INTRODUCTION

There are so many traditions regarding the ancestry of William Davis that it has been impossible to trace them all to their sources. One, however, has been proved to be without foundation. It is the legend that William Davis and President Jefferson Davis of the Confederate States were descendants of the same ancestor. Jefferson Davis was of Welsh descent, and there is nothing to indicate that William Davis was of that nationality.

Another tradition is that the parents of William Davis escaped from Scotland in the early part of the eighteenth century — when the Clan Davidson was being persecuted — and came to America to join relatives in the vicinity of Philadelphia.

The tradition of the pirate ancestor is the most plausible one. The Pirate was Capt. John Edward Davis, a record of whose exploits is found in Esquemeling's "The Buccaneers of America."

John Edward Davis was a successful pirate from 1683 until 1688. At the end of that time he saw the error of his ways; obtained a pardon from the King; and settled at Old Point Comfort, Virginia, where he lived for fourteen years — until July 24, 1702. The year 1688, therefore, marks the settlement of this family in America.

The descendants of John Edward Davis migrated to the vicinity of Philadelphia and there made their home until the time of the Revolutionary War.

William Davis was born near Philadelphia, Penna., Oct. 27, 1756. His father was a native of Pennsylvania, and his mother was born in Scotland.

William was one of a family of four children. His brother's name was Henry. He had two sisters; Jennet, who married her cousin, Jonas Davis, and Elizabeth, who married Robert Ritchie.

In 1784 William Davis married Izabella Scott, who was born in Londonderry, Ireland, May 14, 1768, and came to this country, with her parents, in 1775.

William Davis was visiting his eldest daughter, Nellie Boles, in Muskingum County, Ohio, in the Winter of 1833 and 1834. He died there Feb. 14, 1834. His son, Henry, brought the body home for burial in Mount Carmel Churchyard. Izabella Scott Davis survived her husband exactly two years.

Nothing is known of the family of Elinor (Nellie)
Davis Boles.

Very little is known about William Davis II. He is believed to have died about 1815.

Elizabeth Davis was twice married. Her first husband was William Edwards. They had one daughter, Isabell, who died when three years of age. William Edwards died July 10, 1854. Sometime after his death Elizabeth married David Brotherton (a widower) who survived her. Elizabeth's favorite brother was Alexander. For each of his children she made a wool coverlet — good examples of her skill at weaving. The coverlet presented to her nephew, William Hugh, in 1846 is now the property of his granddaughter, Virginia.

William and Izabella Scott Davis had ten children; of whom eight lived to rear families of their own. An effort is being made to trace the descendants of Nellie Davis Boles. The descendants of the other seven children have formed a Davis Family Reunion Association; of which the officers are:

CHAPTER I

Henry Davis, eldest son of William and Izabella, was the "live wire" of the family. In the War of 1812 he was a Sergeant in Capt. Robert Leiper's Company, 138th Regiment. He was County Surveyor of Beaver County in the years 1827 to 1830. He was also an astronomer, farmer, miller and driller of salt wells. He took up — or "laid warrants on" — much wild land; including the Robert Temple Farm, Henry Temple Farm, Alex. Temple Farm, Shaffer Farm, Brick House Farm, Roseberg Farm, Mount Vernon Farm and forty acres in Tramp Mill Run.

He built a log house on Johnston's Run (later known as Tramp Mill Run). His three eldest children were born in this log house.

In 1817 he built the Davis Brick House, where he lived for many years; he also built the Roseberg House, which was occupied by his son, William Henry.

It has not been definitely ascertained whether Robert Temple or Henry Davis started the village of New Sheffield. Temple was of English descent, which gives weight to the claim that he was responsible for the name "New Sheffield". However, Henry Davis owned most of the industries. He operated a wagon-shop, gun-shop, black-smith shop, harness shop; and a shop where saddle-trees were shaved out. He owned a wool-carding machine; and had a grist mill on Tramp Mill Run.

Henry's wife was Jane Johnston, daughter of James and Mary McClelland Johnston. Of their five children only one, the eldest — "granddaughter Isabella" — is mentioned in William Davis' Pension Record. She was born in the log house on Johnston's Run Feb. 13, 1814. James S. Davis and William Henry Davis were also born in that log house. The two younger children (John and Jane J.) were born in the Davis Brick House.

Henry Davis died in New Sheffield and was buried in Mount Carmel Churchyard. His widow made her home with her half-brother, Walter Johnston, for some years, but died at the home of her son, John. She, too, was buried at Mount Carmel.

- Lulu B. Calhoun married Edward Paul Jones. They had four children; Paul Calhoun, Joseph Edward, Geraldine and Pricilla Josephine.
- 6 Paul Calhoun Jones married Elizabeth Nan Hewitt.
- 6 Geraldine Jones married Reed Coatsworth.

- Elizabeth Jeffries. They had four children; Joseph Jeffries, Mary Elizabeth, Warren Davis and Burrell Howard. Dr. Frank W. Calhoun is the present owner of the sword used by William Davis in the Revolutionary War. William Davis gave his sword to his eldest daughter, Isabella Davis Calhoun. from whom it descended to her son, Rev. Joseph Calhoun, and then to Dr. Frank W. Calhoun.
- Johnston Calhoun II was a United Presbyterian minister. He married Marie Hunter. They had one son, Johnston Hunter.
- Edith E. Calhoun married Gustave Schmierer. They had three children; Elizabeth, Robert Gustave and Mary Lou.
- Joseph A. Calhoun studied dentistry. He married Mabel Bryant. They had three children; Joseph Bryant, Harlan and Richard.
- 5 Dwight Lafayette Calhoun married Cleta C. McKnight.
- Paul Calhoun was a United Presbyterian minister. He married Nettic L. Pratt. They had three children; Paul Bailey, Helen and Constance Eileen.
- 5 Emma Verona Calhoun married Harry L. Johnston. They had three children; Theodore Leigh, Juliet Anne and Patricia Joan.
- Hannah Vern Calhoun married Charles H. Caldwell. They had four children; Mary Jane, Betty Lou, Charles Joseph and Nancy Lee.

- Eliza Calhoun taught in a "Mission School for Freedmen," in Huntsville, Ala., taught one year in Pennsylvania; attended Hookstown Academy for one year; attended Westminster College for two years, and graduated in the class of 1869. She went to India in the Autumn of 1869 as a missionary of the United Presbyterian Church, and was located at Gujarnwala, Punjab. She married (Rev.) Marcus Manard Carleton, a missionary of the Presbyterian Church, whose home was in Marshfield, Vermont. Rev. Mr. Carleton died in 1898. Eliza remained on the Mission field until 1910, when she retired after forty years service.
- Henry Davis Calhoun married Martha E. Love. They had one son, Ephraim Jay. After the death of his first wife, Henry married Martha Strickler.
- 5 Ephraim Jay Calhoun married Margaret Burson. They had one son, Henry Jay.
- John Calhoun was an invalid. Never married.
- Johnston Calhoun was a United Presbyterian minister. He married Clara L. Gilmore. They had four children; Ethel Clare, Steele Carleton (who died in infancy), Harold Gilmore and Clara Jean.
- Ethel Clare Calhoun married Irving H. Lowrie. They had four children; Wilfred (who died in infancy), Creighton Johnston, Clara Mildred and Jean.
- Harold Gilmore Calhoun married Dorothy Donnell. They had two children; Donald and Dorothy Jean.

- George Norwell Calhoun studied medicine and established in Hoquiam, Wash. He was three times married; to Virginia Jones—Emma R. Ballinger and Luella McCray Sawyer. His children were: Alice Amelia, Emma May, Miriam Isabella, Nita Joyce and Erma.
- Nita Joyce Calhoun married Benjamin Anspauch.
- Erma Calhoun married Ralph Bert Prouty.
 They had two sons; Richard Eugene and Herbert Henry.
- Emma Hays Calhoun married Andrew Hunter. They had six children; Maude Ethel, Frederick Andrew (died 3-24-1913), Nellie (died in infancy), Carleton Calhoun, Alice Isabella and Mabel Emma. (Alice and Mabel were twins).
- Alice Isabella Hunter married Ernest A. Fassler. They had four children; Robert, Roberta, Warren and Geraldine.

- James S. Davis was born August 14, 1815. On March 3, 1840 he married Maria Flanegin. They had nine children; Sarah Jane, Ione F., Francis Flanegin, Josephine, Louisa M., Elizabeth H., Henry A., James Everett and Daisy.
- Sarah Jane Davis married Richard G. Smith (an Englishman). They had two soms; William and James. The last known address of these two boys was Portland, Oregon, where

one was Inspector of Bridges and the other had a grocery store.

- Ione F. Davis married Joseph MacDonald.
 They had one daughter, Minnie, who died when eighteen years of age.
- Francis Flanegin Davis was the adventurous one of the family. He left home when fourteen years of age, and found many means of making a livelihood. Eventually, he entered the real-estate business in Sharon, Pa., where he made good. He married Abbie R. Stout and now lives in Orangeville, Ohio.
- Josephine Davis married Robert P. Stoddard. They had one son; James F. After the death of Mr. Stoddard, Josephine married H. B. Wherry.
- James F. Stoddard married Myrtle Patterson. They had three children; Donald (who was killed in an automobile accident when a young man), Robert and Helen.
- Robert Stoddard married Dorothy Ballou.
 They had one daughter, Patricia Joan.
- Louisa M. Davis married Simpson Musgrave. She died when twenty-one years of age. No children.
- Elizabeth H. Davis married Lewis S. Stewart. They had three daughters; Marie Isabel and Ione.

He knew his classics, literature from A to Z, several foreign languages and considerable science; built up no mean fortune and a large law practice. His Grandfather, Henry Davis, was also a very remarkable man, an inventor and a man of outstanding ability." The home of Henry A. Davis was in Sewick-

William Henry Davis was the favorite son of his father (Henry Davis) from whom he inherited two farms. He lived in the "Roseberg House" for many years. He was killed by a train in Allegheny in 1865.
- Joseph Davis served in Company C., 63rd Penna. Infantry, in the Civil War. He survived the War, but all later trace of him has been lost.
- 4 Alice Jane Davis married Miller Kenton. No children.
- Henry K. Davis is said to have gone to Oregon. Definite information lacking.
- William C. Davis's fate is unknown. The tradition is that he went West and married a Blackfoot squaw.
- Horace Greeley Davis studied medicine.
 Tradition says that he died of typhoid fever, in 1885, at Idaho Falls, Idaho; but this has not been verified. (Tradition also says that his widow married again and, with her children,

went to Helena, Montana).

- John Davis was a Presbyterian minister and also an inventor. He invented the Davis Airbrake—which is said to have been quite similar to the one later patented by Westinghouse. He also obtained a patent for a "Planetarian" which is still used in teaching Astronomy. John Davis married Emma Hays. They had one daugther, Eva.
- Eva Davis married Dr. Wiliam S. Huselton. They had three children: Norman (who died when a young man), Roma and Frances.
- Roma Huselton married Capt. Gerald O'Brien of London, England.
- Frances Huselton married John Bancroft.
 They had two children: John and Frances.
- Jane J. Davis married her cousin, George Shaffer Davis, and her children are listed as descendants of Alexander Davis.

James Davis (born Oct. 6, 1788, died Jan. 7, 1867) served as a Private in the First Regiment of Pennsylvania Militia, under Lieut. Col. Joel Ferree, in the War of 1812. He enlisted in Allegheny County Oct. 2, 1812 and was discharged April 2, 1813. On account of that service he received Bounty Land Warrant 6806 for eighty acres, under the Act of 1850, which land he assigned to William H. Davis (his son-in-law).

On Aug. 22, 1822, James Davis married Mary Ann Searight. They made their home near the North Branch Church, in Moon township, Beaver County.

William James, born in 1823, died in 1907, married Isabella Veazy.

Jane S., born 9-5-1829, died 7-16-1896, married William Hugh Davis.

Margaret, born 2-11-1837, died 2-8-1905, married Joseph Gray.

Jane S. Davis married her cousin William Hugh Davis and her children are listed as descendants of Alexander Davis.

CHAPTER III

Alexander Davis was not such a remarkable man as his Brother, Henry, but was, nevertheless, a good carpenter, farmer, and a noted athlete. His record for the high and the broad jump was "posted" at Elliott's Tavern (where the Militia mustered annually), and was undisputed for many years. He was also an exceptionally good wrestler.

He is said to have been a "peace loving body" who got on well with his neighbors; but was a terror to evildoers when he thought action necessary. His Brother, Henry, frequently made use of him to settle disputes which Henry had "stirred up" with his neighbors.

Alexander and his brothers cleared the Temple Ridge when the wolves were so thick the men had to quit work before sun-down to get home in safety.

Alexander bought Mount Vernon Farm from Henry (who had paid fourteen dollars for it), paying Henry 'one year's work' for the latter's right to the land. Alexander later took out a Patent and paid the Government \$1.25 an acre. The land was surveyed, for Patent purposes, by John Gebhart on Dec. 19, 1836. The Patent is dated Feb. 14, 1837, and enrolled in Patent Book H., Vol. 34, Page 203.

Alexander and his Brother-in-law, William Edwards, built the first cabin on Mount Vernon Farm in 1819. They built it in one day — evidently record time. The log barn, which still stands, was not built until 1834.

Alexander brought his bride, Elizabeth Shaffer, to Mount Vernon Farm Nov. 30, 1819; and all their children were born there. Alexander died May 6, 1857, of pneumonia contracted while building some gates for his Brother, Henry.

CHAPTER IV.

John Davis, the youngest son, is the only one of his children mentioned in William Davis's Pension Record. John was born Jan. 4, 1804 at Middletown (now Coraopolis), Penna. He was only a small boy when the family removed to Beaver County. After the death of his Mother, John made his home with some of his Mother's people in Elizabethtown (now Elizabeth), Penna., and found occupation in the boat-yard at that place. There he met a comely maiden, Margaret Flanegin, daughter of F. C. Flanegin, whom he presently induced to change her name to "Davis."

John and his bride established their home on Raccoon Creek, near Independence, a few miles from the home of Brother Henry. The log house they built is still standing, although unoccupied for many years. A cluster of fox grapes in the rear, and a spray of wisteria climbing over the front porch are silent witnesses of the frugality of the master and delicate taste of the mistress.

As the family became larger, the one-story log house was extended toward the creek until it was necessary to curtail further improvements or move the course of the creek. Then, John and Margaret Davis bought the property of John's sister, Elizabeth Edwards, near the Davis School-house, and moved there.

John Davis was a man of sterling qualities. His piety was genuine. The family altar was early established in his home. The large family wagon was regularly at the front gate on the Lord's Day—not as a command but as a gentle reminder that all the members of the family were expected to attend church.

The family altar (which has always been an institution in the Davis Clan) was sometimes the scene of mirth in the home of John Davis. As the family knelt in prayer, John II would kneel behind his Father and pretend to be doing "sums" (a recognized accomplishment of the Davises) on the soles of his parent's boots. "Turk"—the dog—was the victim of persecution at such times, and would register vocal protest. Margaret would shake her finger at her unruly children.

Margaret Davis was beloved of all who knew her. Possessing a fine courage and a keen sense of humor, she was able to guide her household and accomplish tasks that would daunt many a modern woman. In her early married life she rode horseback from her home on Raccoon Creek to the home of her parents at Elizabethtown; carrying her baby with her; and proudly presented her first-born for the admiration of his grandparents.

Her husband acknowledged that she had better "business sense" than he had, and consulted her in all his affairs. One of their most profitable occupations was the production of wool. They kept large flocks of sheep. On one occasion John Davis took a load of wool to market; sent the empty wagon home in charge of one of his sons, and remained for the "pay-off." Late that night he walked home, along unfrequented roads, with five hundred dollars in silver in a flour bag which he carried on his shoulder.

Frances Flanegin Davis, the eldest son, studied medicine; enlisted in the Civil War as a surgeon; and later located in Oil City, Penna., where he became a valued and honored physician and citizen. On the day of his funeral all business houses in Oil City were closed—a rare tribute to a physician.

William Davis, the second son, inherited the religious tendencies of his parents. He was a favorite with the Pastor, Rev. Mayes Smith. William spent most of his life in Iowa, where his descendants still live.

Mayes Smith Davis, the youngest son, was named for the Pastor, Rev. Mayes Smith, who was a great friend of the family. He studied medicine at Rush Medical College and did post-graduate work at Columbia University. He was a prominent physician in Beaver County and, later, a noted specialist in Pittsburgh. He is said to have been "the most popular Davis."

CHAPTER V

James Scott (a descendant of King Robert Bruce), was born in Roxburghshire, Scotland.

When about twenty years of age he removed to London-derry, Ireland, where he lived for some years. His first impressions of Ireland were not favorable. When his employer offered him a tract of land if he would stay and work for him, he replied, "I'll hae nane of your barren hills. I'll gang hame to my ain counthrey." But, (as his grandson commented many years later), "he married and never ganged hame."

James Scott married Margaret Tully of Londonderry, and they were the parents of: David, born in, died in, married Jane McLellan and Jane Walker; John, born in, died in; James, born in, died in; Robert, born in, died in, died in, died in

The son David preceded the other members of the family to America. He was educated for a merchant's profession (was also a surveyor) and, after attaining manhood, was sent to Philadelphia in the interests of a Liverpool firm whose employ he entered at that time. He had been prepared for his work by being made thoroughly conversant with the French language, owing to the fact that the trade of his firm was conducted largely with Frenchmen.

Soon after coming to America, David married Jane McLellan; a native of Armagh, Ireland, although of

Scotch parentage. Jane McLellan crossed the Atlantic in an ordinary sailing vessel, the voyage being made in 105 days.

James and Margaret Tully Scott, with their younger children, came to America in 1775; arriving at Philadelphia when that city was in possession of the British. Their ship was the last one permitted to land immigrants until the War was over. In the confusion of landing one child — a four-year-old boy — was lost. It was never known if he was drowned or if he was cared for by some other family of immigrants.

At the close of the Revolutionary War, the family crossed the mountains to Redstone (now Brownsville). David's wife died, and he married Jane Walker and went to Pittsburgh, where he settled on land which was owned by his descendants many years later. The other members of the family remained in Brownsville for some years; later removing to Neville Island.

Margaret Tully Scott died at her home on Neville Island, and was buried in "Dr. Riddle's Churchyard at Montour." After her death, James Scott made his home with one of his children in Brownsville.

David Scott (son of James and Margaret Tully Scott) is said to have served in the American Army during the Revolutionary War. He was a Quartermaster under General Anthony Wayne when the latter was at Legionville (between Logstown and Fort McIntosh). While engaged in the construction of the fort at Legionville David had the misfortune to break his right leg, which so disabled him that Wayne's expedition had done its work before he recovered. In compensation for this misfortune he was subsequently given, by the government, a five-hundred-acre tract of land lying across the river from Legionville, which he retained in his possession until the time of his death. He removed in 1792 from Pittsburgh to "Zion Hill" (as the tract was called), and lived there the remainder of his days.

Outside the learned professions, few men of his day obtained as liberal an education as David Scott possessed, or as much general information. His legal advice was much sought by his neighbors. He received (under the old law) a life-appointment as justice of the peace. It was his custom to hold court in his residence every Saturday, and upon that day it was not an uncommon thing to see from twenty to fifty horses tied in front of the Justice's door.

CHAPTER VI.

With two of the daughters of the Flanegins married to sons of the House of Davis, it has seemed wise to include in this volume a record of the Flanegin Family.

The earliest mention of the Flanegin Family in America is that of Thomas Flanegin and his wife. Their home was in Chester County, Pa., where their children were born. They had two sons: Thomas II, and James. The names of other children (if any) are not known.

Francis O'Connor Flanegin (in later years he dropped the "O" from "O'Connor") was born near Finleyville, Washington County, Pa., Sept. 5, 1799. When sixteen years of age he indentured himself to Andrew Crites of Elizabethtown, Pa., to learn the trade of "carding and fulling wool." There was a boat-yard at Elizabethtown, and he also learned "steamboat drafting."

On Dec. 10, 1818, Francis C. Flanegin married Sarah Crites. She was a daughter of Andrew and Katherine Ernfreit Crites. Her father was born in Chester County, Pa. Her mother was born in Germany, but had been brought to America when quite young. The Ernfreit home was near Germantown, and Katherine was hidden in the cellar during the Battle of Germantown. Sarah

Crites was born in Washington County, Pa., Dec. 7, 1796.

After his marriage, Francis Connor Flanegin studied Law. He registered as a Law student in Allegheny County with Thomas Mellon May 28, 1840, and was admitted to the Bar in Washington County in November, 1842; and to the Allegheny County Bar Nov. 30, 1842, on certificate from Washington County, on motion of Moses Hampton.

F. C. Flanegin was elected District Attorney of Allegheny County in 1850, for three years, and was sworn into office November 4, 1850. He was the first District Attorney in the County under the law making that office elective. He served three years, and was succeeded by R. Biddle Roberts.

Later, he was a partner of Marshall Swartzwelder—the firm name being "Swartzwelder and Flanegin."

Francis C. and Sarah Crites Flanegin had seven children: Margaret, born March 17, 1820, died Nov. 10, 1893, married John Davis; Maria, born Sept. 25, 1822, died March 22, 1899, married James Davis; Francis C., born Oct. 2, 1824, died June 9, 1911, married Abigail McD.: Catherine E., born July 17, 1827, died April 3, 1902, married Joseph Caldwell; Sarah, born Oct. 21, 1829, died April 3, 1892, married E. S. Wright; James E., born March 25, 1832, died Jan. 6, 1888, married Matilda Glaydoll; Ione, born Feb. 3, 1835, died Sept. 14, 1910, married Z. Brickle.

Their home was at 101 Wylie Avenue, Pittsburgh, where Sarah Crites Flanegin died May 9, 1853. Francis C. Flanegin died at Coultersville, Pa., Jan. 8, 1866.

CHAPTER VII

Contributed by James Everett Davis and Araminda Jevene Johnston Baker

It has been impossible to find written records of the ancestry of James Johnston. He told his children that he was a son of Sir William Johnson and Caroline Hendrick, and that he had run away from home in his youth.

(Sir William Johnson was born in 1715 at Warrenton, County of Down, Ireland. His home in America was at Johnstown on Kayaderosseras Creek (Fulton County) in New York State).

James Johnston was born in 1738. Nothing is known of his life prior to his service in the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War. His Pension Record shows that he served for two months in 1776, under Captains Strawbridge and William Armstrong; was captured at Fort Washington, confined in New York, and released during the Winter; after which he served for four months in various companies employed by the County Lieutenant of Chester County, Penna. His application for pension was dated Oct. 29, 1832.

At the close of the War he settled near Pittsburgh, Penna., later moving to the vicinity of New Sheffield. where his children grew up.

About 1782 James Johnston married Mary McClelland. They had four children: John, born in 1782, died; William, born in 1784, died in 1833; Mary, born in 1786, died in; and Jane, born in 1789, died in 1870. After the death of Mary McClelland Johnston, James married Jane Anderson. They had two sons: James, born

in 1795, died in 1839; and Walter, born in 1796, died in 1878.

John Johnston married Peggy Davis. A record of their descendants is given elsewhere in this volume.

ORIGIN OF THE NAME TEMPLE (Supplied by Dr. Henry C. Temple)

- An Anglo chieftain named Croeda founded the colony of Mercia in Central England in 586 A. D., and to him (through forty-five gnerations) we trace the origin of the Temple Family. He died in 610.
- .2 Wibba—who died in 627 A. D.
 - Penda—who made Mercia an independent kingdom and became its first king. He was killed in battle near York in 655 A. D.
- Paeda—King of Mercia. He married Achfdeda, (daughter of Oswy, King of Northumberland), who introduced Christianity into her husband's family.
- Son of Paeda—name unknown, who lived in exile after his father's overthrow.
- 6 Ethelbald—who regained the throne of Mercia in 716. He died in 752.
- Son of Ethelbald—name unknown who died before his father.
- Offa—who became King of Mercia through revolt against his grandfather. He died in 795.

- Ethelred—who was given the title of "Eolderman of Mercia". He was made "Protector of London" in the year 886. He married Ethelfleda, daughter of Alfred the Great.
- Son of Ethelred and Ethelfleda—name unknown.
- 15 Alfere—Eolderman of Mercia.
- Alfric—Earl of Mercia. He married a Danish woman, name unknown.
- Edric Streone—Earl of Mercia. He died in 1016.
- 18 Leofwine—Earl of Mercia. He died in 1027.
- Leofric—Earl of Leicester, a part of the ancient Mercia. He was the husband of Lady Godiva, the heroine of the famous ride through Coventry town.
- 20 Algar—Earl of Leicester. He died in 1057.
- Edwyn—Earl of Leicester, who was killed resisting the invasion of William the Conqueror. His sister, Edith, was the wife of Harold, the last Saxon King of England. Edwyn died in 1071.
- Edwyn de Temple. After the death of his father and the confiscation of most of the estate, he settled on a small holding in Warwickshire known as the Manor of Temple. The name "Temple" seems to have originated in a grant made for religious purposes by Lady Godiva in her old age. Probably the nature of the grant saved this small property from confiscation with the rest of the estate.

After the death of Return Temple his family scattered; for times were cruelly hard following the War and there was much moving to and fro in search of a living.

Nathan Temple, son of Return Temple, migrated to the West—to what was then called the "Ohio Country". He settled in West Virginia, South of Wheeling. He lived to a ripe old age; and established a numerous "Temple" family in lower West Virginia and Kentucky.

Robert Temple, son of Return Temple, after the War left New Jersey and went to Philadelphia (which was then the metropolis of the country) in search of employment. Here he met Ann Johnston, who became his wife. About the year 1786, proceeding under the Homestead Laws of Pennsylvania, Robert Temple—in company with John Wyke and a man named Johnston (probably his wife's brother)—went West for the purpose of establishing a home in the "new" country West of the Allegheny mountains. They settled in Beaver County, Penna

was survived by his widow and one son, Robert. (After the death of her husband, Ann Johnston Temple married a man named "Pettit". They had two children: Elizabeth and Margaret).

Robert Temple, son of Robert and Ann Johnston Temple, was born March, 1788, and died in March, 1870.

CHAPTER VIII

(Continued)

Robert Temple was born in March, 1783, and died in March, 1870 at the age of eighty-two years. He was the only child of Robert Temple, Sr., and Ann Johnston Temple, who came from New Jersey about 1785 or 1786 and settled in Beaver County, Penna., not far from the site of the village of New Sheffield (now a part of the City of Aliquippa). Robert Temple, Sr., was killed by a falling tree while clearing away the forest preparatory to establishing a home in the—then—new country. This fatal accident left his widow with the care of their child, who at that time was but an infant. This child was given a home in the family of John Wyke—a man who had come to Beaver County in company with Robert Temple. With this family the boy made his home until he was able to support himself by working out.

Robert Temple, when a young man, enlisted in the War of 1812 and was a member of the Pennsylvania militia.

March 1, 1794, and died July 20, 1854, at the age of 60 years, 4 months and 20 days. She was the daughter of William and Isabella Scott Davis.

Robert Temple and Mary Davis were married in the year 1814. To this union 13 children—seven boys and six girls—were born; namely: Isabella, Jane, William, Henry, Mary, Robert, Margaret, Esther, Johnston, Anderson, James Ray, Rachel and Alexander.

Robert and Mary Davis Temple established their home on a farm in Hopewell Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania; about twenty miles North of Pittsburgh, and a few miles West and South of the Ohio River. Here they lived and raised their large family; and on this farm they both died.

Robert Temple was a shoemaker by trade, and he divided his time between farm work and shoemaking. He was

a great lover of sports and had many an exciting chase after deer and wild turkey, which were plentiful in the forests in those days.

Robert and Mary Davis Temple were active members of Mount Carmel Presbyterian Church for many years.

After the death of Mary Davis Temple, Robert married Rebecca Flanegin Crook (daughter of Thomas Flanegin and Margaret O'Connor Flanegin). They had no children. Rebecca Temple survived her husband about five years.

Robert Temple, Mary Davis Temple and Rebecca Temple were all buried in Mount Carmel Cemetery.
