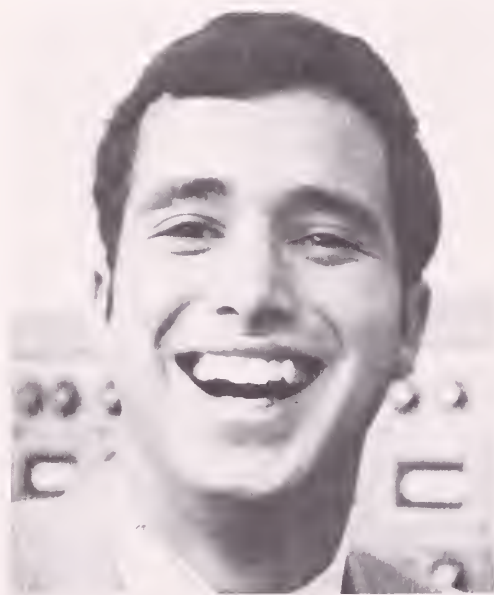






Then one day it started to rain.

The last week of classes came and we almost didn't realize it. We stopped working and our teachers didn't say anything. They had seen this before. They would stay and we would leave and what else could you say?

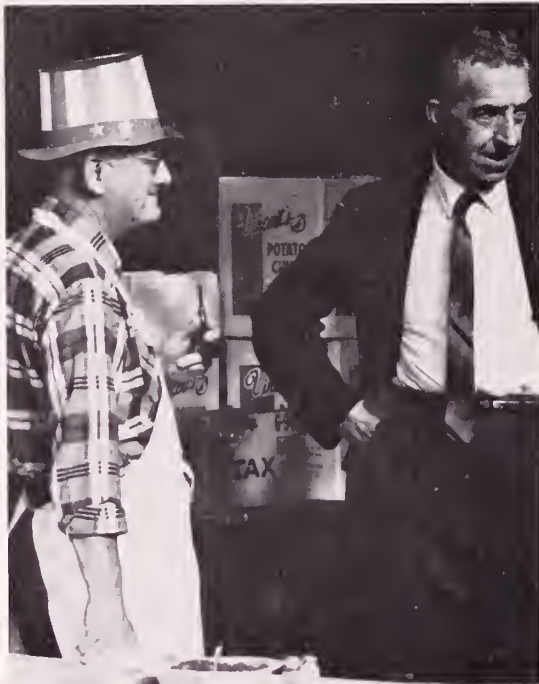
