ALL EVERGREENS—MOSS BALLED

All evergreens are taken up expertly to secure the tender roots, the soil removed, and then the roots dipped in Transplantone and balled and wrapped in wet moss. By this method we are now able to eliminate 50 to 60 pounds of soil, making low cost express shipments possible. This method also insures excellent growth and quicker roots action. In planting, remove wrapping and use moss in hole around roots. If desired balled in soil and burlapped add \$1.50 per plant to cover additional cost of handling and special packing.
