New York king gambler Arnold Rothstein (David Janssen) still tinances a floating crap game for his small-time boyhood partner, Johnny Burke (Mickey Rooney). Politician "Big Tim" O'Brien (Jack Carson) offers Rothstein protection from their lifelong enemy, Detective Phil Butler (Dan O'Herlihy), if he'll open a gambling house with Jim Kelly (Mickey Shaughnessy). Rothstein does. Butler beats Johnny up, tells Kelly Rothstein is cheating him. Kelly takes \$40,000 from the safe. Rothstein lets him keep it for his interest in the business, tells him he's a sucker. Meanwhile, Rothstein courts actress Carolyn Green (Dianne Foster), is bitter when his respectable father (Joseph Schildkraut) withholds approval of their marriage for religious reasons. At the race track on their wedding day, he leaves Carolyn to engineer a betting coup, and that night she retires alone. Rothstein is at his gambling house, just raided by Butler. O'Brien persuades Rothstein and Butler to open another casino as partners. But Rothstein traps Johnny into revealing Butler's grafting history to a newspaper. Gunmen kill Johnny for this, are arrested on sus-picion. Through attorney Tom Fowler (Keenan Wynn), Rothstein gets them to tell who hired them, uses this to send Butler to the chair. But Carolyn, learning what Rothstein did to Johnny, leaves him. O'Brien too hears Rothstein's part in the graft revelations that are threatening to bring a reform party into power, marks him for death. He is shot, mysteriously, during a poker game. Carolyn is with him in the hospital when he dies. And at the poker table a cop turns over the last card Rothstein drew, revealing the hand he dreamt of all his life, a royal flush.

Because nobody, including the victim, would talk, the mystery of who shot Arnold Rothstein, socalled "banker to the underworld." during a card game in room 349 of New York's old Park Central Hotel on the night of Nov. 4, 1928, has never been officially solved.

Yes, ma'am, that's what it says here, and anybody acquainted with the "mighty mite," who somehow manages to give an impression of high precocity even with a stubble of beard, would hesitate to disfor his performance in "The Bold pute the point with him.

After being counted out twice during his long career, Mickey is riding the crest again, playing the tragic little tinhorn, Johnny Burke, pal of king gambler Arnold Rothstein, portrayed by David Janssen, in Allied Artists' "King of the Roaring 20's-The Story of Arnold Rothstein," now at the Theatre.

Mickey's parents were vaudeville performers, and as he tells it he crawled out of their dressing room and onto the stage one evening in the midst of their act. Charmed by his first sight of an audience, he turned somersaults and then, encouraged by his mother, crooned —all right, ma'am, babbled — the song to her.

He began touring vaudeville circuits with a partner before he was five, he says, and at five got his first movie job - the producer thought he was a midget. Then for six years he starred as Mickey (Himself) McGuire in a series of short film comedies based on Fontaine Fox's tough little cartoon character. He outgrew the role, and Hollywood counted him out the first time.

ROARING 20's EVENTFUL DECADE!

The roaring 20's was a fabulous era, but there was more to it than babes, bathtub gin, black bottom and mobsters. Several notable and historic events occurred between 1920-1929. For use in special feature newspaper stories, here is a list of the most important:

- 1. Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti held for killing two men in a robbery. Found guilty in 1921 and executed on August 22, 1927.
- The nineteenth Amendment giving suffrage to women was proclaimed in effect August 26, 1920.
- 3. First sound-on film talking pictures (vaudeville shorts) shown in New York beginning April, 1923.
- 4. Beer putch in Munich, led by Gen. Ludendorff and Adolf Hitler. November 8-9, 1923. Ludendorff arrested and paroled; Hitler wounded and imprisoned.
- 5. Nellie Ross Taylor elected Governor of Wyoming in 1924, is first woman so honored. Same year Miriam (Ma) Ferguson elected Governor of Texas, and installed Jan., 1925.
- John T. Scopes arrested in Tennessee for teaching theory of evolution in high school in 1925.
- 7. Capt. Charles A. Lindbergh, first to solo from U.S. to Europe, May 20, 1927. Reached Paris on May 21.
- 8. First all taking motion picture shown in New York Nov. 6, 1928.
- ARNOLD ROTHSTEIN, KING OF THE ROARING 20's, DIED OF SHOT WOUNDS NOV. 6, 1928. KILLER NEVER FOUND.
- 10. 1929 St. Valentine's Day Massacre Feb. 14th in Chicago. 7 killed.
- 11. 1929—October 29th—Stock Market crash. Depression begins.

Tunes of the Twenties

Many, many tunes of the 20's are now, what is known in the music business, as standards. Songs like "Ain't She Sweet," "Pretty Baby." "Varsity Drag," etc., are as popular today as ever. Get local disc jockeys to schedule programs in which they spin the 10 top tunes of the 20's, offering tickets as prizes for those sending in the correct titles.

Battle of Dixieland Bands

Another contest that ties in with the fabulous era is a Dixieland band contest. The bands or groups can battle it out on your stage. Have them wear blazer jackets, straw hats and other attire of the 20's. If you can arrange it, offer winning band a theatre engagement, entertaining on your stage or lobby.

"Flappers" Street Bally

A street bally of a group of "flappers," attired in wearing apparel of the 20's, would attract plenty of attention. Get extra plug by advertising for them in the newspapers. Have them driven about town in an open model 1920-29 car. Banner the car.

"Charleston" and "Black Bottom" Contests

Bring back the most popular dances of the 20's by staging Charleston and Black Bottom dance contests. Via your newspapers and dancing schools, you should have little difficulty getting contestants. Promote loving cups or jewelry as prizes.

Photos of the Roaring 20's

Have newspaper readers submit photos of people and places of the roaring 20's. Award gift tickets for the best photos shot during the jazz age. People are interested in how things looked in your town over 30 years ago, as well as looking at folks attired in the mode of the day.

1920-1929 Fashion Displays

Tie in with one of the better department stores for a multi-window display of both men's and women's styles of the 20's. Each window should contain a liberal supply of stills and tie-in signs. Add such accessories as collegiate type hats, pennants, etc.

SPECIAL CARDINAL PAPERBACK MOVIE EDITION OF BEST SELLER

It is strongly urged that you make up a sticker or a wrap around with similar copy imprinted. Contact your local distributor who should be more than willing, as it is to his benefit, to make sure that each book bears the picture label. Additionally, make up and spot tie-in cards on newsstands, paperback racks, book shop windows, etc. In window displays be sure to surround book displays with plenty of production stills



CONFISCATED GAMBLING EQUIPMENT

Your local police department vice squad may be able to help in arranging an interesting exhibit, either in your lobby or in a downtown store window, of gambling equipment seized in local raids. Such a display generally includes slot machines, gambling wheels of all kinds, dice and "21" tables, chuck-a-luck cages, etc. Such an exhibit should have an appropriate tie-in sign such as the following: THE GAMBLING EQUIPMENT DISPLAYED HERE IS THE SAME TYPE AS SEIZED IN A ROARING 20'S GAMBLING RAID AS SEEN IN ALLIED ARTISTS' "KING OF THE ROARING 20's—THE STORY OF ARNOLD ROTHSTEIN."

MERCHANDISING TIE-INS

Sporting goods establishments and department stores carry small replicas of various gambling games equipment such as roulette, crap and "21" tables, chuck-a-luck bird cage and miniature slot machines. Contact such stores for window displays of their gambling merchandise. Surround all displays with plenty of production stills and other NSS accessories.

REYNOLDS BROWN POSTER ART

Be sure to check the NSS posters illustrated on the back cover. The key art, painted by Reynolds Brown, top Hollywood illustrator, is dramatic, colorful and eye-catching. Make good use of the larger-sized figures in the 24 and 6 sheets for lobby display pieces. There are several individual pictorial units suitable for this purpose.

WHAT ARE THE ODDS?

The boys with the smart money know exactly what odds they face when playing such well known games as poker and roulette. In sporting events they make their own odds, however, the mathematical odds in poker and roulette have been figured exactly and make very interesting reading. Make up a card with this information on it and see that they get city-wide distribution. On the reverse side of the card imprint your own copy such as: IT'S A 1000 TO ONE YOU'LL ENJOY SEEING "KING OF THE ROARING 20's—THE STORY OF ARNOLD ROTHSTEIN." Add theatre name and playdate.

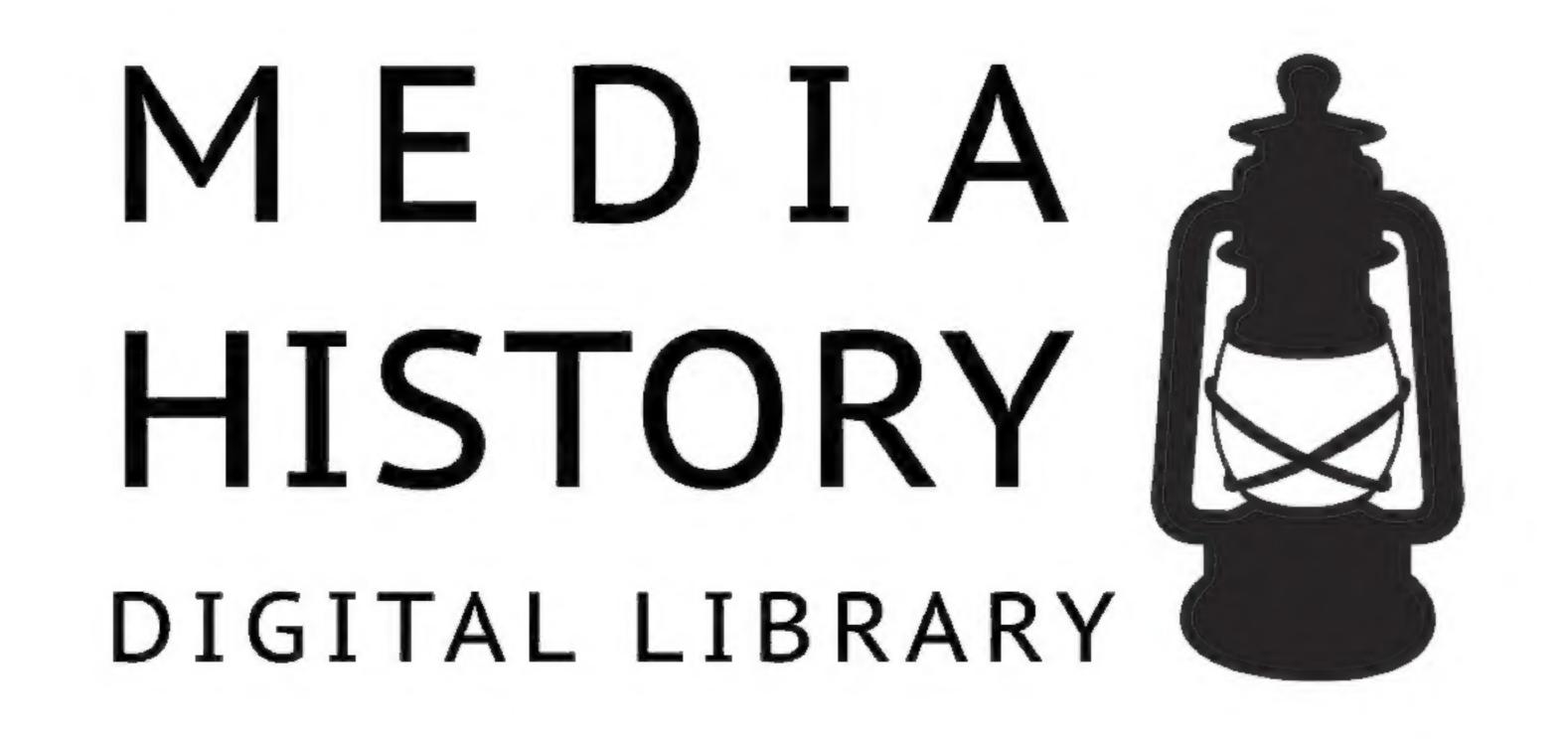
