The Proposed New Church

*



OR a number of years the members of the Summit Street United Brethren Church have felt the need of a new, more commodious, and more modern church-building, one designed to accommodate to better advantage the various activities of the church, especially the Sunday school, Ladies' Aid, and other present organizations, as well as many other forms of religious and social work in contemplation. All

this had been talked of for a long time, but no active work was done toward the new building until a little over two years ago. Then a very desirable location was purchased on the corner of Euclid and Third streets by the trustees; and a little later a building committee was formed, plans were laid, and preliminary subscriptions were taken which amounted to \$17,000.00, nearly all of which has been paid, and the remainder probably will be paid in a short time. The lot is paid for, and there will soon be \$10,000.00 in cash on deposit for the new building.

There has been a general demand among our members that the building proceed as soon as possible. In response to this demand, the trustees and the building committee have had various plans drawn by an architect, which were discussed, improved, and finally agreed upon as presented in this folder, subject to such changes as may be suggested by members or may seem desirable by the committee on further study.

We think all will agree that this will give us a commodious, convenient, and beautiful building, and one which will go far to arouse greater interest in the work of the church, religious and social.

It is estimated that the building, according to these plans, built of pressed brick, with Bedford stone trimmings, slate roof, steam heat, finished with plain oak and hard pine, will have cost about \$55,000.00 when completed.

A plan has been formed by the committee to raise the necessary additional money, and it is hoped that these plans will be satisfactory and will be closely adhered to. It now remains for the members to do their part.

If the members subscribe promptly and pay into the treasury \$10,000.00, the building will be begun early the coming spring, with the hope that in a year we shall be able to occupy the new and long-dreamed-of church home.

When completed, this church will furnish a pleasant and commodious place in which a devout people may assemble to worship Almighty God, and will be a monument handed down by this to succeeding generations.

Explanation of Plans

The Exterior

The pictures on the next two pages show the front and side views of the proposed new church, which is of a modern and attractive style of architecture. It has a width of 76 feet on Third Street and 152 feet on Euclid Street.


First Floor Plan

This comprises a main auditorium which will seat 514 people; to this can be added, by raising partitions, the ladies' parlor, Sunday-school and class-rooms, which, together with the balcony, will give a total seating capacity of 2,278, all within sight and hearing distance of the speaker. In addition to these general features, the main floor will have a large ladies' parlor, which can be used for small meetings, a mothers' room, music room adjoining the choir seats, a minister's room, and Sunday-school offices room, etc.

The main Sunday-school room will accommodate 423 people. Opening into this are nine class-rooms on the main floor and eleven on the balcony floor, which will give a seating capacity of 1,248, supplying ample and much-needed facilities for the various departments of our Sunday-school work.

The Basement


The basement, in addition to the heating plant and several small rooms, will contain three large rooms, besides a dining-room nearly 50 feet square. A large kitchen on the Euclid Avenue corner, instead of where it is marked on the present plans. The main church floor will be elevated 7 feet above the sidewalk, which will give a dry floor, high ceiling, and plenty of light to the basement.




Front View Proposed Church Building for Summit Street United Brethren Church, Third and Euclid Streets, Dayton, Ohio.
