





" Handsome and even stately in all its appointments of paper, printing, illustrations, and binding, this volume relating to the local antiquities of a secluded corner of our North American Dominion, is, as to its literary contents, what may be termed 'a thing of shreds and patches.' having, however, as a unifying strand, the enthusiastic interest of the author in all that survives, in extant record and memorial, of that Acadie which is remembered by most of us as the opening scene of Longfellow's idyll of ' Evangeline.' Of the Port Royal of the days of the French settlement, on the shores of the Bay of Fundy, on whose site the Nova Scotian town of Annapolis now stands, not a trace now remains above ground, unless it be the earthen vase or ' wine-cooler'—a relic, now preserved in the Victoria and Albert Museum, which probably was brought originally from Provence, and was dug up nearly half a century ago near the site of that battle of Bloody Creek, fought in December, 1757, in which the 43rd Foot lost so heavily. Mr. Morse has turned his attention to the old ' Gravestones of Acadie,' to be found chiefly in the Cemetery of Annapolis—' one of the most ancient in Canada, and probably in North America.' Of these sepulchral monuments, while some of them go back to the first half of the eighteenth century, none can be assigned to the period when ' New France ' was still on the map, although French names still linger in the district, and find record, as do the Loyalist refugees from the States of later date, on the stones. The memorials in this and other Acadian churchyards are carefully noted in Mr. Morse's catalogue, and in the cases of the more quaint and artistic of them, he has secured photographies that are works of art. He has had the skilled assistance, in his descriptions and commentaries, of his friend, Mr. W. B. Dalton. He has supplemented his contribution with excerpts from an early eighteenth century book on Annapolis Royal, Granville, and Wilmot; and from documents relating to the Fisheries of Nova Scotia in the same period; with a paper on the identification of early sites in Acadie; with extracts from the Parish Records of the district for the years 1780-1800; and with data ' concerning the Mayflower ' and the descendants of Mayflower pioneers in Nova Scotia; and, lastly, there is reproduced in facsimile the original MS. of a report, *circa* 1660, to the Dauphin of France, from the Governor of Acadie, Nicolas Denys, in which the importance of the country ' lying between Acadie and the St. Laurence,' and of its pastures, is emphasised, and the means pointed out by which, through their development, the King of France would be ' rendered as powerful on sea as he is on land.' "—*Scotsman.*
