The Grand Master submitted the following annual address, which was read and referred to the following Committee: Bros. Reid, Blackstock and Hubbard:

ADDRESS.

Frethren of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

Through the blessings of Divide Providence, we have been permitted, after another Masonic year has passed, to assemble in Annual Communication around the altar which we have from time to time been accustomed to meet and offer up our devotions and renew our vows of fidelity and pledge again our faith to maintain inviolate from the ravages of the barbarous foe, the mildew of time or the crush and counfall of Republics and States, the sacred archives and land-marks of the Order, which have been for a while committed to our trust. How thankful should we be to Him, who, with parental solicitude, has warehed our wayward wanderings and permitted us again to assemble in this consecrated and loved spot which is ever dear to the Mason's heart, diffusting, as it does, the glorious principles of the order.

Here we can, for a while, retire from the turnoils, strife, carnage and confusion incident to a civil or political revolution like the present, and offer up anew our devotions to Him who has youch-safed to guide and direct us in our pilgrimage to

that Temple not made with hands eternally in the heavens.

We have met under peculiar circumstances; a terrible war is upon us; its horrors are experienced alike by the rich and poor, the proud and the humble, I all classes and conditions of our once happy people. The cloud, which at one time, to the eye of the grasping politician, seemed "no larger than a man's band," has gradually apread like a mighty pall over the entire horizon of our country, enshrouding it in glorm, belching forth, horrid lightnings, filling every heart with consternation, obliterating each star of hope and giving no promise of a happier and brighter future. The little stream of strife, which but three years ago, seemed to small and insignificant in itself as to give no promise of danger in the future, and which many an idle dreamer promised to dam up without difficulty or delay, has swellen into a mighty, stream, a torrent, whose waves are red with the blood of slaughtered heroes, whose i upetuous confents no human hand can stay, into whose awful chasen the rights, the institutions, the laws and usages of a free people are fast crumbling to be lost forever, and upon whose trembling banks two astonished nations stand aghast at their o in felly and wickedness, bewildered by the huge proportions of the strong cataract, and sighing for the blessings that have been engelphed beneath its angry waves. Each family mourns its loss by the death and mutilation of some honored member; hearts are sofrewful that only thrilled with

joy before; eyes are filled with bring tears that only flashed with pride or joy or hope in other days; her auxious suprense and her deep sorrow calls upon Heaven for comfort. For these there is no help here below; childhood, innecent childhood, has forgotten the toys and sports in which it once delighted, and awaits in sullen sorrow the return of parents or brothers from the field of blood and carnage. Temples of learning are closed or deserted, the marts of trade are cupty, commerce is banished from our streams; the solemn toll of the funefal beil is heard continually through the land; gaint hurger walks abroad at noon-day and startles opulence itself by its fearful presence. The booming of artilery, the roar of the deadly musket, the strong notes of the invigorating drum, the shouts, the cries, the greans of contending armies, the shrieks of widewed wives and fatherless children, and all that tells of a bloody and terrible war, are heard from the Potomas to the Gulf. The plot thickens perpetually, the night grows darker, the storm gathers, peace with its blessings, seems more distant than ever. Such is the condition of the country at this moment, such is the picture which truth constrains me to draw of our onco happy and pressures land. It does not become one to discuss those measures' which have been elswicre proposed, for the solution of the difficulties by which an unhappy fate has sa rounded us.

Is is pre-eminently proper, however, that I should recall the fact, that other nations before us have purchased the sacred boon of free lom at a cost equally as great by the expenditure of their best blood, the loss of their noblest patriots, the sufferings, the sacrifices, the agony of all classes of their people. It is perfectly right that I should dwell on the fact, that Masonry is not dazzled by the pomp, glitter and splender of war, but that her votaries have wen for themselves a name upon the historian's page, while gallant deeds are appreciated and liberty has a temple upon the earth; that upon an nundred goey fields and in the midst of death's most wilde and fearful camival, they have thught posterity a lesson of true heroism, of unwavering courage, of patriotic martyrdom that will be remembered with gratitude and reverence until time shall be no more. An unfortunate combination of circumstances has, however, divided us; whether it be that the war was not a ne essity, and that the hearts of our people are not in it; whether those is power have been and are incompetent; through ignorance or bigotry or prejudice, to direct the struggle; whether the administration or its enemies have sown the seed of discord with the vain hope of reaping future personal or political burves. Lam not called upon to decide; the fact is plain that disagreements do exist; that we are not standing shoulder to shoulder; yet over those things, masonry has no control.

The groans of the bittle field have reverberated and must in a short time be cehoed again in right of intense bereavement from thousands of desolated hearths, and the cries and lamentations of the widowed mother and orphanless children, will ascend to beaven in appeals to sim whose ears are ever open to their appeals, and whose strong arm is veuclisafed to protect and defond them. He it is, who must stay the present tornado and again bring peace to a distracted country and quiet to the homes and firesides of his people. We have only pictured a scene of war and desolation that has actually taken place; the returning soldier brings and will still bring many sorrows to his home from the infected camp. Our country, is demoralized; treasures are expended which would have built thousands of churches whose spires would have pointed the ways worn traveler to that spiritual temple whose builder and maker is God. It would have built Universities, hospinals, de , er have bound tegether continents with rails of con. If this great tressure which is now being expended by our Northern brothern, were sunk in the sto, it would be a great calamity, but it is to be applied and expended in a #55t unholy crusade, against those who have repeatedly asked to be permitred to separate from those with whom they cannot live in peace. Yea, it is to be expended in severing the veins and arteries of human life and exterminating, if possible, the Southorn fathers, sons, wives and daughters. May the great Architect of the universe yet open the eyes of those-our enemies-to see the atrocity of the crime they are now committing against us, and stay the hand that would be guilty of so four w deed, should Bo the sincere wish of every Mason in every clime on the habitable globe.

Masonry is not exempt from the evils which fall to the lot of humanity. She, in common with other institutions, has been assend by her enemies, and the blood of her followers her been made to flow until the earth hes been literally drenched with the same, and chains add dangeons have been their down; the rack and wheel have loudly responded to the grouns of her victims, yet she has remained and but the ignorance, superstition and tyranny of her enemied. Kingdoms and

empires have then and had their days of glory and renown, and have again crumbled into the dust, but Masonry remains the same and will over remain the same so long as the great Johovah has a people apon the earth. War may devastate and lay waste the most beaut ful pertions of God's creation; nations may be annihila lated and republics crumble to the dust, yet. Musonry will remain the same through all the untations of time, and by the sid of her enlightened philanthropy and pure and joly views of religion, she has been enabled to soar aloft to the regions of Meaven and dip her broad pencil in the clouds of charity and spread the cement of brothery lave and affection through earth's remotest bounds. She has scattered bands and mobs, extinguished the diames and unbound the victim at the stake. and shed her genial rays in every part of the habitable globe, and her influence is felt by the distressed in every clime; the widow's thanks and the orphan's tears, are made to flow as her grateful encomiums, and friendship hai's her with gratitude in every clime. She promotes the kindly intercourse, not only of individuals but of nations, and softens the asperities and diminishes the horrors of war, and acts in aid and concert with car boly religion in alloviating all the sufferings of man in the present world, thereby preparing him for an admittance into the Holy of holies or Sanctuary, there to enjoy the presence of the great I Am, through end-.ess ages.

I desire to call the attention of the members of this hody to a resolution passed at your last annual communication, requiring the Grand Treasurer and myself to dispose of St. John's College and apply a portion of the proceeds to the payment o' the outstanding liabilities. Bro. Matchings, Grand Treasurer, and myselfadvertised the sale of the property, but owing to the unsettled condition of the country and consequent darangement of the currency, I thought it prudent to correspond with the creditors of the Grand Lodge, and ascertain, if possible, the amount of our indebt doess, and also what thoy were willing to take as currency in the pays ment of their claims. Bro. Jne. Berry being the principal creditor, I addressed him a note, and del not receive, as I thought, a satisfactory answer. I was under the necessity of again writing him on the subject, stating, in such plain language, the questions I desired him to suswer, that I thought it impossible for any mising terpretation of the same to be made. I seen afterwards received from him an answer in which he declined to rescive in payment of his claim, as I understood him, anything except North Carolina State Bonds issued prior to the present revolution; bence, after consultation with the Grand Treasurer and other distinguished Brethren, we determined to postpone the ste for the present, believing it adulty we owed the Grand Lodge and the Fraternity of the State. The present condition of the currency is such that any sale we might have been able to have made, would in our opinion, have been detrimental to the interest of this body, and would not have resulted in accomplishing the wishes and the views of those who ordered a sale of the property. Brethren, how far we have succeeded in acting for the interest of Masonry in regard to this subject, is for this Grand Lodge to determine? . *

I bog leave to suggest the propriety of raising, at this communication, a sinking fund, for the purpose of extinguishing the debt. I think this far prefable to selling the property, and am fully satisfied the Craft in North Carolina will sustain,

cordially, any plan you in your wisdom may, adopt for that purpose.

The adject of initiation fees is one that deserves your consideration, and I hope you will increase the sum to ---- for the ensuing Masonic year. Also the dres of the Subordinate Lodges in this body, should, for the same period, be in reased in

an equal ratio.

I have granted, during the present Masonic year, Dispensations in several instances to various Lodges for the purpose of correcting irregularities unavoidable in the present condition of the country. In only one instance have I granted a dispensation for the puspose of forming of a new Lodge; that was granted to Bro. J. A. Pre ther and others, to open a Lodge in Jefferson, Ashe county, the petition of the observer having been properly recommended under the seat of -

Lodge, Vo. -.

Application has been made to me in two or three instances for Dispensations to open Military Lodges; one in South Carolina and the others in Virginia. I have declined to grant either of the Dispensations for reasons which I think are sufficiently strong, believing in fact that my jurisdiction and right to establish Lodges, was strictly confined to the limits of North Carolina, and that my compliance with the request of the reterior ers wou' I have teen an infrincement upon the jorisdiction and rights of the Grand Musters of those States respectively. I know squae of the Grand Mustors in the Couthern States differ with me on this point, and Brg. Fellows, G M of Louisiana, exercises the prerogative to grant Dispensations for opening Lodges in other jurisdictions, but at present I leave this subject to be decide by an

impartial judgment of the Masonic Fratermty.

The present crisis in the political history of our unhappy country, is one in which the aucient landmarks of the order are most likely to be violated. Hence the importance of those who preside over the Subordinate Lodges of this jurisdietion, having their minds well informed upon our ancient customs and usages. Free masoury, as the most ancient and universal of all societies, is governed by laws and rules of action which are peculiar to herself and which have sprung out of her own organization. Lifference of opinion has existed among Masonic writers as to what the landmarks properly are. It is not our purpose, at this time, to enter into any notice of the various epinions which have been promulgated by the many authors who have written on this subject, but simply to impress upon the minds of the brothren present, the vast importance, to the craft, that in their various duties they should not suffer anything to cause a departure from the landmarks of the order. Blackstone has truly said, "the goodness of a custom depends upon its hav ing been used time out of mind, or in the solemnity of our legal phrase, time whereof the memory of man runneth not to the contrary." This it is that gives it its "weight and authority." All this may, with great force, be applied in the precise terms, to the landmarks of Froe Masonry.

The characteristic peculiarity of the landmarks of Masoury is, they are unchange-No Grand Lodge has the right or power to enact; any new landmarks, neith. er has it the right or prerogative of abolishing any of those that now exist. What they were in the beginning of the institution, they must ever remain and must continue in force untit Masonry itself shall cease to exist. Fortunate it is for the stability of Masoury that her landmarks so unchangoable should exist; they stand as bulwarks, which to the intelligent Mason, are insurmountable, and control and check innovations. Should they sometimes beinadvertently violated in the excitement and haste of Masonic legislation, the reflective and conscientious Mason are soon again brought back under their benign influence and will preserve that uniformity of character and general design which constitutes the great universality of

the institution.

Frequent applications having been made to me during the past Masonic year, in regard to one of the landmarks of the Order, I deemed it due the members of this hody that I should give or call your attention to the same, that is, the qualification of candidates for initiation during the revolution that now exists. Many of our worthy young men have been disabled and maimed for life, and yet many of them after returning hame, have been and are still applying for admission into the Lodge, We regret that those who are true and trusty, and have served their country with such fidelity, should, by such minfortunes, be debarred from entering our portals and enjoying the lights which Masonry affords, but such is the nature of our institution, without a violation of one. of its most important landmarks which plainly tell us that the candidate must have "no main or defect about his body that may render him incapable of learning the art." Thus are excluded, the blind, he deaf, the dumb, and those having but one foot, and those baving but one hand,

none of them can learn and teach the rituals of the order. This landmark being of such plain interpretation, you may think it entirely unnecessary on my part to call the attention of so intelligent a body as this, to the subject, but when conside ered in its true light, you, I taink, will agree with me that its importance is a sufficient reason for your attention being called to the subject, hoping thereby to cause to be avoided by the Subordinate Lodges, an infringement of the same.

The oral landnarks of the Order gree of no less importance than the written, and he

who has the honor to preside over the graft, no matter in what position, should make it his constant study to have his mind well stored with the Ancient Constitution of the

Order and the oral traditions of the same, thereby being the better qualified to fulfil any position to which he may be called by his brethren.

Those who have the honor to be called by their brethren to preside over the craft, should be thoroughly instructed in the lectures, well acquainted with the ceremonies and complete in all the degrees of Free Masonry. But Masonry is a science and an art of great magnitude and extent. A knowledge of her mystery is not to be obtained at once by the initiate, but is attainable only by the industrious craftsmen, and then only by degrees. By much instruction and assidious application, are advances only made. Every step is progressive and opens new light and information in proportion to the caracity of step is progressive and opens new light and information in proportion to the capacity of the mind of the initiate to receive the same. According to the progress we make we limit or extend our inquiries, and in proportion to that capacity, we attain to a less or greater degree of perfection. It is not him who knows the names and understands the application of the various working tools and implements of the craft, that is thereby turnished to every good work, but he only who uses them and applies them to his intellectual, moral and social edification, that is the workman that need not be ashamed to exthis to the Grand Artificer of the universe, a specimen of his work which will not be cast, at the day of final accounts, enoug the rubsk as work unit for the builder's use, but work that will car the test of the gent doverseer's so are, and be prepared for a place on that tembe and building prepared for the faithful. Therefore, in exporting you to use every effort to be perfect in Vasoncy, I instant and a transfer to the property of the faithful. tend, not merely that you should be expert in giving the letters, or easer to rise rapidly through the different degrees of the same, but that you should enter fully into the spirit of its most solemo rites, and should endeavor to learn the full impart of its interesting symbols; that you should be perfect in the knowledge and in the upplication of its p it ciples, in the full possession of the virtues it expects, and in the discharge of all the

inoral and enristian duties it enjoins.

Among the great variety of duties incumbent upon us, we should ever remember that Among the great variety of duties menumbent upon us, we should ever remember that there is none more essential to the preservation or more efficacions to the good and welfare of our institution than duantially of action, brotherly love and charity. This makes the cement, the great and brying principle of cohe sion, which gives compactness to all the parts and members of the mystic tic, forms them into a regular sturbure, into one uniform, beautiful and mystic building, and adds harmony, friendship and stability to the whole. Or it may with propriety be linked to the keystone which is compacts and strengthens the arch upon which the edifice is supported and upheld. Brotherly love is the life and soil of all societies, and must be much more so of those who pretect do asthe life and soul of all societies, and must be much more so of those who preterd to associ te together upon the noble maxims of charity; it is the golden chain which hinds together our ancient order, the life principle on which depends its internal harmony and

ontward prosperity.

As in the exection of the spacious Temule of Solomon, everything was so prepared that "there was neither hammer not axe, nor any iron tool heard" in the house which it was building, so of the Fraternity of Free and accepted Masons: they always perfected their work by quiet and orderly methods without the least sound of the hammer of contention, the axe of division or any other tool of discord, being perfectly joined together in the same mind and the same in gonerity walking by the same rule and following and teaching the same principles, having but one interest and one object, the benefit at dadvancement of the whole

tit as d advancement of the whole.

Glory to God in the highest, passe on earth and good will towards men, is and should be the disposition and desire of every Free and Accepted Mason. With such a temper, my brethren, we will enjoy the eatistaction of an approving conscience, the approbation and concurrence of a l the wise and good, and the God of love and peace will be with us. That Divine Being who is the author of all peace and the lover of concord, with repler our endeavors successful and reward them with the blessings of time and the glories of

The special connection and relation in which I have stood to you during the past Masonic year, now ceases, but the affection connected with it and the hear, fet gratitude arising from it, will ever remain, and while I wish you, each to accept my best wishes as I am ce tain you share the best affections of my heart. Any errors which I may have committed in the discharge of the daties incumbent upon me as the Grand Master of a connected when the best process of the head, and not of the heart, and it affords me sovereign State, have been errors of the head and not of the heart, and it affords me much satisfaction to know they are in the hands of a kind and affectionate brethren who are ever ready to throw the mantle of charity over the foibles of their ereing brethren.

M" particular thanks are due the officers and members of the Grand Lodge for the honors with which they have distinguished me, and I entreat them to accept my warmest acknowledgements for their assistance and kindness. I should be ineven-ably insensi-

The Committee appointed by the Grand Lodge, to consider and report upon the affairs of St. John's College, beg leave, respectfully, to report, that we do not recommend the sale of the College, but submit the following statement and recom-

mendation

A large amount of money has been centributed by the people of North Carolina, to establish and endow a fund for the education of Orphans in North Carolina. The Financial Agent of this Fund is the Rev. Dr. Deems, a member of our fraternity. This fund is to be incorporated at the present session of the Legislature. We recommend that all the property held by the Trustees of St. John's College, be transferred to the Orphan Fund on the condition that this Grand Lodge shall have the same benefit from the fund as are secured to each individual doner, namely, one vote for every \$50 thus given, and one beneficiary for every \$2.500, the Orphan Fund to assume the debts of the College, and the Lodge to be credited for an amount equal to the cost of the property over and above the debts assumed by the Orphan Fund, and that a Committee of —— be appointed on the part of the Grand Lodge, to consumate this arrangement.
