescent lamp to limit current flow. Connect the negative wire to some inconspicuous spot on the shoe and the positive lead to a fair-sized sheet of clean copper. During plating turn the shoe frequently, or else suspend it in the center of the jar surrounded by several copper anodes. Wash off the electrolyte, polish the shoe, and coat with clear lacquer.-H. L. Keyton.

## Chemistry Spins a Yitrli

Hy Kenneth M. Swezey

TRANSFORMATION of tree fibers or cotton linters into rayon fabrics is one of the greatest achievements of modern industrial chemistry. Chemically, rayon is almost pure cellulose, the same as cotton and linen. But instead of using cellulose as found in nature, the rayon chemist starts with cheap and plentiful spruce and hemlock trees, or the fuzz that clings to cotton seed after it has been ginned. He chops these up, dissolves them, and then causes the cellulose to reappear in silky filaments that may be spun, twisted, knit, or woven into forms that compete successfully with cotton, silk, linen, or wool.

Although the rayon industry is less than


How rayon is made by the cuprammonium process may be shown at home. Add a sodium hydroxide solution to one of copper sulphate.

60 years old, and modern rayons less than 15 , the idea that man might imitate the silkworm dates back to the 17 th Century. In 1664, Robert Hooks, an English scientist, wrote that natural silk is merely a "glutinous excrement" from the body of a worm, and he wondered why men couldn't do as well by squeezing a suitable gum through tiny holes.

Count Hilaire de Chardonnet was the first to accomplish this on a commercial basis. One day while he was coating some photographic plates with collodion, the bottle slipped and broke on the table. When he tried to clean up the mess some time later, the partly dried collodion stretched into long threads. With this as a beginning, Chardonnet worked 30 years to perfect a

synthetic yarn. His "Chardonnet silk" was the hit of the Paris Exposition in 1889.

Other methods of taking cellulose apart and putting it together again as textile fibers were soon perfected. Early types were called artificial silk. In 1924, the name "rayon" was adopted for all textiles made artificially from cellulose.

Most rayon is now made by the viscose process. Acetate rayon comes next, while cuprammonium, a superior rayon for certain special uses, is in third place. Although complex machinery and precise technical control are required to produce usable rayon yarn, you can readily demonstrate how cellulose in one form can be broken down and then "regenerated" in a form entirely different. The cuprammonium process has been chosen as the one most easily paralleled at home.

First, make some copper hydroxide by dissolving 5 grams of copper sulphate crystals in 100 ml . water and adding slowly a 10 percent solution of sodium hydroxide


Called Schweitzer's reagent, this deep-blue solution dissolves cellulose. Dissolve enough filter paper to produce a syrupy solution.
until the pale blue precipitate stops forming. Wash this precipitate by decantationmixing with water in a tall glass, allowing to settle, pouring off the clear upper liquid, mixing with more water, and repeating the process five or six times.

Filter the precipitate and dissolve the gelatinous solid in the smallest possible amount of 28 percent ammonium hydroxide. With the ammonium hydroxide, the copper hydroxide forms a complex deep-blue compound. The resulting solution (called Schweitzer's reagent from the German chemist who discovered it) dissolves paper, cotton, wood, and other forms of cellulose.

Commercially, cuprammonium rayon is made from cotton linters. If you wish, you may use absorbent cotton, but filter paper -a pure form of cellulose-will dissolve much faster. Tear up a 15 cm . sheet and put it into the blue solution. Stir occasionally until it has completely dissolved. This may take several hours.

In commercial practice, the solution is


Rayon thread forms when dissolved cellulose flows down through a small opening from the upper tank into a dilute sulphuric acid bath.


Acetate rayon also may be made at home. Mix acetic acid, acetic anhydride, and a few drops of sulphuric acid. Dissolve some filter paper.
now filtered and air bubbles removed. Then it is pumped to the spinnerets-disks with tiny holes through which the solution is forced. The spinnerets are located at the upper end of a cylinder through which water is flowing downward. This water starts to coagulate the threads and stretches them. The filaments are completely coagulated in dilute sulphuric acid.

In your home setup, the spinneret can be a glass tube drawn to a $1-\mathrm{mm}$. opening at one end and fitted into a stopper that is inserted, in turn, into the lower end of a tube about $1^{\prime \prime}$ in diameter and $6^{\prime \prime}$ long. The large tube serves as a tank from which the solution can be gravity-fed to the coagulating bath, a 5 percent solution of sulphuric acid in a large cylinder.

Before lowering the outlet tube beneath the surface of the coagulating bath, half fill the tank with the cellulose solution. Be


Pour the solution slowly into a large beaker of water. This will precipitate the cellulose acetate. Remove from the water by filtering.
sure the solution is free from undissolved cellulose as this would clog the opening. As a further precaution, run a fine copper wire down through the opening. By manipulating the wire, you can clear the opening if it becomes clogged.

To complete the experiment, lower the filled spinneret until the delivery tube is several inches below the surface of the bath. If the solution doesn't flow, give it a few prods with the wire. At first, the issuing thread may tend to rise, but gradually it will sink. Commercial cuprammonium filaments are much finer, of course, and are stretched during the spinning to give them greater strength. The final treatment consists of washing, drying, and twisting into yarn or thread.

Viscose rayon usually is made from cellulose derived from wood pulp. After being steeped in sodium hydroxide solution, this


Dry the compound thoroughly by blowing warm air over it. Then dissolve the dry compound in the smallest possible volume of acetone.
pu'p is squeezed almost dry and allowed to age for several days. Treated with carbon disulphide, the alkali cellulose changes to cellulose xanthate. Dissolved in sodium hydroxide solution, this forms a viscous am-ber-colored solution that is forced through spinnerets in much the same way as cuprammonium solution.

Unlike cuprammonium or viscose rayon, acetate rayon is not merely cellulose that has been taken apart and put together again. Instead, it is a real compound of cellulose-cellulose acetate, the material of which most photographic film is made. All you must do to make filaments of this substance is to dissolve it in acetone, or other suitable solvent, squirt it through little holes, and finally pass it through warm air. The heated air rapidly evaporates the solvent, leaving a solid thread.

You can make cellulose acetate by dis-

solving 1 gram of filter paper in a mixture of 40 ml . of glacial acetic acid and 12 ml . of acetic anhydride, with 6 drops of concentrated sulphuric acid added as a catalyst. Complete solution will take at least eight hours. Stir it occasionally.

When the paper has been fully dissolved, you can recover the cellulose acetate by pouring the solution in a thin stream into a large volume of water, stirring constantly. Then separate the compound by filtering it, press out the excess water by squeezing the compound between filter papers, and dryeither in the open air or by directing upon it the warm blast from an electric drier.

When dry, dissolve in the smallest possible amount of acetone. Place the resulting solution in the "tank" used in the previous experiment. This time the solution just flows into the air where heat from the drier solidifies it.


## Homemade Shop Stove Burns Crankease Drainings

This efficient oil stove, which uses old crankcase drainings as fuel, has for several .winters provided cheap heating of a goodsized repair shop. Compressed air from the shop air line "atomizes" the fuel and gives a steady, hot flame.

A $55-\mathrm{gal}$. drum, fitted with a door and a stovepipe chimney, serves as the body of the stove. The bottom is covered inside with firebrick, and a ring of bricks elevates the drum from the floor. The air nozzle consists of a short length of $\frac{11 / 2}{4 \prime \prime}$ pipe welded


## Lab Still Uses Ddds and Ends

In a few minutes you can put together the little distilling setup shown above, which is entirely satisfactory for many home-lab purposes. The wet cloth wrapped around the long tube will provide almost as much cooling as tap water circulating in a water jacket. Be sure to use a guard to keep the drip from the condensate. Don't apply heat too fast or unevaporated solution may bubble into the line. A few short pieces of glass tubing in the first test tube will keep big bubbles from forming. You'll find that an ordinary medicine dropper will provide a handy and controllable way of supplying water to the cloth.-John L. Story.
to the drum. Inside it and protruding $1 / 4 / 1$ farther is the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ fuel-supply pipe. ## llur llatal inld  lialld Oller

THAT all energy is somehow related is very evident in the behavior of heat and electricity. The toaster and electric iron convert kilowatts into useful heat. But a thermocouple-simply two pieces of dissimilar metals welded or soldered togetherchanges heat directly into electricity when one joint is put into a flame.

Heat affects electrical conductors too. When you turn on a 100 -watt bulb, its cold filament has about a tenth of its hot resistance, and there is a tremendous surge of current-about 9 amp . for a millisecond or two. But the filament immediately gets hot. In a tenth of a second its resistance rises until it draws only its rated .8 amp .


Heat Increases Resistance. You can safely use more lights on a single circuit without blowing a fuse if you turn them on one at a time. The reason? Almost all metals, including lamp filaments and heating elements, have greater resistance when they are hot than while cold. Hence, they pass less current after heating up.

You can demonstrate this characteristic
of metallic conductors by connecting a 3volt flashlight bulb in series with two dry cells and about $10^{\prime}$ of thin iron wire wound around a strip of asbestos. While cold, the wire has a low resistance and enough current passes to cause the bulb to shine brightly. But put a flame under the wire, and the resistance becomes so great that the light will dim-and may go out.


Heat Decreases Resistance. In the case of conducting solutions, or electrolytes, the resistance decreases as they are heated-as you can demonstrate by another pair of tests. Connect your bulb and dry cells in series with two metal plates suspended in a water-filled beaker. Stir salt in-

to the water until the bulb lights dimly. Now put a flame under the solution. As the solution becomes hotter, the light will grow brighter. Because of this lowering of resistance, electrolytic rheostats must be designed large enough to carry the current that is required without overheating.


Parallel Versus Series. Heat depends on the current and resistance in a circuit. Thus, if two or more appliances of similar type, such as light bulbs or heaters, are connected in parallel, the bulb or heater with the lowest resistance-which draws the greatest current-gives the most light or heat. As an illustration, the 60-

watt bulb on the right in the left photo has less resistance and so gives more light than a companion 40 -watt bulb. But connect the same two bulbs in series, as at the right, and the reverse holds true. The same amount of current now passes through both, but it creates more light and heat in the bulb where it overcomes the higher resistance.


Heat Actuates Meters. Because the heat produced in a wire or circuit is proportional to the square of the current flowing through it, and because heated metals expand in a predictable way, the heating effect of electricity is used in one type of instrument to measure amperage or voltage.

You can easily demonstrate the principle of a "hot-wire" meter. Stretch a strand of iron picture wire horizontally between two nails driven into a board. At the center,
suspend a wire hook connected to a string held taut by a weight. Drill a hole through the center of a short dowel, cement a cardboard pointer to the dowel, and mount the dowel to turn freely. Loop the string once around the dowel so that the pointer moves to the right when the weight is pulled down.

Connect a single dry cell to the supporting nails, and the pointer will move slightly as the wire heats, expands, and sags. Connect two, and the movement will increase.

## Two Aids Speed Service on Pump Located in Pit




Pumps installed in pits and other hard-to-reach places can be serviced more readily if equipped with these aids. At the left, an extension plug makes it easier to open a drain hole, and at the right a removable drip shield protects the motor. To avoid corrosion, use brass pipe fittings and sheet copper or aluminum for the shield.
Replacing a common pipe plug, the extension plug can be conveniently removed or installed by hand without a wrench. So that the pump frame or fittings will not keep the handle from turning, assemble each plug with a pipe nipple of suitable length, depending on the location. Couple the plug and nipple as indicated in the drawing.
If it is necessary to fill the plug nipples

to prevent leakage, use roofing cement or similar waterproof material for those on the discharge side. Fill those on the suction side with molten lead or other metal.

When the pump needs servicing, the drip shield is easily removed by unscrewing the short nipple and cap. A bracket made from a pipe nipple and tee is particularly suited to the type of motor shown, for the latter has a pipe-threaded wire outlet for convenience in mounting a pressure switch at this point if desired. Where this is the case, a pipe flange screwed on top of the pressure switch may be substituted for the bracket shown. A similar mount may be employed on motors having side outlets for the wire leads.-J. Modroch.

## Wall Studs Should Be Nailed Through Wide Sides

Sound joints between wall studs and the plate are an essential framing requisite for either plaster or wallboard application, since weakness at this point leaves the surface without adequate support and is likely to result in cracks.

The joints will be weak if the nails are driven into the narrow face of the studs, as at A. Instead, nail only through the wide sides, as in B .


## Fusible Links Shut Dif Burner After Explosion

If your oil burner is not designed to shut down automatically in case of a "puff back" explosion, the illustrated setup will do the job-and prevent what might become a costly fire. Should the door be blown open or the flue wrecked by delayed ignition, the rising heat will melt a fusible link and allow the spring switch to open the burner circuit.

The switch should be a normally-open momentary-contact type. Connect the toggle arm to a wire that runs to the links, and tension the wire so that the switch is held closed, allowing the burner to operate. Install the switch in series with the hot side of the main line that runs to the burner.

## Tube Keeps Work on Sawhorse



Cabpenters and others will find that boards do not have such a tendency to slide and slip while they are being cut on sawhorses, if a length of inner tube is wrapped over the ridge of each horse and tacked to the sides with roofing nails. Rubber on the horse supporting the free end of the work is especially helpful.-W. B. Eagan.

## Batter Beater Cuts and Lifts "Skin" from Paint

Usually available in a dime store, a batter beater will often be found a handy tool in the home paint shop. It will quickly cut and lift the "skin" that forms on the surface of paint left standing in cans for some time. Excess paint drains through the tines, and the skin does not slide off as it will from a knife. If the beater is too wide to fit small cans, one or more tines can be cut from each side.-Will Thomas.


Use fuse links with a rated melting temperature of 160 deg., locating one directly over the furnace door and one or more over the flue pipe, depending on its length.

## Clothespin Holds Lag Screw



A clothesspin inserted in a hole as above makes it possible to anchor a lag screw firmly in cement. The head of the clothespin may be cut off to save the work of drilling a deeper hole.-Richard Salzer.


## FOR EASIER FARMING



Gate Fits Any Dpening. Steel members at the ends and center of this gate encase two-by-fours that may be cut so the length of the gate suits the opening. Supported by double hasp hinges, the gate swings in either direction and is held shut by a lever-operated latch. If the support post should sag, the gate may be realigned by a built-in leveler. The gate is made by Doughboy Industries, New Richmond, Wis.


New Poison Kills Pests. Said to be four times as potent as DDT against certain insects, a new poison announced by the United States Rubber Company has been found especially useful against hordes of grasshoppers on western farm lands. Both a contact and stomach poison, it is called "Synklor" and has chlordane as the active chemical. Reported to be no more toxic to humans than DDT, the poison is available either as a liquid or a dust. A liquid form (above) quickly knocks out roaches.


Motoreycle Makes May. A motorcycle has been found useful in a hayfield at the proving ground operated by the AllisChalmers Manufacturing Company, near Elm Grove, Wis. Cylindrical bales made by the company's one-man baler are left in the field to dry, but must be turned at least once. This is the job of the motorcyclist. Riding slowly, he bumps the bales with the guard, turning them rapidly.


Aids Contour Plowing. An instrument marketed by the Ellis Sales Company, of Fairfield, Iowa, makes it unnecessary for a farmer to survey a field and put out stakes to guide his tractor along a contour line. Mounted on the tractor facing the driver, the instrument has a dial calibrated in percent of slope above and below the level, or contour, line. Thus, after locating his key contours, the farmer can just start plowing, correcting his wheels whenever the indicator hand moves off zero.

Indicating specific gravity, all three appear level behind their transparent window when battery is fully charged. Drop of green ball means five percent discharge; white, 50 percent; red, 95 percent. For recharging, battery need not be removed, as charger can be plugged in. Made by U-C Lite, of Chicago, the lamp throws a $2,500-\mathrm{ft}$. beam.


## Easier Color Printing

Ektacolor, a new negative color film developed by Eastman Kodak, is going to take a couple of the headaches out of making color prints. It eliminates the need for masking and for separation negatives.

The Ektacolor process is able to do this by using color couplers. These provide color correction as the film is developed, producing a negative image combined with positive color "masks."

With most previous color films you must work from a positive transparency, and color correction is achieved by making one or more low-density, negative images as masks that then are bound in register to the transparency. Ektacolor completely eliminates this step.

The making of separation negatives is another tedious step in producing color prints from positive transparencies by the dye transfer method, since such negatives are needed to produce printing matrices. This process is also eliminated by the new negative color film, providing a second major saving of time and materials.

Working from the Ektacolor negative with color filters, positive printing matrices may be made directly on another new Kodak product-Pan Matrix film. Thus, in effect, Ektacolor provides in one film a set of corrected color negatives.

Black-and-white prints for use as proofs may also be made directly from Ektacolor negatives on special paper.

Intended primarily for professional use with artificial light, Ektacolor is designed for processing in a photographer's own studio. It will be supplied in standard film sizes for use in conventional cameras, and is expected to be available early in 1948.

## Dil Gauges Air Speed

Castor oil has added another to its many uses in this Westinghouse gauge to study air velocities in an electronic air cleaner. The center tube holds the castor oil, while the two bottles on either side contain salt water. Air entering the right-hand bottle forces a salt-water bubble up into the oil. ADECENT interval after this issue reaches subscribers, about a thousand interested readers will sit down to fill out a question form they have received. On this long, detailed questionnaire they will check their readership of every major article and department in the magazine. Then the printers dish up the first proofs, and I sit down myself to eat the issue. Sometimes I start at the front and read straight through. Or start at the back and flip from one high spot to another.

But usually I go through the magazine looking at pictures, reading headlines and captions. Knowing the words (because I read most of them when they were still only typewriting on yellow paper), I am always a little amazed at how much you can get out of PSM without even reading it.

Anyway, when the votes from readers come in I'm anxious to find out how they liked the things I liked on the menu. Usually the articles we think are interesting enough to get the most space are what you like best. But every issue there are a couple of surprises-articles that turn out to be more popular than we expected. And where there are winners there are always loserssome of our little favorites make crash landings in the reader polls.

Maybe you've never received a ballot. Or maybe you buy your PSM at a newsstand, as I used to before I got free copies. If so, you never get a ballot.

    BRUSSELS, Belgium-(Special to Popular Science Monthly). By applying the lifting principle of a balloon to a diving chamber, Prof. Auguste Piccard, pioneer explorer of the stratosphere, has found a way to descend to greater depths of the ocean than man has ever reached before. He has embodied his idea in a submarine craft of extraordinary design, able to navigate more than two miles beneath the waves. As this is written, he and his Belgian assistant, Prof.

    Max Cosyns, of Brussels University, are preparing to entrust their lives to the invention in the Gulf of Guinea, off the Ivory Coast of Africa.

    The existing deep-sea record was set in 1934 by Dr. William Beebe, of the New York Zoological Society, off Nonesuch Island, Bermuda. His spherical steel diving chamber, or bathysphere, was lowered to a depth of 3,028 feet by a steel cable.

    Professor Piccard's subsea craft, in contrast, will not be suspended from its mother craft. Instead, it will navigate under its own power, driven by two propellers with elec-

    tric motors. The bushy-haired, 63-year-old, Swiss-born professor intends to take it down to a depth of two and a half miles, which is more than four times as far as Dr. Beebe went, to make scientific observations in an unexplored region of eternal night.

    ## Armor Withstands Pressure

    Combining the Greek words for depth and ship, Professor Piccard calls his craft a "bathyscaphe," or ship of the deep. Pilot and observer will ride in a hermetically sealed, alloy-steel sphere 61/2 feet in outside diameter. Its massive walls, $3 \frac{13}{2}$ inches thick, will safely withstand the tremendous pressure of more than 5,700 pounds to the square inch-about a ton for every mile of
    descent-resulting from the crushing weight of water overhead. Two windows of transparent plastic, measuring 16 inches in outside diameter, four inches in inside diameter, and six inches thick, give the crew a view into the lower depths. At the points where these ports are inserted, the walls of the sphere itself are correspondingly thickened for strength. The greater the water pressure upon the windows, the more tightly they are forced against their conical seats, preventing any leak. Electrical cables enter through smaller cones of plastic, similarly providing a watertight seal.

    So that the men inside the globe can control its ascent and descent at will, Professor Piccard suspends it from a "balloon"-a

    buoyancy float consisting of seven aluminum cylinders within an encircling shell of thin metal. Just as the gas bag of a balloon contains a gas lighter than air, so these aluminum

    cylinders will hold a fluid lighter than water. For this purpose Professor Piccard has chosen aviation gasoline, which weighs $433 /$ pounds to the cubic foot-just 20 pounds less than a cubic foot of sea water. Thus the total capacity of the cylinders, 1,000 cubic feet of gasoline, gives a lifting force of 20,000 pounds, or 10 tons. This will be considerably more than sufficient to counterbalance the weight of the steel sphere-its 10 -ton weight out of water becomes $5 \frac{1 / 2}{2}$ tons when submerged-and its equipment.

    The buoyancy tanks are filled with gasoline in preference to air because the extreme pressure to be encountered would compress

    air beyond all usefulness for displacing water. Even the gasoline, relatively incompressible, will be squeezed to a slightly smaller volume. Hence, openings at the bottoms of the cylinders will admit sea water freely, equalizing pressure inside and out and obviating any need for heavy armored walls such as the cabin requires.

    ## Upside-Down Ballooning

    In order to descend, the undersea explorers will "valve off" gasoline, exactly as balloonists descend by valving off gas. To complete its parallel to a balloon in principle, the bathyscaphe will drop ballast in order to rise again. This ballast consists of heavy concrete blocks fitted with iron faces, so that they may be suspended from the float by electromagnets. As long as current flows through these magnets from a 2,600 -pound storage battery built into the float, the blocks remain in place. By pressing buttons within the spherical cabin, the occupants may drop any or all of the blocks. For more delicate adjustments of buoyancy, iron shot may be dropped by other electromagnets. A total of $2 \frac{1}{2}$ tons of ballast may be released and, in an emergency, the storage battery itself may be jettisoned.

    Equipment of the submarine gondola will provide every scientific facility for the adventurers' purpose of observing marine life at extreme ocean depths and exploring the

    bed of the sea. Trained through a window, a motion-picture camera will photograph strange denizens of the deep illuminated by 3,000 -candlepower undersea lamps. The films are expected to record a myriad of fish and other creatures new to science, which have eluded nets lowered from the surface in earlier attempts to bring them up for study. Because the explorers will be far too busy to jot down notes on their scientific observations, their rapid-fire comments on what they see will be picked up by the microphone of an automatic voice recorder,

    to be played back and transcribed after they return to the surface. By remote control, they will operate equipment on the outside of the bathyscaphe that will trap specimens of deep-sea life, bring up bottlefuls of water, and collect samples of the ocean bed.

    A 4,000-ton ocean-going tug, the Scaldis, has been fitted out to serve as their floating base of operations. While the bathyscaphe rests on the deck, the two men will squeeze into the cabin through a circular entrance port, containing one of the windows, which will then be sealed into place. A crane will lower the apparatus into the water, the gasoline will be pumped into the buoyancy tanks, and the bathyscaphe will start its plunge.

    ## Color of Sea Changes

    Through the observers' portholes, as they descend, the color of the sea will change from bright green to blue-green, darker blue, and then to deepening gray as daylight fades out. As they approach the 2,000 -foot level they will enter a wonderland that only the occupants of Beebe's bathysphere have penetrated before-a realm of absolute blackness such as surface dwellers can scarcely imagine, darker than the darkest night and punctuated only by the flashing blue and yellow lights of the weird, luminous creatures that inhabit this nether world. The walls of their steel sphere will become icy cold to their touch. At the depth they will reach, the sea's temperature hovers only a few degrees above the freezing point, summer and winter alike. As pressure gauges show the craft is approaching the sea bed, its distance above bottom will be
    gauged by lowering a weighted cable from a motor-driven drum. By careful control of ballast and buoyancy, Professor Piccard expects to be able to keep the bathyscaphe within a few feet of the ocean floor as it drifts along, or turns on its battery-powered propellers for faster progress. For a better look at objects of interest illuminated by the powerful lamps, varying the relative speed of the propellers will rotate the cabin to face in any direction. Underwater navigation will be aided by a compass mounted on the outside of the cabin, with a connection to an indicator on the inside that will duplicate its reading.

    ## Program for Record Dive

    Plans call for an undersea journey lasting from eight to 10 hours, for which oxygen tanks in the cabin provide an ample supply, and an adequate reserve for good measure. Air-conditioning apparatus will keep the air in the sealed cabin purified by means of chemicals, removing exhaled carbon dioxide with soda lime and absorbing excess humidity with silica gel.

    Just as a barograph serves to confirm an airplane or balloon altitude record, so a recording water-pressure gauge, whose pen similarly traces a record upon a revolving drum bearing a paper chart, will testify to the greatest depth reached by the bathyscaphe.

    As the subsea craft ascends once more and approaches the surface, possibly several miles from its starting point, it will reveal its whereabouts to the surface ship by means of an undersea signaling transmitter loaned

    for the purpose by the British Admiralty, a device of a type used during the last war for signaling between submarines with sound waves. Thus the Scaldis will be able to reach the bathyscaphe promptly after it surfaces, haul it aboard, and release the men sealed within it. In case of any slip-up, the bathyscaphe is also equipped to signal its surface
    location by radio and by flares and rockets, and is brightly painted so that, if necessary, search planes should find it easily.

    So far as human foresight can provide, every imaginable contingency has been anticipated. Models of the cabin, built to one-tenth scale and tested to destruction in a high-pressure hydraulic chamber, indicate the gondola will withstand two to three times the pressure it will encounter-a generous margin of safety. To insure against defects in its steel shell, a capsule of radium was placed within the ball and its entire

    exterior was covered with envelopes containing sheets of photographic film. The resulting radiographs revealed the metal to be flawless, save for one inconsequential "bubble" that was drilled out and filled with solid metal, just to be on the safe side. As a final precaution, the first descent with men aboard will be preceded by a full-dress test dive with the craft empty. Sent down to a depth of $3^{3} \frac{3}{3}$ miles, half again as deep as it is intended to carry passengers, it will be preset to release ballast automatically at this level and bob up again. If it survives the titanic crushing force at this depth, a total of more than 72,000 tons upon its spherical shell, it should serve its purpose successfully. Despite every possible precaution, however, the adventurers are well aware that their first descent will be a gamble with death. They are prepared to accept all of the hazards.

    ## Army Tries an Expendable Spoon

    For use with combat rations, the Army has developed a plastic spoon that can be thrown away after one meal.     ENGINEERING refinements are featured in the 1948 motorcycles announced by Indian and Harley-Davidson. Starter noise, for instance, has been cut down in the Indian by means of a silent kick starter, in which the usual ratchet is replaced by a freewheeling ball-lock device. Normally resting in holes in one plate, five metal balls engage in sockets on the gear face when the starter is used. A click-and your motor's running.

    The Harley has new tricks, too-aluminum heads, a feature that reduces engine weight eight pounds, and hydraulic valve lifters of the push-rod type for $61-\mathrm{cu} .-\mathrm{in}$. and 74 -cu.in. overhead valve engines. Previously used only in airplanes and high-priced cars, these lifters are self-compensating for expansion, contraction, and wear of the valve train. The rocker arms operate in an oil mist that helps cool the aluminum heads. Top frame members are higher to allow for the rocker covers.

    Other new Indian features are a lock to keep the kick-stand leg from folding up if the cycle is pushed, and a five-gear oil pump that replaces the plunger type. The speedometer is operated from the front wheel.

    Its eight, giant J-35 turbojets develop
    $32,000 \mathrm{hp}$., almost three times the power of its propeller-driven counterpart, the B-35 Flying Wing. Bomb bays, cargo space, crew quarters for 13 men-including bunks for six off-duty members-are all in the seven-foot-thick wings. Designed for the Air Force as a very heavy bomber, the tailless plane can be adapted to cargo or transport use.

    ONE day last September our four-engine transport plane squatted on an airport in the wilderness of Newfoundland. The pilot pushed a button in his cockpit-and then sat back and put his hands in his lap.

    The airplane took off by itself. The landing gear retracted itself. The throttles presently crept back to cruising power, though no hand touched them.

    The crew of the plane didn't even know its destination. But the plane knew. It headed east out over the Atlantic as unerringly as a hound on a hot scent.

    Hours later, this C-54-named the Robert E. Lee-automatically banked and began circling. We were in the vicinity of the airport to which the plane was taking us. Presently we were in a glide, pointed straight for the airport. The downwind end of the
    runway flashed by. The wheels touched. The throttles cut back to idling speed. Only then did the human pilot, sitting in the cockpit, make a move. With his feet he braked to shorten the landing run. With his hands he kept the plane in the middle of the runway until we rolled to a stop.

    We had made the first wholly automatic transatlantic flight in the history of aviation, and I had been lucky enough to be aboard. We had taken off automatically, flown automatically, and landed automatically.

    What makes push-button flight possible? What opens and closes the throttles, raises and lowers the landing gear, and points the nose of the plane to its destination? Flight by robot sounds fantastic, even spooky, to the layman.

    It isn't, at all. What makes our C-54 work
    

    Entry on electronic brain fixed 12 planned sequences for entire flight in advance. In first, idling power is provided for engines. Pilot takes runway heading manually, then presses button advancing Master Sequence Selector to Position 2.
    

    No-hands take-off follows as throttles are advanced automatically to take-off power. Runway heading is maintained as the plane lifts off the field. Fifty feet up, the radio altimeter, the sensor now in charge, advances Selector to Position 3.

    is fundamentally as simple as the thermostat in your living room. The thermostat "senses" that the house is too cool. The furnace is actuated by an electrical command. The same thing happens in the U. S. Air Force's C-54; sensor devices indicate that something is to be done, and an actuating device-an "actuator"-does it.

    There was nothing sensational in the way of equipment in the plane. Most of the elements of fully automatic flight had been used in aircraft and other vehicles for years. What was new in our plane was that we had taken these elements, put them all together, and added a series of sensing units developed by the personnel of the All Weather Flying Division. It was the combination, plus these sensing units built on the chassis of instruments and devices already in use in aircraft, that made automatic flight possible.

    When we started our trip to England by way of Stephenville, Newfoundland, our push-button airplane already had proved itself in trial runs here at home. But we knew that flying the Atlantic might be something else again.

    There was some tenseness when we neared our first homing radio station in mid-Atlantic. This was a U.S. Coast Guard weather ship on permanent station. About 70 miles from it, according to our air log, we asked the radio operator to hold his key down for 30 minutes so the plane could bird-dog its course.

    Would everything work?
    It was shortly after midnight, Newfoundland time, as all hands, save for the pilot and copilot who were up in the cockpit, gathered around the master control panel just behind the main cabin bulkhead. Above us the stars were shining. Below us some-

    Reaching for the sky, the plane keeps climbing 1,000 feet per minute as flaps are retracted. Compass heading is unchanged. When the predetermined altitude-3,000 to 8,000 feet-is reached, the radio altimeter advances the Selector to Position 5.

    where, rolling in the waves, was a tiny vessel. We couldn't see it. We were too high and our plane swam in darkness.

    We couldn't even have the satisfaction of a cigarette. Huge cylinders containing supplementary fuel were at our elbows.

    On the radio signals from that unseen vessel depended our automatic "fix" in uncharted space. From that point we would proceed to our second air-log sequence. Eyes were trained on a compass needle.

    Then everything happened at once. An amber light flashed on the control panel. The sequence was advancing. The compass needle crept around. The plane banked gently, assuming a new course. Nobody said anything. We just exchanged glances. The smile that was passed around contained, perhaps, as much relief as gratification.

    But men's faith must be renewed periodically. Again, over the patchwork quilt of
    fields that was England, we gathered around the master control panel. Our concern was justified. The Royal Air Force had installed the USAF Instrument LowApproach System (SCS-5l) with only cabled instructions. Would there be a hitch?

    The airplane crossed the radio station that had led it in. We knew that had happened when the needle of the radio compassstandard equipment in all transports-swung around 180 degrees and pointed backward. It said, "Wait a minute! Your destination is back there!"

    The ordinary radio-compass needle is a non-metallic luminous pointer. Ours, however, was made of metal. As it swung, it closed a switch, just as you would switch on an electric light. The compass, of course, was the sensor. Closing the switch put an actuator into operation.

    A signal was fed through to the auto-
    

    With uncanny precision, the plane now changes course automatically and takes preselected heading for second leg. Air Log No. 2 starts counting estimated air miles of this leg. When zero is again reached, API advances the Selector to Position 8.

    pilot in the cockpit. The autopilot, controlling the ailerons and rudder, put the plane in a gentle bank around the radio station. The signal simultaneously actuated another electric servo system that retarded throttles to the proper setting for a glide.

    Some other things were happening. The plane had been kept at a constant altitude through a barometric pressure altitude control of the autopilot-another of the plane's sensory organs. Now, as the throttles came back for the glide, the barometric pressure sensor was switched off. The plane orbitted and started downstairs.

    A radio altimeter stepped in as another in the series of sensors. The wheels came down-automatically. The plane's nose picked up the runway localizer of the SCS-51. Then it found the second part of the landing system, the glide path, the invisible highway leading to the runway.

    Through the haze we could see that we were landing at the RAF Brize Norton Field. The British had done their work well.

    We repeated the experience, giving our plane its head westward back across the Atlantic. Except for three occasions, when proper radio facilities were lacking, the entire round trip was by push button.

    While I was the senior officer aboard, the operation of the aircraft was in the hands of seven men headed by red-thatched Capt. Thomas J. Wells, the chief test pilot. He was ably assisted by James L. Anast, chief of the automatic flight branch of the All Weather Flying Division; Captain R. J. Whiting, navigator; T/Sgt. Welker W. McKee, the crew chief; S/Sgt. John C. Nimon, engineer; T/Sgt. Raymond Centolella, radio operator; and George B. Johnson, technician.

    There are only a dozen sequences, or phases, fed into the Automatic Flight Con-

    Yet wholly automatic flight does remain experimental. And it is misunderstood by the public. Our C-54 airplane has no relation whatsoever to the guided missile program. Today when ceilings and visibility come down, flights are canceled wholesale in the inter-
    ests of safety. Automatic flight is going to make flying safe, in any weather.

    ## Mechanical Butterfy

    When Hollywood couldn't deliver a trained butterfly called for in a movie script, studio mechanics came up with this metal one, wired for action.

    The wings are made to flutter by remote control, out of camera range. As shown at right above, two thin metal strips are at-
    
    tached to the hinged wings of the imitation insect. Four inches below the wings, the strips are joined and attached to a piano wire running through a long copper tube. Pull the wire, and the butterfly performs. This model represents the butterfly poised upon a flower, as in the picture at left. Another version, attached to a traveling boom, simulates a butterfly in flight.

    ## Thunderbolt Tower

    Giant "tripod" at left is world's largest lightning arrester, its three 29 -foot-high legs designed to carry thunderbolts harmlessly to the ground. Constructed by Westinghouse, it is installed on a 500,000 -volt test transmission line in Ohio to protect delicate equipment. One of two other arresters is visible at lower right.
    

    ## Guess Which Is Real

    Look alike, don't they, these two star rubies? But the one on the left is a natural stone, valued at $\$ 12,000$, while the one on the middle finger is synthetic, worth about $\$ 600$. Developed for industrial use, synthetic star rubies and sapphires will soon be on the market as jewelry.

    ## "Samding Roads"for Planes

    SCIENCE'S snow makers are crossing ice off the list of flying dangers by removing the supercooled clouds that cause the ice to form on wings and control surfaces. They "sand" the clouds with ordinary dry ice-and in 15 minutes there is a hole big enough for a plane to land through.

    Capt. Clarence N. Chamberlain, Jr., pilot of the Air Force plane used in the first cloudboring test, said, "The hole looked like someone had taken a giant shovel and scooped out a large section of the cloud."

    As reported in Popular Science Monthly last June, prevention of airplane icing was one of the many developments expected from the method of weather control discovered by Dr. Irving Langmuir and Vincent J. Schaefer of the General Electric Co. (see "The War Against Hail," PSM June '47, p. 82). This method already has brought
    rain to drought-struck areas in Illinois and Arizona, and Dr. Langmuir believes it can be adapted to change the entire winter climate of large sections of the country. It may also prevent costly hailstorms.

    Schaefer is now working on a gun to shoot dry-ice bullets straight ahead from the nose of an airplane flying inside an ice-forming cloud. The bullets would continuously clear an ice-free path for the plane. The dry ice would change the cloud, composed of very tiny droplets of water below the freezing temperature but still unfrozen, into snow by chilling the droplets until they froze. Once started, the reaction would keep going by itself, and the cloud would disappear into snowflakes. The research program, called "Project Cirrus," is being sponsored jointly by the Army Signal Corps, Navy, Air Force, and General Electric.

To collapse the barrel, hoops are knocked off.

    ## Huglilse Hoat Rides the Waves

    THE "feelers" jutting out from this novel boat follow the ups and downs of waves and troughs. In turn these "jockey" skids change the angle of the hydrofoils to provide extra lift so that the Hydrofin boat rides the wave crests in rough water. The result is a smoother, faster ride, according to the craft's British inventor, Christopher Hook. The first commercial model, expected to be in coastal service early next year, will be 30 feet long, and will accommodate a dozen passengers plus a crew of two.
    

    Top picture shows Hydrofin at rest, its hull in the water. In lower picture it gathers momentum and hydrofoils lift the hull out of the water, cutting water drag and adding speed.

    ## How to Malse Two Bits

    THE coins you jingle in your pocket may not buy much nowadays, but to Uncle Sam they are big business. Only by using modern mass-production methods can his money factories keep up with the demand.

    Making a quarter today doesn't take too much hand work-unless you're a counterfeiter. Then you'd appreciate that making money the mint's way is a job of fine craftsmanship. More than two billion coins from half dollars to pennies, valued at more than 77 million dollars, were turned out last year. And every one had to be up to par in weight and alloy. That's not just pride in fine metalwork, but so that your nickel won't be rejected by pay phones, cigarette machines, turnstiles, and other coin devices.
    
    4. Here the output of the cutting machine is being dumped into a riddle, or large sieve. As it rocks back and forth any scraps of silver and broken or off-size blanks drop through the wire mesh into a salvage box. The metal, hardened from the rolling, next goes into an annealing furnace where it is softened by subjection to high temperatures. Cleaning comes next.
    

    1. From a glowing crucible, a mint worker dips alloy and pours it into molds. When cool, the metal will be in the form of "coinage ingots" 12 inches long, two inches wide, and one-half inch thick. The alloy consists of nine parts silver to one part copper-the copper makes the coins tougher. Each ingot must meet rigid assay tests for purity.
    
    2. Emerging wet from a chemical cleaning solution, the blanks are dumped into this drier. A few whirls and they come out gleaming, looking like silver for the first time. From here they are fed into an "upsetting" machine that gives the blanks the raised rims. Precision again is paramount, for with uneven rims the finished coins would not stack properly.
    
    3. The metal starts on its way to become a quarter. Here the coinage ingots are passed through rolling machines that reduce their thickness to about that of a finished coin. The process results in strips eight to 10 feet long, and a little wider than two coins. At this early stage of production the working metal resembles zinc more than it does silver.
    
    4. As a double check, time out is taken to weigh the blanks in these automatic scales. Although the blanks are weighed individually, one machine can handle 9,000 an hour. Standard weight for a quarter is 96.45 grains. With deft fingers the operator picks out any coin that varies by more than three grains. These rejects are put in a box on top of the machine.
    
    5. The strips of metal then are fed through a cutting machine that punches out coin blanks, two at a time. To insure maximum uniformity, grippers hold each strip rigidly in place as the cutters strike. There is no waste anywhere along the production line of Uncle Sam's mints. Scraps left over after cutting, called "clippings," are remelted and used later.
    
    6. Here come the quarters-finished coins at last. The press shown here gulps blanks through opening at upper left and ejects its two-bit product into box at right foreground. Eighty tons of pressure squeeze the blanks between steel dies to make the head and tail designs; at the same time a collar puts reeding around the edge. Capacity is 100 coins a minute.
    

    Important clues in hair identification are the scales, shown above magnified 500 diameters. These are of the "shingle" type; others are

    ## How laboratory research 'fingerprints" human hair as an aid to scientific identification.

    ADEFENDANT was on trial for assault. The jury was in doubt when Dr. Paul L. Kirk, of the University of California's crime laboratory, showed them a pair of similar hairs wound around a glass bobbin. One hair was found on the scene of the crime; the other taken from the accused.
    "I can't prove that these two hairs are from the same head," said Dr. Kirk. But then he went on and demonstrated point after point of identity between the two strands.

    The verdict was "guilty."
    This was not the first time that the scien-
    tific study of human hair has helped bring the guilty to justice or clear those falsely accused. Dr. Kirk, a professor of biochemistry, began his study of hair some 20 years ago. Since that time he has worked in his laboratory on more than 150 cases, representing crimes ranging from petty larceny to murder. And although Dr. Kirk is the first to admit that hair is not yet a positive means of identification, his courtroom testimony never has been discredited.

    To describe a hair scientifically you must look inside it, and study its structure-particularly when a man's liberty or life is at stake. A good head of hair contains about 130,000 strands. They assume many shapes, the majority being oval in form.

    Their structure is complex. A hair is divided into three parts: scale, cortex, and medulla. The scales appear as tiny shingles, several hundred to the inch. The cortex, immediately under the surface scales, is composed of a group of tiny elongated fibrils. The medulla (not always present), is a pithy core of cells interspersed with diffused pigment, pigment cells, and air spaces, lying along the central part of the shaft.

    And to confuse the hair detective, the hairs on the crown of a man's head are not the same as those on the nape of his neck. A permanent wave can result in two spots of a single hair being different in both appearance and composition. Dyeing alters surface hair color but not internal-pigment color, while bleaching does both.

    Refractive index (the ability to slow up

    light passed through it) averages higher in women's hair than in men's, which helps the hair sleuth. Knowing the subject's race, Kirk can examine a hair, and four out of five times tell if it comes from a man or a woman.

    Identifying the guilty and absolving the innocent by means of hair, however, is not yet a job for the cops. A vast store of knowledge must first be acquired by investigators such as Kirk. Comprehensive files including nearly all types of human hair must be built up and made available for study.
    

    1. Searching for telltale hairs, Dr. Kirk goes over a bedspread with a special vacuum attachment. Hairs will be caught on a porous disk through which air but not dirt can pass.
    2. After drying, short hairs are then cut into pieces one millimeter long for mounting on slides. Two ordinary razor blades, set parallel on a thin brass block, do the job efficiently.
    

    Kirk has already filed 100 hairs each from 400 people, mostly willing students at the University of California, covering all parts of their bodies. He plans to obtain samples from some of them over a period of 20 years to study changes that develop with age.

    Although scores of factors enter into the hair identification picture, Dr. Kirk depends largely on the following major points to prove his cases:

    Color. This is the first and most obvious, and in many cases can quickly eliminate
    
    2. The dirt and hair collected is then examined through a low-power enlarging lens. The hairs are carefully removed with tweezers and prepared for microscopic and other studies.
    5. Hairs of different density will be separated when immersed in a mixture of two liquids of different specific gravity. Here Dr. Kirk is taking a density reading off a test tube.
    
    suspicion from a person. But color must be interpreted with caution, for shades of hair vary widely on a single head, such as from blonde to brown on a red head. Kirk hopes that an absolute color chart for hair may be worked out, and that the chemical identity or differences of pigments may be established as a check on color.

    Diameter. Before assigning any great significance to the fineness or coarseness of an individual hair, accurate measurements of the maximum diameter is taken with
    
    3. A microscope is needed to detect some fine hairs among the debris of dandruff, oil, and dust. Once isolated, the hairs are washed in a mixture of equal parts of ether and alcohol.
    6. Enlarged photographs, some as high as 500 diameters, are used for further study and courtroom presentation. Dr. Kirk uses small camera, placed lens down on horizontal mount.
    
    a calibrated ocular micrometer, and of the minimum diameter with a calibrated fine adjustment on a microscope.

    Scale Count. Scores of counts must be taken along one or several hairs to obtain an average. If the average count on your hair, for instance, is 24 scales for each two-tenths of a millimeter of length, all hair averaging less than 22 or more than 26 would be considered as coming from someone else.

    Scale Picture. This means the shape, regularity or irregularity of sizes, edges, and any other features revealed through the microscope. Generally, hair scales of one head follow the same general pattern, and hairs have been identified on this basis alone.

    Pigment. This is one of the best points of evidence in the identification of hair. Both density and distribution play a part. "In general," Kirk says, "the pigment density is inversely proportional to the amount of light that can be transmitted through the hair." Very light blonde or gray hair is of minimum density. Distribution of pigment granules is also important.

    Medullation. The presence or absence of a pithy core (medulla) in hair is not considered of great significance. However, since some people have much medulla in their hair, and others little or none, its study is sometimes of value.

    Refractive Index. The varying ability of hair to slow up light serves both in matching hairs and in determining race and sex.

    Double Refraction. All hair is capable of this optical phenomenon to some degree. When two hairs of the same diameter are examined with polarized light, however, those from the same source usually show the same interference colors; those of different origins, different colors.

    Density. The specific gravity of hair often differs among individuals, ranging from 1.30 to 1.39 . It will also differ between medullated and nonmedullated hair of the same person.

    Other factors may prove of consequence, such as tensile strength, stretch coefficient, and electrical characteristics. Permanentwaved hair, for instance, stretches readily as compared to untreated hair. Perhaps hair of one individual will stretch farther than hair of another. So far, little investigation has been done along these lines.

    Someday, Dr. Kirk believes, further research by physicists and chemists may make hair the equal of fingerprints as a means of positive identification.

In the center, six socket receptacles receive the jack-plug ends of bead chains covered with plastic insulation. At other ends of the chains are clamps for attachment to objects such as anesthesia machine, operating and instrument tables, nurses, and patient.

    Use ElectronsFABRIC designers in search of inspiration may well turn to a television receiver, General Electric engineers suggest.

    When they test cathode-ray tubes for modern sets by applying varying voltages, the engineers have found that the flying electron beam often sketches traceries of striking beauty upon the luminescent viewing screen. Ranging from random squiggles to intricate geometrical lacework, the designs offer fascinating possibilities for dresses, scarves, ties and draperies.

    Small, portable test sets, currently available, are suited to apply this new scientific aid to art. Simply by twirling a dial, a seeker after new patterns can conjure up an infinite variety. Through the magic of electronics, the marvelous symmetry of motions resulting from the complex interplay of natural forces becomes visible to human eyes. Captured by photography. as at right, the fleeting images may be preserved for subsequent transfer to fabric.

    Turningy Wateh Inside Dut
    

    TH ERE is how you can take a watch-or an aircraft engine-apart and put it together again without even a screwdriver. It's all done with transparent plastic, printer's ink -and painstaking techniques. Using them, the Trans-Vision process can turn a machine inside out for you and not lose a sćrew.

    Here we see the process, developed by Milprint, Inc., applied to watches. Each page of this booklet, prepared for the Bulova School of Watchmaking, has drawings of one layer of a watch. Every time you turn a page, you peel off a layer, like a layer of an onion.

    At left is shown the complete watch, enclosed in its case, as it appears through the transparent opening of the cover. Lift the cover and you lift off the upper case. As each page is turned, the underside of the section removed can be seen on the left-hand page, the top of the next layer on the right. Thus, while the watch is taken apart on the right side, it is put together again on the left.

    Printing and binding one of these booklets is an exacting job. Each picture must be printed, by rotogravure, on the back of the sheet, so that the ink is protected by the transparent paper. Pictures of the top and bottom of a layer of mechanism are printed on one sheet, which is then folded to bring the two back to back. Not only must they match, but each page must be in perfect alignment with every other page or the effect is lost.

    Below, the pages are turned for you-and a watch comes apart in your hands.
    

    1 Opening the cover has already removed the upper half of the case: now the hour and minute hands are lifted off as you turn the first page, leaving the dial exposed on the next sheet. When all details have been carefully noted, the page is turned and the underside studied.
    

    2 Now the dial has been lifted off and placed at left, face down. This uncovers the hour wheel (shown in yellow) and yoke. Since all parts are always available they can be studied at leisure.

    3 Now the yoke and hour wheel; crown stem; clutch, setting, and minute wheels; setting and clutch levers; and setting-lever spring have all been peeled off. This leaves the pillar plate exposed at right.

    4 Another page exposes the movement side of pillar plate at left, showing barrel recess. This houses barrel, mainspring, and barrel arbor, on right page. Third, fourth and center wheels are in yellow.

    5
    Turning over another layer reveals, at right, the barrel bridge (at top), train-wheel bridge with train. jewels (lower right), and pallet bridge with pallet-arbor jewel (lower left).

    6Now only a few pieces remain in the watch shell at right. They include the ratchet and crown wheels and the click (at top), balance bridge and wheel, the hair spring, and the roller with its jewel.

    7The watch has now been rebuilt in reverse in the left-hand column. Closing the back cover of the booklet, at right, fits the back of the case over the works. An automobile could be

In actual production, however, this weight saving has permitted the installation of tons of new devices and additional equipment developed during the war, while keeping within the 139 -ton maximum. That maximum is imposed by the requirements of the B-36's job-carrying $10,000 \mathrm{lb}$. of bombs 10,000 miles, or a peak load of $72,000 \mathrm{lb}$., its capacity when flying to a target at shorter range.

    ## Air Limers

    The Problem: The mess of string on a map (above, at right) at the Airborne Instruments Laboratory in Mineola, N. Y., shows New York City's air-traffic problem. There are almost 600 strands, representing
    
    that many scheduled air-line flights every 24 hours. In good weather, traffic control is no problem; when ceiling and visibility are low, it's a prime headache. What can be done to remedy it?
    

    A Solution: This model, made of wire, illustrates one proposal made by the laboratory to the Air Transport Association to double the number of planes handled in the metropolitan area under marginal weather conditions. Viewed from the northwest, it shows nonconflicting incoming and outgoing routes provided for each of the area's three major airports. Planes using the routes would have the safeguard of both horizontal and vertical separation.
    The three columns-red for Newark Air-
    port, yellow for LaGuardia, blue for Idle-wild-are "stack orbits" where planes would loaf until they could land. In landing, a plane would leave its orbit and fly outbound on a "timing loop" designed to insure adequate spacing with the plane ahead. The plan contemplates use of ground radar to assist in this time spacing. Outgoing routes split off after take-off to allow rapid dispersal of traffic. Arrows attached to the ends of the wires indicate the proposed routes and show directions of flight.
    

    Dry-docked ship is painted to repel barnacles, protect hull from rust and galvanic action.

    0NLY part of a big ship's lifetime is spent in the water. Periodically she must be dry-docked, usually twice a year, to repaint her bottom and effect any repairs that may be needed to maintain her hull in seaworthy condition. This may be done either in a graving dock-a basin that can be shut off from the sea and pumped dry-or, more spectacularly, in a floating
    dry dock, which actually lifts the vessel bodily from the water.
    How a floating dry dock raises an ocean vessel high and dry is shown on the following pages in pictures made by Hubert Luckett, PSM staff photographer, during the recent dry-docking of the 492 -foot S.S. Mormactide in No. 7 dock of the Todd Shipyards Corporation at Brooklyn, N. Y.
    

    1. S.S. Mormactide, passenger-cargo ship of 17,600 tons displacement, enters floating dry dock for periodic overhaul. By flooding its buoyancy compartments, dock has been lowered far enough to provide ample depth of water over its center line of keel blocks.
    
    2. In control room on dock, operator flicks electric switches actuating pumps, valves. Pumps empty buoyancy compartments and dock rises at rate of one foot in 45 seconds, lifting the big ship bodily. Water around vessel spills from open ends of rising dock.

    Built during the war to U. S. Navy design, this 622-foot-long steel dock has a lifting capacity of 18,000 tons. Its exceptional width, 96 feet, admits ships of unusually wide beam. Shaped like a box without a cover or ends, this dock has 16 buoyancy compartments in its side walls.

    First step in lifting a ship from the sea is to lower the dock by flooding these compartments. A ship can then be floated in at the open end, over a line of massive wooden blocks extending along the center to support the vessel's keel. These are submerged 28 feet beneath the water at maximum operating depth. Movable bilge blocks, "tailor-made" in advance from plans of the particular vessel to be docked, are brought
    
    2. Deck winches at bow of ship take up lines made fast ashore and slowly draw vessel into place, under control of tugboats holding back on stern lines. Dockmaster with microphone, in foreground, directs entire operation through system of loudspeakers.

    up against her sides after she is in place to help hold her securely while she is out of the water.

    Pumps now empty the buoyancy tanks and the lightened dry dock rises, lifting the ship from her natural element. Water within the dock spills from its open ends as it rises, until all has drained out. As soon as the ship and the floor of the dock are high and dry, workmen swarm into the dock to put the vessel in first-class condition in the shortest possible time. Depending on the amount of work to be done, the ship may spend anywhere from a day to several months in dry dock.

    A typical hull-painting job calls for three coats, each with a special purpose. Light

    red anticorrosive paint protects the hull from rust. Next comes a red coat of antifouling paint, a mercurial preparation that repels barnacles and other marine growths. The third coat, a black antigalvanic compound, prevents the steel hull plates from being pitted as a result of losing metal through a process akin to electroplating. But for the compound, this would take place because bronze propellers and steel plates form a natural electric battery when immersed in salt water.

    During the periodic dry-docking, a ship's hull gets a rigid inspection for seaworthiness and any necessary repairs are made, such as replacing plates found to be excessively corroded. Grounding or collision may

    send a ship to dry dock for more extensive repairs.

    Responsibility for the handling of a ship while she is entering and leaving a dry dock falls upon the dockmaster. He used to direct the entire operation with a megaphone, but now he has the aid of a microphone and a system of loudspeakers along the dock and in its control room. The safety of the vessel depends upon his skill in bringing her to rest securely upon the blocks. Orlando Dewling, assistant dockmaster at the Brooklyn yard, who superintended the docking of the Mormactide, says that no ship in his charge has ever keeled over during the docking operation. When one does, he plans to look for another job.

    ## Plastic Toys Learn to Crawl. Wiggle and Pop

    ALTHOUGH metals for toys are more plentiful now, the war-born use of plastic substitutes is still enjoying a wellearned popularity with the toy makersand the youngsters. Here are three new recruits to the growing ranks of plastic toys.
    

    Plastic and elastic allow Swimbo to wiggle through the water like an elusive trout. A tiny crank in the nose winds a rubber band inside that gives undulating motion to the flexible, sectional body. The toy fish is made by Bantam-U. S. Toys, Inc., of N. Y.
    

    A guiding hand is all that is needed to put Slowpoke in action. Operated by a central cam, the head, legs and tail move when the turtle is pushed. The head bobs, the legs walk, the tail wags. It is made by Samuel Eppy \& Co., of New York City.
    

    Shooting 10 wooden pellets as rapidly as a youngster can turn the small crank in the end of its breech, this toy machine gun features a barrel of polished Bakelite. The Baldwin Manufacturing Co., of Brooklyn, N. Y., produces the realistic toy.
    

    ## Chemicals Clear Fog

    This giant "smudge pot" burns a mixture of chemicals at $3,000^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. to produce a vapor that disperses fog at airports. Swirling upward, the vapor lowers the humidity,
    clearing the fog. The $141 / 2$-foot, $31 / 2$-ton vaporizer, shown above at the Lockheed Air Terminal, Burbank, Calif., consumes 100 gal. of fuel oil and 200 pounds of chemicals an hour. Four of them can clear a square mile of fog up to $\mathbf{7 0 0}$ feet in 20 minutes.

    ## Plow Uproots Rocks

    To speed the clearing of rough and rolling land for cultivation, this odd machine functions both as plow and ripper.

    Pulled by a Diesel-powered tractor, the device has a heavy steel blade, 65 inches long, that slices horizontally through the soil from 18 to 40 inches below the surface. As it moves, the blade loosens roots and stones, bringing them to the surface.

    A center point guides the blade into the earth where it automatically flattens into plowing position. In addition to combining two operations in one, the method prepares the land for cultivation without overturning and covering the topsoil.
    

    Pulled up like a drawbridge, the big blade (above) is easily reached for servicing. Note bulldozer rig on the front end of the tractor (at left) for clearing surface obstacles.
    

    One man can handle the "free" pump unit that is contained in this stainless-steel cylinder 2 inches thick and 10 feet long. Operator is about to lower it down well.

    # Using Dil to Pump Dil 

    ANEW, highly efficient, low-cost pumping system may bring new life-and profits -to oil fields abandoned as depleted. It uses oil under pressure to pump production oil up from the bottom of the deepest wells.

    Developed by the Kobe Hydraulic Pump Company of California, the operating unit of the system consists of a hydraulic engine connected to a double-acting piston displacement pump, both contained in a slender steel cylinder. This "free" pump does not have to be attached to the walls of the well pipe as do ordinary pumps, but is simply floated down to the bottom of the well where it is kept firmly seated and operating by a supply of power oil pushed down a feed line under pressure.

    The Kobe pump eliminates costly. steel derricks and big power plants. One man at one central motor-driven charging pump above ground can feed fluid power to hydraulic units at the bottom of a dozen wells. And units can be dropped down crooked wells, or those under water-wherever the power oil can be piped.

    Should the well-bottom pumping unit need repairs, the operator turns a valve reversing the power flow, and the $40-\mathrm{lb}$. cylinder slides up to the top of the well where it is caught and held by steel grippers.

    Copper-on-Plastic Book Ends. Here's a perfect wedding of two materials that carry out the modern mood. Burnished copper on sparkling crystal plastic creates a pair of book ends you'll be properly proud of. Simple plans appear on page 188.
    

    Runners Convert Wagon. Four small wheel runners quickly convert this child's wagon into a steerable sled for use in winter. Patented by Emil Lersch, of Pensacola, Fla., the ski-like, turned-up metal
    runners are each clamped firmly to a wheel of the wagon by a pair of side plates shaped to conform closely to the wheel's contours. In addition, angled braces between the runners and the axles provide lateral stability.
    

    Pot Works by Itself. This is a percolator you don't have to watch. As the boiling water rises through the tube, it flows from one side of the two-chambered pot to the other. Its weight tilts the rockered hot-plate base, turning the electric heat down but not off. Patented by Julian Meier, of Detroit, Mich., the percolator can be set to go on at any time.
    

    Car Pushes Its Dwn Plow. A small, lightweight snowplow that can be pushed by an ordinary automobile has been invented by Samuel Eliot, of Newton, Mass. Mounted on the front bumper, it has two
    screwlike, spiral sections that keep pushing the snow to either side of the car, clearing two wheel tracks. Four blades in the drum in the center dig into the snow one after another and keep the plow rotating.
    

    Ladder Has Several Uses. This novel ladder, formed of two $V$-shaped runged sections joined together by a pole, serves as a stepladder when folded in the middle. Laid out flat with side braces added to folding rungs in its central section, it becomes a straight ladder. Folded another way, it is a scaffolding support. It was invented by J. Anderson, of Vancouver, B. C.
    

    Tie Keeps Ends in Place. You'd never lose or forget the tie fastener patented by Joseph Johnson, of Islington, Mass. -it's sewed right onto the tie. Pulled through any one of a number of loops in the tie's longer end, a string attached to the shorter end is threaded back through a small hole and then wound around the nearest shirt button, holding the tie in place.
    

    Hearts and diamonds in varied hues, as well as countless other ornaments, may be shaped from plastic laminated with colored cement. Sold in liquid form ready for use,

    Using a brush, flow cement liberally over one face of a sheet of plastic, being careful to coat the entire surface. Cements of different colors will produce a rainbow effect.
    the cement is available in all basic colors. Like paint, two or more of these may be blended to make a desired shade. The heartshaped pendant was made as shown below.

    Laminating is accomplished by placing another plastic sheet over the cement. Slide it about, pressing out air bubbles by squeezing. Work fast; the cement dries quickly.

    # Lamminated Plastic Works Color Magic 

    By Maurice Lammon

    CEMENTS in various hues offer intriguing possibilities to the craftsman who works with plastic. Consisting of a dye in a plastic solvent, these cements are specifically intended for producing color in laminated sheets of clear plastic.
    As a rule, the laminating should be done before any finishing operations, since the excess dye spills over the edges and must be sanded off. Apply the cement with a brush, flooding it on quickly so as to coat the entire surface liberally. Slide about the other sheet of plastic to blend colors and work out all air bubbles with finger pressure. Work fast, for the cement begins to dry in seconds. Solid colors may be used, or several may be applied in streaks or splotches.
    If you'd like to duplicate the hearts pictured on these pages, laminate two $2^{\prime \prime}$ by $2^{\prime \prime}$ pieces of $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ or $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ clear plastic. Scribe the heart from a cardboard pattern, cut out with a hacksaw or coping saw, file to shape, and buff to a high polish. On a jigsaw, blade speed should be reduced, as fast cutting generates enough heat to weld the cut together.

    In making your selection of colors, go easy on the blue and green. These colors are much stronger than the others and are apt to overshadow the reds and yellows.

    Hacksaw the heart from the most colorful area of the plastic after scribing with a cardboard pattern. Rounded edges refract the light, making it colorful from any angle.
    

    Refracted light adds to the beauty of plastic laminated with colored cement. Viewed edge on, the joint shows only as a dark line. But bevel the edges and the color appears.

    Turn a screw eye into the edge for attaching a chain or cord. First, drill a hole slightly smaller than the shank of the screw eye, which will then turn firmly into the plastic.

    YOU push down the handle, wait . . . and the bread pops up all by itself, toasted to a turn. Ever stop to wonder how the toaster knows enough to brown your slice without burning it?

    Automatic toasters are mostly of two types-both ingenious. One has a thermostat that cooks with the toast and switches off the current after the right amount of heat. The other kind is timed by clockwork, but uses a thermostat to speed up the machinery when full heat is reached. Here is what goes on inside both types, shown in Toastmaster toasters through the courtesy of A. Lockyer of Toaster Appliance Sales and Service Co., New York City.
    

    Thermostat- and clock. work-controlled toaster.

    On this type, pushing down the big handle not only closes the switch but also winds up the clockwork timer and starts it ticking. Clockwork is in the box on far side, behind the hand. As in the thermostat type, the darkness control switch is at the lower right of the end of the toaster. The oven slides up and down on guide rods.
    

    ## How Your

    

    Here is a thermostat-controlled toaster just after the handle has been pushed down, dropping the bread carriage into the oven. This has closed the main switch, and both the toasting elements and the auxiliary heating unit around the thermostat have begun to glow. A latch holds carriage down against tension of the "pop-up" spring.

    The latch grips the bread carriage in the bottom position, but the clockwork is slowly lifting the handle back to the top. With it a cam is rising toward the roller latch release that will pop up the toast. A thermostat under the toaster, shown in the next picture, is speeding up the clockwork as the toasting elements get hotter.
    

    ## Automntic Tonster Worles

    

    Removal of bottom plate of toaster shows thermostat bar wrapped in its own heating unit. As it grows hot, bar bends along dotted line, pushing lever beside it to left. When lever is stopped by pin, it halts movement of center of thermostat bar, but heat keeps bending bar, forcing its tip to the right. Tip pushes switch to shut off current.

    Removing plate from underside reveals bimetallic thermostat, close to the left of the long "pop-up" spring. As it heats, the thermostat pushes the pin, just to the left of its lower end, that increases the speed of the clockwork. This enables the clockwork timer to allow for the varying efficiency of the heating elements as they heat up.
    
    

    As it cools, thermostat has straightened and released latch, allowing the carriage to pop up. The small control wheel on toaster end changes toasting time by pushing in or out the little pin that halts thermostat movement. Setting control at "light" pushes in pin so that it shortens time before thermostat tip bends, shutting off heat.

    At end of cycle, the clockwork allows the cam to push aside the roller, just above the handle in the center of the picture. This releases the latch holding the toast carriage, and the "pop-up" spring forces it up. At the same time the master switch, at lower left, opens, shutting off the current to the heating elements.
    
    
    

    ## Heal Planes Add Up to a Dream

    DON'T let this odd contraption fool you. It's artist-flier John T. McCoy, Jr.'s idea of how a giant air liner the size of the B-36 might look. Despite its unconventional design, its features have all seen actual use in past or present aircraft.

    The huge plane's canard, or "tail first," design places the passengers ahead of engine noise and fire hazards, and provides a

    forward view unobstructed by a large wing. The bicycle landing gear saves weight, permits a thinner wing and helps eliminate gear failure, since the wheels retract into the fuselage and can be checked in flight.

    Ex-Major McCoy, who has been flying airplanes since 1926 and drawing pictures of them even longer, has full confidence in the flying ability of his creation.

    TODAY the lowly nail is just as hard to come by as an automobile-for about the same reason. Demand far exceeds supply. Not only is building booming, but the nail is the end product of a long, complicated, steel making process. Nails must compete for raw materials with a host of other products. So even though steel men shipped 422,500 tons of nails last year, and are topping that record this year, you may still have to hunt quite a while for the right nail to mend your roof.

    Colonial farmers hand-forged their nails during the long winters. Nails then were prized possessions, hoarded and straightened for re-use, often spent as money. Later, cut nails were made by machine, and since 1850 wire nails have been colddrawn. Increasing mechanization has made nails more highly specialized, until today

    ## here's how they are made.

    more than 1,200 species of nails are produced for as many different, distinct uses.

    They range from 15 -iach boat spikes, weighing 1 lb . 10 oz . each, to $3 / 16$-inch escutcheon pins, fine as a needle, running 95,000 to the pound. In between lie all kinds of nails, including the common bright ones in sizes from 3 - to 20 -penny, ${ }^{\circ}$ most widely used for housing and general purposes. There are barbed nails and cementcoated nails for jobs where extra holding power is required, as in making boxes and trunks. There are leakproof roofing nails, with a perfectly flat head surmounted by a tiny boss so that the hammer blow will not deform it. There are special precise brads with sharp diamond-shaped points for automatic flooring machines. Sterilized nails, with a characteristic blue color, are made for the benefit of lathers who put them in their mouths. Corrugated nails are popular where the hammer head might slip. There are special nails for gypsum board, egg
    *One theory holds that in England nails were once sold by the penny; hence, a 10 -penny nail was the size of which 100 cost 10 pence. An equally tenable idea is that 1,00010 -penny nails used to weigh 10 pounds, 1,000 16 -penny nails, 16 pounds, etc. Whatever its origin, the penny system is now universal.
    

    Here are steel ingots waiting to be made into rod, wire, and nails. Each $25-$ by 30 -inch ingot is seven feet long, weighs six or seven tons.
    crates, berry boxes; there are dating and marking nails, and even nails with two heads, one below the other, to make it easy to pull them out.

    Let's take just one group of nails-wire nails-and see how they are made. First, just any steel won't do. Nail steel must be worked both hot and cold. It can't be too soft or too hard. It must not oxidize too

    From billet to finished nail, the steel passes through the stages shown above. Previously, the big seven-ton ingot had a seven-minute workout
    in the blooming mill. There it first became an eight-inch-square bloom, 50 feet long; then a four-inch-square billet, 227 feet long.

    Eight-inch-square bloom becomes a four-inchsquare billet in this mill. Here bloom passes through the fifth stand. In process it is twisted three times for good grain and structure.

    In a reeking, noisy pit, steel rod is reeled after leaving finishing mill at $40 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$. Over entrance of intensely hot pit, operator has scrawled: "Have you visited Hell's Kitchen?"
    

    A 9/16-inch-square rod leaves the roughing mill. The rod, roughly diamond-shaped, is moving about $81 / 3$ feet a second as it passes through a flying shear that crops off the damaged ends.

    After cooling, the $400-\mathrm{lb}$. rod bundles are picked off onto a hook conveyer, inspected, and labeled to show hearth and heat numbers. Steel never loses its identity in entire process.
    
    rapidly during milling. Most wire nails are made of good low-carbon steel, relatively free of phosphorus and sulphur.

    In the huge Sparrows Point plant of the Bethlehem Steel Co., near Baltimore, the steel is made from Chilean ore, West Virginia coal, and Pennsylvania limestone. A "heat" of steel, generally 175 to 200 tons, is ladled into molds that form seven-ton ingots. As it rolls into the blooming mill, each ingot is almost white-hot, crusted heavily with scale that it has acquired enroute. The job of the mill operator is to reduce the ingot to a "bloom" 50 feet long and eight inches square. Because rolling deforms the ends of the bloom, it is cropped fore and aft by a powerful steam-driven, up-cut shear after it has been reduced.

    The eight-by-eight bloom is run through the big rollers 15 or 20 times. Here it is squeezed through six stands of a smaller rolling mill that leaves the billet 227 feet long and squared off so that it will measure four inches on a side when cold. The four-by-four, still glowing, is reduced to a two-by-two and cut into 30 -foot lengths for convenient handling and just the right size for working into rod.

    In the rod and wire mill, the two-bytwos are heated to a uniform $2,000^{\circ}$ in a continuous furnace. The billets enter the first of seven stands in the roughing mill, creeping at a foot a second, and come out of the last stand in the form of diamondshaped steel rod, roughly $9 / 16$ inch on a side, speeding about 20 miles per hour. Again, flattened ends are cropped off, and the rod goes through 10 stands of the finishing mill, roaring out at a 50 -mile-anhour clip, still white hot. Now and then a rod becomes a "cobble"-it misses its roll and runs wild. Usually, however, the rod coils up smoothly into 400 -pound "bundles."

    After cooling, inspection, and labeling on a continuous hook conveyer, the bundles of rod are packed off to the cleaning house.

    Cleaning is an important step. After the hot-drawing into rod, the steel is worked cold. Surface impurities and scale, being far harder than steel, won't draw into wire and play hob with the accurate tungstencarbide dies. So the bundles are pickled in hot dilute sulphuric acid, then rinsed, limed, and baked.

    Modern high-speed wire-drawing machines are capable of turning out 20 tons of wire per shift. In three drafts, 10 -gauge rod can be reduced to five-gauge wire, with a consequent increase in length. The collecting reel generally takes up finished wire at about $20 \mathrm{~m} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{h}$.

    Now a shiny, smooth wire, the steel is finally ready to be made into nails. The process is deafening and nerve-shattering, because nail-making is largely a matter of the terrific impact of steel against steel. In the nail mill, automatic machines turn out large sizes, such as 12 -inch dock spikes, at the rate of 90 per minute; half-inch, 20 gauge nails emerge at 600 per minute.

    The wire is not fed into the nail machine continuously but in a series of jerks, ramming just enough wire into the gripper dies to make one nail. At the start of the cycle, enough wire projects beyond the grippers to form the head when a cam-driven hammer rises up and slams forward to upset it. By changing the hammer and the gripper dies, which act as the anvil, any type of head can be put on a nail: flat, oval, round, countersunk, corrugated, numbered, or bossed.

    After the head has been formed, the gripper dies spring apart, the hammer cocks again, the headed wire moves forward and two cutters bite off the finished nail with

    Rod bundles are next dipped in hot sulphuric acid to remove scale, then rinsed in water, silica-soda solution, and lime. Then they are baked for 20 minutes to harden the lime coating.

    After removal from the oven the coils are greyish white. The lime coat forms a foundation for lubrication needed while rod is converted into wire by cold-drawing through dies.

    other, are polished; sawdust picks up the oil, grease, and little slivers of waste steel. Poured out of the drum, the nails are shaken into the standard $100-\mathrm{lb}$. kegs you see in the hardware stores.

    For many nails, however, tumbling is by no means the final operation. Cold-working makes the nail brittle; where a softer product is needed, as in clinching hinge nails, they are annealed in a furnace. Galvanized nails for outdoor work and roofing are tumbled in a bottom-heated drum containing flake zinc and a sal-ammoniac flux. When the zinc melts it flows evenly over the nails, coating them protectively, while the tumbling keeps the nails from sticking together. Cement-coated nails (which are not really cement-coated) are made by tumbling nails in a mixture of pitch and resins in solution. When the solvent evaporates, the coating becomes hard and smooth. The heat caused by driving a coated nail melts the mixture enough to "glue" the nail to the wood. Plated nails get that way in an electroplating bath, and painted nails are tumbled in a thin paint solution. Needle-pointed nails can never be tumbled; they have to be kept free from grease during manufacture and made so carefully that they have no whiskers when they emerge from the machines.

    Short nails can be barbed with deep notches by special gripper dies; longer ones call for barbing rolls on the nail machine.
    

    Now the hammer has struck, flattening the projecting wire to form the nail head. In a moment, the wire will move to the left, ready to be cut off as a nail. The 8 -penny nail, whose manufacture is shown here, is the most popular size of the most useful nail in the world.

    Besides cement-coating, nails can be acidetched or equipped with "fetter rings"small circlets formed by gripper dies below the head.

    The best nail for the job is the type with the greatest holding power that causes the least distortion of the wood fibers. One of the reasons for the seemingly fantastic variety of nails is this necessity for maximum holding power in even more varied uses and materials. Where there's a will to join wood, leather, rubber, metal, or many other materials, there's usually a nail.

    ## Fiber Scales May Shrink Wool

    Why does wool shrink? One theory is that once the fibers draw together, as they do when wet, the scales on the fibers prevent their being pulled apart again.

    ## X-Rays Developed Automatically

    Doctors now can read X-rays an hour after they are taken. A completely automatic machine, developed during the war for processing industrial X-ray film, is being installed in hospitals that handle large quantities of X-ray work. Films ride a conveyer through developer, hypos, fix, wash and dryer at the rate of one per minute. In an emergency film can be read while still wet, after only nine minutes of processing.

    ## They Still Cut Ice the Old Way

    HARVEST time is approaching on the Black River at Carthage, N. Y., where the New York Central Railroad still cuts an annual crop of natural ice. It will cool next summer's milk cars, passengers' drinking water, and be used in cabooses for the convenience of freight-train crews.

    When the railroad started cutting ice on the river in 1901, it was a big operation. A
    decade ago 35,000 tons were cut every winter. But modern refrigeration methods, especially milk tank cars that work on the principle of a Thermos bottle, have cut into the operation. When one of two storage houses burned down, it wasn't rebuilt.

    Even so, the New York Central is probably the biggest harvester of natural ice in the country nowadays. This winter the railroad expects to cut an estimated 12,000 tons of ice at Carthage and other cutting areas.

    During severe winters, with three and four feet of snow on the ground and the temperature down to $20^{\circ}$ below, 100 men and at least two teams of horses are needed to keep the work moving. Old-timers recall a record freeze when the ice was cut 32 inches thick, making individual cakes that weighed 736 pounds, or almost two-fifths of a ton for each chunk.

    2. Horse-drawn scrapers are first on the job, cleaning snow off the ice. The sheet must be frozen to a thickness of at least 12 inches before the harvesting operation can begin.

    3. To provide room to work, first cakes are sawed by hand. End of the field is located upstream from storage house so that river current can help move ice down to conveyers.

    6. As the cakes move along the length of the icehouse, men with hooks stand at each of the eight entrances to the storage rooms and pull the cakes inward at the rate of one a minute.
    
    7. Floats of five cakes ride the channel. As these approach the conveyer, barring forks are used to split them through below the point reached by the saw, producing single cakes.
    
    8. As the individual cakes move up, a planer shaves off slush and gives a rough surface to the ice for easier handling. Fourteen-inches of ice produce cakes weighing 322 pounds.
    
    9. At 10 miles an hour, the cakes slither down a chute to the packing crews. Keyman is the switcher, who must catch the quarter-ton blocks and guide them to where packers are working.
    

    ## House Tests Heat Flow

    If anyone is cold in this house, it won't be for lack of heat-the house has nine complete heating systems, while scores of special heat-measuring gadgets take its temperature by the square foot.

    Built by the National Bureau of Standards to test heat distribution and equipment, the bungalow was equipped with gas, oil, and electric heaters of various types, with meters to determine heat loss through walls, floors, and ceilings; thermocouples for temperature variations; and recording thermometers. The house itself, since enclosed in an insulated shell, follows plans widely used for low-cost homes, with the exception of wall insulation and weatherstripping.

    Chief discovery was that many heating systems produce wide temperature varia-
    

    Closely spaced thermocouples, suspended from the ceiling throughout the house, register minute temperature variations at different levels.
    tions between foot and head levels, which, for health and comfort, should not exceed $15^{\circ}$, say engineers. So far, top honors have gone to a hot-water furnace, which squeezed the difference down to a mere $5^{\circ}$, and an electric heater and a gas heater, both equipped with blowers, which held the difference to $10^{\circ}$.
    

    ## Sphere Maps End Errors

    The problem of navigating a round world with a flat map may be solved by the use of curved maps that eliminate the distortions of flat projections-distortions that complicate long-range, high-speed flight planning.

    Devised by Col. Carl J. Crane, U. S. Air

    Force, the slightly curved maps are actually sections of what, if assembled, would be a giant, 17 -foot globe. Formed of translucent plastic, they can be fitted into the plotting table, at left above, and sections necessary for a particular flight can be carried in a plane. A special version of the air map is shown folded on the right.
    

    This toy jeep may look complicated, but new construction set's clips make it easy to build.

    ## Clipping a Toy Together

    TAKE some straight and curved rods, snap them together with steel clips, add a few wooden wheels, and you have built the toy jeep shown above.

    Secret of the new construction set, made by the Clip-Craft Corp., of New York City, is in the specially tempered steel clips that hold the aluminum parts tightly in place. Their edges are rounded and turned outward, so that a slight finger-tip pressure is all that is needed to insert the rods and arcs; dismantling is just as easy. The snapaction clips take the place of screws, nuts, and bolts, and make tools of any kind unnecessary for building even the most complicated structures.

    Flat sheets of aluminum are furnished for covering surfaces of the models and for fashioning fins for planes. The wooden wheels can be used for gears and pulleys.
    

    Using only these basic parts, hundreds of different toys can be clipped together. Arcs can be used to form complete circles.
    

    These are a few of the joints that can be formed by combinations of the rods, ares, and clips.

    A bearing added to a joint makes it a support for rotating or sliding shafts.

    ## Intemnal lives Plane Ratidios Hilobial Rangee

    GLOBAL air power needs global radio communication. The United States Air Force has both. Recently a flight of B-29 Superfortresses left Tokyo bound for Washington on a one-stop flight. Forty minutes out, they turned on their radios and a few twists of the dials brought them into direct contact with headquarters-on-the-Potomac, some 6,000 miles away.

    The planes didn't have any special equipment, used their standard liaison radio sets. Something new had been added in Washington, however-a "rotary beam parasitic array antenna" that literally tracks a plane along every mile of its flight any place in the world.

    Known to radio hams for years, but used heretofore only for point-to-point transmission and receiving (PSM, Aug. '47, p. 92), this was the first use of the system for longrange air-ground radio communications.

    The first transmission from the planes in flight gave map co-ordinates of their position, their indicated airspeed, altitude, and course. The radio operators in Washington then calculated the approximate position of the planes at the next scheduled transmission. The rotating beam was swung to bear on the expected position, and when the planes began sending, the antenna was tuned until the strongest possible signal was received.

    With emphasis on long range both in military and commercial planes, the advantage of instantaneous communication with a flight, no matter how distant, is obvious. Another advantage is the compactness of the new ground antenna unit, plus the push-button action that swings the tracking antenna completely around the compass in less than a minute.
    

    Brain center of the long-range communications setup is this control board. Center telephone panel connects directly with tactical headquar-
    ters, which normally would be some distance away. Receiving and transmitting antennas are also separated to avoid interference.

    ## Wetter Water Melps Douse Fires

    TO PUT out fires faster, fire departments now can get a chemical that, added to ordinary water, makes it "wetter." The chemical, produced by the American-La-France-Foamite Corp., of Elmira, N. Y., breaks the microscopic film normally sur-

    rounding water droplets. Mixed one part to 100 of water, the chemical, called Penetrate, gives the water a fast-spreading and penetrating quality that strikes at the heart of deep-seated, smoldering fires. It is no more harmful to materials than plain water.
    

    Similar sponge, dropped in wetter water, sank to bottom in three minutes because the chemical had broken surface tension of the water.

    Device Grips Hot Pans. Operated like a pair of pliers, this stainless-steel kitchen tool is designed for easy handling of hot pans or plates. Priced at about $\$ 1$, it is made by the Taylor Products Manufacturing Company, of Colorado Springs, Colo.
    

    Thermostat Saves Heat. Fully automatic, a time-control thermostat announced by the Minneapolis-Honeywell Regulator Company, Minneapolis, Minn., includes a new electrical mechanism that prevents the heater from overshooting the daytime temperature limit during the morning. External controls permit easy setting.
    

    Lamp Has Switch on Top. A table lamp made by Homecraft Electronic Products, of Chicago, has the switch conveniently located on top of the shaft, eliminating the need of reaching under the shade. Using a circular 32 -watt fluorescent tube for diffused light, the lamp has a brass base and wood shaft. Various shades are offered.
    

    Toy Has Three-Way Action. This wooden rocker is designed to give a child an active ride. When the arms set the rockers in motion, the feet move up and down with the platform on which they rest, and the seat glides back and forth. The rocker is built by Hall Industries, Inc., of Chicago. It costs approximately $\$ 9$.
    

    Stand Turns Yule Tree. Powered by a small AC motor, this stand not only supports a Christmas tree but turns it at the rate of three revolutions a minute.     # Nlost Flits fre Your Own Finlt 

    Hy R. P. Stevenson

    WHEN one of your tires goes suddenly flat along the highway, perhaps miles in the country on a dark and blustery night, it's a pretty safe bet that you might have detected the impending trouble and taken steps to prevent it. There's evidence to prove that some 90 percent of all such inconvenient tire failures can be avoided.

    This doesn't mean you must scan every inch of the roadbed ahead for nails and tacks. Anyone is apt to puncture a tire now and then, and even the most careful driver occasionally bumps a rock or curb with sufficient force to break the fabric. Such damage almost invariably results in a flat. But -and this is a fact that drivers often fail to realize-complete failure may not come for days, and perhaps weeks. In the interval, there usually is ample opportunity to detect the symptoms of forthcoming failure and repair the tire before it hangs you up along the road.

    Tires are built to give their maximum mileage under operating conditions over
    

    Overinflation wears the tread in the center, leaving the fringes in fairly good condition. Because of abnormal tension, such a tire also is more susceptible to cuts and tread breaks.
     correct wheel alignment. proper adjustment and efficient use of brakes, and avoidance of damaging road obstacles. Carelessness about any of these points may quickly ruin a tire. Examples of such damage are illustrated on this and the preceding page.
    When a tire has been badly worn or damaged because of one of these reasons, it may of course go flat or blow out without warning. But suppose a comparatively new and
    

    Underinflation, especially if it is excessive, may have this unexpected result-heavy wear only on the shoulders. For the cost of underinflation, see the chart on the next page.
    

    Sudden braking causes one end of each tread button to wear more than t.ie other, heaviest wear occurring on the end that first contacts the road. This is known as heel-and-toe wear.
    

    Steering geometry involves proper relationship of camber, caster, king-pin angle, and toe-in
    (which requires that $A$ be less than B.) If any element is off, undue tire wear will result.
    vantage. It is the basis of a method of preventive maintenance developed by $A$. Schrader's Son, of Brooklyn, N. Y., a division of the Scovill Manufacturing Company, Inc. Called the "Comparative Air-Loss System," this method of preventing tire failure emphasizes that any excess loss of pressure, as shown by regular gauging, should be regarded as a warning that the tire has been damaged and will eventually go flat.

    The system embraces four points:

    1. Gauging of tires when they are cool, once each week before adding air.
    2. Recording and careful comparison of the pressures. If the pressure of one tire is 3 lb . below its running mate, there probably is a leak in the tube, and the cause should be immediately determined.
    3. Keeping a valve cap firmly applied at all times, not only to prevent air loss in case the valve is faulty but also to restrict any source of leakage to the tube.
    4. Removal of foreign objects from the tire surface when the car is lubricated.

    Originated during the war as a tire conservation measure, the system was featured
    
    

    Warning of a flat tire is contained in this record. The excess pressure loss in the right
    front tire indicates a slow leak. If a flat is to be avoided, this tire should be checked at once.
    in a bulletin distributed to branches of the armed forces and to bus and truck fleet operators. That it produces results is shown by the experience of one company operating a fleet of trucks. Before adopting the system, the company had an average of three flats a day. Subsequently, the same trucks ran for six months and one day, a total of 236,000 miles, before the first roadside flat occurred.

    The system can be applied to passenger cars with equal results, and a test on a 1946 model, reported by the Schrader company, shows why. At the beginning of the test, the car still had the original tires and tubes and already had run 11,284 miles. While cool, the tires were inflated to 28 lb . Then, 20 nails were deliberately driven into the four tires, and the car was started out on a test run at above average speed. At the end of five days, the tires were reinflated to 28 lb. , after first being gauged. At that time, despite the presence of the 20 nails, the greatest air loss for any tire was 10 lb . On each day thereafter, the tires were brought back to 28 lb .

    Finally, after the car had been driven 1,051 miles, one tire dropped from 28 to 10 lb . pressure, and then went completely flat after the car had been standing about 10 minutes. The second gave out at the end of 11 days and the third after 16. It was not until the 18 th day, after 1,844 miles of driving, that the fourth suddenly went flat on the road. If any one of these tires had been punctured accidentally, the excessive
    amount of air required to keep it properly inflated should have been taken as a warning.

    One important point to remember in applying the air-loss system is that tires should be gauged and inflated only while they are cool; that is, at atmospheric temperature. During operation, normal flexing of a tire generates heat, and the heat causes the pressure to increase, possibly several pounds. If a tire is inflated-or deflated-at this time to what is assumed to be correct pressure, it will be underinflated when cool.

    To make the air-loss system work to your best advantage, it is therefore advisable to have your own hand gauge and use it before moving the car from the garage. Then, if no tire shows an excessive loss, you can drive to a filling station and bring them up as needed. But if one does show a sudden drop, better investigate at once. END
    

    Gauge your tires weekly, taking the reading after the car has stood at least two hours.
    

    Arm Rest Is Removable. Although designed particularly to support the driver's right arm on long trips, this arm rest also may be used by a passenger in either the front or rear seat. If turned sideways, the foam-rubber cushion also doubles as a high chair for a youngster. A broad metal base keeps the rest upright while in use. Manufactured by the Perlin Perfect Products Company, of Chicago, the rest sells for about $\$ 3.50$. It stows away compactly when not in use.
    

    Key Springs from Lock. Designed to prevent drivers from leaving the ignition key in the lock, a key case manufactured by Robert Hetherington \& Son, Inc., of Sharon Hill, Pa., contains a spring that causes the key and case to spring out into the hand as soon as the ignition is turned off. It retails for about 40 cents.

    Cantion Sign Reflects Light. A caution sign introduced by Strayline Products Co., of Dobbs Ferry, N. Y., measures $9^{\prime \prime}$ by $24^{\prime \prime}$ and stands $24^{\prime \prime}$ high, but it may be collapsed into a compact bundle for storage. Made of aluminum, the sign has reflecting letters that are clearly visible up to $250^{\prime}$ at night. It sells for about $\$ 3$.
    

    Hand Throttle Rests Foot. Pivoted under the steering column so it may be swung right or left for use by either hand, this hand throttle is connected to the carburetor by a flexible wire and may be used interchangeably with the foot accelerator. The throttle is placed so that it does not interfere with operation of the gear shift, gas being fed by drawing the lever gently upward toward the steering wheel. Made by Trans Continental Industries, Inc., of St. Louis, Mo., it sells for about $\$ 6$.
    

    Awnings Are Transparent. Made of transparent plastic in blue or smoky green, these car-door awnings provide shade without materially reducing the visibility. In addition, they afford protection from rain and snow. Introduced by the Toadroy Manufacturing Co., of Wellington, Kan., they sell at $\$ 13.50$ to $\$ 19$ a pair.
    

    ## AUTO HINTS

    1. How to Thaw a Radiator. Hot water poured against a frozen radiator in a narrow path from top to bottom directly over the lower hose connection will thaw a strip $2^{\prime \prime}$ or $3^{\prime \prime}$ wide and restore circulation. When the motor is started, the hot water inside the thawed tubes will soon free the entire radiator. A length of hose slipped over the kettle spout will enable you to reach inaccessible spots.-E. R. Walshaw.
    2. Belts Serve as Chains. Heavy V-belts wired to a wheel as illustrated work well as emergency chains. I always carry a few for that purpose.-George E. Tomlin.
    B. Inexpensive Flares. Waxed milk containers may be used effectively as flares to warn oncoming traffic when you must make car repairs along a highway at night. Ignited at the top with a match, they burn like torches for five or six minutes. A small stone dropped in the bottom will keep the wind from tipping them.-N. W. Goodwin.
    3. Turner Cleans Dff Snow. An ordinary pancake turner carried among your tools will prove a convenience when next you return to your parked car and find the windshield and rear window coated with clinging snow. It may also be used to chip ice off the windshield.-W. E. Pritchard.

"I was driving along at about forty with the car running swell-just like it had been running ever since I left here-all of a sudden there was the darndest clatter you ever heard. The sound seemed to come from the crankcase. I figured it was a burnedout connecting-rod bearing that was just about to let go. This happened 'way out in the sticks, but I spotted a sign saying there was a garage and repair shop 15 miles further on. I decided to take a chance that the bearing would hold out until I got there. The clatter didn't let up, but it didn't get much louder, and I made it.
    "The fellow who ran the garage could probably find a flat tire if you pointed it out to him, so to save time I said I thought it was a burned-out rod bearing. After he fooled around for 15 minutes he reckoned I was right. I let him go ahead and fix it, and went down the main drag to get something to eat. When I got back he had the crankcase all unbuttoned. He said that all six rods were bad and I'd have to have new ones. Frankly, they didn't look too bad to me, but I was still hoping he knew what it was all about, so I asked what the job would cost. He quoted more than twice what we would have charged for it, and we had an argument. But in the end I told him to go ahead.
    "He sent his grease monkey 20 miles to get the rods, and when he finally got started I could see he was strictly a left-handed mechanic. At last-late in the afternoon-he got the rods installed and the engine back together. Everything was fine-except that she wouldn't run! That reformed black-
    smith stood there scratching his head. He suggested one thing after another that might be the matter, but I could see he was up a tree. I told him that if he found out what was wrong and fixed it I'd pay him for the job, but I wasn't going to pay for putting in six new rods that weren't needed. We had another argument. He threatened to phone the constable and have my bus held, so in the end I had to come across. By that time I was so sore I wouldn't let him try anything else. I found a fellow to help me roll the car out into the street, and then I called you . . . What do you think can be the matter with the old bus?"
    "Soon find out," Gus grunted.

    He cleared the oil passage with a piece of wire, and rolled what he got out of it between his thumb and forefinger. "Solid sludge," was his verdict. "It stopped lubrication of the gears; heat and friction did the rest. I wonder-"

    He got an old drinking glass from his bench, washed it, drained a little oil from the crankcase into it, and held it up to the light. "Your oil is foul with sludge and muck," he said. "No wonder you had trouble-the surprising thing is that you didn't have more of it." He looked hard at his partner. "I told you to fill up with fresh oil before you started. Did you forget to do it?"
    "Of course I didn't forget to do it!" Joe snapped. "What do you think I am-a
    dope? Why, I even used heavy-duty oilthat new premium stuff we got in just before I left. The oil-company salesman had been telling me how it keeps sludge and such stuff suspended instead of letting it settle in the oil pan, and I figured that using it on my trip would be a swell way to clean out my engine. When I got to Pittsburgh I checked the oil level. The dip stick was as shiny as new-the oil had cleaned all that sticky brown stuff off it, so I knew it was doing the job the salesman said it would."

    Gus stared at his partner. "And you didn't change the oil?"

    Joe looked surprised. "No. Why should I? I'd gone under 1,000 miles and there was plenty in the crankcase. What's all this about, Gus? Aren't the new premium oils any good?"
    "Sure, they're good," Gus assured him. "So is dynamite or TNT or atomic powerif you know how to use 'em. But premium, or heavy-duty, or detergent oil-they all mean pretty much the same thing-can cause a lot of trouble if you don't use it right. So much trouble in fact that some of the oil companies aren't recommending it for passenger cars."

    Joe looked horrified. "That's bad!" he said in a worried voice. "I haven't sold any of it yet, but I've talked it up to several customers. We'll be behind the eight ball if any of them take my word for it and get in trouble, the way I did."
    "That's all right," Gus reassured him. "You can go right ahead recommending it for cleaning out engines, and for all-thetime use by drivers who make long trips at high speed-so long as you make darn sure that the people you sell it to know how to use it."

    JOE pointed to the broken timing gear. "That doesn't look as if I know how to use it. If it's that tricky-"
    "There's nothing tricky about it," Gus interrupted, "if you stop to think that a detergent oil is just what it claims to be-a purging oil. While it lubricates, it cleans off the sludge and other muck-the waste products of combustion-that accumulate on the innards of an automobile engine. Usually there is a dispersant in these oils, a chemical that is added to keep dirt and sludge suspended, instead of allowing them to settle into the oil pan. What you've got to remember is that the detergent cleans the accumulated sludge off the engine parts
    but not out of the engine until it is drained off with the oil.
    "Your car has been driven over a hundred thousand miles, mostly short runs, without ever having its oil pan down, so its engine must be pretty dirty. I've been meaning to clean it up for you, but since we've always babied the car and it continued to run well, I never got around to it. You put in detergent oil and then drove from here to Pittsburgh and three-quarters of the way backsay 750 miles. That long run gave the purging oil a good chance to do its job, and it did it. The trouble was that it cleaned so much sludge out of the engine and into the oil that the oil passages couldn't digest it. They clogged up. The jet that sprays oil between the crankshaft drive gear and the camshaft gear was plugged solid with hard, hightemperature sludge. If the resulting breaking of the timing gear hadn't laid you out on the road, you probably would have burned out a bearing-the bearing lubricating tubes are nearly filled up."
    "And still," Joe growled, "you say there's nothing tricky about detergent oil!"
    "There isn't," Gus said. "Not if you change it before the sludge it has cleaned off the engine parts has a chance to do any damage. For an engine that's just average dirty, the oil should be drained, and the crankcase flushed, after about 300 miles, and again after another 500 miles. But for an engine that's really dirty, the first change should be made after only about 100 miles. You can't do any harm by changing the oil too soon-but you can do a lot of harm by not changing it soon enough."
    "You've got something there," Joe admitted. "Now if you can get my bus rolling, maybe I'll take a little drive."
    "What for?" Gus asked apprehensively. "You aren't figuring on trying to collect the dough you spent for the con-rod job?"
    "Naw." The co-owner of the model garage smiled sheepishly. "We got a college right here in town, and I'm thinking it's about time I took that quickie course in mechanics you've been talking about." END

    MEXICAN craftsmen introduced this patio furniture to the Southwest. Working with primitive tools and materials, they have managed to fashion such comfortable and eye-appealing pieces that the supply of imported chairs and taborets like those illustrated has fallen hopelessly behind the
    

    Date-palm fronds are used in this Mexican original, but $1 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ " splints may be easier to obtain.
    demand. If you have a spot in your porch or garden that calls for this rustic furniture, you'll find that the quickest way to fill the vacancy is to build it yourself.

    The drawing shows a simplified adaptation of the original; it can be made with jackknife, saw, and hand drill. Willow withes or other flexible branches that may be picked up in the woods are ideal for the frame. Hickory or ash should be used for the seat and base hoops, and $1 / 3^{\prime \prime}$ lattice splints for the diagonals that join them. Rawhide or raffia, and cowhide or canvas, in any combination, serve for the lacing and seat and back.

    Soak or steam the ash or hickory and bend it around a rough form to make the three semicircular hoops needed for the chair. Bind them to the four legs with rawhide or raffia set in casein glue or shellac. The curved top frame and arms are installed next, and the diagonal slats are bound inside the hoops as shown. Rawhide strips are crisscrossed over the seat to support the cowhide or canvas cover, which is then fitted and laced in place. Seat and back are cut separately, and each piece is laced tightly in its frame.-Hi Sibley.

    ## Swinging Doors Close Dff Kitehen

    

    Fit the doors with brass hardware. Hang them to swing either one or both ways as desired.

    BESIDES being a convenience, swinging doors of the ship's-cabin type bring a note of distinction to a doorway between the kitchen and dining room. The dimensions and requirements given in the above drawing are for two doors to suit a $3^{\prime}$ by $7^{\prime}$ doorway.

    Stiles and rails may be made from $1 / 2^{\prime \prime \prime}$ door stock (it measures $15 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ net), cut to size, and joined by blind end laps pinned with ${ }_{8}^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $5^{\prime \prime}$ dowels.
    

    Chisel out each noteh after cutting kerfs as shown in the drawing. Space them 17s" apart.
    

    Notches may be cut in the stiles for the slats by first making a saw kerf $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ deep ${ }_{88}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ from the edge and then sawing away a $1 / 4 "$ section of this cut. At the points where the three rails join the stile, chisel out to the bottom of the first saw cut. Then mark off the notches $1^{7 / 8^{\prime \prime}}$ apart to allow the slats to overlap slightly, and chisel out the notches. Alternatively, notches might be made by cutting wedges and gluing them into a rabbet.-Edward R. Lucas.
    

    Overlap the slats slightly and glue them in position. Also glue all the joints of the frame.

    ## Fletricic llock Pliays Illusic onithe Hour

    Hy R. J. De Cristoforo

    IF YOU are looking for a project worthy of becoming a real heirloom piece, here's one with absolutely no strikes against it-an electric clock housed in a handsome case along with a Swiss music-box movement that plays music on the hour, every hour. A toggle switch mounted on the back and wired into the circuit makes it possible to shut off the music during the night if you wish.

    Selection of the music movement deserves a lot of care. The unit shown has a large drum and plays two tunes to each revolution. In any event, since you will be hearing it so often, make certain you choose one that especially appeals to you and your family. Perhaps a movement can be salvaged; if not, one can be bought from a mail-order supply house.

    Before starting the project, it is advisable to study the drawings and photographs thoroughly to get a clear picture of the action and construction. You will note that a pin on the clock minute-hand gear triggers the action. Revolving once an hour, this pin momentarily presses together two electrical contacts-just long enough for the musicmechanism motor to turn the music drum until two other spring contacts are pressing firmly against a brass disk on one end of the drum. This completes the main circuit, and the drum then makes a full revolution, stopping only when one of the latter contacts drops into a notch in the brass disk and breaks the circuit. When the next hour rolls around, the pin again closes the first pair of contacts and the cycle repeats.

    Selection of the electric clock itself is an important feature, since it may have a face
    of a size or shape that will necessitate altering the case. For this reason, it probably will be best to leave the case until last, and start by assembling the music mechanism on the sliding bottom shown in the photo and drawing at right.

    Availability undoubtedly will determine your selection of a motor to run the music movement. In browsing through various stores, I found a dozen or so different motors that appeared suitable for the job. When tested, however, several lacked sufficient torque to turn the movement. I finally came across a capacitor type with a built-in gear box that turns at 2 r.p.m.-just the speed required.

    Wiring for this motor is shown, but if any ordinary motor having only two power leads is used, connect it at $A$ and $B$ in the drawing. If you should use a larger or smaller music unit, check the speed of the drum while turning under the original spring power and then buy or gear down a motor to turn the movement at this speed.

    A capacitor was included in this circuit to make sure the induction motor would start immediately, but it is optional. A slight delay in starting should not make any serious difference.

    Take the music movement apart and discard everything except the drum and reed comb. The drum may be mounted as indicated in the drawing, or you may prefer to hacksaw the original casting and utilize its parts as I did. Mount the brass contact disk with two small screws after drilling and tapping suitable holes in the drum. The size of the notch in the disk is best determined after you have noted how much the motor overruns when the current is cut. Locate the notch directly opposite a blank space on the drum so the music will stop at the end of a tune-not in the middle.

    A gear also may be screwed to the drum, or if you prefer it could be soldered in place. To simplify the job, the large gear was attached directly against the original one in my clock. Before operating the mechanism, be careful to see that the motor turns the drum in the right direction, for turning it in reverse might ruin the reeds.

    After the motor, gears, and music assembly are in place on the mounting board, set up the two spring contacts and apply the current while one is in the circuit-breaking notch. Then push this spring with your finger to complete the circuit and allow the drum to make a complete revolution. If the

    motor overruns enough to allow the spring to jump the notch, lengthen the latter slightly with a file so that it will not.

    When this part of the project is operating successfully, make the two upper contacts and mount them on a piece of wood. Then include them in the circuit and again apply the current to check the action.

    It is now time to think about the clock to be used. An inexpensive kitchen model will do the job if you can find one with a face that pleases you.

    When you have located the minute-hand gear, the one that makes one revolution an hour, attach the trigger pin to it, being careful to see that the pin does not interfere in any way with the rest of the clock movement. In the clock that I used, this gear is readily accessible, but in some it may not be. This is a point to bear in mind when selecting the clock.

    Another is the fact that in the ordinary electric kitchen clock the gears do not turn when the hands are operated manually to set the timepiece. Because of this, you will face the problem of synchronizing the clock and music movement so you will get your tunes on the hour-and not somewhere between. Such clocks can be adjusted so that moving the hands will move the gears, but this is a job that will vary with each indi-
    vidual clock. Rather than go to this trouble, it is suggested that when the clock and music mechanisms are complete you follow this procedure:

    Apply the current until the music starts to play, but cut it off immediately. Then set the hands of the clock to the next exact hour. When another timepiece shows that this hour has rolled around, apply current and let the clock go.

    Since it is necessary to synchronize the mechanisms in this manner only when you first set them going, the setting procedure is not enough of a drawback to discourage you from using an inexpensive clock. Of course, if you have a clock in which the gears turn as the hands are set you can forget about this operation.

    Straight-grained walnut with an oil finish will give the clock case a handsome appearance. After jigsawing the face of the case to the pattern in the drawing, cement a piece of tapestry cloth over the back of the lower scrollwork, and attach the clock with bent metal straps. Install two runners on the inside of the case bottom to support the music-mechanism mounting board when you slide it in or out. To soften the music tone, cement a piece of felt to the base of the mounting board. A back may be either screwed or hinged to the case.

    # Child's Wardrobe Is a Hammer annd Saw Job 

    ## Hy Henry Clarls

    

    IF YOU'VE gotten past the stage of wondering how you are going to buy all the clothes your growing youngster needs, you have probably started wondering where you are going to put them. That's the time to dig out the hammer and saw and get to work on this handsome, modern child's wardrobe or closet.

    The basic structure is shown on the facing page. Three walls are cut from $3_{4}^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $15^{\prime \prime}$ stock-if wood of that width is available-or built up from $10^{\prime \prime}$ and 5 " widths. To these a top is added, and joints are butted and screw fastened. Back and bottom are made of wallboard or composition board; cut them to size and screw them in place.

    Base runners are put on next. Drawer rails consisting of $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ square strips are then added in. the left compartment. Separators are
    
    
    butted in front of the rails and secured with countersunk flathead screws driven through the left side and center partition as in Fig. 1.

    Cut the drawer faces to size-in one opration if possible-and rabbet them as shown in Fig. 2. Eight sidepieces, all exactly alike, are sawed out and squared. Backs and bot-
    
    toms are made of composition board, and drawers are assembled with glue and small nails. If front, back, and sides of each drawer are properly squared, the bottom should fit snugly into the open box. Plastic handles are attached, and the drawers are put in place. Planing and filing will correct for sticking or jamming.

    You can now determine the exact height of the storage door. Cut and assemble this and the closet door as shown in Fig. 3. Butt hinges are added after their positions are determined and notches are chiseled out.

    It is important to get the hinges and doors properly aligned for correct closing. A small doorknob and latch are installed as in Fig. 4, and stops are nailed in to keep the doors from swinging past the shut position. Add a friction catch to the small door, a clothes pole and utility shelf as illustrated, and the construction work is completed-unless you'd care to install a mirror in the recessed closet-door panel.

    To finish the piece, round the corners of the top and sand all surfaces smooth. A coat of stain or enamel dresses up the wardrobe -and you have a piece that will serve your child for years to come.

    ## Kiddy Car in Tractor Style

    $\mathrm{K}^{1}$ICKED along like a kiddie car, this little tractor will give a child many happy hours. As maneuverable as a tricycle, it runs easily because of the large wheels.

    Build up the body from pieces cut approximately to the sizes in the photo below. Assemble rigidly with glue and countersunk flathead wood screws. If tricycle wheels are not available, wheels turned from maple may be fitted with rubber tires and axle bushings.

    Form the rear axle from 1" channel iron, bending it to a U-shape so as to provide adequate room for the child's heels on their rearward thrust. Use sufficient length to space the wheels $16^{\prime \prime}$ apart. Bolt the axle fast in a notch cut in the top of the long frame member about $3 \frac{132 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ from the rear. Over this attach a seat cut from $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ stock. Round all metal corners with a file.

    Although a tricycle fork was used in this case, a fork may be assembled as seen in the drawing. Steering is provided by a single $1 / 41$ rod, directly coupled to lugs on the fork and on an $11^{\prime \prime}$ steering shaft cut from $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rod. You probably can find a suitable steering wheel on another toy.

    Paint the body red and the wheels some contrasting color.-Wilber H. Fulker.
    
    

    ## 酸KEEPINGTHE HOME SHIPSHAPE

    

    A clothesline can be taut though detachable if it is fitted with a tightener as shown. Slide the stick back until the line is tight; the weight of the clothes will keep it that way.
    

    If you have to take a baby out into rain or snow, wrap him in a transparent plastic tablecloth. It will keep him and his clothing dry and allow him to see what's going on outside.
    

    You need not discard a vase that has sprung a slight leak. Warm it, melt some paraffin, and swish this about inside to coat the bottom and sides. The waxy film will calk small holes.
    

    To keep grapefruit, canteloupe, and melons from sliding about on the plate, cut a flat on the bottom before serving. Be careful not to cut too deeply, or juices will escape.
    

    A dish mop makes a good floor mop for use under sinks or wherever there isn't enough room to swing a large mop. It gets between pipes and under radiators and furniture.
    

    For faster, better cleaning of hardened paintbrushes, punch a few holes in the ferrule between the bunched bristles and the end of the handle. This lets the solvent work through.
    

    Tie racks can be made easily from wire coat hangers. Bend parallel legs for about 4 " from each end; then turn the legs out at right angles. Hang the rack on the wall with tape.

    If you have trouble filling your lighter from a bottle that has no spout, obtain a screw-cap window-spray dispenser of the type shown. Cut the tube to fit the bottle and enlarge the jet.
    

    Breaks or tears in collapsible tubes, such as those used for toothpaste and shaving cream, can be mended with strips of cellulose tape wrapped once or twice around the break.

    ## Flat Storage Chest Rolls Dut of Way Under Bed

    

    Designed for use under a bed, this shallow chest solves the problem of where to store those extra blankets that overflow all available closet space. Mounted on casters, it may be moved easily when desired.

    Except for the $1 / 4 / 1 /$ plywood top and bottom, $3_{4}^{3 \prime \prime}$ stock is used throughout. As indicated in the drawing, the bottom is set in a $1 / 3^{\prime \prime}$ groove cut $y_{2}^{\prime \prime}$ deep into the sides and ends ${ }_{1 / 2} 1 /$ from the bottom edge. Simple rabbet joints are used at the corners, rabbets $3_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ wide being cut $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ deep across the ends
    
    of the $48^{\prime \prime}$ pieces. Assemble the box with finishing nails.

    Rabbet joints also are used in making the top framework, and the plywood top is fitted flush by means of a rabbet cut around the inside edges of the frame. Attach the plywood with headless brads, and screw a handle to the front edge. Locate a lid support on the inner face of each end of the box, pivoting it on a screw at the forward end, and install a small block as a rest at the back.-Elma Waltner.

    ## Infrared Lamp Speeds Up Work in Drafting Room

    This simple device has opened up a production bottleneck in the drafting room where I am employed. Instead of having to wait for ink to dry before continuing a job, we now just snap on the light, hold it over the wet ink for a few seconds, and get on without the usual delay.

    Because the heat is so rapid and intense, it is best to hold the lamp a bit above the surface to be dried. Since the sheet-metal shade is considerably longer than the conventional reflector, it also serves as a convenient rest for the lamp when not in use-
    
    as well as providing a safety guard in case the bulb should shatter. The holes in the shade lessen the possibility of someone leaving the light on by error.-Robert Delson.

    ## Spool Substitutes as a Level

    When a carpenter's level is not available, a typewriter ribbon spool makes an excel-
    lent substitute if the surface is smooth. Put down on edge, it will indicate even a very slight incline by rolling toward the area that is lower.-Frank Shore.
    

    Boat Has Plastic Hull. Supplied in kit form, this speedy hydroplane has a molded plastic hull. Quickly assembled with only simple tools, the boat is $25^{\prime \prime}$ long, has a beam of $73^{\prime \prime \prime}$, a maximum depth of $3^{3 \mu^{\prime \prime}}$, and weighs only 34 oz . without its air-cooled gas engine. Special molded ribs increase the strength of the hull, enabling it to withstand shock and vibration. The boat is manufactured by Reuhl Products, Madison, Wis.

The kit includes special cutters, sanding disks, buffing and polishing compounds, polishing wheels, plastic dyes, and cements.
    

    Knickknack Shelf. Painted or stained, a pair of these shelves will help dress up a bare wall.

    ## Lists-llinule Gift Projerts

    Here are seven handsome home accessories that you can make in a jiffy from a few Venetian-blind slats.

    Several slats may be sawed simultaneously if clamped in a vise. Sandpaper the cut edges.
    

    Cookie Server. Although dainty and fragile in appearance, it is quite strong. The handle is 178 popular science
    a square frame cut from ${ }^{1 / 4 \prime}$ stock. Remember to slide the handle on before attaching the feet.
    

    Candy Tray. The lid in the center covers a narrow receptacle that may be used to store
    matches or other small articles. Cleats under the lid will prevent it from sliding off the box.

    QUICKLY made at little cost, these gift items all use new Venetian-blind slats. Made of good wood, such slats are a pleasure to work with, for they come in various widths, have nicely rounded edges, and are smoothly finished, ready for staining or painting. A local Venetian-blind manufacturer probably will sell you cutoffs for a few cents, or failing that, you can buy a supply from a mail-order house.

    The slats may be worked with just a few simple tools. A coping saw is good for cutting curved pieces. When it is necessary to make a lengthwise cut, a sharp knife and a straightedge will do a good job. Edges may be smoothed and rounded with sand-
    paper, and sandpaper wrapped around a block enables you to make bevels where desired.

    Simple butt joints and brass escutcheon pins were used in making the projects pictured. To avoid splitting the wood, it is best to drill small holes for the pins. For greater strength, coat mating areas with glue before driving home the pins. Although slats take paint readily, the seven projects were finished in this case with a maple oil stain and then waxed.

    The wall shelf is large enough to be a unit on its own, yet of a size that will permit hanging in pairs. It is $17^{\prime \prime}$ high and the width of six $1 a^{\prime \prime}$ slats loosely spaced. Two
    

    Cigarette Box. Two brass rings hinge the two lids, the rings being placed in holes drilled
    in the lids and center partition. A cleat on each lid would make it easier to open the box.
    

    Wastebasket. Lined with cardboard, it may be used to empty ashtrays, but watch live butts.
    

    Pipe Rack. Lengthen to take additional pipes if the man who'll get it has more than three.
    

    Napkin Holder. A natural finish and the heads of brass pins give it an old-time appearance.
    slats butted together make the $31 / 2{ }^{1 / \prime}$ sides. All are nailed around three shelves cut from $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ stock and spaced $633^{\prime \prime}$ apart. It would be wise to lay the slats side by side to the required number and measure them so that you can cut the shelves to suit. The pieces used to edge the front of the shelves are $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ lengths cut from $13_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ slats.

    A $1_{8 \prime \prime}^{5 \prime \prime}$ slat is butted against the edge of a $13_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ slat to form the trough of the cookie server. The ends are $18^{\prime \prime \prime}$ squares butted inside the trough, and the uprights are $13_{4}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ by $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ with a $90-\mathrm{deg}$. notch. Made of a $23^{\prime \prime}$ square of ${ }^{1 / 4 \prime \prime}$ stock, the handle is cut out in the middle to fit the trough. The joints may be glued.

    For the cigarette box, sides and ends $1 \%{ }^{\prime \prime}$ wide are fitted around a bottom of $1 /{ }^{1 \prime \prime}$ stock, forming a box $3 \frac{14^{\prime \prime}}{}$ by $7 \frac{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}{}$. A partition is fitted midway, and the two lids are hinged to this with brass rings. Small holes should be drilled simultaneously in both covers and the partition so that the brass rings line up perfectly. The lids each are made of two pieces joined by cleats below.

    The candy tray is a structure similar to the cigarette box, but the sides are cut on a slope and two partitions and a loosefitting cover form a closed receptacle in the center. A piece tacked underneath keeps the lid from slipping. Outside dimensions of the tray are $53^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $10 \frac{14^{\prime \prime}}{}$.

    For the bottom of the wastebasket, cut a square from ${ }^{3 / \prime \prime}$ " stock. Slats $12^{\prime \prime}$ long are nailed to it and to a square framework located $9^{\prime \prime}$ from the bottom. This frame may consist of $33_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ square stock assembled with butt joints. For uniform spacing of the slats and a pleasing effect, it's wise to lay the slats on a flat surface, spacing them as desired. Then measure across them and cut the bottom and frame accordingly. In this case, $13 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ slats were spaced $\frac{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}{}$ apart.

    Simple and pleasing in design, the pipe rack has a $238^{\prime \prime \prime}$ by $4 \frac{1 / 2 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ base, cut from ${ }^{1 / 4 \prime}$ stock. The slat framework is strengthened by a $1 / 41$ " square cleat (not seen in the photo) nailed under the $1^{7 / \prime \prime}$ by $5^{\prime \prime}$ top, the latter being beveled on three edges to soften the lines of the rack. The two back slats are $1_{3 / \prime \prime}^{7 / \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ and the sides are $43_{4}^{\prime \prime}$ high. If desired, small partitions may be placed on the base between the bowls.

    Built on a $3_{4}^{3 \prime \prime}$ by $3^{\prime \prime}$ by $6^{\prime \prime}$ base, the napkin holder stands $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ " high at the back and $6^{\prime \prime}$ in front. Cleats hold the front and back slats together. Rounding all edges improves the appearance.

    All structural parts of this doll house are cut from a single $4^{\prime}$ by $\mathbf{8}^{\prime}$ sheet of $\mathbf{3}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ " plywood.

    # Four-Foot Doll House Stores Flat

    THERE must be some little girl on your Christmas list who has written to Santa for a real big doll house. Her mother probably didn't mail the letter because she knows that a big house for daughter's dolls won't leave much space for the rest of the family. But Santas who know all about housing shortages and small apartments can please both generations with a house that can be folded away in a jiffy.

    One panel of $3 / 81$ plywood supplies all the material needed except for dowels and a few strips of pine. Lay out the pieces as shown in Fig. 1. Appearance of the completed house is illustrated in Fig. 2. The front wall lifts off to give access to the interior.

    Assemble the pieces as shown in Fig. 3. Small dowels with rounded ends are installed where indicated, and slightly larger holes are drilled in the matching pieces. End walls of the two-story part and of the wing and kitchen are dowel-fastened to the base, and the rear wall is added. Put in the partitions and floors, and then the roof and chimneys. The front wall goes on last; both it and the rear wall are secured by turn buttons as shown in the lower inset detail of Fig. 3.

    If you want a simple job, stencil the windows in blue and put a frame of thin wood around the door. Transparent windows set in openings are made as in Fig. 4. Carved valances and window boxes are attached with brads and glue.

    ## Gireniade Bank "Xxplodes" When Full

    ## By Jack Mellinger

    UNLESS you choose to smash it with an axe, you'll never succeed in robbing this bank when you're short of change. The only way to get back the pennies, nickels,
    
    or dimes already in it is to put in moreand more-until the bank is full. Then, the last coins unlatch the mechanism and allow the two halves to fly apart.

    After turning the halves from softwood, cut the indicated grooves in the side with
    

    When the bank is full, the final coins force the chute halves apart, letting the bank open.
    

    All the parts are pictured above. In the left foreground are the two halves of the chute.
    
    a rasp and drill $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ holes in the lower half for two springs. Form the coin chute from two $1^{1 / 8^{\prime \prime}}$ by $2^{\frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}}$ pieces of 20 -gauge brass. Bend each lengthwise to a U-shape so as to form an opening just wide and long enough to take a nickel when the two pieces are placed edge to edge.

    Examination of the drawings will show that the chute halves are pivoted at the upper end, a small spring holding them together at the lower. Make two $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ by $1^{3 \prime \prime}$ " hinge bars from $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ brass, and solder one bar to the side of each chute half at the upper end. Solder $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ by $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ by $1 \frac{1 / 2 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ lock bars to corresponding sides of each chute half at the lower end. Note that each lock bar is filed at an angle $a$. the outer end.

    Two brass angles support this assembly, the chute halves being hinged on $1 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ screws fitted with small bushings. Attach
    the angles to the upper half of the bank with flathead wood screws.

    Cut the inside locking ring from sheet copper and fasten it to the lower half of the bank with flathead wood screws. You should now be able to snap the two halves together. If the lock bars fail to snap into piace, you can probably remedy the difficulty by placing a cardboard ring under the locking ring to raise it slightly. If the bank halves are too loose, raise the angle plates slightly with cardboard shims. At this point, you can unlatch the mechanism with a small, thin screwdriver.

    In the top plate, drill and file a coin slot that will just pass a nickel, being careful to locate it directly over the chute. Attach the plate with flathead screws, countersinking the heads. Then fill in with solder and smooth with emery paper.

    ## Repeater Rubber-Rand Gun Gets 6-Big Games

    

    Here's a rubber-band gun that looks like a gun, cocks with a click, and shoots three bands one after another on one loading. By making several of these guns and a target panel, on which pictures of big-game animals are revealed when the flying bands knock aside covering disks, you will have an interesting indoor game.

    Lay out the pattern of the stock on three sheets of $1 / 4 / 1$ plywood bradded together. Then drill the two $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ holes and saw the stock to shape. Now separate the three sections of the stock. Cut away part of the
    middle one to accommodate the trigser and rotor. Also make saw kerfs to take the trigger spring and guard.

    Glue the two pieces of the middle section in their original position on one of the solid sections. After installing the rotor, trigger, and spring, put the other section on temporarily to see that everything works. If it does, glue this section in position. Notch the back $4^{\prime \prime}$ of the barrel to fit the stock and attach with two $1 \frac{1}{2} \mathbf{\prime}^{\prime \prime}$ countersunk wood screws after gluing. When you use the gun, squeeze the trigger slowly.-R. R. Cole.

    ## Toy Worlimen Drive Spilse

    MECHANICAL toys seem so much a product of our own century that it may be hard to believe this one originated around 300 years ago. In the tavern scene reproduced on page 129, Jan Havicksz Steen depicted an ingenious plaything held firmly in the hands of its young owner. You can make a copy from pine and plywood.

    The two handles are made of $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wood with holes spotted in the same position on both pieces. Each of the figures is made of $1 / 4 \prime \prime \prime$ plywood sides glued around the $1 / 2 \prime \prime$ center sections used for head and body and hands. If you have access to a power jigsaw, make all four sidepieces at one time.

    Assemble the figures with glue and sand and shellac them carefully. Drill 5/32" holes into the center of the hands to hold the hammer handles, and also drill scant $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ holes through the legs as shown. Hammer heads and the spike are shaped from $11_{2}^{\prime \prime \prime}$ stock. Dowels used for the hammer handles should be cut a trifle long initially so that they can be trimmed as needed until both hammers hit the spike squarely.

    Give all parts a final sanding. Apply a coat of shellac and allow it to dry before assembling the moving parts. Paint in the detail and color as indicated in the photo on page 129.-James J. O'Hara.
