FIVE HUNDRED OF ONE PARTICULAR SORT OR VARIETY will be furnished at THOUSAND rates, FIFTY at HUNDRED rates, and SIX at DOZEN rates. Long lists of assorted varieties cannot be sold at Hundred and Thousand rates.

It must be distinctly understood that after stock is delivered to the Transportation Companies we will not be responsible for any damages that may result through delays or accidents while in transit. Trees are always packed so that they will reach their destination in perfect order if forwarded within a reasonable length of time. Claims for damages during transit must be made to the Transportation Companies direct.

N. B. Every precaution is taken that all trees or plants shall be true to name. Fruit trees are propagated from bearing trees at Sausal Fruit Farm. Mistakes are sometimes liable to occur in the busy packing season, although the chance for such is very small indeed. Should such errors occur, and they be not discovered at first, we cannot agree to be liable for more than first cost of trees, and if this is not agreed to by purchaser, he is hereby asked to return stock bought.

Having made special arrangements with Wells, Fargo & Co., we can ship nursery stock by express at a reduction of about 20 per cent from regular express rates.

By this arrangement customers can have their small orders sent by express almost as cheaply as by freight.
