For nearly 170 years, Rush has been part of the Chicago landscape longer than any other health care institution in the city! Rush Medical College received its charter on March 2, 1837, just days before the city of Chicago was chartered. Its founder, Dr. Daniel Brainard, named the school in honor of Dr. Benjamin Rush, the only physician with medical school training to sign the Declaration of Independence and also known as the "Father of American Psychiatry".

In 1843 with a class of twenty two students, Rush Medical College officially opened its doors. It was the first institution of higher learning chartered in Illinois and one of the first medical schools to open west of the Allegheny Mountains. During its first century of operation, more than 10,000 physicians received their training at Rush.

As Chicago grew, so did Rush's interaction with other budding organizations. St. Luke's Hospital was established in 1864; Presbyterian Hospital began in 1883, influenced by the support of the Rush faculty; and the University of Chicago, with which Rush Medical College was affiliated from 1898 to 1942.

With the onset of World War II, Rush discontinued its undergraduate education. However, the library was maintained and its faculty continued to teach at the University of Illinois. In 1969, Rush Medical College reactivated its charter and joined with Presbyterian St. Luke's Hospital, which itself had been formed through a merger in 1956, to form Rush Presbyterian St. Luke's Medical Center. The original logo of Presbyterian St. Luke's was an anchor cross, an early religious symbol. This anchor





and crosspiece symbol conveyed messages of faith and hope for those at sea as early as the first century. When Rush merged with Presbyterian St.Luke's in 1969, a stylized version of the anchor was developed to remind those educated through Rush to remember the mission and values of the institution.

In 1971, Rush Medical College reopened with a class of 66 first year students and 33 third year students. Beginning in 1972, Rush Medical College has been part of Rush University, which is comprised of Rush Medical College, the College of Nursing, the College of Health Sciences, and The Graduate College. The Medical Center officially changed its name in September 2003 to Rush University Medical Center, to reflect the important role education and research play in its patient care mission.

You have each demonstrated on numerous occasions that you are committed to the best outcomes for your patients and the creation of a supportive health care environment. I'm always most optimistic about the future of medicine when I think of the passions, skills and character of Rush students.
