In July of 1892 a Society of L. E.
was formed by a few persons who
were interested in the work of the
Society at large and in having
meetings of the society at Dana.
At that time Josiah Willis
was pastor of the church. The
week-day and Sunday evening
services were not very well
attended and it was hoped that
a L. E. society being something
new would quicken an interest
in religious meetings. Mr. Willis
joined the society and attended
the meetings which were held
a half hour before his meetings,
but he was hardly hearty in
his cooperation and when several
of the members left town it was neither
desirable nor possible for those remaining

to attempt to continue the Society,
considerable interest, however,
was felt and when it was
proposed in the early part of 1898
to reorganize the Society, it was
shown that good seed had been
sown in '92.

There was \$1.50 left in the treasury
in '93 and that was given by the
treasurer, Miss Huntton to Miss F.
V. Doane and was used by her in
'98 to help in opening the new
Society.

The first appointment in '98 was
of L. E. Sunday, Feb. 6, but
a storm postponed the gathering
so that the first meeting was
held Feb. 13. Mr. Alfred Eggers
led the meeting and much
interest was shown.

Feb. 20 was again a severe storm and no meeting was held either morning or evening in the church.

Feb. 27 Mr. James Gordon led the meeting and Mar. 6. Miss Effie Brewer.

Mar. 13. Miss F. V. Doane led and after the meeting the society was formally organized by the election of officers and the appointment of committees. The members having signed the constitution and pledges in the preceding weeks. This evening, Mar. 13 there were twenty-five persons at the meeting.

Of these four were active members and nine were associate members of the Society. The meeting opened at 7.15 and continued till 8.30.

Your secretary was absent from the meeting of March 27. An attendance of thirty-four is reported with an unusual number of responses. Mr. Gordon called the roll and reported all but two present; they sent responses. A collection of \$1.12 was taken, to this was afterward added


This consecration service was the most interesting meeting yet held.

April 3.

There were twenty-nine or thirty present. Of these four were active members and eight were associate members. About thirteen took part in the meeting by prayer remarks or scripture selection. Miss Grover conducted the meeting in a dignified and earnest manner and very acceptably to all present. The meeting began at 7.30 P.M. and closed at about 8.30 P.M.

April 10. Easter concert. 75 people present.

April 17.

There were 37 present at this meeting. It was very interesting consisting of reading by different members of the Society and others, illustrations of the lives of great missionaries,

Apr. 24. This was ~~an~~ ~~was~~ a stormy Sunday, and only seventeen were present. Conservation Service collection.

May 29. Sabbath School concert led by Mr. Eyes. This was a Memorial concert. For programme see another book.
Mr. Hicks Supt. 88. was not present so Mr. Eyes officiated. There was a full house.

June 5. This meeting was led by Rev. Mr. Houghton, your secretary was unable to be present.

June 12. Subject Christian courage. Meeting was led by Miss Ethel Thompson. There were about thirty present, and a good response from both active and associate members.

June 19. This meeting was to be led by Mrs. E. Morgan but as she was ill Mr. James Gordon had charge of the meeting. Although it was stormy and there were not so many present as usual the meeting was of unusual interest owing to the earnest leadership. The subject was

True Friendship.

June 26. A Children's Day exercise was given this evening. The children of the Grammar School sang, and most of the recitations were given by the Primary School children, there being a few exceptions. The children all did well. The exercise was one of David Cook's. To the mind of your secretary, although these exercises give opportunity for scenic effects in the way of banners &c., they require more actors than our limited number of children supply. This requires that several children shall have two or more parts each. and while there are

children who are ready to take so many parts, it is really burdensome in a way. The music in these books are good if used as intended, as there are selections adapted to the young and also to the older children and to the adults. But when the young people sing the songs written and intended for little ones the effect is hardly satisfactory.

So far as the recitations is concerned, the thought and lesson is always good and while there would be variety were these parts assigned as intended as we have to assign them on account of our fee numbers, they seem

rather monotonous as they have absolutely no literary value whatever. It seems to your Secretary that a more interesting concert results when children select, (i.e., their parents or friends select) the pieces. There may be one or two exercises to take in

those children who are too confident to appear on the platform alone, but it is hardly repays the effort to attempt to carry out fully as in this concert the entire programme of a prepared exercise. This is said not as a criticism of this exercise but as a suggestion for further concerts. In this case those children who

consented to take part were ready for rehearsals and enjoyed their parts; several young children coming long distances hot afternoons to rehearse. There was a large audience, probably 70 or more.

July 3. Miss Carrie Houghton led this meeting with great acceptance. Misses Mary and Daisy Houghton, Mr. Knight and Mr. H. Houghton all had good words to say, making a meeting of great interest. There were 27 present. Mr. Gordon was ill. This was the second Sunday he was absent on account of illness.

July 10, Mr. H. Brightton had charge
of this meeting. Mrs. Woodbury,
agent for the American Congregational
Association occupied the pulpit

spoke on The Indian Problem
at the C. E. Society. There were
30 present.

July 17. Owing to the death of
James L. Gordon which took place
Saturday afternoon at a little
after 5 o'clock. Memorial services
were held by this society.
The regular subject was not
used but the subject of July 10
as more appropriate was considered.
Prof. J. F. Johnson read the
scripture lesson for July 10.

Hag. 2:1-9. Mark 12:29-31.

His remarks set forth the idea of the consecration of Ability to the chosen work of life and the importance of a chosen purpose to which to consecrate ability. He spoke briefly of Mr. Gordon as consecrated to his work.

He was followed by Mr. H. Houghton extending the thought to the idea of Christian consecration. Rev. Mr. Houghton spoke touchingly and sympathetically to the friends of Mr. Gordon and appealed to the young people and especially to the young men taking as his text David's words.

Mr. H. L. Johnson spoke rather briefly but with much feeling of his friendship and attachment and that of his family for Mr. Gordon, and presented resolutions in memory of the lost brother.

Mrs F. V. Doane recalled some of Mr. Gordon's personal traits and the words he has spoken and the principles which governed him holding up his consecrated life as a model for Christian Endeavours since it was modeled after the Christ life. She also referred to the hope of eternal life and the mystery of the beyond. She presented resolutions. Both sets were adopted, and are hereewith transcribed.

Unfortunately the Barre Society which held the banner did not appear with it. So Rev. Mr. Geo. Hubbard of Enfield presented an imaginary banner to the Dana Society and the President Miss F. V. Doane received it.

This banner will hang in our church as an inspiration and a reminder. The convention was very interesting especially as Rev. Mr. Goodspeed pastor of the first Congregational Church of Springfield, Mass., was present for the day. He has but recently returned from a tour abroad during which he visited Egypt and the Nile Valley, the Holy Land coming back in season to attend the International

Convention at London - 1900. He kindly gave some account of the ^{London} Convention in his morning talk and in the afternoon gave an address on "Dreams and Visions as Inspiration to work," "The Up-look." In this address he gave several interesting illustrations of the ability and self-denial of the American and other missionaries stationed all along the Nile. One story of special interest was an account of the drowning of a young man from the American School at Athens. This young man's home was in Providence, R. I. He was a member of Mr. Goodspeed's party and went into ^{the river} bathing at the close of the day and was drowned. His body was soon recovered but the travelers found to their dismay that the inn keeper would not allow the

body to be brought into the inn. There was not a coffin to be had, they never had a coffin. The American Consul to whom they applied was an Arab who could not speak a word of English.

What could they do? So they asked each other as the body of the young man lay there upon the river bank surrounded by a crowd of curious natives. Then the American Missionary came forward. The body was carried to his house, tenderly cared for, the parents of the boy were written to, a letter giving all the details of his death, a coffin was fashioned of ~~a~~ ^{the} rough boards such as could be procured and services were held in the Mission chapel the missionary preaching in Arat and Mr Goodfellow

This is but one illustration of what the missionaries stand ready to do,


