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PREFACE.

IT is a well-known fact that in sparsely settled communities a knowledge of the minutiae of public service is more general than in the densely settled communities where people are strangers to one another; and yet, obviously, the relative importance would strongly suggest the necessity of a reversal of these conditions.

In the genius of our Government the separation of powers affords the development of peculiar responsibilities. The Legislative Department enacts laws, the Executive Department executes them, and the Judicial Department construes them; and, with certain exceptions, each Department is entirely independent of control by the others.

Up to the middle of the present century the tendency was toward a more representative character in our whole Government. In recent years the tendency, though not marked, has been toward a less representative and a more bureaucratic form of government.

The State of New York, truly the Empire State in many respects, ranking first in population and wealth, and with multi-form enterprises setting it at the head of the column of American Commonwealths, affords a splendid object-lesson in governmental and political conditions.

Here we have drifted from an almost purely local control into a centralized control in many notable instances. The Excise Law, which was formerly administered by the local authorities, is, under the act known as the Raines Law, administered by a State Commissioner. A few years ago sanitary regulations were strictly within local areas; now we have a State Board of Health. And so, within comparatively recent years, the State Legislature has assumed control of pauper lunatics; has provided a State Board of Equalization and Assessments to regulate taxes, uniform factory

inspection laws administered by a State Factory Inspector, State officers to regulate railroads, banking, insurance, and various other matters pertaining to local and general welfare.

These transformations toward central control, which take place in many instances unobserved by those affected, are thought to be due in part to the rapid and disproportionate growth of cities compared with rural districts which the United States, in common with other civilized countries, has experienced in recent times.

Students of political science who are opposed to anything like monarchy nevertheless believe that our Government can serve the people better if less representative and more concentrated. They admit that this theory holds good only in-so-far as it affects metropolitan districts, where, in the absence of personal acquaintance with one another, the people do not confer concerning the merits or demerits of public measures or the quality of candidates for office. Purely representative government is therefore somewhat of an experiment, even yet, so far as it affects our large cities, and it would seem that, if it is to succeed, the advantage of personal acquaintance in the country must be supplied in the city by some new device. If this chasm of estrangement lying between men living close together in congested sections could be overcome, if voters could be made better acquainted with our public service, then we might be spared the necessity of adopting that system which approaches dangerously near to one-man power in all our departments of Government.

Viewing offices and employment in the Municipality, the Commonwealth, and the Nation from the standpoint of patronage, it is manifestly conducive to independent manhood that every one ambitious to serve should have an intelligent knowledge of the places to be filled, and in a general way know the processes by which they may be secured rather than be dependent upon party leaders, who, in some instances arrogate to themselves all the knowledge there is concerning such matters, and dole out the information as a reward for political subservience. But from the broader standpoint of efficient government—"the greatest good to the greatest number"—obviously every citizen who acquaints himself with the importance of official positions, the enormous amount of public labor, and the almost fabulous expenditure of money incident thereto, will be more jealous of his franchise and

more insistent for proper principles and properly qualified candidates.

In the publication of "Public Service" it is hoped that some little contribution is made toward arousing greater individual interest and toward supplying such political and governmental information as might otherwise be obtained only by constant intermingling, neighbor with neighbor, in the forum of industrial pursuits.

The geographical divisions provided for political purposes bear an important relation to this work, as a knowledge of the distribution of officers and Government employees is difficult both to acquire and to retain without a clear understanding of their territorial jurisdiction.

A note of explanation is called for by the outline map of The City of New York relative to the boundary-line in New York Bay. All maps to which our attention has been drawn place the boundary-line east of Bedloe's and Ellis Islands, their authors relying, doubtless, upon the following language from Chapter 678, New York Laws of 1892: "The boundary-line between the States of New York and New Jersey is as follows: Commencing at . . . thence southerly along the middle of said (Hudson) river and of the Bay of New York to a point opposite the northeast angle of Staten Island."

Interpreted literally, this would seem to justify the direction and location of the line as laid down by other maps; but Article II. reads: "The State of New York shall retain its present jurisdiction of and over Bedloe's and Ellis Islands, and shall also retain exclusive jurisdiction of and over the other islands lying in the waters above mentioned and now under the jurisdiction of that State."

The second paragraph of Section 2 of Chapter 378, New York State Laws of 1897, reads: "First. The borough of Manhattan shall consist of all that portion of The City of New York, as hereby constituted, known as Manhattan Island, Nuttin or Governor's Island, Bedloe's Island, Bucking or Ellis Island, the Oyster Islands, and also Blackwell's Island, Randall's Island, and Ward's Island in the East or Harlem rivers."

Furthermore, this question has been submitted to the Attorney-General, Hon. T. E. Hancock, and he holds that it is to be pre-

sumed that the Legislature properly interpreted the laws governing the State's possessions when they prescribed the limits of the borough of Manhattan as above cited.

With the exception of the most important Federal officials, the present work is confined to that public service which touches and concerns the people in the State of New York. The main divisions of the work are the Federal Public Service in the State of New York; the Commonwealth Public Service, exclusive of the Municipality of The City of New York, and the Public Service of The City of New York. It will be observed that special importance is attached to The City of New York.

The preparation of the maps and the accumulation and compilation of the data have involved a surprising amount of tedious and detailed labor; and the success of the book—so far as by public sufferance success may be admitted—is due to the untiring energy and zealous vigilance of Mr. Charles P. Worrall and Mr. Robert Johnston. The uniform courtesy and prompt co-operation of public officials, heads of departments, chief clerks, &c., in the various branches of the Government, whose suggestions and aid have been solicited, rarely in vain, has placed me under obligations which I cheerfully acknowledge.

Any criticism to the effect that the work is neither complete nor perfect cannot claim the distinction of originality, for both these faults are admitted in advance. Concerning some of the Departments not yet thoroughly organized, prompt response to our request for information has been impossible; and for this reason, in a few instances, we have been compelled to omit desirable information.

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CITIZENSHIP, NATURALIZATION, PASSPORTS.

SECTIONS OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA RELATING TO THOSE SUBJECTS, TOGETHER WITH GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS IN REGARD TO PASSPORTS.

CITIZENSHIP.

SEC. 1992. All persons born in the United States and not subject to any foreign power, excluding Indians not taxed, are declared to be citizens of the United States.

SEC. 1993. All children heretofore born or hereafter born out of the limits and jurisdiction of the United States, whose fathers were or may be at the time of their birth citizens thereof, are declared to be citizens of the United States; but the rights of citizenship shall not descend to children whose fathers never resided in the United States.

NATURALIZATION.

SEC. 2165. An alien may be admitted to become a citizen of the United States in the following manner, and not otherwise :

First. He shall declare on oath, before a circuit or district court of the United States, or a district or supreme court of the Territories, or a court of record of any of the States having common-law jurisdiction, and a seal and clerk, two years, at least, prior to his admission, that it is his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty and, particularly, by name, to the prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty of which the alien may be at the time a citizen or subject.

Second. He shall, at the time of his application to be admitted, declare, on oath, before some one of the courts above specified, that he will support the Constitution of the United States, and that he absolutely and entirely renounces and abjures all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty; and, particularly, by name, to the prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty of which he was before a citizen or subject; which proceedings shall be recorded by the clerk of the court.

Third. It shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the court admitting such alien that he has resided within the United States five years at least, and within the State or Territory where such court is at the time held one year at least; and that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; but the oath of the applicant shall in no case be allowed to prove his residence.

SEC. 2166. Any alien, of the age of twenty-one years and upward, who has enlisted, or may enlist, in the armies of the United States, either the regular or the volunteer forces, and has been, or may be hereafter, honorably discharged, shall be admitted to become a citizen of the United States, upon his

petition, without any previous declaration of his intention to become such ; and he shall not be required to prove more than one year's residence within the United States previous to his application to become such citizen ; and the court admitting such alien shall, in addition to such proof of residence and good moral character, as now provided by law, be satisfied by competent proof of such person's having been honorably discharged from the service of the United States.

SEC. 2167. Any alien, being under the age of twenty-one years, who has resided in the United States three years next preceding his arriving at that age, and who has continued to reside therein to the time he may make application to be admitted a citizen thereof, may, after he arrives at the age of twenty-one years, and after he has resided five years within the United States, including the three years of his minority, be admitted a citizen of the United States, without having made the declaration required in the first condition of section twenty-one hundred and sixty-five ; but such alien shall make the declaration required therein at the time of his admission ; and shall further declare, on oath, and prove to the satisfaction of the court, that, for two years next preceding, it has been his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States ; and he shall in all other respects comply with the laws in regard to naturalization.

SEC. 2168. When any alien, who has complied with the first condition specified in section twenty-one hundred and sixty-five, dies before he is actually naturalized, the widow and the children of such alien shall be considered as citizens of the United States, and shall be entitled to all rights and privileges as such, upon taking the oaths prescribed by law.

SEC. 2169. The provisions of this Title shall apply to aliens [being free white persons, and to aliens] of African nativity and to persons of African descent.

SEC. 2170. No alien shall be admitted to become a citizen who has not for the continued term of five years next preceding his admission resided within the United States.

SEC. 2174. Every seaman, being a foreigner, who declares his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States in any competent court, and shall have served three years on board of a merchant-vessel of the United States subsequent to the date of such declaration, may, on his application to any competent court, and the production of his certificate of discharge and good conduct during that time, together with the certificate of his declaration of intention to become a citizen, be admitted a citizen of the United States.

PASSPORTS.

SEC. 4075. The Secretary of State may grant and issue passports, and cause passports to be granted, issued and verified in foreign countries by such diplomatic or consular officers of the United States, and under such rules as the President shall designate and prescribe for and on behalf of the United States ; and no other person shall grant, issue, or verify any such passport. Where a legation of the United States is established in any country, no

person other than the diplomatic representative of the United States at such place shall be permitted to grant or issue any passport, except in the absence therefrom of such representative.

SEC. 4076. No passport shall be granted or issued to or verified for any other persons than citizens of the United States.

SEC. 4077. All persons who shall be authorized to grant, issue, or verify passports, shall make return of the same to the Secretary of State, in such manner and as often as he shall require; and such returns shall specify the names and all other particulars of the persons to whom the same shall be granted, issued, or verified, as embraced in such passport.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS IN REGARD TO PASSPORTS.

Citizens of the United States, visiting foreign countries, are liable to serious inconvenience if unprovided with authentic proof of their national character. The best safeguard is a passport from this Department, certifying the bearer to be a citizen of the United States. Passports are issued only to citizens of the United States, upon application supported by proof of citizenship.

When the applicant is a native citizen of the United States he must transmit his own affidavit of this fact, stating his age and place of birth, with the affidavit of one other citizen of the United States to whom he is personally known, stating that the declaration made by the applicant is true. These affidavits must be attested by a Notary Public, under his signature and seal of office. When there is no Notary in the place, the affidavits may be made before a Justice of the Peace or other officer authorized to administer oaths; but, if he has no seal, his official act must be authenticated by certificate of a court of record.

If the applicant be a naturalized citizen, his certificate of naturalization must be transmitted for inspection (it will be returned with the passport), and he must state in his affidavit that he is the identical person described in the certificate presented.

Passports cannot be issued to aliens who have only declared their intention to become citizens.

In issuing passports to naturalized citizens, the Department will be guided by naturalization certificate; and the signature to the application and oath of allegiance should conform in orthography to the applicant's name as written in the naturalization paper.

The children of a naturalized citizen, claiming citizenship through the father, must transmit the certificate of naturalization of the father, stating in their affidavits that they are children of the person described therein, and were minors at the time of such naturalization.

The oath of allegiance to the United States will be required in all cases.

If the applicant is to be accompanied by his wife, minor children, or servants, it will be sufficient to state the names and ages of such persons and their relationship to the applicant, when a single passport for the whole will suffice. For any other person in the party, a separate passport will be required. A woman's passport may include her minor children and servants.

By act of Congress approved June 20, 1874, a fee of five dollars is to be collected for every citizen's passport. That amount should be paid in advance of each application.

A passport is good for two years from its date and no longer. A new one may be obtained by stating the date and number of the old one, paying the fee of five dollars, and furnishing satisfactory evidence that the applicant is at the time within the United States. The oath of allegiance must also be transmitted when the former passport was issued prior to 1861.

Citizens of the United States desiring to obtain passports while in a foreign country must apply to the chief diplomatic representative of the United States in that country, or, in the absence of a diplomatic representative, then to the Consul-General, if there be one, or, in the absence of both the officers last named, to a Consul.

To persons wishing to obtain passports for themselves, blank forms of application will be furnished by this Department on request, stating whether the applicant be a native or a naturalized citizen. Forms are not furnished, except as samples, to those who make a business of procuring passports.

Communications should be addressed to the Department of State, indorsed "Passport Division," and each communication should give the post-office address of the person to whom the answer is to be directed.

Professional titles will not be inserted in passports.

CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

ARTICLE II.

Qualification of Voters. SECTION 1. — Every male citizen of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been a citizen for ninety days, and an inhabitant of this State one year next preceding an election, and the last four months a resident of the county, and for the last thirty days a resident of the election district in which he may offer his vote, shall be entitled to vote at such election in the election district of which he shall at the time be a resident, and not elsewhere, for all officers that now are or hereafter may be elective by the people; and upon all questions which may be submitted to the vote of the people provided that in time of war no elector in the actual military service of the State, or of the United States, in the army or navy thereof, shall be deprived of his vote by reason of his absence from such election district; and the Legislature shall have power to provide the manner in which and the time and place at which such absent electors may vote, and for the return and canvass of their votes in the election districts in which they respectively reside.

NOTES.

1. An aide-de-camp to a major-general is allowed \$200 per year in addition to the pay of his rank.
2. An aide-de-camp to a brigadier-general is allowed \$150 per year in addition to the pay of his rank.
3. An acting commissary of subsistence is allowed \$10 per year in addition to the pay of his rank.
4. Assistant surgeons are entitled to pay of captain after five years' service, service to be reckoned from date of acceptance of appointment or commission.
5. Lieutenants of the Signal Corps to be promoted after fourteen years' service.
6. Retired officers receive 75 per cent. of pay of their rank.
7. A retired chaplain receives 75 per cent. of the pay of his rank.
8. The officer in charge of the public buildings and grounds (Washington, D. C.) has, while so serving, the rank, pay, and emoluments of a colonel.
9. The principal assistant in the Ordnance Bureau of the War Department shall receive a compensation, including pay and emoluments, not exceeding that of a major of ordnance.
10. An acting judge-advocate, detailed by the Secretary of War, is entitled to pay and allowances of captain of cavalry.
11. Additional pay to commandant of military prison at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., \$500 per annum.
12. Retired officers detailed for duty at colleges entitled to full pay.

REMARKS.

Mileage, at the rate of *four* cents per mile, over shortest usually travelled routes, and, in addition thereto, the cost of transportation actually paid by the officer over the route or routes, exclusive of parlor-car fare or sleeping-car fare and transfers. For travel over free and bond-aided Pacific railroads, transportation in kind must be obtained from the Quartermaster's Department.

Commutation of quarters to be paid by Pay Department as follows: General, \$125 per month; for all other grades, at the rate of \$12 per month per room.

Vouchers in payment of an officer's salary must cover his whole compensation for a period of one or more calendar months.

Enlisted men (retired) are entitled to three-fourths of the monthly pay allowed by law to them in the grade they held when retired, with commutation of clothing and rations. Not entitled to travelling allowances on retirement, but to transportation in kind by the Quartermaster's Department.

A certificate of merit entitles a soldier to \$2 per month additional pay, commencing on the date of rendering "distinguished service" and continuing through all subsequent service as an enlisted man.

INFORMATION RELATIVE TO THE APPOINTMENT AND ADMISSION OF CADETS TO THE UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY.

APPOINTMENTS.

How Made.—Each Congressional District and Territory—also the District of Columbia—is entitled to have one Cadet at the Academy. Ten are also

appointed *at large*. The appointments (except those *at large*) are made by the Secretary of War at the request of the Representative, or Delegate, in Congress from the District or Territory; and the person appointed must be an actual resident of the District or Territory from which the appointment is made. The appointments *at large* are specially conferred by the President of the United States.

Manner of Making Applications.—Applications can be made at any time, by letter to the Secretary of War, to have the name of the applicant placed upon the register, that it may be furnished to the proper Representative, or Delegate, when a vacancy occurs. The application must exhibit the full name, date of birth, and permanent abode of the applicant, with the number of the Congressional District in which his residence is situated.

Date of Appointments.—Appointments are required by law to be made one year in advance of the date of admission, except in cases where, by reason of death or other cause, a vacancy occurs which cannot be provided for by such appointment in advance. These vacancies are filled in time for the next annual examination.

Alternates.—The Representative, or Delegate, in Congress, may nominate a legally qualified second candidate, to be designated the *alternate*. The alternate will receive from the War Department a letter of appointment, and will be examined *with the regular appointee*, and if duly qualified will be admitted to the Academy in the event of the failure of the principal to pass the prescribed preliminary examinations. The alternate will not be allowed to defer his reporting at West Point until the result of the examination of the regular appointee is known, but must report at the time designated in his letter of appointment. The alternate, like the nominee, should be designated as nearly one year in advance of date of admission as possible.

ADMISSION OF CADETS.

Candidates selected by the War Department shall be instructed to appear for mental and physical examination before Boards of Army Officers to be convened at such places as the War Department may select on the 1st day of March annually (except when that day comes on Sunday, in which case the examination will commence on the following Tuesday). The candidates who pass successfully shall be admitted to the Academy in the following June.

Candidates selected to fill the vacancies unprovided for at the examinations held in March shall be instructed to report at West Point for mental and physical examination early in June. No candidate shall be examined at any other time, unless prevented from presenting himself by sickness, or some other unavoidable cause, in which case he shall be examined during the last week in August.

Immediately after reporting to the Superintendent for admission, and before receiving his warrant of appointment, the candidate is required to sign an engagement for service in the following form, in the presence of the Superintendent, or of some officer deputed by him

“I, ———, of the State (or Territory) of ———, aged ——— years ——— months, do hereby engage (with the consent of my parent or guardian) that, from the date of my admission as a Cadet of the United States Military Academy, I will serve in the Army of the United States for eight years, unless sooner discharged by competent authority.”

The candidate is then required to take and subscribe an oath or affirmation in the following form :

“I, ———, do solemnly swear that I will support the Constitution of the United States, and bear true allegiance to the National Government : that I will maintain and defend the sovereignty of the United States, paramount to any and all allegiance, sovereignty, or fealty I may owe to any State or country whatsoever ; and that I will at all times obey the legal orders of my superior officers, and the rules and articles governing the Armies of the United States.”

Qualifications.—The age for admission of Cadets to the Academy is between seventeen and twenty-two years. Candidates must be unmarried, at least five feet in height, free from any infectious or immoral disorder, and generally from any deformity, disease, or infirmity which may render them unfit for military service. They must be well versed in reading, in writing including orthography, in arithmetic, and have a knowledge of the elements of English grammar, of descriptive geography (particularly of our own country), and of the history of the United States.

The compensation of Cadets is \$540 per annum, commencing on admission to the Academy.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ADMISSION OF CADETS INTO THE UNITED STATES
NAVAL ACADEMY AT ANNAPOLIS.

There shall be allowed at said Academy one Naval Cadet for every Member or Delegate of the House of Representatives, one for the District of Columbia, and ten at large.

The course of Naval Cadets is six years, four years at the Naval Academy and two years at sea.

Appointments to fill all vacancies that may occur during a year in the lower grades of the Line and Engineer Corps of the Navy and of the Marine Corps will be made from the Naval Cadets, graduates of the year, at the conclusion of their six years' course.

The nomination of a candidate to fill a vacancy shall be made upon the recommendation of the Member or Delegate, if such recommendation is made by the first day of July of that year; but if it is not made by that time the Secretary of the Navy shall fill the vacancy by appointment of an actual resident of the district in which the vacancy exists, who shall have been for at least two years immediately preceding the date of his appointment an actual and bona fide resident of the district in which the vacancy exists and having the legal qualifications under the law as now provided.

Candidates allowed for Congressional Districts, for Territories, and for the District of Columbia must be actual residents of the district or Territories, respectively, from which they are nominated. And all candidates must, at the time of their examination for admission, be between the ages of fifteen and twenty years, and physically sound, well formed, and of robust constitution.

Candidates that pass the physical and mental examinations will receive appointments as Naval Cadets, and become students of the Academy. Each Cadet will be required to sign articles by which he binds himself to serve in the United States Navy eight years (including his time of probation at the Naval Academy) unless sooner discharged. The pay of a Naval Cadet is \$500 a year, commencing at the date of his admission.

NOTE.—Provided, That no officer on the retired list of the Navy shall be employed on active duty except in time of war; And provided, That those officers on the retired list, and those hereafter retired, who were, or who may be retired after forty years' service, or on attaining the age of 62 years, or those who were or may be retired from incapacity resulting from long and faithful service, from wounds or injuries received in the line of duty, from sickness or exposure therein, shall be entitled to 75 per centum of the present sea pay of the grade or rank which they held at the time of their retirement.

Coxswains detailed as coxswains of steam launches, or as coxswains to commanders in chief, shall receive \$5 per month in addition to their pay.

Seamen in charge of holds shall receive \$5 per month in addition to their pay.

Landsmen assigned to duty as Jacks-of-the-dust, or as lamplighters, shall receive \$5 per month in addition to their pay.

Any person who, after having enlisted in the Navy for a term of three years and received an honorable discharge or a recommendation for reenlistment, upon the expiration of his term of service, reenlists for three years within three months from the date of his discharge, shall receive an increase of \$1 per month to the pay prescribed for the rating in which he serves, for each consecutive reenlistment.

Twenty cents per month is deducted from the pay due each officer, seaman, and marine in the Navy, to be applied to the fund for naval hospitals.

All enlisted men, except musicians of the band, serving on a first period of five years' service, are entitled to \$1 per month for the third year, \$2 per month for the fourth year, and \$3 per month for the fifth year's service, in addition to the sums given in the first column above, which additional amounts are retained until expiration of service and paid only upon final settlement and honorable discharge.

One dollar per month is retained from all enlisted men (except the Marine Band) serving under a reenlistment. This retained pay is not included in the above table, and is to be credited and paid only upon final settlement and honorable discharge from service.

Members of the Marine Band are allowed \$4 per month in addition to rates of pay as given above for playing at the White House and public grounds.

All enlisted men (except reenlisted men) have \$4 per month retained from their pay during the first year of their enlistments, the amounts so accruing being paid with interest at 4 per cent. per annum on honorable discharge from the service.

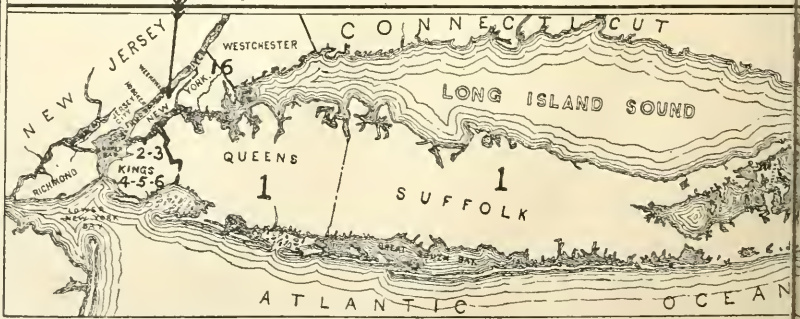

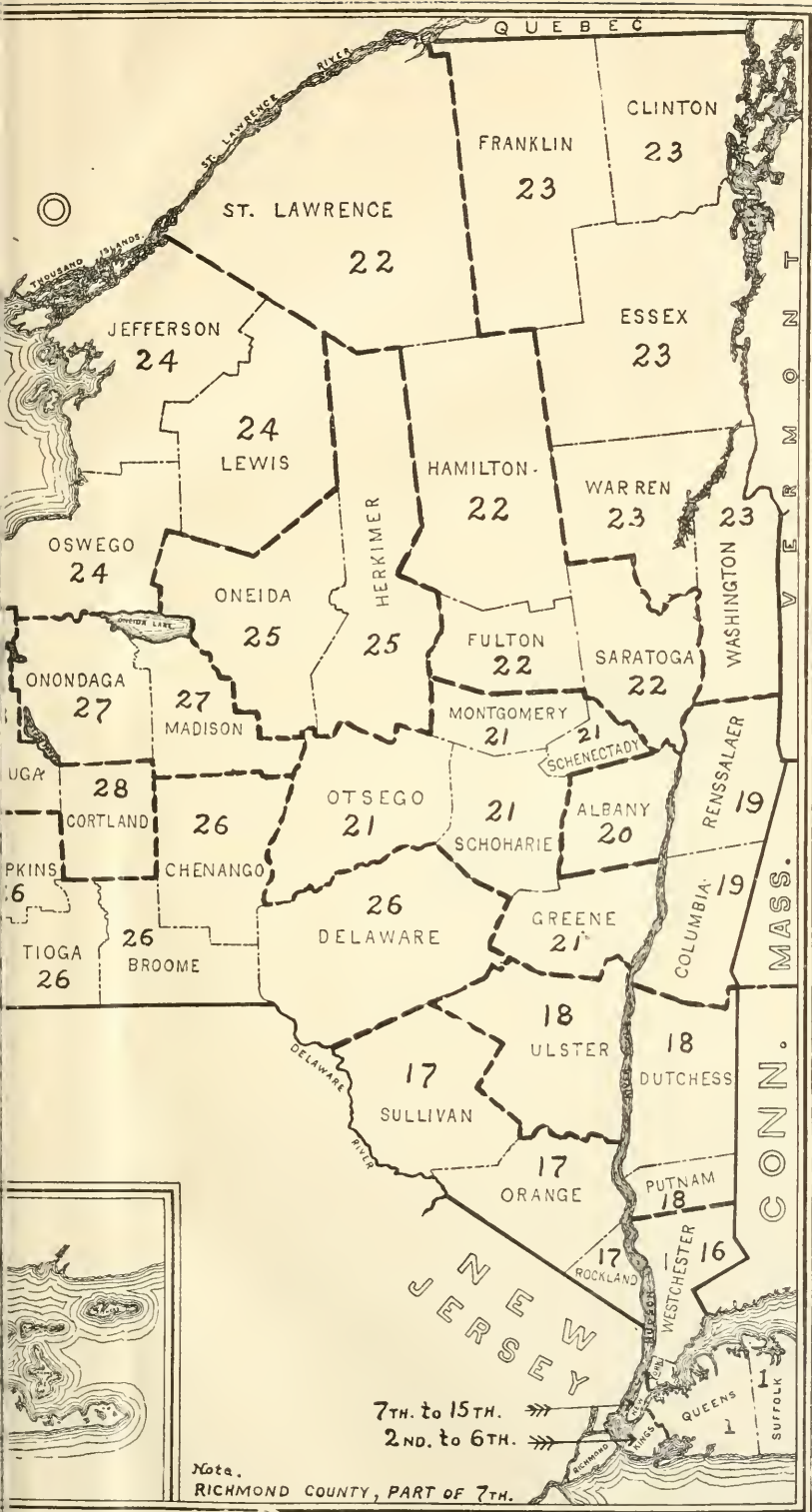
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NEW YORK STATE SHOWING THE 34 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS.

DEFINITION OF CLASS II.

1. Class II. shall include all positions now existing or hereafter created, of whatever functions, designations, or compensation in each and every branch of

the classified service, except such positions as are specifically designated in Class I. or Class III. or included in Class IV., and embraces Clerks, Cashiers, Custodians, Messengers, Engineers, Inspectors, Special Agents, Law Positions, Medical Positions, Mathematicians, Scientists, Agriculturists, Instructors, Mechanics, Craftsmen, Miscellaneous Positions.

DEFINITION OF CLASS III.

Class III. shall include skilled laborers, attendants, and other positions of a minor grade as are named in this rule ; *provided*, that no position the duties of which require the incumbent to come in contact with the inmates of any hospital, asylum, prison, reformatory, or like institution of charity or correction shall be considered that of an unskilled laborer.
